SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the RubberDucks, 13-2, for their fifth straight win. Richmond scored seven runs in the first inning. Sabin Ceballos hit a two-run single, Scott Bandura brought in a run with a groundout, Adrián Sugastey singled in a run and Justin Wishkoski hit a three-run homer. After an Akron run in the top of the fifth, Carter Howell worked a bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the inning, Victor Bericoto scored on a wild pitch and Sugastey brought in a run with a groundout. Akron's Alfonsin Rosario hit a solo homer in the sixth to cut the score to 10-2. In the bottom of the eighth, Bandura drove an RBI double and Howell hit a two-run single to extend the Richmond lead to 13-2. John Michael Bertrand allowed two runs in six innings and tied his career high with nine strikeouts. Dylan Hecht threw two scoreless innings and Shane Rademacher pitched a scoreless ninth.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the opener of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. This is the third series between the two teams this year. From June 18-22, the Flying Squirrels went 3-2 in an abbreviated five-game series in Altoona. The Curve won four-of-six at The Diamond from August 12-17. Altoona leads the Southwest Division second-half standings over Richmond by 2.5 games with 12 games remaining in the regular season.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,578 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks eighth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average and tetal attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 2.5 games behind first-place Altoona. They won the final five games of last week's six-game series against Akron at The Diamond. After going 5-9 over 14 games from August 10-22, the Flying Squirrels have gone 7-1 in their last eight games since August 23. Of Richmond's 72 losses this season, 40 of them have been by two runs or less (24 by one, 16 by two). Their 24 one-run losses are second-most in the EL, one less than Reading.

THE CURVE are in first place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 2.5 games ahead of Richmond. Last week, Altoona won four-of-six at Harrisburg, including taking the last three games by a combined score of 31-5. Altoona's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including SS/OF Konnor Griffin (No. 1), 2B Termarr Johnson (No. 7), RHP Antwone Kelly (No. 12), RHP Wilber Dotel (No. 13), OF/INF Mitch Jebb (No. 20), OF/IB Esmerlyn Valdez (No. 22) and C Omar Alfonzo (No. 25), MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list features six Altoona players, including Griffin (No. 1), Johnson (No. 6), Valdez (No. 15), Jebb (No. 18), Alfonzo (No. 19) and Dotel (No. 28). Griffin is rated by both Baseball America and MLB.com as the No. 1 prospect in baseball.

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Joe Whitman makes his 24th start of the season and his third against the Curve. He last pitched last Wednesday against Akron and allowed one run over 5.1 innings to pick up his fourth win of the season. He has made two starts against the Curve this year, going 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA (4 ER/9.0 IP). On June 21 at PNG Field, he allowed one run over 3.2 innings in a loss. He pitched against the Curve on August 15 at The Diamond and allowed three runs over 5.1 innings with six strikeouts. In the Eastern League this season, Whitman is ranked third in K/9 (9.87), third in K% (25.2), sixth in strikeouts (114), eighth in innings pitched (104.0) and 10th in BAA (.274). On May 3, Whitman threw six perfect innings against the Patriots at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced, and set a then-career high with 10 strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on May 5. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. FOR ALTOONA: Left-hander Blake Townsend makes his 10th Double-A start of the season and his fourth appearance against Richmond. He last pitched on Wednesday at Harrisburg and allowed four runs (three earned) over 4.2 innings in a loss. He faced the Flying Squirrels on June 21 in Altoona in a start and threw three hitless, scoreless innings. He made a relief appearance at The Diamond on Aug. 12 and allowed two runs in 1.1 innings. In a start in Richmond on Aug. 16, he threw 3.1 scoreless innings. For the year, Townsend has a 2.35 ERA (2 ER/7.2 IP). Townsend signed with the Seattle Mariners in 2018 and was pitching for High-A Everett last season before being released in August. He signed with the Pirates two weeks later and joined Double-A Altoona, posting a 2.00 ERA in five appearances. This year, Townsend has split his time between Altoona, High-A Greensboro and Triple-A Indianapolis.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan, Onil Perez and Drew Cavanaugh have combined to catch 66 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 46 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 59 runners caught stealing for his career is tied for the most in franchise history, even with Williams (2010-11, '15).

BERI BOMBS: Victor Bericoto has 11 homers this season, which leads all Richmond players for the year. He has 33 home runs in his Flying Squirrels career, which is tied for second-most in team history with **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) and four behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. Bericoto now has 133 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In his last 27 games since August 1, Bericoto is batting .330 (30-for-91) with three homers, three doubles, 16 walks and 16 RBIs.

IT'S BO TIME!: Bo Davidson is batting .371 (13-for-35) with four homers, a double and six RBIs in his last eight games since August 23. On Friday, against the RubberDucks, he had his second two-homer game at Double-A and drove in three runs. He had his second three-hit game at Double-A on Thursday night. Among full-season Giants minor leaguers this season, Davidson ranks second in triples (7), second in total bases (200), third in batting average (.288), third in OBP (.383), third in SLG (.481), third in OPS (.864) and fourth in homers (17).

SECOND-HALF SABIN: In his last 14 games since August 9, **Sabin Ceballos** is batting .412 (21-for-51) with three homers, six doubles and 18 RBIs. For the season, he leads the team lead with 47 RBIs. He has four consecutive multi-hit and multi-RBI games. In his last 37 games since July 3, Ceballos is batting .313 (41-for-131) with five homers, 10 doubles and 27 RBIs.

TAKE A WALK: Diego Velasquez has worked 62 walks this year, which is tied for third-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, tied with Jarrett Parker and Mark Minicozzi's previous franchise records for the 2023 season. Jacob Heyward set a new record with 80 walks in 2019 and Hayden Cantrelle moved into second on the list with 66 walks in 2023. Velasquez is tied for fourth in the Eastern League in walks this season.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked tied for fourth in walks (62) and tied for fifth in hits (107). Turner Hill is tied for ninth in triples (5). John Michael Bertrand is second in ERA (2.94), second in innings pitched (125.2), seventh in BAA (.249) and seventh in WHIP (1.33). Jack Choate is fifth in strikeouts (118). Joe Whitman is sixth in strikeouts (114), eighth in innings pitched (104.0) and 10th in BAA (.274). Tyler Myrick is tied for first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 255 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bo Davidson (No. 3), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Joe Whitman (No. 11) and Jack Choate (No. 30). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1989: The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 5-0, in Game 1 of the Governors Cup playoffs at The Diamond. Charlie Puleo started and threw a one-hit shutout. He faced the minimum 27 batters, allowing only a single to Chico Walker in the seventh. He was later thrown out trying to steal. Mark Lemke brought in Richmond's first run with a groundout in the first inning. In the eighth, Barry Jones hit a bases-loaded, two-run single and John Mizerock added a two-run single for a 5-0 Richmond lead. 1990: The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 9-8, at The Diamond. The Tides came to Richmond with only two available pitchers, and infielder Mike DeButch had to pitch the ninth with an 8-6 lead. Dwight Taylor tied the game with a two-run homer. Dennis Hood won the game with a sacrifice fly in the bottom of the 10th. 1994: The Richmond Braves beat the Charlotte Knights, 3-2, at The Diamond to clinch the International League West Division title. Charlotte scored a run on an error in the fifth and a second on another error in the sixth. In the bottom of the sixth, Brian Kowitz cut the deficit to 2-1 with a two-out single. In the bottom of the eighth with two outs, Tyler Houston hit a go-ahead, two-run homer to give Richmond a 3-2 lead. It was Houston's fourth homer of the season. 2010: The Flying Squirrels beat the Erie SeaWolves, 14-0, at Jerry Uht Park. It is the most lopsided shutout win in franchise history. Mike MacDonald threw five innings, Mitch Lively threw two and Rafael Cova threw the eighth and ninth. Brad Boyer and Conor Gillaspie hit solo homer in the first inning. In the fifth, Ryan Lormand hit an RBI double, Brock Bond scored two with a ground-rule double, Thomas Neal drove in a run with a double and Clay Timpner stretched the lead to 7-0 with a single. In the sixth, Neal and Gillaspie hit RBI singles, a run scored on a passed ball, Clay Timpner hit a two-run single and Juan Ciriaco drove a two-run homer. 2022: The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators,
