LHP Michael Plassmeyer (7-4, 4.56) vs. RHP Andrew Quezada (2-8, 6.57)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes hold a 2-1 series advantage after claiming a 10-6 victory yesterday ... Andrew Quezada is expected to start for Albuquerque while Michael Plassmeyer is slated to take the hill for the Express.

ATTENDANCE: During the 2025 season, the Isotopes are averaging 6,703 fans per game on the year—the highest in the Pacific Coast League and sixth-highest in all of MiLB.

-The club has also tallied a total attendance of 428,974 over 64 openings—ninth-highest in MiLB and third-most in the PCL with five fewer openings than first-place Las Vegas (442,785). The Isotopes are on pace to have the highest total and average attendance in PCL for the third and fourth-straight years, respectively

BROADCAST: Tonight's Isotopes game will air on KOAT, which can be found on channel 7 throughout the state of New Mexico.

HITS: The Isotopes tallied 17 hits last night, their ninth time recording 17+ in a contest in 2025 (last: Aug. 1 vs. Sacramento – 17). Additionally, it was Albuquerque's most knocks in a home game against Round Rock since June 11, 2014, when they finished with 19.

XBH: Albuquerque finished with eight extra-base hits last night, the eighth time this year with at least eight in a contest (last: August 21 vs. Las Vegas, eight).

HITS A PLENTY: All nine of the starting position players in Albuquerque's lineup Thursday recorded at least one hit for the 11th time in 2025 (last: Aug. 30 at Sugar Land).

50 RBI: Adael Amador and Zac Veen both picked up their 50th RBI in Thursday's game, giving the Isotopes eight players to reach that plateau this season.

SWIPES: Since July 1 (54 games, Braiden Ward's promotion to Albuquerque), the Isotopes have stolen 81 bags, sixth-most in Triple-A and third-most in the PCL after swiping just 56 bags in their first 80 contests.

KESTDADDY: Keston Hiura tied his season high with three hits last night (two previous times: May 16 vs. Tacoma and June 27 at Las Vegas)

-Thursday was his sixth game with multiple extra-base hits in 2025, and first since accomplishing the feat in three consecutive games from July 31-Aug. 2 vs. Sacramento ... Has a team-leading 17 homers on the season.

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson went 1-for-3 Wednesday, extending his on-base streak to 23 games. Slashing .370/.489/.630 with five doubles, one triple, four homers, 13 RBI and 14 walks. ... His 14 dingers on the year ties a career-high set in 2023 with Spokane (7) and Hartford (7).

-Over his last 77 games, is slashing .332/.428/.580 with 20 doubles, seven triples, 12 homers and 47 RBI, increasing batting average from .178 to .290.

-In the PCL, is 2nd in triples (8), T-5th in XBH (47), 9th in OBP (.387) and 10th in OPS (.890) and slugging (.503).

-Needs two triples, one homer and one stolen base to tally 25+ doubles, 10+ triples, 15+ home runs and 10+ steals for the campaign, only done by seven Triple-A players since 2005.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard leads PCL in Triples (11), 2nd in slugging (.575) and OPS (.948) and T-3rd in XBH (49) ... Tied for third in all of MiLB in triples.

-Is one double and one homer away from joining 25+ doubles, 10+ triples. 15+ home runs and 10+ steals list.

ADAEL: Adael Amador went 3-for-5 last night with a double and three RBI to extend his on-base streak to 17 games. Slashing .333/.443/.530 with six doubles, two triples, a homer, 19 RBI and eight stolen bases during the stretch. Tallied at least three hits for the sixth time this season (last: Aug. 23 vs. Las Vegas, 3-for-5).

SPEEDSTER: Braiden Ward picked up two knocks yesterday, his ninth multi-hit game at Triple-A. Scored three runs for the fourth time in his last 21 contests (last: Aug. 22 vs. Las Vegas).

-Stole his 27th base in 35 contests for Albuquerque (dating back to July 1), second among Triple-A players in the timeframe (Jared Oliva, Nashville – 29). Tied for the eighth-most swipes in the PCL this season (also: Tim Locastro, ELP) and Grant McCray, SAC).

-Has 200 swipes since the beginning of 2022, tied for second-most in MiLB during span (Chandler Simpson, 225 and Jonatan Clase, 200) ... Has the tenth-most swipes in the PCL this season.

CRIM DE LA CRIM: Blaine Crim singled and walked in four atbats Thursday, and has reached base in 28 of his last 67 plate appearances. The stretch dates back to August 12 at Oklahoma City (15 games), producing a .345/.448/.491 slashline with five doubles, a home run and eight RBI ... In PCL, T-5th in RBI (81) and XBH (47),T-6th in homers (20) and T-8th in doubles (26) and total bases (202)

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
