## LHP Kenny Rosenberg (5-4, 3.84) vs. RHP German Marquez (NR)

**TODAY'S GAME**: The Isotopes lost a five-run lead after allowing six runs in the ninth to lose 8-7 last night ... Rockies right-hander German Marquez is expected to make his first rehab start with Albuquerque while Kenny Rosenberg is slated to start for Salt Lake.

**BLOWN LEAD**: Last night was the second-biggest ninth inning blown lead in a loss during a home game in Isotopes history. On Sept. 1, 2010, Albuquerque led lowa 13-6 heading into the ninth, then the Cubs exploded for nine runs in a 15-13 triumph.

**ONE-RUN GAMES**: Albuquerque dropped to 6-14 in one-run games, including 4-6 at home. Last night was their first contest decided by a lone tally at Isotopes Park since June 1 vs. Oklahoma City (10-9 victory).

NINTH INNING RUNS: Yesterday marked the second-most runs allowed in the ninth inning by Albuquerque's pitching staff this season (most: March 31, El Paso, eight, 16-15 loss) ... Allowed the most ninth inning runs in MiLB, 61 (second: Indianapolis, 52).

DINGERS: Albuquerque belted one homer yesterday and have from Aug. 9-28, 2022.

FIRST INNING TALLIES: By scoring first last night, the Isotopes have plated the initial run in five consecutive ballgames, their longest stretch since Sept. 16-23, 2022 (seven: vs. Oklahoma City, at Sugar Land).

TWO HOMER GAME: Salt Lake's Keston Hiura connected on two home runs, the 13th multi-homer performance by an opposing batter in 2024 (last: Cal Mitchell, June 11 vs. El Paso). The last Bees player to accomplish the feat against Albuquerque was Jordyn Adam's on June 1, 2023,

TOPES STARTER: Peter Lambert tossed the Isotopes ninth quality start of the season yesterday and sixth in June ... Was the seventh time an Albuquerque hurler worked into the seventh inning (last: Tanner Gordon, June 22 at Oklahoma City).

**ATTENDANCE**: Over 42 openings, Albuquerque has tallied the third-highest total attendance in all of Minor League Baseball (275,786) and highest in the Pacific Coast League.

8TH INNING: The Isotopes lost a game when leading after eight

MR. JONES: Greg Jones has recorded two hits in four of his five games since being optioned from Colorado on June 22 ... Last night was his first contest with multiple extra-base knocks since April 16, 2023 with Double-A Montgomery (triple and homer)

ON BASE STREAK: Jones has reached base in 18 consecutive starts for Albuquerque, compiling a .303/.391/.539 slash line during the stretch.

STOVIE: Hunter Stovall extended his hitting streak to 10 games with two hits yesterday. Is 17-for-41 with four doubles, two homers, 10 RBI and seven multi-hit efforts during the span.... Is the second-longest active hit streak in the PCL (longest: Will Wagner, Sugar Land, 12) ... It's his longest streak since April 26-May 7, 2023, also 10.

**TAKE FLIGHT**: Jimmy Herron was 2-for-4, his ninth multi-hit game of the season for Albuquerque. This is the second time he has produced two hits in back-to-back contests in 2024 (also: June 15-16 vs. El Paso).

VANDY: Connor Kaiser recorded his seventh multi-hit contest of the year last night and third in his last seven games ... Dromultiple runs for third in 2024, with all three coming in June.

**COOLIN' OFF:** From April 21-May 18, Drew Romo slashed .450/.459/.725 with eight doubles, four homers, 20 RBI ... Since, over 26 games, hitting .196 (20x102) ... Five of his seven walks have come in June.

JC: Julio Carreras swiped his 20th bag of the season last Wednesday, establishing a new career high ... Has been caught stealing in two-straight contests, has three on the year.

BIG WILLIE STYLE: Willie MacIver has four homers since June 12 (11 games) ... Has a hit in six of his last seven contests (8x25 with five RBI).

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 8th in average (.300) Julio Carreras is 6th in SB (20) ... Greg Jones in 7th in stolen bases (19)

**TEAM STATS**: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in triples (36), and total bases (1,305), 2nd in hits (759), slugging (.476) average (.277) and OPS (.833) and 6th in runs (459).

SWIPES: Julio Carreras and Trevor Boone each stole a base last night, the 32nd occurrence of the Isotopes recording multiple swipes in a contest this season.

## **NUCLEI NOTES**

**SKIPPER**: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID:** Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

**BALLS AND STRIKES**: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- Took no-hitter into ninth inning June 29, 2021 vs. Pittsburgh before allowing a leadoff single to Ka'ai Tom, the third-longest no-hit bid in franchise history behind Ubaldo Jimenez's no-hitter on April 17, 2010 at Atlanta and Kyle Freeland's 8.1 no-hit innings on July 9, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL

- Named a 2021 NL Silver Slugger Award finalist  $\dots$  won the award in 2018, joining Mike Hampton (2001
- & 2002) as the only pitchers in club history to garner that recognition.
- Pitched the first one-hit complete-game shutout in franchise history, April 14, 2019 at San Francisco
- Set a single-season franchise record with 230 strikeouts in 2018 (previous: Ubaldo Jiménez, 214 in

2010), the fourth-most strikeouts in the National League.

- Named National League Pitcher of the Month for September 2018 (2.14 ERA).
- Became the second pitcher in club history named to the Topps All-Star Rookie Team in 2017 (also:

Jason Jennings, 2002) after leading Major League rookies in quality starts (14) and tied for the lead in

wins (11).

- Recorded his first career win on Sept. 21, 2016 at 21 years, 212 days of age, becoming the second-

youngest Rockies player to earn his first career win (youngest: Jamey Wright, 21 years, 206 days).of one-run ball with nine strikeouts to earn the win over the Cubs
