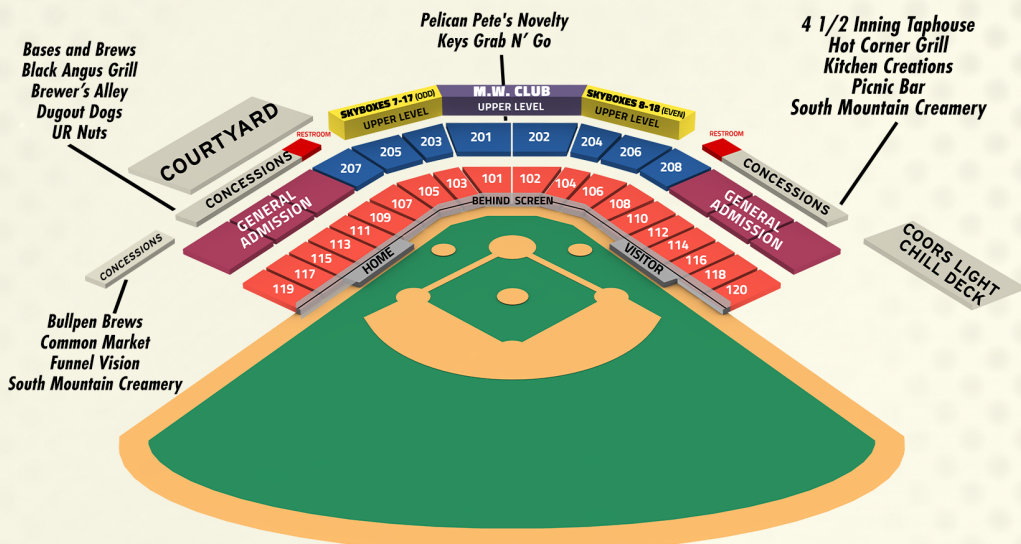

CUEVAS FINDS FREDERICK HOME AS HE CONTINUES TO CLIMB

Elis Cuevas, a shortstop and utility player for the Keys, has emerged early in the 2026 season. Sporting six home runs and 20 RBI through his first 34 games, Cuevas is on track for his best season in the Orioles farm system in year number five.

Cuevas was signed to a minor league contract in January of 2022, before heading to the Dominican Summer Leagues that summer. As a 17-year-old with DSL Baltimore, he hit .315 with 20 RBI and seven extra-base hits. In 2023, he continued his strong start to his career, hitting .305 with 20 extra base hits and 28 RBI. He played nearly twice as many games in '23 as in '22, showing he could have that success over a more sustained period.

The Dominican Republic native would see his position in the farm system elevated in 2024. After joining the FCL Orioles in the Florida Complex League, he totaled 43 hits in 56 games while driving in 23 runs and walking 21 times. He struck out just 25 times and stole 33 bases in 40 attempts. His athletic and versatile skill set quickly got him a call up to Single-A Delmarva.

In 20 games with the Shorebirds in '24, Cuevas saw 64 at bats and earned 15 hits. Two doubles and two home runs accompanied seven RBIs, 14 walks and 14 stolen bases in 19 attempts. He continued to show his patience and athleticism while proving he was ready for the next level.



In 2025, Cuevas spent a brief three games in the FCL before rejoining Delmarva. Back with the 'Birds, he hit .229 with 20 RBIs and 41 hits before being lifted to High-A Aberdeen in the South Atlantic League. Now, he's found himself on the lineup card at Nymeo Field at Harry Grove Stadium on a near-everyday basis. Now the High-A affiliate of the Orioles, the Keys have shot out to a 29-15 start in their first league back as an affiliate.

Cuevas has been a key contributor in a star-studded lineup. He's hit six home runs through his first 124 at bats, just two shy of his single season career high, while also delivering in clutch moments for the Keys. Most recently, it was a single in extra-innings, driving in Wehiwa Aloy to secure the second victory of the day for the Keys on May 24. The team was slated for two seven-inning ballgames after a series of rain delays had plagued Frederick's series with the Greenville Drive.

As Cuevas continues to contribute to the best lineup in the SAL North, one that's posted a +80-run differential through late May, he'll continue to give a versatile and athletic approach in the field, at the plate and on the basepaths, with 16 swiped bags in 18 attempts so far.

A LOOK AROUND THE FARM SYSTEM

So far in the first two months of the Minor League season, the Baltimore Orioles farm system has seen their fair share of top prospects getting called up, some even as high as the Major Leagues.

In the Single-A ranks, the Delmarva Shorebirds have trended up as they currently sit in the middle of the standings in the Carolina League. Leading the way on the mound is former Keys MLB Draft League right-handed pitcher Christian Rodriguez, who has totaled 53 strikeouts to lead all Shorebirds pitchers across 40 innings pitched as a starting hurler. Alongside Rodriguez, sixth-ranked Orioles prospect Esteban Mejia has emerged as a top starter for manager Adonis Smith's group, as he has posted 37 strikeouts across 28 innings of work in his first full year in the affiliated ranks.

Offensively, infielder and 29th-ranked Orioles prospect Cobb Hightower leads Delmarva in batting average with a .342 average in his first 10 games of the season, while outfielder Stiven Martinez leads the team in homers with five through May 27.

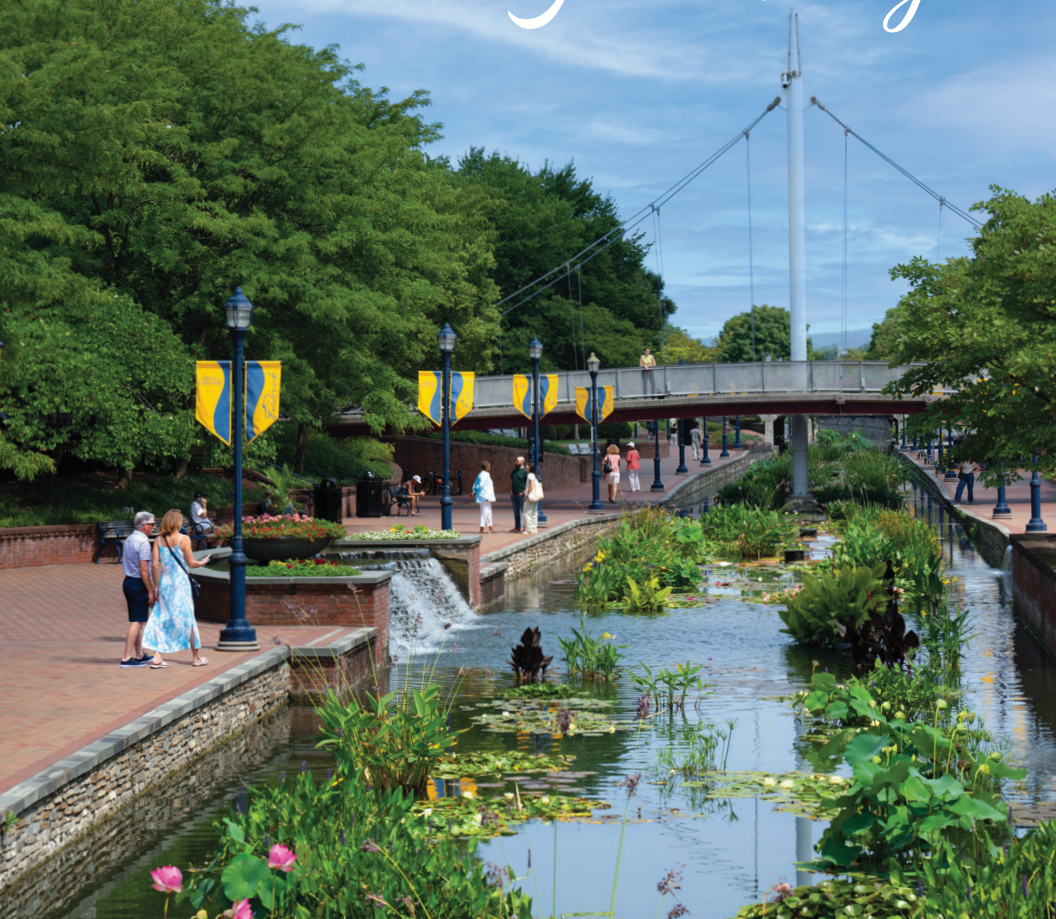
Heading up to Double-A, the Baysox have continued to make their push in the always competitive Eastern League, with Orioles 23rd-ranked prospect and catcher Ethan Anderson surging at the dish with a team leading eight home runs in 38 games on the season. Infielder Aron Estrada has also found his footing at the dish as he currently has posted a .268 average along with hitting five home runs and serving as one of their top defenders throughout the first half of the 2026 campaign.

On the mound, Chesapeake has been led by a variety of arms including Sebastian Gongora, who in nine games and in 41.1 innings has posted a team-leading 47 strikeouts as their main starter along with top-five Orioles prospect Luis De Leon. Former Keys reliever Evan Yates has inserted himself into the rotation for the Baysox as of late and recently picked up his second win of the season last week on the road against the Erie Seawolves.

As for Triple-A Norfolk, the Tides had their first Major League call up earlier this season in right-hander and fourth-ranked Orioles prospect Trey Gibson earned the call to the Major Leagues in early May when he made his debut in Yankee Stadium on May 3. He also earned his first win of the season on May 27 in a series sweep over the Tampa Bay Rays, after throwing 5.2 innings of one-run ball for his first Major League win of his career.

JOSEPH DZIERWA: KEYS FIRST CALL UP

This year, the Keys have already celebrated many firsts as part of their return to Birdland, including their first player get called up Double-A Chesapeake. Left-handed pitcher Joseph Dzierwa got the call to join the Double-A Chesapeake Baysox back on May 19, shortly after being named the Orioles April Pitcher of the Month.

Dzierwa entered the 2026 season as the 12th-ranked prospect in the Orioles organization and quickly got assigned to the High-A Frederick Keys after throwing three scoreless innings in the Spring Breakout Game on March 20. He then took the organization by storm after throwing six innings of scoreless and one-hit ball against the Hub City Spartanburgers (High-A, Rangers) in the season opener on April 3, helping the Keys win their first game as an Orioles affiliate in seven years. In that game, he also finished with nine strikeouts which was a season-high until his Double-A debut on May 22 when he had 10 strikeouts in his first game with the Baysox.



After his dazzling performance on Opening Night, he followed that up with seven innings of two-run ball against the Winston-Salem Dash on April 10 and did not allow any walks while recording three strikeouts.

From there, he continued to cruise along as the top starter in the Keys starting rotation and finished with a 5-1 record during his time with the Keys and racked up 40.1 innings on the hill along with a 2.21 ERA and 50 strikeouts. This included two outings against the Jersey Shore BlueClaws (High-A, Phillies) on May 5 and 10 where he combined for 8.2 innings pitched while allowing only one run and recording 15 strikeouts.

His time in Double-A has started off strong as in his first game on May 22 against the Somerset Patriots (Double-A, Yankees), he threw five innings of no-hit ball and finished the outing with a professional career-high 10 strikeouts despite earning the loss. He is also scheduled to start later in the month of June as one of their top starters in the rotation, as he continues to make the climb up the Orioles farm system as the highest drafted pitcher in the Mike Elias era of the Baltimore Orioles.

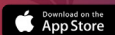

JT QUINN CONTINUES DOMINATING IN FREDERICK

The 29-15 start for the Keys, good for first place in the South Atlantic League North by a half game, has been a true team effort. The pitching staff has held opponents to just a .213 batting average through the first 44 games, while young, highly touted prospects like right-hander JT Quinn, and left-handers Joseph Dzierwa and Boston Bateman have proven to live up to their high draft status.

Quinn was selected in the second MLB Competitive Balance round in 2025 out of the University of Georgia. He began his career at Ole Miss after posting a 1.02 ERA with 82 strikeouts as a high school senior at Berkely Prep in Tampa, FL. He went 9-2 and was named to the 2022 Florida All-State team while earning his third varsity letter.

With the Bulldogs, he pitched to the tune of a 2.75 ERA while going 1-1 with a save and striking out 49. He held opponents to a batting average of .184 as the Bulldogs earned the No. 7 seed in 2025 and hosted a regional in Athens.

In his first season with the Keys, he hasn't moved away from his high school or collegiate dominance.

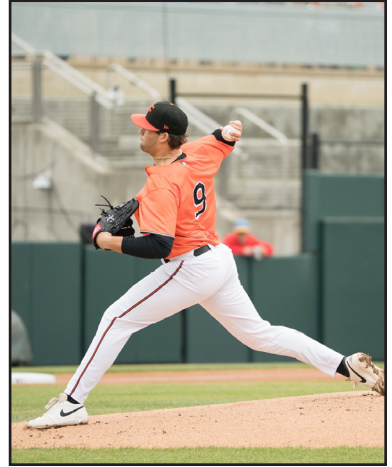
Through nine starts, Quinn has gone 37.2 innings while giving up just 13 earned runs on 30 hits. His 3.11 ERA is good for second on the active roster while leading it with 49 strikeouts.

A dominant April, highlighted by a career-high 10 strikeout performance over Winston-Salem, showed the Orioles organization what Quinn is capable of at the young age of 21. The 19th-ranked Orioles prospect has given up more than two earned runs in an outing just once through his nine starts while shutting out his opponent three times.

In May, Quinn has allowed just 11 hits and two home runs while striking out 16. In his May 19 start against the Greenville Drive, Quinn allowed one run on three hits while striking out six in his four innings of work.

Now, with 12th-ranked Dzierwa moving on to Double-A Chesapeake, Quinn's role has gotten larger. Quinn most recently helped the Keys to a victory in the first game of the series at Jersey Shore. For Quinn and the Keys, development and growth remain the priority as he continues his first season with the organization.

KEYS HITTERS SURGE UNDER JAKE RATZ

Throughout the season, the Keys offense has continued to surge offensively under first-year Keys hitting coach Jake Ratz, with a lot of his players learning from his positive attitude and what he brings to the field each day from his experiences on the college circuit.

In terms of hitters that he has impacted this year, one of those is first baseman Victor Figueroa, who currently leads the team in home runs with 11 through the first 44 games of the 2026 campaign. However, his development as a hitter started long before 2026, with Ratz enjoying having Figueroa in the batter's box and watching him improve on a daily basis.

"He is a great guy to have around," Ratz told reporters earlier this season. "He shows up every day and when you see him walk into the cages, you get a big smile on your face. One of those guys you really looking forward to working with each day. He's definitely a worker. He takes a lot of swings every day and there is a reason he is seeing success. He works each day and is open to feedback. He's a great teammate."



Alongside Figueroa, he has helped shortstop and third baseman Wehiwa Aloy surge as one of the organization's top prospects on the hitting circuit. Aloy leads the team in average at .307 and ranks second in home runs with 10 heading into the homestretch of the first half.

Both players have had the same mindset throughout the season to help the surging Frederick lineup, and Coach Ratz has noticed that both have had their routines bounce off one another as they continue to bat close to each other in the lineup.



"Similar to Wehiwa (Aloy), when he (Victor) is committed to hunting his pitch and getting his best swing off, that is when he is at his best," Ratz said. "That is the formula for a lot of hitters. Be committed to getting your pitch then we see his strength and the way he is able to elevate the ball consistently."

Ratz came to the Keys after serving as a hitting coach for the FCL Orioles in Sarasota, Florida last year, helping get several of the top Orioles hitters up the farm system quickly. Prior to that, he served as a hitting coach in the 2023 and 2024 seasons for the Orioles

Dominican Summer League teams, setting the stage for him to make the affiliated ranks sooner than later.

AROUND THE SOUTH ATLANTIC LEAGUE

With the 2026 season now in full swing, the Keys continue to face off against new league opponents in the South Atlantic League, as the first half concludes on June 18 when the Keys host the Hub City Spartanburgers (High-A Rangers), the same team they faced to begin their return to Birdland in early April.

In the last month, the Keys began by finishing a road series in Coney Island against the Brooklyn



Cyclones (High-A, Mets), winning the series four games to two after winning the series finale on May 3 at Maimonides Park. From there, the Keys hosted the Jersey Shore BlueClaws (High-A, Phillies) for the first time in franchise history from May 5-10 at Nymeo Field and took five out of six games from the BlueClaws, which included an 11-inning victory on Friday, May 9. Frederick then hit the road to Hudson Valley and took on the Renegades (High-A, Yankees) from May 12-17, becoming the first team to ever sweep the Renegades in a six-game series in their team's history.

The Greenville Drive (High-A, Red Sox) traveled to Frederick for the first time in franchise history the next week from May 19-24 and it was the Keys who, despite dealing with three rainouts from May 21-23 at Nymeo Field, still found a way to take three out of four games at home to keep themselves in first place with just over 20 games to go in the first half. Frederick finished off their month with their first ever trip to Jersey Shore and took on the BlueClaws for the second time of the month while trying to stay in front of the division standings heading into the homestretch of the first half.

During the month of June, the Keys will host the Renegades for a second time from June 2-June 7 and will look for revenge after Hudson Valley took four out of six from the Keys during the first home series from April 14-19 in the Key City. They will also host the Spartanburgers to close the first half and will play a six-game series against Hub City from June 16-21 at Nymeo Field. In addition to these two home series, Frederick will take road trips to Brooklyn (June 9-14) and Wilmington (June 23-28), with the Blue Rocks (High-A, Nationals) series representing the first full series of the second half of the 2026 campaign.

Through the first 44 games of 2026, Frederick has remained out in front by a half a game over the Greensboro Grasshoppers (High-A, Pirates) for first place in the South Atlantic League North Division. Wilmington remains in the hunt for first place as they sit in third in the North Division and trail Frederick by five games. Hudson Valley is currently in fourth place at 21-25 while Jersey Shore and Brooklyn round out the standings with only three weeks remaining in the first half of the season.

As for the South Division, the Bowling Green Hot Rods (High-A, Rays) still have a commanding lead for the first half crown as they sit six and a half games in front of the Winston-Salem Dash (High-A, White Sox) for first place. The Rome Emperors (High-A, Braves) are currently in third place and are 9.5 games back of the first place Hot Rods at 25-22. Hub City sits in fourth place while Greenville and the Asheville Tourists (High-A, Astros) round out the standings heading into the homestretch of first half play in 2026.

ORIOLES MONTHLY HONORS LAND IN FREDERICK

The Baltimore Orioles announced Monday that Frederick Keys infielder Victor Figueroa and left-handed pitcher Joseph Dzierwa were named the Orioles Minor League Player and Pitcher of the Month for April.

Figueroa was named Player of the Month for April in the Orioles farm system after leading the organization in batting average (.387), slugging percentage (.700), OPS (1.138), hits (25), extra-base hits (11), and total bases (49). He also finished the month with six home runs, which tied himself with Jud Fabian of Triple-A Norfolk for the most homers during April.

Following his first game on April 4, Figueroa reached base in his first 21 games played through May 2, the longest on-base streak by any Keys player so far in the 2026 campaign.

He also became the first player to hit a homer on the Frederick roster this year, after hitting home runs in back-to-back games on April 4 and 7 in his first two games in a Keys uniform.

Dzierwa earned Pitcher of the Month for April for the Orioles farm system after finishing with an organization-leading three wins and a 2.33 ERA across 27 innings pitched. In addition to the three wins, he recorded 29 strikeouts and allowed only seven walks in five total starts, helping his team finish 4-1 in the games he started in as their main starter in the Keys rotation.

His first outing of the season took the organization by storm when he posted a season-high nine strikeouts and allowed one base hit during six innings in the season opener on April 3 against the Hub City Spartanburgers (Rangers). Dzierwa also had a second nine-strikeout performance against the Wilmington Blue Rocks (Nationals) on April 22, while allowing one earned run and four hits during five innings on the hill.

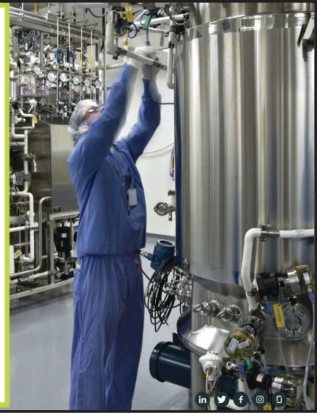

FREDERICK KEYS FAN BEHAVIOR POLICY

The Frederick Keys are committed to creating a family-friendly and welcoming environment at the ballpark for all guests. As part of that commitment, we have adopted this written policy addressing fan behavior. The policy includes a Fan Code of Conduct, which is fan-facing and describes how fans are expected to behave.

All Frederick Keys staff, including game-day staff, must receive a copy of this policy before working any games. In addition, all staff must receive annual training on this policy, the substance of the Fan Code of Conduct, and how to respond to prohibited fan behavior. All training will be documented.

A copy of the Fan Code of Conduct can be found at any entrance gate to the ballpark, at any guest services booth, on www.FrederickKeys.com, and in the official game program.

Fans will be notified before and during the game through public service announcements ("PSAs") on the main video board that summarize the Fan Code of Conduct, the penalties for violation, and how to report prohibited behavior.

Reporting An Incident

Any game-day staff member who witnesses or receives a report of prohibited fan behavior by a fan must report the incident to a Club security supervisor. This can be done by contacting your immediate supervisor, notifying a nearby security staff member, or by contacting (301) 662-0013.

Use of derogatory language by a fan toward a player, umpire, Club staff, or their family members must be documented by the Club and reported to the Club's General Manager and to the Commissioner's Office via email to PDLsecurity@mlb.com. Clubs must seek to collect the name and identifying information of the fan and must include in their report a description of how the Club addressed the incident and any planned discipline.

Fan Code of Conduct

In order to provide a welcoming experience for all, the Frederick Keys have implemented a Fan Code of Conduct. Out of respect for fellow guests, players, coaches, and ballpark staff, all guests are prohibited from:

- Trespassing on the playing field at any time;
- Interfering with baseballs that are in play;
- Throwing or tossing objects;
- Using foul, obscene or derogatory language (see below) or gestures;
- Misusing or overconsuming alcohol, including, underage consumption;
- Behaving in a manner that is disruptive, unruly, or abusive;
- Accessing areas of the ballpark without a proper ticket, pass, or credential;
- Misusing tickets, passes, or credentials in any way; or
- Bringing prohibited items into the ballpark.

Derogatory language is defined as offensive language concerning a person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin, and anyone using such language is subject to automatic ejection from the ballpark.

Violations of the Fan Code of Conduct will not be tolerated and may lead to ejection from the ballpark, a ban on attending future games, or other consequences. Guests who are found to have used derogatory language will be ejected from the ballpark.

Guests are encouraged to report violations of the Fan Code of Conduct to the nearest ballpark staff member. This can be done in person, at the nearest Guest Services location, directly with Ballpark Security or by calling (301) 662-0013.
