TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints found themselves in a 4-0 hole after the first inning and could not get out of it in a 7-5 loss to Toledo. Yunior Severino cut into the deficit in the second inning by hitting a solo home run. In the third inning, DaShawn Keirsej Jr. hit the first of his two homers to make it 5-2. Austin Schulfer, Michael Boyle and Hobie Harris allowed just two runs over the final 7.2 innings, walking three while striking out seven. Down 7-3 in the ninth, Keirsej Jr. hit his second long ball, a two-run blast that made it 7-5. However, that is as close as the Saints would get in the loss.

KEIRSEY JR. CRUSHING: DaShawn Keirsej Jr. had the Saints first multi-home run game of the season with his two long balls on Tuesday. He became just the second Saint to hit multiple home runs at Fifth Third Field, joining Mark Contreras, who did so on September 7, 2022. Keirsej Jr. also collected hits in his seventh consecutive game, tying his own and the team's longest hit streak of the season. During the streak, he is hitting .355 (11-for-31), with three home runs, nine RBI and a 1.089 OPS.

TOUGH LUCK IN TOLEDO: Since joining the Triple-A ranks, the Saints have historically struggled in Toledo, going 11-21 at Fifth Third Field since 2021. Below is how the Saints offense has fared in each road venue that they have played at least two series in since 2021:

WALLNER WARMING UP: Over the last five games, Matt Wallner has started to find his stride, going 7-for-19 including his season-long, four-game hit streak, which was snapped Tuesday. Wallner has homered in three of his last five games and had multiple hits in three of his last four games, which is the longest multi-hit streak of the season for the Saints. Five of the last 10 balls Wallner has put in play have left the bat at 102 miles per hour or faster.

FIZZLING OUT: In the final three innings of games, the Saints have struggled to put up runs, scoring only 33 of their 161 (20.2%) runs in the seventh inning or later. The 33 runs in the final three innings are the second-fewest in Triple-A, in addition to the club's .182 batting average in the seventh or later, which ranks last in the circuit. Double plays have also been an issue, as the Saints have hit into 11 of them in that timeframe, one off the most in Triple-A. The Saints run differential in the seventh or later is -23, the worst in the IL, ranking just below Toledo, who is -17.

NOT ALWAYS A PACKAGE DEAL: Despite striking out a season-high 16 batters on Sunday, the Saints were unable to come away with the victory, losing 7-6. It is the third time in franchise history the Saints have struck out at least 16 batters in a nine-inning game and one short of their franchise-record 17 that came on May 8, 2022. However, the Saints are 2-3 all-time in games that they have struck out 16-or-more batters and 1-2 in nine-inning games.

REHAB ROUNDTABLE: The Minnesota Twins added Josh Winder to the St. Paul roster on Tuesday on Major League rehab. He joins Justin Topa as the other rehab assignment on the Saints roster. Topa has appeared in four games, allowing two earned runs in 4.0 innings, walking one and striking out six.

IT WAS A LONG FIRST INNING: In the first inning on Saturday, the Saints plated seven runs, tied for the third-most runs scored in any first inning in the International League this year. The Saint also saw 74 pitches from Louisville pitchers, which is the most pitches thrown in a single inning in the IL this year and the second-most since 2021, when the Memphis Redbirds threw 95 pitches in the sixth inning on August 6, 2021.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins allowed eight runs over the final three innings in a 10-6 loss to the Seattle Mariners on Tuesday. Bailer Ober struck out seven over 5.0 innings of two-run ball. Ryan Jeffers went 2-for-4 with a three-run home run in the third that gave the Twins a 4-2 lead, which would be their last lead of the game.

LAST APPEARANCE: 5/2 v LOU...made sixth start of the season, allow two runs on five hits, one home run, walking none and striking out one...both runs allowed in the fifth inning on a two-run homer to his final batter faced, Rece Hinds, which ended his streak of 16.2 innings without allowing an earned run...did not allow a walk for the second consecutive start...allowed one batter to reach base in each of the first four innings, retiring the other three faced...did not factor into the decision in an 8-4 Saints loss.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 4/25 v ROC...made fifth start of the season, not allowing an earned run for the second straight appearance...allowed a double in each of the first two innings...allowed only one runner to reach third base...extends his streak of zero earned runs to 12.0 consecutive innings, the longest of the season for St. Paul...received second consecutive win in 3-0 Saints shutout victory

WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP: Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

SOMETHINGS BREWING: One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

GIVE BACK: Each of the Major League team's usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.
