## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Saints were locked in a low-scoring affair with the Omaha Storm Chasers, but Omaha pulled away late in a 9-1 loss in the finale on Sunday. Louie Varland allowed three runs over 5.0 innings, striking out six. The Saints' lone run scored in the second inning when Patrick Winkel hit an RBI single to tie the game at one. In a 3-1 game in the eighth, the Storm Chasers tacked on six runs to pull away. Diego A. Castillo went 2-for-3 in his first game back, also reaching on a walk. Dalton Shuffield also reached base in all four of his plate appearances. Edouard Julien extended his on-base streak to 25 games in the loss.

**JULIEN JUMPING ON BASE:** Edouard Julien has reached base in 25 consecutive games, riding the Saints' longest on-base streak this season. It is the third-longest streak in franchise history and the second-longest single-season streak, trailing only Trevor Larnach - 26 G (2022-23) and Jake Cave - 49 G (2022). It is tied for the seventh-longest streak in the International League this season and the second-longest active streak (Buddy Kennedy - 42G). During Julien's 25-game streak, he is hitting .261/.454/.420 (.874 OPS).

**WINK WINK:** Patrick Winkel has been locked in since the start of July, hitting .350 this month. This July is currently the best month of his career (min. 20 PA's), beating out August of 2023, where he hit .333. His .945 OPS in July is the second-best of his career (min. 20 PA's), trailing his 1.024 OPS, also in August 2023. Winkel has hit safely in eight of his 12 July games, collecting multiple hits in four games, including three of his last five games.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** Coming out of the All-Star Break (seven games), the Saints have been able to capitalize with runners in scoring position. The Saints have hit a league-best .351 (34-for-97) with RISP since the break. Their 34 hits with RISP are the second-most in Triple-A that span. Of those 34 hits, 29 of them are singles.

**WILLIAMS RECORD WATCH:** Chris Williams hit his 12<sup>th</sup> home run of the season on Sunday and the 43<sup>rd</sup> of his Saints career. He has tied Mark Contreras for the career franchise lead at 43 long balls. His 43 home runs since his Triple-A debut on July 17, 2022 are tied for the 11<sup>th</sup>-most in the International League.

**S** In the month of July, Williams has clubbed seven home runs, tied for the second-most in the International League. He also ranks among league leaders in July with his 17 runs (T-3rd), his .667 slugging percentage (8th), 42 total bases (T-9th) and 10 extra-base hits (T-10th). His .990 OPS is also the best of any month he's had in 2024 and nearly double his .544 OPS in June.

**ELECTRIC EELES:** Since joining the Saints on July 4, he has constantly found ways to get on base, sporting a .397 on-base percentage in Triple-A. He's reached base in 15 of the 18 games he's played in, drawing 10 walks and been hit by a pitch four times. *He is third among full-season minor league players in on-base percentage at .440 across three levels.*

**SUMMERTIME SEVERINO:** In Junior Severino's 48 games since May 21, he has hit .341 (62-for-178), with 10 home runs, drawing 35 walks to 49 strikeouts, owning a 1.021 OPS. Since June 1, Severino is tied for the league lead with 51 hits, second in batting average at .357, on-base percentage at .466, and third in OPS at 1.032. His 30 walks since the start of June are the fifth-most in the league.

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Minnesota Twins dropped their series opener to the Mets 15-2 on Monday. Simeon Woods Richardson was tagged for six runs over 3.1 innings, taking his second loss of the year. Three Twins' pitchers allowed at least four runs in the loss.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** 7/24 v OMA...made 17<sup>th</sup> start of the season and his first in 15 days after he was designated for assignment on Jul 4 14 right before the All-Star Break...threw his seventh quality start and first since June 28...allowing one run on four hits, one solo home run, walking one and striking out three...did not allow first hit until the third inning, immediately erased on a double play...first runner to reach second base came in the fifth inning on a Rodolfo Durán double...allowed a solo home run to CJ Alexander with two outs in the sixth inning...marked seventh time this season he completed six innings under 80 pitches this season...received league-leading ninth win in 6-2 Saints victory.

**APPEARANCE PRIOR:** 7/9 @ LOU...made 16<sup>th</sup> start of the season and the first of the series in Louisville...game was delayed 90 minutes to start...allowed the first three batters to reach, all of which scored...allowed four runs in the first inning...gave up a three-run home run in the third inning to Levi Jordan...game was delayed in the second inning with a runners at second and third with two outs for 20 minutes...came back to strike out Hernán Pérez to finish the inning...faced four batters in the third inning to finish the start...allowing seven hits and runs for the second consecutive start...took third consecutive loss and fourth of the season in 8-1, rain-shortened loss in five innings.

**WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP:** Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

**SOMETHINGS BREWING:** One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

**GIVE BACK:** Each of the Major League team's usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.
