Buffalo Bisons RHP Dylan Cease (NR) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Devin Sweet (1-2, 4.44)

Deuces Wild – The Worcester Red Sox and the Buffalo Bisons (AAA-Toronto) – who have split the first two games of their 6-game series (Sox won, 3-2 on Tuesday night and Bisons won, 12-0 on Wednesday afternoon) – play game three tonight at 6:05 pm at Polar Park. Every Thursday summer evening game at Polar Park, including tonight, the WooSox are pleased to feature the popular “Deuces Wild” promotion when fans can purchase \$2 Hot Dogs (Coney Island and Hebrew Nationals), \$2 12-ounce drafts of Coors Light and Masshole Light Lager, and \$2 bottles of Polar water (the beverage deal run for seven days). It will also be Purr in the Park tonight as fans can bring their cats to the game, as well as Greek Heritage Night and Uxbridge Town Takeover, presented by Altus Dental, on a busy night at Polar Park. Tonight’s game is live on NESN and can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM.

Ceasefire – Toronto Blue Jays RHP **Dylan Cease** is expected to start for the Buffalo Bisons tonight. Cease, 30, has been on Toronto’s injured list with a hamstring strain since leaving his last start on May 24 vs. Pittsburgh. Signed by the Blue Jays as a free agent this past December, Cease is 3-3 with a 3.05 ERA in 11 starts for Toronto this season with an American League-leading 92 strikeouts in 62 innings. A veteran of eight seasons in the Major Leagues with the White Sox (2019-2023), Padres (2024 & 2025), and now Blue Jays (2026), the Georgia native has a big league career record of 68-61 with a 3.83 ERA in 199 games (all starts) along with 1323 SO in his 1077.1 IP.

This Series – Buffalo is making their first visit to Worcester of the season this week/weekend. The 6-game set (tied at one victory apiece) continues tonight & tomorrow evenings both at 6:05 pm, and then concludes over the weekend on Saturday at 4:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm. This is Buffalo’s first of two visits to Polar Park this season (they are back for another 6-game set from August 11-16). Worcester goes back to Buffalo when it’s almost football season for a 6-game set from September 1-6. The Bisons took 4 of 6 from the WooSox in Buffalo less than three weeks ago from May 12-17. Buffalo and Rochester are the two opponents the WooSox face the most this season (24 total vs. each).

Even Again – The WooSox (at 28-28) are back at the .500 mark. They dipped to a season-low 2-games under .500 from May 23-25 when they were 23-25 on the year during those three days. Their low point all of last season was 4-games below .500 on April 11, 2025 at 4-8. Worcester has been a season-high 6-games over .500 four different times this season...April 10 (9-3) & April 12 (10-4) and May 2 (18-12) & May 8 (21-15).

Home and Away - The WooSox are 13-14 at home at Polar Park compared to 15-14 on the road.

What Have You Done For Me Lately – Worcester has won 5 of their last 8 games after dropping 10 of 12 from May 10-23.

Three for All – The WooSox have had exactly 3 hits in each of their last 3 games (going 1-2 in those) and are batting .107 in those 3 games (9-for-84) with a total of 3 runs scored.

Sandoval Start on Friday - The Boston Red Sox are expected to send LHP **Patrick Sandoval** to Worcester to begin a 30-day injury rehab assignment as the WooSox starter tomorrow. Sandoval had an injury rehab stint with the WooSox from April 8-20 making two starts before being pulled off rehab and remaining on the Red Sox injured list after experiencing tightness in his bicep.

His two rehab starts for the WooSox came on April 8 vs. Columbus (ND in an 8-5 Sox win) – 3.1 IP, 3 H, 3 R, 0 ER, 3 BB, 3 SO and on April 14 at Nashville (LP, 9-4) – 2 IP, 3 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 4 BB, 1 SO. Patrick most recently threw a 20-pitch live bullpen at Fenway Park prior to Tuesday's Red Sox game vs. Baltimore.

Sandoval, 29, has been sidelined since undergoing Tommy John surgery on June 26, 2024. He missed all of last season after signing a 2-year contract with the Red Sox on December 23, 2024. In 107 career Major League games (100 starts) all with the Los Angeles Angels, Sandoval is 19-45 with a 4.01 ERA with 529 strikeouts in 536 career big league innings.

Originally an 11th round selection of the Houston Astros in 2015 out of Mission Viejo High School in California, Patrick was traded to the Angels for Martin Maldonado in July of 2018. He made his MLB debut with the Angels in 2019 and spent the next four seasons in the Los Angeles rotation (2020-24) before leaving a start on June 21, 2024 with his injured elbow. From 2021-23 he posted a 3.53 ERA in 72 games despite a tough-luck losing record. He also owns MLB's 7th-lowest HR/9 IP ratio since the start of 2022 (0.675).

Vinny Capra	Has a .309 batting average in 23 road games (25-for-81) with a team-high 14 RBI in away games.
Nate Eaton	Has missed the last 4 WooSox games with hamstring issue. Is on a 5-game hitting streak (9-for-19) with 4 2B, 1 HR, 4 RBI, 6 runs scored and has hit in 11 of his last 12 games (18-for-47, .383) with 5 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR, 6 RBI, 10 runs scored. In his last 27 games is batting .333 (36-for-108) with 10 2B, 2 3B, 4 HR, 16 RBI, and 18 runs scored.
Nathan Hickey	Last 10 games is (7-for-31) but with 8 walks, 3 HR, 6 RBI, and 4 runs scored.
Anthony Seigler	Promoted to Boston on June 3. Had a 6-game hitting streak (9-for-20) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 6 RBI. In his last 10 WooSox games was 12-for-35, .343 with 3 2B, 2 HR, 12 RBI. And in 18 games in May he hit .344 (22-for-64) with 3 HR and a team-leading 14 RBI.
Braiden Ward	Has reached base safely in 19 of his last 21 starts. Has 16 stolen bases in his last 22 games and leads the league with 25 SB. Has been hit by pitch 14 times in his 38 games played to lead the league. Those 14 HBP are already an all-time WooSox record. The Pawtucket Red Sox record for Most HBP in a season is 20 set by David Eckstein in 2000. Ward leads the WooSox with .304 batting average at home in 17 games (17-for-56) with 18 SB.
Jake Bennett	Has given up just 2 runs in his last 3 starts covering 15 innings with 22 strikeouts.
Alec Gamboa	Went 1-2, 1.89 in 5 games (3 starts) in May (4 ER in 19 IP).
Tommy Kahnle	Has 3 saves in each of his last 3 appearances. In his last 14 relief appearances he has gone 1 scoreless inning in each – 14 IP, 8 H, 0 R, 8 BB, 18 SO. In 11 RA at home has a 0.79 ERA – 11.1 IP, 11 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 8 BB, 14 SO.
Noah Song	Has allowed 2 runs in his last 10 innings over 8 relief appearances on just 4 hits & 4 BB with 9 SO.

Getting in Tune in June - The WooSox are 1-1 to begin June during a month that will see Worcester play 26 games in the 30 days of June. June also means the conclusion of the official 1st half that ends for the WooSox on June 21 at Lehigh Valley and then the beginning of the 2nd half that starts for the WooSox on June 23 vs. Toledo. All teams will start fresh at 0-0 for the final 75 games of the season. Worcester has 17 games remaining to close out the 1st half including a make-up doubleheader in Rochester next Thursday, June 11th at 1:05 pm. The WooSox will only play 73 of their 75 scheduled 1st half games as they have had two games cancelled due to weather – April 3 at St. Paul and May 9 at home vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

Fall From Grace – While going 7-13 since May 10, the WooSox have fallen from 1st-place in the International League East division and +1½ games on May 9 (3½ weeks ago) to 6th-place and -7 GB of front running Rochester who are a Triple-A best 22-5 since May 2. Worcester had been alone or had a share of 1st place in the East division between April 30 – May 15.

Results vs. the Bisons- The Bisons lead the season-series, 5 games to 3. They took 4 of 6 from the WooSox in Buffalo from May 12-17. Buffalo won the opener, 7-2; the Sox took game two, 6-2; the Bisons rolled to three straight wins the next three nights by 4-3, 5-2, and 2-0 scores; and Worcester won the series finale on May 17, 4-0. The WooSox grabbed the opener of this current 6-game set Tuesday night, 3-2 in walk-off fashion but the Bisons broke a scoreless tie with 12 runs over the final 3 innings to win going away on Thursday afternoon, 12-0.

Stats vs. Buffalo – Buffalo pitching has been excellent in the season series thus far. The Bisons staff, who have the 2nd lowest ERA in the International League at 4.02, are 5-3 with a 2.26 ERA vs. the WooSox this season (17 ER in 67.2 IP) while holding Sox batters to a .182 batting average. WooSox hitters are batting .182 (43-for-236) with 7 2B, 3 HR, and 20 runs scored in the first 8 games vs. Buffalo. Meanwhile, Worcester pitchers are 3-5 with a 4.36 ERA (31 ER in 64 IP) with 5 HRA and 34 runs given up vs. the Bisons.

Buffalo Sauce – Worcester leads the all-time series vs. Buffalo (since 2021) by a 66-55 margin. The Sox are 27-26 in Buffalo compared to 39-29 at Polar Park in Worcester. The WooSox won the season-series over Buffalo last year, 10 games to 8 going 3-3 in Buffalo one year ago and 7-5 in Worcester.

Buffalo Bites – The Bisons won the 2024 season-series over Worcester by a 15-9 count including an 8-5 mark at Sahlen Field along with a 7-4 record at Polar Park. The 15 losses were the most the WooSox suffered to any opponent that season. Ironically the year before, Worcester went 15-8 vs. the Bisons (including a 10-2 mark at Polar Park compared to 5-6 in Buffalo) as those 15 victories were their most over any IL foe in 2023.

Day Dream Believers - The WooSox have fared pretty well in day games (morning or afternoon) this season going 16-13 compared to 12-15 at night.

Homer Helpers – The good news is the WooSox are 20-6 when they homer in a game this season. The bad news is the fact the WooSox have the fewest HR in the International League with 46 HR.

Leaving the Walkers Behind – Continuing with the good news/bad news theme... Worcester batters are 2nd in the league with their 299 walks but they have the 3rd most left on base in the International League with 446 LOB.

Series Matters – The WooSox are 5-4-1 in their 10 series thus far...5 wins, 4 losses, and 1 split. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

Streaks of Five – The WooSox were recently on a 5-game losing streak (May 19-23 all at home vs. Rochester) to equal their season-high 5-game losing skid from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). Worcester's longest losing streak all of last year was also 5 games (April 25-30, 2025). They have still not lost 6 straight since a 6-game losing streak from May 22-28, 2024. Worcester had a season-best 5-game winning streak from March 31 – April 5 all in St. Paul, Minnesota. That is their longest winning streak since a club-record 9-game winning streak last year from June 1-11, 2025.

Rainbows – The rainout on Sunday, May 24 vs. Rochester marked the second home postponement at Polar Park this season after the WooSox were able to successfully play each of their first 19 scheduled home games between March 27 – May 8. That was their longest stretch to open a season without a home postponement since their inaugural 2021 campaign. Last year the WooSox set a new club record for most home games either postponed or cancelled in a single season with nine. Saturday, May 9th vs. Scranton/WB was the first home postponement (which eventually became a cancellation since the game will not be made up) at Polar Park this season.

The Sox have had two postponements (April 2 at St. Paul and April 29 at Rochester) and one cancelled game (April 3 at St. Paul) on the road thus far.

May We Skip the Month – Worcester's 10-15 record in May was the second worst month they have ever had behind only a 10-16 month of July during their inaugural season of 2021. Worcester has been remarkably consistent in their history and more recently since August of 2024 they have had just three losing months in their last ten months. The WooSox went 15-10 this April.

Monthly Team Stats for May – Worcester hitters batted .235 this May (193-for-823) with 41 doubles, 4 triples, and 22 HR in 25 games while WooSox pitchers had a 4.85 ERA (118 ER in 219 IP) with 29 HRA. The Sox out-scored by their opponents, 126-110.

Monthly Individual Leaders for May – WooSox May leaders offensively included: Anthony Seigler at .344 in 18 games last month (22-for-64) with 3 HR & 14 RBI and Nate Eaton at .289 in 19 games (22-for-76) with 6 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 9 RBI. On the pitching side: Tommy Kahnle made 11 scoreless relief appearances in May covering 11 shutout innings; Alec Gamboa was 1-2, 1.89 in 5 G, 3 GS (4 ER in 19 IP); Eduardo Rivera was 3-0, 2.20 in 8 RA (4 ER in 16.1); and Noah Song was 1-0, 2.25 in 7 RA (3 ER in 12 IP).

An Enjoyable April – After going 2-2 to begin the season from March 27-31, Worcester posted a winning April going 15-10. The Sox finished April alone in 1st-place in the International League East Division. The 15 wins this April equal the most Worcester won in any month last season when they went 15-10 in June and 15-13 in August.

April Stats Leaders – As a club the WooSox batted .252 in April with 19 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.63 ERA with 24 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month, 127-122. Vinny Capra led the Sox in average in April hitting .322 in 18 games with 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a team-high 18 runs scored. Matt Thaiss (.324 in 11 games with 2 HR & 11 RBI), Nate Eaton (.301 in 23 games with 5 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR & 10 RBI), and Kristian Campbell (.294 in 23 games) all enjoyed fine Aprils. Leading pitchers during the month were Payton Tolle (2-0, 0.82 in 2 GS) and Jake Bennett (2-0, 1.00 in 4 GS) while Tayron Guerrero was the best out the bullpen posting a 1.13 ERA in 7 relief appearances with 2 saves.

A Winning Tradition – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under former manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

Fun Fact – Of the 287 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5+-year history (up to today), a total of 211 of them have played in the Major Leagues (73%) including 142 with the Boston Red Sox (50%).

Portland Sea Dogs Update – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (28-24) out-slugged Hartford, 10-7 last night. Ahbram Liendo led the way with 3 hits, 3 RBI, and 3 runs scored including a solo HR (#5) while Johanfran Garcia also had 3 hits and a solo HR (#9). Will Turner added a solo shot of his own (#6). Cade Feeney (2-2) was the winner in relief going 2.1 IP with 2 runs allowed while Reidis Sena fired 2 hitless innings with 3 SO to earn SV #4.

WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES – The Boston Red Sox today selected reliever **Tommy Kahnle** from Worcester while placing INF Trevor Story on the 60-day injured list and optioning LHP Tyler Samaniego back to Worcester. (Samaniego has not yet been added to the WooSox roster). The Red Sox today also transferred OF/INF **Tyler McDonough** from Double-A Portland to Worcester. McDonough replaces INF Anthony Seigler who was promoted to Boston yesterday.

Kahnle, 36, has posted a 1.40 ERA (3 ER/19.1 IP) with 21 strikeouts and five saves in 18 games for Worcester this season. And in his last 14 relief appearances with the WooSox he has gone 1 scoreless inning in each – 14 IP, 8 H, 0 R, 8 BB, 18 SO. The right-hander signed as a minor-league free agent with Boston on March 19. In 2025, he recorded a career-high nine saves in 66 games for the Detroit Tigers while recording a 4.43 ERA (31 ER/63.0 IP). Originally selected by the New York Yankees in the fifth round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft, the New York native owns a 3.61 ERA (175 ER/436.2 IP) with 502 strikeouts in 456 career games for the Colorado Rockies (2014-15), Chicago White Sox (2016-17), Yankees (2017-20, 2023-24), LA Dodgers (2022), and Tigers (2025).

Samaniego, 27, has posted a 2.66 ERA (6 ER/20.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts in 20 games (one start) for Boston this season, his Major League debut. The left-hander has also made four relief appearances with Triple-A Worcester, allowing four earned runs over 6.1 innings. Originally selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 15th round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, the Alabama native was acquired by the Red Sox in a trade in December 2025 and owns a 3.89 ERA (71 ER/164.1 IP) in 131 career minor league games (two starts).

McDonough, 27, has spent all of this season with Portland where he hit .217 in 44 games with 7 doubles, 2 triples, 4 HR, and 16 RBI along with 14 stolen bases in 14 attempts. He spent all of last year with the WooSox batting .254 in 79 games with 5 HR & 27 RBI. Last year, McDonough, who has now been with Worcester for parts of four seasons (2023-2026), played 34 games at SS, 18 games in LF, 17 games at 2B, 11 games in RF, and 1 game in CF for the WooSox. In 118 career games with Worcester he has a .244 average.

Worcester has made at least one player move during 41 of the last 59 days (including today) between April 7 – June 4 for a total of 77 moves during that stretch. The WooSox went three consecutive days without a player transaction (May 30, May 31, and June 1 – although they did not play on June 1) for the first time since just after their season-opener when they did not make a move during four straight days from March 28-31.

The WooSox have used a total of 43 players already this season (28 pitchers and 15 position players). OF/INF Tyler McDonough and RHP Osvaldo Berrios would become #'s 44 & 45 if/when they debut.

Furthermore, 14 different WooSox players have been promoted directly from Worcester to Boston this season (not counting rehabbers). The lucky list: RHP Zack Kelly, RHP Tyler Uberstine, LHP Tyler Samaniego (three times), RHP Jack Anderson (twice), LHP Eduardo Rivera, LHP Payton Tolle, OF Nate Eaton, LHP Jake Bennett, LHP Alec Gamboa, C/INF Mickey Gasper, INF Nick Sogard, RHP Tyron Guerrero, INF Anthony Seigler, and RHP Tommy Kahnle. In addition, the WooSox had their manager, Chad Tracy and hitting coach, Collin Hetzler both promoted to Boston for those same roles with the Red Sox on April 26.
