TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints got a stellar pitching performance from Brent Headrick and Randy Dobnak in a 2-1 victory over the Iowa Cubs on Wednesday night. Headrick tossed 3.0 shutout innings in his return from the Injured List, followed by Randy Dobnak who struck out six over 6.0 innings, picking up his franchise-record 11th win. The Saints took the lead in the third inning on an RBI double from DaShawn Keirsej Jr. After the I-Cubs tied the game in the fifth, Carson McCusker came up with an go-ahead single in the eighth to give the Saints the 2-1 lead.

MADE IT COUNT: The Saints came out with a 2-1 win on Wednesday, despite collecting only four hits. Their two runs and four hits are both tied for the fewest in a win this season. It's the third occasion this season the Saints have won a game with only four hits and just the second time they have won with only two runs, matching their 2-1 victory over Columbus on August 8. The club's five total bases are tied for the fewest in a nine-inning win in franchise history with their 2-0 win at Toledo on September 30, 2021.

GOING IN THE GLOVE: Saints hitters struck out 10 times on Wednesday, doing so for the fourth consecutive game. The four-game streak of 10-or-more strikeouts ties the longest of the season, matching the first four games of the 2024 campaign, when the Saints struck out 45 times from March 30-April 3. The last time the club struck out 10 times in five consecutive games came August 24-29, 2023. The Saints have struck out 46 times over their last four games.

DOUBLE-DIGIT DUB CLUB: Caleb Boushley will look to become the Saints' second 10-game winner in franchise history tonight, joining Randy Dobnak, who now has 11 wins this season. Boushley previously won double-digit games in 2022, going 12-2 with Nashville. No IL pitcher has had multiple 10+ win seasons since 2021. Only 16 IL pitchers have posted multiple 10+ win seasons in the Statcast Era (2015). The last time the Twins' AAA affiliate had two 10-game winners was Aaron Slegers (15) and David Hurlbut for the 2017 Rochester Red Wings, who were also the affiliate's last 10-game winners.

REHAB RUNDOWN: Byron Buxton played his second game on Major League Rehab with the Saints last night, going 0-for-2 before getting ejected from the game. Buxton was placed on the Twins' 10-Day Injured List on August 15 (retro August 13) with right hip inflammation. In his previous rehab stint, Buxton went 0-for-6 with an RBI. In his current stint, he is 1-5 with a run scored. In his 14 career games with the Saints, Buxton has hit .267 (12-45) with two doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI.

ELECTRIC EELES: Since joining the Saints on July 4, he has constantly found ways to get on base, sporting a .412 on-base percentage in Triple-A. He's reached base in 42 of the 48 games he's played in, drawing 21 walks and been hit by a pitch eight times, the most in the International League in that span. He is fifth among full-season minor league players in on-base percentage at .435 across three levels.

SUMMERTIME SEVERINO: In Yunior Severino's 75 games since May 21, he has hit .316 (90-for-285), with 14 home runs, drawing 45 walks, owning a .927 OPS. In that time, Severino ranks third in the league in OPS, hits and in batting average, ranking fourth with 55 RBI, sixth in on-base percentage at .404, seventh in total bases with 149 and eighth in slugging percentage at .523. His 45 walks in that span are the ninth most in the league.

Severino has now collected 111 hits on the season, becoming the sixth player in franchise history, and second this season (DaShawn Keirsej Jr.), to surpass the 100-hit mark in a single season. He also ranks second in the single-season home run charts, trailing the 21 long balls that Jair Camargo and Chris Williams hit last season.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins surrendered eight runs in the fourth inning, dropping to the Tampa Bay Rays 9-4 on Wednesday. The Twins rallied with four runs in the seventh inning, getting home runs from Kyle Farmer and Carlos Santana. Scott Blewett tossed 2.2 shutout innings in relief for the Twins in the loss.

LAST APPEARANCE: 8/27 v ATL...made second Major League appearance of the season, throwing 2.0 shutout innings of relief against the Atlanta Braves...allowed three hits and one walk...allowed a pair of one-out singles in the sixth, stranding runners at the corners...in the seventh, allowed a walk and single...departed the game after the seventh with the Twins trailing 4-3...did not factor into the decision in an 8-6 Twins' loss in 10 innings

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 8/22 v SWB...made 22nd start of the season, allowing six runs to score on eight hits, walking a season-high four batters, striking out three over 5.2 innings...four of the six runs allowed scored in the first inning, when five of the first six batters of the game reached base, throwing 30 pitches in the opening frame...scattered four hits across the second to fifth innings...departed the game with a runner at first base that came around to score...did not factor into the decision in a 8-7 Saints victory

WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP: Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

SOMETHINGS BREWING: One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

GIVE BACK: Each of the Major League team's usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.

- Placed on the Twins' 10-Day Injured List on May 3, retroactive to May 2, with right knee inflammation...landed on the IL on August 15 with right hip inflammation
