Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound tonight, looking for his second straight win after eight losses to start the season. The Mets will counter with RHP **Dakota Hawkins**. Columbus is 45-31 (.592) versus right handers this year. Hawkins has never pitched against Columbus in his career, as tonight will be his fifth career game in Triple-A (second this season).

vs. the Mets

The Clippers have won the season series in five of the last seven years they have played the Mets (lost in 2023, split in 2019) and have triumphed in 34 of 53G (.641) dating to 6/11/15. They were 2-4 in Syracuse in 2024 (5-1 in the home slate) and 2-3 at Syracuse in 2023. Individually, **George Valera** has hit .324 (12x37) with 5HR and 11RBI against Syracuse in 11G of his career.

Magnificent Seven

The post-deadline seven weeks of the season see the Clippers sitting 7.0 games out of a playoff spot (gained a game last week). Of the seven series left, four are against teams ahead of Columbus (Indy, Omaha and St. Paul, twice) while three are opposite teams below (Syracuse, Iowa and Louisville). Additionally, 24G will be at home (Columbus is 29-21 at home, .580 is 3rd best win percent in the IL).

Jump Start

Columbus outscored Toledo 33-4 in the first four innings last week, taking a lead of at least three into the 5th of every game. Toledo then outscored Columbus 27-12 from the 5th-9th, but managed to complete only one comeback. On the season, Columbus is 57-23 when taking a lead this year (.712, 5th best in the IL) and 34-50 (most comebacks) when trailing at any point in the game (.405, leads the IL).

Crushing It

The Clippers clubbed 13HR in 6G last week (7HR in first 9G coming out of the All-Star Break), but still have a -11 homer differential (14th). Saturday's bomb from **Cooper Ingle** (17, +6 on career high) broke a tie with **Kody Huff** (16, +9 on career high), for the team lead. Clipper catchers have 22HR (t-1st in the IL), following a 2025 season with 8HR (tied for fewest; 203HR from 2014-24, 1st in the IL).

Ingle is Back

In 18G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 32x75 (.427), drawing 10BB (.488OBP) with 13XBH (5HR, .733SLG). He is one of two in the IL, along with **BJ Murray** (Iowa), hitting .300/.400/.500 and he is currently riding a 10G hit streak (.488, 21x43 with 4HR and 13RBI since 7/23, reigning IL Batter of the Week). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.358OPS (14HR) in 37G (.691OPS and 3HR in 31G between DH and LF).

Zone Recognition

Through his first 32G in Triple-A, **Angel Genao** struck out over three times as much as he walked (27K, 8BB), producing a .294OBP. His last 39G have seen a .463OBP with 29BB (4th most in the IL since 6/13) against only 19K (3K in 93PA from 6/23-7/21). As Genao's mastery of the strikezone improved (2-6 on challenges in first 32G, 2-0 in last 38), so did his average (.243 in first 32G, .359 in last 39).

Take it on the Road

Ralph Velazquez had his 5G RBI streak snapped on Sunday, but finished the home stand 5x21 with a double, 3HR and 7RBI (6RBI in previous 13G). Velazquez owns a .579OPS in 25G on the road (2HR in 100AB), compared to .883 in 29G at home (5HR in 103AB). He was hitless over the last roadtrip (0x21 at St. Paul, 7/21-7/26) and was 4x16 in 4G at Lehigh Valley before that (7/7-7/10).

In a Slump

After doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** hit .111 (8x72) with a .139SLG in his next 20G (6/27-7/28). On 7/30, he was 2x3 with a HR (snapped 124AB homerless streak) and his 150th career RBI as a Clipper (38th most all-time), and he went on to hit in each of 2G over the weekend (2x6, double, RBI). Valera has scored six times in his last 3G, crossing the 150 threshold there (38th all-time).

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 16th HR of the season Friday night (all in last 268AB; had 15HR in previous 856AB, 6/28/23-4/5/26). Having already established career highs in runs, triples, RBI, walks, and steals, Huff is just five hits and four doubles from personal bests. He is 9x35 in his last 11G (4HR) and his .901OPS is 11th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior; **Cooper Ingle** leads: 1.042).

This Date in Clipper History

8/4/2018

Greg Allen doubled in a pair off Louisville's **Kevin Quackenbush** (IL All-Star, Clippers tallied 10 of his 14ER allowed on the year) in the 9th to knot the score at 3-3 and send the game to extras. After falling behind by a run in the 10th, recently promoted **Bobby Bradley** notched his fourth hit of the night, a 2-run single off the Hamburger Balcony, to give the Clippers a thrilling 5-4 victory.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,469 to 1,414).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 154-122 (.558) in pitch reviews, with batters going 80-77 (.510) and pitchers/catchers going 74-45 (.622). They have run out of challenges in 42G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 809, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 126 through 107G (on pace for 175SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 35CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 2nd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (49; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 159 runs while crafting a .911OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 96 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +63 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 249-153 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,967RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.36 through the first 107G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 196HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.982), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 60G this season (36-24, .600), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 3rd most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 5th most games decided in the last at bat (26, Memphis has 30). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 100G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-52 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 443-456 (.493), 413-410 with Columbus (.502).

Starting Now:

Peterson got a late start to the season, beginning the year on the shelf with a strained right triceps. Since being activated on 4/28, he is one of 57 pitchers in the IL to accumulate at least 50.0IP, ranking 30th among that group with a 4.84ERA (70.2IP, 38ER) and 40th with a 1.53WHIP. He ranks 5th with 76K thanks to a 12K outing on 6/16 vs. Scranton/WB (one off career high of 13K with Lake County at Cedar Rapids on 5/29/24; had second career 0K game on 7/9 at Lehigh Valley).

That's Over:

From 5/9-7/23, the Clippers went 1-12 in Peterson's 13G, as he personally went 0-8 (longest losing streak of career, had 10 losses in previous two seasons combined). He registered a 5.52ERA (58.2IP, 36ER) over the stretch, while the bullpen produced a 6.99ERA (47.2IP, 37ER) and blew three saves.

Love Those Ohio Mounds:

Peterson excels when pitching in Ohio, having appeared in the state 40 times over his short career (17G with Columbus, 12G with Akron, 8G with Lake County, 3G in Toledo). He owns a 14-10 record in the Buckeye State, fashioning a 2.48ERA (225.0IP, 176H, 66R, 62ER, 49BB, 219K). Outside of Ohio, his ERA sits at 4.49 over 55G (268.1IP, 286H, 152R, 134ER, 70BB, 245K).

First and Foremost:

Through his first 12GS, Peterson allowed a single run in the 1st inning (homer to **Kaelen Culpepper** to lead off the game on 5/15 at St. Paul; opposing hitters were 3x3B with 3BB and 16K in the 1st inning). That all changed in his 13th start, at Lehigh Valley on 7/9, when he labored through the opening frame on 41 pitches, allowing a trio of runs (3x6, 2BB). In 3G since, including his relief outing on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, Peterson has held the opposition scoreless in his first inning of work (1x10, 1BB, 3K). Despite that early success, the top third of the order has a .976OPS off Peterson (6HR in 107AB), while batters 4-9 produce a .661OPS (1HR in 165AB).

In a Jam:

Opposing hitters are batting .322 (38x118) with runners on base (.342, 25x73 with RISP) this year, while going just 39x154 (.253) with the bases empty. Only 23.2% of at bats end in a strikeout with RISP (17K, 73AB), compared to 29.6% in all other scenarios (59K, 199AB). He did not uncork a wild pitch this season until his 410th offering with men on base, 7/9 at Lehigh Valley (had another wild pitch in next outing, 7/18 vs. Indy; 3WP in 1,136 pitches with men on base during Clipper career).

From the 'Pen:

Peterson made his third career relief appearance (all with Columbus) on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, picking up a suspended game in the 4th inning against the Indians. Pitching on his regular day of rest, he threw 72 pitches over 4.0IP, while allowing 4ER (15.0IP, 11ER in relief career).
