TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints trailed on three separate occasions on Sunday, before rallying for a 5-4 walk-off victory in 11 innings over the Columbus Clippers. Brent Headrick struck out eight (eight consecutive outs recorded by strikeout) over 3.2 innings of work. The Saints used eight different pitchers, allowing zero earned runs, three hits, and two walks over the final 7.2 innings. The Saints trailed 2-1 after the fourth inning, up until the ninth when Alex Isola delivered a sacrifice fly to tie the game and force extras. Teams traded runs in the 10th and in the 11th, Yoaner Fajardo hit a ground ball up the middle to score two runs and win the game 5-4.

PITCHING POWER: Through the first two games of the season, Saints pitchers have dominated, striking out 28 batters and walking just five. Their 5.6 strikeouts per walk is the *most in Triple-A*. The staff also ranks second in the circuit with a 0.80 WHIP and .162 opponent batting average. The three runs the club has allowed are the fewest in the International League and the third-fewest at Triple-A, despite playing only two games in the opening weekend, the 1.35 ERA ranks atop the IL.

LOOKING TO CHANGE THE TUNE: In the last two seasons, the Saints and Sounds have only met twice, both at CHS Field (4/26-5/1/22 and 5/2-5/7/23). The Saints lost the series three-games-to-two in 2022, with the finale getting canceled. In 2023 the clubs split their six-game set, giving Nashville a 6-5 advantage in the all-time series. This is the first trip to Nashville in the Saints' fourth season as the Twins' Triple-A affiliate.

FOR OPENERS: The Saints are 1-2 in Opening Day games, all on the road, since 2021. In their first season as the Minnesota Twins Triple-A affiliate, the Saints lost in Omaha 8-2, bounced back in 2022 with a 3-2 with over Louisville, and last season lost 7-4 in Toledo.

AND THE SAINTS GO MARCHING IN: For the first time in franchise history, the Saints will play a home game in the month of March. Last season was the first time they had ever played a game in March, when the season opened on March 31 in Toledo. The March 30 start is the earliest in franchise history, including their days as an independent club. Last season, following their three-game roadtrip in Toledo, their first two home games on April 4 & 5 were postponed. Their April 4 game was postponed due to six inches of snow that had fallen on March 31 and their April 5 game was postponed due to inclement weather.

HAVING A GRAND OL' TIME: The St. Paul Saints thrived with the bases loaded in 2023, clubbing 14 grand slams, the most in all of baseball. The 14 slam tied the modern day record (since 2005 in the Minor Leagues, as far back as minor league stats are available), matching Albuquerque who did it in 2022, Cleveland, who accomplished the feat in 2006 and Oakland who did so in 2000. No Major League team had hit more than 14 grand slams in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901).

IT'S LIKE DAY AND NIGHT: When the sun is shining, the Saints are red hot with the bats. Across Minor League Baseball over the last three seasons in day games, the Saints are second in home runs (157), fourth in runs scored (604), and total bases (1595). Contrast that during night games and the Saints are 16th in homers (421), 25th in runs (1769), and 26th in total bases (4680).

HOPING TO BE PRIME "BIG ALEX" MCDONALD: LIST TOP 30 PROSPECT: The Saints will have plenty of talent to start the season, especially if you go by the Top 30 List. The Saints have seven players listed on Baseball America's Top 30 List on their active/IL roster. They are: Brooks Lee (#2/#35 overall), David Festa (#5), Austin Martin (#10), Yunior Severino (#20), DaShawn Keirse Jr. (#23), Jair Camargo (#26), and Simeon Woods Richardson (#30).

MAYBE ONE DAY WE'LL MEET: The Saints will play only one new team in the 2024 season, the Syracuse Mets when they visit CHS Field from June 4-9. There will still be six of the 19 IL teams the Saints will have yet to play when their fourth season wraps up in 2024: Charlotte Knights, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Memphis Redbirds, Norfolk Tides, and Worcester Red Sox. The Saints have also not traveled to eight International League cities. Along with those six teams, the Saints have not traveled to the Gwinnett Strippers and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Railriders. *The only new ballpark they visit this season is the Nashville Sounds, their first roadtrip of the season.*

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins took two out of three games in Kansas City to open the season. They were off on Monday as they traveled to Milwaukee to take on the Brewers for two games before opening the home portion of their schedule on Thursday against the Cleveland Guardians. Former Saints Louie Varland will make his season debut for the Twins, squaring off against right-hander Jakob Junis for Milwaukee.

IT'S NO LONGER HIGH NOON: If something looks different for SWR in 2024, it's because he's made a couple of changes. During the offseason he changed his arm angle and no longer comes straight over the top. Instead of a 12 o'clock arm angle, he dropped down about six inches in hopes of getting his velocity back up to 93-94 mph. In addition, SWR added about 10-15 pounds to his frame.

IT'S NOT HOW YOU START, IT'S HOW YOU FINISH: It was a tale of two different halves for SWR in 2023 with the Saints. From April 9-June 8 he was 0-5 with a 8.08 ERA (42.1 IP/38 ER) while walking 26 and striking out 36 as opponents hit .322 against him in 10 starts. After skipping a start, SWR was electric over the final three months of the season going 7-1 with a 3.03 ERA (71.1 IP,24 ER) with 35 walks, 60 strikeouts, and a .205 OBA in 14 games (12 starts).

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: Over his final three starts in 2022, SWR tossed three quality starts (at least 6.0 innings and three or fewer runs). He went 6.0 innings in each of those three starts and didn't allow a run in two of the three while allowing two in the other. Those three quality starts were tied for the most on the team in 2022. The Saints threw just 12 quality starts, going 6-6 in those outings, with Mario Sanchez also throwing three.

EITHER YOU'RE HOT OR YOU'RE DUE: After a 2-0 start in 2022 over his first four starts, Woods Richardson went 11 starts without picking up another win. It was the longest stretch in his career between wins over the course of a single season. Between the end of his first pro season in 2018 and into the start of 2019, he went 16 starts without a win, which included a stretch of five consecutive losses with Low-A Columbia.

HOT START: In his first full season with the Twins in 2022, Woods Richardson did not allow an earned run in his first 23.2 innings to start the year. His dominant start earned him Texas League Pitcher of the Month for April, the first such award in his career.

AND IN TOKYO IT WAS WHAT TIME: When Woods Richardson was traded to the Twins he he was in Tokyo for the Olympics. The call came in at 2 a.m. in Tokyo. When he answered the phone he was half asleep and wasn't sure whether he was dreaming or if the call was real

OLYMPIC EXPERIENCE: Participated in the 2020 Summer Olympics (took place in 2021) where he won a silver medal (did not pitch in a game). Took a picture with Luca Donicci while at the Olympics

CALLING A LIFELINE: Following Woods Richardson's trade from the Mets to the Blue Jays, he scrolled through the phone for someone to call and help him handle the news. He stopped on his former travel ball coach, 14-year MLB veteran, Adam Dunn. Dunn told him he was once traded for a bucket of balls and that he was just traded for Marcus Stroman

TRADING IN BLUE AND ORANGE FOR RED AND BLUE: Traded from the Mets to the Blue Jays along with LHP Anthony Kay for RHP Marcus Stroman on July 28, 2019. Was driving to Port St. Lucie with his parents trailing him in their RV after being called up to High-A when he was informed he'd been traded to the Blue Jays and should now head to Dunedin.

BUFFALO WILD WINGS, YOU HAVE TO BE HERE: Was hanging with friends at a Buffalo Wild Wings in Sugar Land, not thinking he was going to get drafted because teams soured on him because of a bout of tonsillitis during his senior season which held him out two weeks, when he got a call from his agent a little after 11 p.m. He saw his face on the TVs in the bar and all of it caught him completely off guard

LATE BLOOMER: After showing up to Kempner HS in Sugar Land, TX at 5'4 and 120 lbs, a growth spurt between freshman and sophomore year put him on scouts radar that added eight inches and 40 pounds. He was committed to the University of Texas before the Mets drafted him in the second round and signed him for \$1.85 million.

CAREER NOTES

- Begins 2024 as the #24 rated prospect by MLB Pipeline and #30 rated prospect by Baseball America in the Twins system
- Received his first MiLB.com Organizational All-Star in 2022 with Twins going 5-3, 2.77 (33 ER, 107.1 IP) with 36 walks, 115 strikeouts, and a .200 opponents batting average against in 23 games (22 starts) between Double-A Wichita and Triple-A St. Paul
- Made his Major League debut on October 2, 2022 @ Detroit and allowing three runs (two earned) in 5.0 innings while walking two and striking out three in a losing effort
- Entered 2022 as the Twins' fourth-best prospect, per MLB Pipeline and sixth in Baseball America, now ranks sixth in both publications after the mid-season update
- Earned a non-roster invite to spring training for the second-straight year after getting his first in 2021 with Toronto
- Was the Blue Jays fourth-best prospect in 2021 and their top pitching prospect behind Nate Pearson
- Started 2021 with Double-A New Hampshire, was placed on the Temporary Inactive list from May 25-June 9 to join Team USA in the qualifying tournament for the Tokyo Olympics. He was scheduled to start a game in the qualifier against Puerto Rico but it was cancelled due to the weather. He was put back on the Temporary Inactive list on July 20 to join Team USA at the Olympics. He did not pitch in the tournament but won a silver medal alongside former Saints pitcher Joe Ryan.
- Traded from the Blue Jays to the Twins organization on July 30 while in Tokyo, along with Austin Martin in exchange for José Berrios.
- Following the trade, he made just four appearances (three starts) for Double-A Wichita. He allowed six runs on six hits in 8.0 innings.
- Originally drafted by the New York Mets with the 48th overall pick (fifth pick in the second round)
- Traded by the Mets in 2019 to Toronto along with Anthony Kay in exchange for Marcus Stroman
- After a 3-8 start in Low-A Columbia, the Blue Jays assigned Woods Richardson to High-A Dunedin when they acquired him, where he went 3-2 and took nearly two full runs off his ERA (from 4.25 to 2.54) from one stop to the next. He allowed just eight earned runs in 28.1 innings in Dunedin
- Made seven appearances in his first pro season, allowing three earned runs in 17.1 innings in two different levels of rookie ball
