Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Trenton Denholm to the mound tonight, looking to take a 5-0 series lead (last: 8/2-8/7/22 vs. Rochester; 0-2 in last 2G after starting 4-0). The Mud Hens will counter with RHP Sawyer Gipson-Long. Columbus is 44-30 (.595) versus righties this year. Gipson-Long has pitched against Columbus thrice in his career, going 1-1 with a 1.93ERA (14.0IP, 12H, 3R, 3ER, 3BB, 17K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus has won nine straight (longest win streak vs. Toledo in franchise history) to take a 12-4 series lead over the Mud Hens (last season series win was in 2022, 11-10). The Clippers have scored first in 12 of 15 against Toledo this year (10-2), compared to 37 times (20-17) in their other 89G. Individually, Daniel Schneemann has hit .351 with 7HR and 22RBI against Toledo in his career (25G).

Catch a Niner

Last night's final score saw the Clippers post nine runs for the third straight game, giving them 33 runs through the first 4G of the series (best 4G start this season; most runs in a series: 43, 4/14-4/19 vs. Iowa). On the season, Columbus has put up 9+ runs in 24G (2nd in the IL, -4 on Charlotte), but only 11 times in Huntington Park. Prior to this week, the Clippers had 37 runs in the last 10G at home (6HR).

Crushing It

Each of the first 4G of the series have seen the Clippers go deep, with 11HR in total (7HR in first 9G coming out of the All-Star Break). Last night's bomb from Kody Huff (16, +9 on career high), tied him with Cooper Ingle (16, +5 on career high) for the team lead. Clipper catchers have 21HR (2nd in the IL), following a 2025 season with 8HR (tied for fewest; 203HR from 2014-24, most in the IL).

Ingle is Back

In 16G since his option, Cooper Ingle is 28x67 (.418), drawing 9BB (.481OBP) with 11XBH (4HR, .701SLG). He is one of two players in the IL, along with Iowa's BJ Murray, hitting .300/.400/.500 this season and he is currently riding an 8G hit streak (.486, 17x35 with 3HR and 9RBI since 7/23). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.334OPS (13HR) in 36G (.681OPS and 3HR in 30G between DH and LF).

Zone Recognition

Through his first 32G in Triple-A, Angel Genao struck out over three times as much as he walked (27K, 8BB), producing a .294OBP. His last 37G have seen a .452OBP with 28BB (3rd most in the IL since 6/13) against only 18K (3K in 93PA from 6/23-7/21). As Genao's mastery of the strikezone improved (2-6 on challenges in first 32G, 2-0 in last 37), so did his average (.243 in first 32G, .343 in last 37).

Long Time, No Schneemann

Daniel Schneemann surpassed 100RBI as a Clipper with his 3-run homer last night (102RBI in 172G). In his last 35G with the Clippers, since 4/25/24, he has slashed .341/.460/.642 with 8HR and 31RBI. Of Schneemann's 168 hits in his Triple-A career, they are split exactly even between Huntington Park and the rest of the IL, but he has 17HR in Columbus with a .522SLG (7HR, .422SLG on the road).

Looking to Rebound

Ralphie Velazquez drove in a run for the fourth straight game last night (6RBI total, had 6RBI in 13G prior), while boosting his OPS at Huntington Park to .902 in 27G (.579OPS in 25G on the road; 25x74 with 4HR in last 21G at home). His season slugging mark is back over .400, following a 48 point drop during last week's roadtrip to St. Paul (0x21 in 6G, went from .422 to .374).

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 16th HR of the season last night (all in last 261AB; had 15HR in previous 856AB, 6/28/23-4/5/26). Having already established career highs in runs, triples, RBI, walks, and steals, Huff is just six hits and four doubles from personal bests. He is 8x28 in his last 9G (4HR) and his .913OPS is 5th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior; Cooper Ingle leads: 1.026).

In a Slump

After doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, George Valera hit .111 (8x72) with a .139SLG in his next 20G (6/27-7/28). On 7/30, he was 2x3 with a HR (snapped 124AB homerless streak) and his 150th career RBI as a Clipper (38th most all-time; Juan Brito is at 148RBI). Alfonsin Rosario is hitting .135 (5x37) in 11G since getting promoted from Akron, but smacked his first Triple-A homer last night.

This Date in Clipper History

8/1/1994

The Clippers edged out Scranton/WB by a score of 3-2 in Columbus. Twenty year old SS, **Derek Jeter** went 2x4 with a double and a run in his Triple-A debut. Jeter went on to bat .349 (44x126) over the final 35 games of the season in '94. He returned to Columbus in '95, getting named to the IL All-Star Team, and again in '98 on rehab. In total, he played 159 games for the Clippers, batting .324 (4th all-time).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,466 to 1,412).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 152-122 (.555) in pitch reviews, with batters going 78-77 (.503) and pitchers/catchers going 74-45 (.622). They have run out of challenges in 42G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 807, would rank as 5th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 120 through 105G (on pace for 170SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 33CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 4th most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (47; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 157 runs while crafting a .910OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 92 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 244-152 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,967RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.36 through the first 105G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 196HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.982), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 59G this season (35-24, .593), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 3rd most last at bat wins this year (14, three off the lead) while playing in the 5th most games decided in the last at bat (26, Memphis has 30). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 100G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-52 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 442-455 (.493), 412-409 with Columbus (.502).
