Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Rorik Maltrud** to the mound today, hoping to bounce back from last night's defeat (won the series for the first time since 6/30-7/5 vs. Louisville). The Mud Hens will counter with RHP **Carl Edwards**. Columbus is 44-31 (.587) versus right handers this year. Edwards has faced Columbus six times in his career, going 0-4 with an 8.74ERA (11.1IP, 14H, 13R, 11ER, 9BB, 11K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus won nine straight (longest win streak vs. Toledo in franchise history) until last night and have a 12-5 series lead over the Mud Hens (last series win was in 2022, 11-10). The Clippers have scored first in 13 of 16 against Toledo this year (10-3), compared to 37 times (20-17) in their other 89G. Individually, **Daniel Schneemann** has hit .337 with 7HR and 22RBI against Toledo in his career (26G).

Finally Caught

Columbus is outscoring Toledo 28-3 in the first four innings this week, taking a lead of at least three into the 5th of every game. Toledo is then outscoring Columbus 25-11 from the 5th-9th, with last night's eight unanswered runs being enough to chase the Clippers down. The Mud Hens have scored in every 8th inning of the series (11 runs total, the Clippers gave up 10 runs in the 23 prior 8th innings).

Crushing It

Each of the first 5G of the series have seen the Clippers go deep, with 13HR in total (7HR in first 9G coming out of the All-Star Break). Last night's bomb from **Cooper Ingle** (17, +6 on career high) broke a tie with **Kody Huff** (16, +9 on career high), for the team lead. Clipper catchers have 22HR (t-1st in the IL), following a 2025 season with 8HR (tied for fewest; 203HR from 2014-24, most in the IL).

Ingle is Back

In 17G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 30x71 (.423), drawing 10BB (.488OBP) with 13XBH (5HR, .746SLG). He is one of two players in the IL, along with Iowa's **BJ Murray**, hitting .300/.400/.500 this season and he is currently riding a 9G hit streak (.487, 19x39 with 4HR and 11RBI since 7/23). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.358OPS (14HR) in 37G (.681OPS and 3HR in 30G between DH and LF).

Zone Recognition

Through his first 32G in Triple-A, **Angel Genao** struck out over three times as much as he walked (27K, 8BB), producing a .294OBP. His last 38G have seen a .457OBP with 29BB (4th most in the IL since 6/13) against only 19K (3K in 93PA from 6/23-7/21). As Genao's mastery of the strikezone improved (2-6 on challenges in first 32G, 2-0 in last 38), so did his average (.243 in first 32G, .348 in last 38).

Looking to Rebound

Ralph Velazquez drove in a run for the fifth straight game last night (7RBI total, had 6RBI in 13G prior), while boosting his OPS at Huntington Park to .917 in 28G (.579OPS in 25G on the road; 26x78 with 5HR in last 22G at home). His season slugging mark is back over .400, following a 48 point drop during last week's roadtrip to St. Paul (0x21 in 6G, went from .422 to .374).

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 16th HR of the season Friday night (all in last 265AB; had 15HR in previous 856AB, 6/28/23-4/5/26). Having already established career highs in runs, triples, RBI, walks, and steals, Huff is just six hits and four doubles from personal bests. He is 8x32 in his last 10G (4HR) and his .901OPS is 12th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior; **Cooper Ingle** leads: 1.026).

In a Slump

After doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** hit .111 (8x72) with a .139SLG in his next 20G (6/27-7/28). On 7/30, he was 2x3 with a HR (snapped 124AB homerless streak) and his 150th career RBI as a Clipper (38th most all-time; **Juan Brito** is at 148RBI).

Alfonsin Rosario is hitting .150 (6x40) in 12G since getting promoted from Akron, but smacked his first Triple-A homer on Friday.

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 27x92 (.293) in his last 29G, collecting 15XBH (.565SLG) and 19RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 22G, Tolentino has drawn 18BB to 19K (84PA; 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He is one of 12 in the IL with at least a dozen HR and SB, along with **Kahlil Watson** (Columbus, Omaha and Jacksonville have two).

This Date in Clipper History

8/2/1990

Dave Eiland threw a complete game, 5-hitter as the Clippers beat Richmond 4-1. It was Eiland's fourth consecutive CG, as he ran his record to 14-3. He would go on to capture the franchise's 3rd of six IL Pitcher of the Year awards and was also named an All-Star. His 16 wins on the year tied the Clippers' single-season mark (**Bob Kammeyer**) and his 11CG rank 3rd. In total, he had 61 wins for Columbus (most all-time).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,468 to 1,414).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 153-122 (.556) in pitch reviews, with batters going 79-77 (.506) and pitchers/catchers going 74-45 (.622). They have run out of challenges in 42G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 808, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 126 through 106G (on pace for 177SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 33CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 4th most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (46; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 159 runs while crafting a .914OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 94 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 249-152 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,967RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.38 through the first 106G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 197HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.982), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 59G this season (35-24, .593), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 3rd most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 5th most games decided in the last at bat (26, Memphis has 30). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 100G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-52 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 442-456 (.492), 412-410 with Columbus (.501).

June Swoon:

In his first 10G of the year (March-May), Maltud gave up 15ER in 50.2IP (2.66ERA), holding the opposition to a .195 average (38x186, 4HR). He gave up multiple runs in each of 5G in June (17.1IP, 15ER) and struggled in July also (22.0IP, 12ER), as he has posted a 6.18ERA (39.1IP, 27ER) over the last two months. Opposing hitters have batted .294 (48x163) with 10HR in 10G since the start of June (9HR to last 107BF).

Undecided:

Through the month of June, Maltud was the only pitcher in the IL with at least 10GS that had not taken a loss and his lone win (4/11 at Worcester) made him the only starter with a single decision. He was 2-1 through 5GS in July, winning back to back starts to begin the month and suffering his first loss of the year in his 17th start (7/22 at St. Paul). Despite a 4.12ERA as a starter and run support of 5.5 per game, Maltud has left with the lead only eight times because the offense is averaging 2.4 runs while he is the pitcher of record, including 11G with two runs or fewer (5G with zero runs).

Efficiency is Key:

Through 92 innings started in 20G, Maltud has retired the side with fewer than 10 pitches on 12 occasions, including a 4-pitch inning on 4/3 vs. Indianapolis, while turning in 20 innings of more than 20. He has hit 30+ three times, thanks to an 11-pitch battle vs. Iowa's **Pedro Ramirez** on 4/17 (walk, 34 in the inning) and a 14-pitch skirmish with Buffalo's **Yohendrick Pinango** on 4/23 (groundout, 30 total). He ranks 4th in the IL with 15.7 pitches per inning (17.0 per in last 10G).

Among the Leader Beans:

Entering today's game, Maltud is 7th in the IL with a 4.20ERA (17 qualifiers, was in the top five prior to allowing 7ER in 3.2IP at St. Paul on 7/22). From his quality start win on 4/11 at Worcester through his quality start on 5/25 at Toledo, he crafted the 2nd best ERA in the IL, at 2.14ERA (42.0IP, 10ER). Additionally, Maltud's 0.95WHIP in that time ranked 2nd best (1.28WHIP on the season places 7th).

Stepping Up:

With runners in scoring position this season, Maltud has held the opposition to a line of .169/.250/.234, surrendering just 1HR in 77AB. With a runner at first base, he has struggled to a line of .313/.370/.552 while allowing 4HR (67AB) and with the bases empty, the bad guys have hit .254/.314/.424 with 9HR in 205AB.

Pitch to Contact:

Maltud's Triple-A debut on 3/28 at Iowa was the 44th game of his career and marked his 37th consecutive start (reached 41GS before relief appearance on 4/30 vs. Toledo, all 7G in relief of career have come on starter's rest and been at least 3.0IP). He did not punch out any Cubs in that game (15BF), marking his second straight game without a strikeout (37BFwith 0K from, 9/10/25-4/3/26; had at least 1K in all 42G prior). Among 117 pitchers in the IL that have at least 200BF this year, Maltud has the 29th best walk rate (8.1%; 31BB to 384BF) and the 64th best strikeout rate (20.8%, 80K; had worst rate, 11.9%, prior to 68K in last 15G).

In Relief:

Maltud has pitched twice in relief this season (previous 5G out of the bullpen came among first 7G as a pro), piggybacking **Trenton Denholm** on 4/30 vs. Toledo (3.0IP, 40 pitches) and **Daniel Espino** on 6/2 vs. Omaha (4.0IP, 81 pitches). He has registered a 5.14ERA out of the bullpen (7.0IP, 11H, 4R, 4ER, 2BB, 13K),
