# Dayton Dragons (28-13) at West Michigan Whitecaps (18-23)

RH Connor Phillips (2-2, 3.00) vs. RH Dylan Smith (4-3, 3.00)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the West Michigan Whitecaps (affiliate of the Detroit Tigers) in the fourth game of a six-game series. Season Series vs. West Michigan: Dayton 7, West Michigan 2.

Current Series vs. West Michigan: Dayton 2, West Michigan 1. The Dragons are batting .294 as a team while averaging 7.0 runs per game. They have hit one home run and stolen six bases. They have a team ERA of 3.75. They do not have an error.

Last Game: Thursday: Suspended Game: Dayton 5, West Michigan 0. Game 2: West Michigan 9, Dayton 6. In the first game, which started Wednesday morning, Bryce Bonnin retired all 16 batters he faced as the Dragons picked up their sixth shutout win of the year, allowing only two hits in a nine-inning game played in two hours, one minute. In game two, West Michigan broke a 6-6 tie with three runs in the sixth. This was the first game in 2022 in which the Dragons scored first but lost.

Last Series vs. Quad Cities: Dayton 4, Quad Cities 2. The Dragons hit 10 home runs in the series, the most of any MWL team during the week (six games). The Dragons were 9 for 9 as base stealers in the series. They scored 5.2 runs per game while batting .238 with a team ERA of 5.20. They committed five errors in the series.

Dragons in the Standings: Dayton is in first place in the MWL East Division, four and one-half games ahead of Great Lakes.

#### **Team Notes**

- The Dragons 28-13 record is tied for third best of all Minor League Baseball.
- The Dragons have approached their highest point above .500 over the last several seasons and currently sit 15 games over. They have climbed to 17 games above .500 for one day since 2011, when they were 30-13 on May 21, 2017. Previous to 2017, the last time they were 17 games over .500 came at the end of the 2011 season, when they were 26 games over at 83-57.
- In the month of May, the Dragons lead the league in slugging percentage (.469), on-base percentage (.348), and OPS (.817).
- The Dragons starting pitcher ERA in May is 2.93 (92 IP, 30 ER).
- The Dragons "Scoring First" record of 21-1 is the best in the minor leagues.
- The Dragons are 10-3 in one-run games; 17-4 in games decided by two or less.
- Dayton leads the MWL in home runs with 48, five more than Quad Cities.
- The Dragons team ERA in their 27 wins is 2.27 (234 IP, 59 ER). Their team ERA in their 12 losses is 8.42 (98.1 IP, 92 ER).
- The Dragons began the season by going 3-3 over their first six games and they are 10-8 over their last 18 games. In the middle, they went 15-2 over 17 games. They have completed seven series, winning six and splitting one.

#### **Player Notes**

- Connor Phillips leads the MWL in strikeouts with 60, ranking tied for seventh in all Minor League Baseball. In three of Phillips' last four starts, he has gone six innings and allowed a total of one earned run combined in those 18 innings. Since April 28, Phillips has made four starts, posting a 1.64 ERA (22 innings, 12 hits, 4 walks, 39 strikeouts, .158 opponent's batting average).
- Joe Boyle leads all Minor League Baseball in ERA (0.53) and opponent's batting average (.058). He has made seven starts covering 33.2 innings and has allowed only two runs and only six hits. He has allowed only two hits to right-handed batters this season (2 for 56, 31 SO). Opponents are 2 for 44 against Boyle with men on base and 1 for 20 with men in scoring position. Boyle has allowed a total of one hit in four road starts.
- Alex McGarry leads all Minor League Baseball (over 800 qualified hitters) in slugging percentage (.798). McGarry leads the Midwest League in OPS (1.173) and extra base hits (23) while ranking second in home runs (11), second in runs batted in (32), and second in batting average (.338)...McGarry has 23 extra base hits in 29 games, an average of .79 extra base hits per game. Over the Dragons history, the top two ranked hitters in extra base hits per game (minimum 50 games) are Nick Senzel (.57 per game in 2016) and Jay Bruce (.54 per game in 2006)...McGarry connected on his 10th homer on May 12. Since daily records became available in 2005, the earliest that a previous Dayton hitter had reached 10 home runs was May 21 (2008, Brandon Waring). Next earliest is May 28 (Jay Bruce in 2006; Juan Francisco in 2007)...McGarry over his last nine games is batting .455 with 10 extra base hits including three home runs.
- **Rece Hinds** is batting .400 with three home runs over his last 16 games.
- Allan Cerda is batting .353 with four home runs over his last 10 games.
- Donovan Benoit over his last nine relief appearances: 10.2 IP, 1 R, 5 Sv. (5 H, 6 BB, 15 SO).
- The Dragons roster includes 13 players selected in the first five rounds of the draft and 11 of the Reds top 27 prospects (MLB.com).

# **Dragons Manager/Coaches:**

Bryan LaHair is in his first season as Dragons manager and his fifth year in the Reds organization. He served as manager with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 and was the manager at Billings in 2019. LaHair opened his coaching career as the Billings hitting coach in 2018. LaHair played professionally for 14 seasons from 2003-14 and 2016-17, appearing in more than 1,000 games. He was primarily a first baseman but also saw considerable time as a corner outfielder. He played in 195 major league games with the Seattle Mariners and Chicago Cubs. In 2012, he appeared in the MLB All-Star Game. LaHair played for TEAM USA's national team three times (2005 World Cup, 2006 regional Olympic qualifier, 2007 Olympic qualifier). LaHair led all of Minor League Baseball in home runs in 2011 with 38 with the Iowa Cubs and was selected as the Pacific Coast League Most Valuable Player. He played one season in Japan in 2013. LaHair is a native of Worcester, Massachusetts and was chosen as the 2000 Massachusetts High School Player of the Year. He was selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2002 draft out of St. Petersburg College in Florida.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** returns to the Dragons in 2022 as pitching coach after serving in the same position in 2021. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level. He finished fourth in the Pioneer League in saves with nine in his first pro season with Helena in 2010.

Hitting coach Daryle Ward returns to the Dragons in 2022 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18 and 2021. He is in his seventh year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. Ward played in 948 big league games with the Astros, Dodgers, Pirates, Nationals, Braves, and Cubs. He connected on a career-high 20 home runs in 2000 with the Astros. In the later stages of Ward's Major League career, he emerged as one of the National League's top pinch hitters. He led all of baseball in pinch hits and runs batted in as a pinch hitter in 2006 while finishing tied for first in pinch hit home runs. Ward played in 2,318 professional games before retiring at the age of 40 following the 2015 season. Ward was originally signed by the Tigers as a 15th round draft pick in 1994 out of Rancho Santiago College in California. He is a native of the Los Angeles area and now makes his offseason home in Riverside, California. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Juan Samuel joins the Dragons as bench coach in 2022, his first season in the Reds organization. The 2022 season is Samuel's 40th year in professional baseball as a player or coach. After a 19-year professional playing career including 16 seasons in the Major Leagues, he served on the Detroit Tigers big league coaching staff for seven years from 1999-2005. He was the manager of the Mets Double-A club in Binghamton in 2006 before returning to the Majors as a coach for the Baltimore Orioles from 2007-10. He served as the manager of the Orioles on an interim basis in 2010. He was a Major League coach for the Philadelphia Phillies from 2011-17. He served as a coach with Monclova in the Mexican League in 2021. Samuel has 18 years experience as a Major League coach and two years as a coach in the minors. Samuel enjoyed a 16-year Major League playing career from 1983-98 and was selected to play in the MLB allstar game three times. Samuel collected more than 1,500 big league hits during his time with the Phillies, Mets, Dodgers, Royals, Reds, Tigers, and Blue Jays. In 1984, he set an MLB record for stolen bases by a rookie with 72 and finished second in the NL Rookie of the Year voting. His best season came in 1987 when he blasted 28 home runs and drove in 100 runs while batting .272 to win the NL Silver Slugger award at second base. Samuel was inducted into the Phillies Wall of Fame in 2008 and was selected as one of the 50 greatest players in Phillies history in a book by Robert W. Cohen. Samuel was born in San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic and graduated from Licey High School in Puerto Rico.

#### Rules Changes for 2022

The Midwest League has adopted a Pitch Clock to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within 14 seconds of receiving the ball when the bases are empty, and within 18 seconds with runners on base. Defensive positioning rules now require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are now limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner with be awarded the next base via a balk. Additionally, the size of each base has been increased from 15" to 18".
