The starting pitching matchup is excellent, featuring A's No. 11 prospect Steven Echavarria against Padres No. 10 prospect Isaiah Lowe.

Off the Field: A Vintage Base Ball Association match opens the day from 5-6 p.m., and a LAFCU Independence Day Fireworks Spectacular follows the game's conclusion.

Yesterday: TinCaps 2, Lugnuts 0. Fort Wayne right-hander Miguel Mendez struck out nine batters in six innings, combining with two relievers on a two-hit shutout in front of Parkview Field's 300th all-time sellout. Jonny Butler singled and doubled in the loss.

On Deck: Tomorrow is a Fiesta Locos with live music, food trucks, \$5 tacos/tallboys, a Sugar Skull Bobblehead Giveaway presented by Miss Dig 811, and postgame LAFCU Fireworks.

Prospecting: The Nuts have eight of Pipeline's Top 30 Athletics prospects: No. 6 Tommy White, No. 9 Joshua Kuroda-Grauer, No. 11 Steven Echavarria, No. 15 Ryan Lasko, No. 16 Rodney Green, Jr., No. 26 Nate Nankil, No. 29 Tzu-Chen Sha and No. 30 Wei-En Lin.

Hello, Truist Park: Third baseman Tommy White and Lugnuts 2025 Opening Day starter Gage Jump (now in Double-A) will represent the Athletics' organization at the 2025 All-Star Futures Game in Atlanta, alongside Fort Wayne's Leo De Vries. White, the A's No. 6 prospect, joins Luis Morales (2024), Denzel Clarke (2022), Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Bo Bichette (2017) and Angel Perdomo (2016) as active Lugnuts to play in the Futures Game.

July 4th Retrospective: The Lugnuts were on the road last year on the 4th of July for the first time since 2008. Coincidentally, Fort Wayne is on the road this year on Independence Day for the first time since 2008.

2023: Junior Pérez had an inside-the-park three-run homer on his birthday and the Lugnuts beat Lake County, 7-4, in front of 11,521, the largest Lugnuts home crowd since July 4, 2013, the largest single-game crowd drawn in all of High-A, and the largest attendance drawn by every team in Minor League Baseball except for six Triple-A teams (Buffalo, Albuquerque, Salt Lake, Indianapolis, Norfolk and Round Rock) and one Double-A team (Frisco).

2022: Tyler Soderstrom's three-run homer walked off Great Lakes, 7-4, in front of 10,055, larger than any crowd drawn by 99 other Minor League Baseball teams, including every team below the Triple-A level except for former Triple-A / current Single-A club Fresno.

2021: Dayton scored three in the ninth and four in the 10th to beat the Nuts, 12-8, in front of 10,109: topped by only 10 MiLB teams (nine Triple-A + Fresno), and higher than the average single game attendance for the Miami Marlins, Oakland Athletics, and Tampa Bay Rays.

Lugnuts in the News: July 2nd was an eventful day for former Nuts! Consider...

- 2023 Nut Jacob Wilson and 2017 Nut Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. were voted in as American League All-Star starters, with Guerrero making his fifth All-Star Game appearance while Wilson becomes the first Athletics starter shortstop since Bert Campaneris in 1974 and the second rookie to start at shortstop in All-Star Game history, joining Ron Hansen in 1960. Wilson ranks 2nd in the MLB in avg. (.339) and hits (108).
- 2012 Nut Kevin Pillar announced his retirement following a 13-year playing career with 10 different teams. A 32nd-round selection in 2011, Pillar went 6-for-6 with a grand slam in a 6-RBI night at the Dayton Dragons on May 13, 2012, and found a fire extinguisher in his locker after the game. He went on to be the 2012 Midwest League Most Valuable Player.
- 2018 Nut Vinny Capra was Clayton Kershaw's 3,000th strikeout victim last night. Capra, a 20th-rounder in 2018, played 25 games for the Nuts on his way up the Blue Jays' ladder. He had been claimed off waivers by the White Sox from the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15.

DK at the Helm: The 19th manager in Lugnuts history is Darryl Kennedy, entering his second year in the A's organization. Kennedy distinguished himself as a catcher at Manatee Community College before starring at the University of North Florida and was named an NCAĂ All-American in 1991 en route to North Florida's Hall of Fame, inducted in 2017. Kennedy played in the Minor Leagues for seven seasons, including parts of four seasons in Triple-A. Following his 1997 retirement, he immediately began managing, leading the Gulf Coast League Rangers to the 1998 GCL Championship. Kennedy won a second title with the GCL Rangers in 2000, moving on to stops in the Florida State League, Northwest League and Texas League through 2006. Upon joining the Royals' organization, Kennedy managed in the Appalachian League, Carolina League, Pioneer League, Arizona League and Texas League through 2020. He served as bench coach for the KBO's Hanwha Eagles from 2021 through 2023 before joining the A's as Double-A Midland's assistant hitting coach in 2024.

Filling Out the Staff: Dave Burba, the Lugnuts' pitching coach, walked on at Ohio State, pitched in the Big Ten Championship game as a freshman, was drafted by the Mariners one round after Ken Griffey, Jr. in 1987, and won 115 games in 15 MLB seasons before spending 13 seasons as a pitching coach in the Colorado Rockies' organization. Rubén Escalera is in his second year as hitting coach and his 30th season in the A's organization; he simultaneously serves as a scout for the A's in Puerto Rico. And the pride of Yuba City, Calif., Cooper Goldby comes to the Lugnuts after two seasons serving as the Dominican Summer League A's manager. The catcher/utilityman was drafted out of Lewis-Clark State in the 35th round in 2017.

4th of July in Lugnuts History

2019: 9.798 celebrate the 4th of July with the Lugnuts - who lost 8-1 to Great Lakes at Cooley Law School Stadium. Gabriel Moreno's homer supplied the Nuts' only run. The game included a 58-minute rain delay in the middle of the third inning, which caused the City of Lansing's fireworks show to occur over the right-field wall throughout the eighth inning and into the top of the ninth.

2022: With 10,055 in attendance, Tyler Soderstrom belted a walk-off three-run homer to center field to launch the Lugnuts to a 7-4 victory over the Great Lakes Loons (Yes, 7-4 on 7/4!). The game was a classic: with two outs in the top of the ninth, Eddys Leonard swatted a game-tying two-run homer to left-center off Trayson Kubo, setting the stage for the bottom of the ninth. It was Soderstrom's second walk-off home run of the year.

Gatorade, Not Gator: Echavarria posted a 0.28 ERA with 80 strikeouts in 50 innings as a senior at Millburn High School, allowing only one extra-base hit the whole season. He was named New Jersey's 2022-2023 Gatorade High School Baseball Player of the Year and the top prep prospect in the state. Initially committed to Oregon, he changed his commitment to the University of Florida as his senior year dawned, but then signed with the A's for \$3 million to head into professional baseball - the only New Jersey high schooler taken in the 2023 MLB Draft.

19-year-old Steven Echavarria is part of an exclusive club: players who suited up for the Lugnuts as teenagers. Future Major Leaguers include 19-year-old Max Muncy, who joined the Nuts for the final 42 games of 2022; 19-year-old Gabriel Moreno, who homered in his first Lugnuts at-bat in 2019; Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. and Bo Bichette, who were 18 and 19 respectively when they dominated the 2017 Midwest League and appeared in the Futures Game; 18-year-old Carlos Beltrán, who was in the Lugnuts' very first Opening Day lineup on April 5, 1996; and the 1999 Lugnuts teenage duo of 19-year-old Corey Patterson, who was named the Midwest League Prospect of the Year, and 18-year-old Carlos Zambrano, who won 13 games and worked 153 1/3 innings. As of today, however, Echavarria is the second-youngest player on the team, eclipsed by new arrival Wei-En Lin, who will turn 20 on November 4th

Path to Lansing: After signing, Echavarria debuted in instructional league ball in 2023. He was slated to pitch in the 2024 Spring Breakout for the A's against the Giants, but the game was canceled due to rain. On May 2, 2024, Game 22 of the Stockton Ports' season, he made his official professional debut, starting against Visalia and working three scoreless innings before allowing two unearned run in the fourth... posted 9.00 ERA in six May starts (20 R/18 ER in 18 IP)... limited opposition to one run or fewer in nine of his final 13 starts of the year, including stretch from June 25-August 4 with just 2 ER allowed in 25 2/3 IP... vs. right-handers: .306/.386/.387, 1 HR, 5 GiDP... vs. left-handers: .316/.431/.474, 3 HR, 1 GiDP... best inning was the fourth inning: 3-for-26, .115 avg. against... base-stealers were successful in 11 of 13 attempts.
