BALK AND A HARD PLACE: The only run Dunedin allowed in Friday's 1-0 loss scored on a balk by Johan Simon in the 7th inning. There was not an RBI in the contest. The Blue Jays were shut out for the third time this season, all of which have come against the Threshers.

AND SO IT GOES: The team with more hits has yet to win a game this week. Dunedin lost 2-0 on Tuesday despite a 5-3 hit advantage, then fell 6-5 on Wednesday while out-hitting Clearwater 11-9. The Blue Jays flipped the script Thursday, winning 7-2 despite being out-hit 11-10. On Friday, Dunedin once again had more hits (4-3) but came up short in a 1-0 loss.

NEW HALF, NEW JAYS: The Blue Jays concluded the first half 33-31, good for fourth place in the FSL West, after Thursday night's 7-2 win over Clearwater. The Lakeland Flying Tigers clinched the FSL West first-half championship with a doubleheader sweep over Ft. Myers on Wednesday to punch their playoff ticket early. In the FSL East, the St. Lucie Mets clinched the first-half championship Sunday with a win over Daytona.

WATER NOT SO CLEAR: It's been a strong week in Clearwater for Dunedin's pitching staff. In Friday night's loss, Landen Maroudis (4 IP, 1 H, 3 K), Eliander Alacalde (2 IP, 0 H, 3 K), and Johan Simon (2 IP, 1 R, 2 H, 3 K) combined to allow only one run on three hits with nine strikeouts. On Thursday, Austin Cates and Gilberto Batista combined to keep the Threshers off the scoreboard through the first 8.1 innings of the Jays' win. In Wednesday's extra-innings thriller, Daniel Guerra and Hayden Juenger held the Threshers without a hit until the 6th inning. Dunedin posted a pair of shutouts last week coming over a three game span, and has four this season.

MOUND MAYHEM: The Jays have not allowed more than three runs in their last ten games. Over their last 15 games dating back to the start of the St. Lucie series, Dunedin's pitching staff has posted a 2.13 ERA, the best mark among Class-A teams over that span. Over their past ten games, Dunedin's bullpen has allowed 10 earned runs in 46.2 innings (1.93 ERA) with a 1.14 WHIP.

BRINGING THE BOOM: After a pair of tough losses to open the series, the Blue Jays broke through Thursday with a 7-2 win over Clearwater, powered by dominant pitching and a four-run seventh inning. Austin Cates fired five shutout frames for his third straight win, and Gilberto Batista followed with 3.1 strong innings as the Jays held the Threshers scoreless through 8.1. Bryce Arnold and Peyton Powell (1st pro HR) sparked the offense early before Dunedin pulled away with a two-out rally in the 7th. Eight of nine starters recorded a hit, and the win marked the Jays' first at BayCare Ballpark this season after five straight road losses there.

STRANDED AT SEA: Dunedin dropped the first two games of the week in Clearwater, including an 11-inning walk-off loss Wednesday, their fourth walk-off defeat this season. The Jays stranded 24 runners and went just 5-for-27 (.185) with runners in scoring position in those two games.

WEIGHT ROOM: As recently as May 20, Dunedin led all Class-A teams in homers. Over their last 27 games, the Jays have only gone yard 10 times, including five over their last 18 games. The Jays are 21-11 in games where the homer this season, and are 13-21 in games where they don't.

ROAD WORK: After Dunedin went 4-13 from May 14-June 1, they fell from two games up in first place on May 13, to as far as 5.5 games out of first place in the FSL West on June 3.

SCOUTING CLEARWATER: The Threshers entered the week having taken nine of 12 from Dunedin this season including taking five of six from the Jays in their most recent series.

DUNEDIN BLUE JAYS COACHING STAFF

Gil Kim | Manager *Year with Toronto: 10 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Pottsville, PA*

First-year Manager Gil Kim provides a wealth of experience as a player, coach, and executive to Dunedin. Hired in 2016 as the Blue Jays Director of Player Development, Kim transitioned from the front office to a coaching role with the organization in 2020 when he joined Toronto's major league field staff under the same job title, before becoming the Blue Jay's major league field coordinator in 2022, a position he held until 2024. Before joining Toronto, Kim spent seven seasons with the Texas Rangers in several scouting roles, culminating as Director, International Scouting. A native of Pottsville, PA, Kim also had a six-year international professional playing career as an infielder, which included stops in the Netherlands, China, Australia, Spain and Venezuela. He played one season of collegiate baseball at D3 Middlebury before transferring to Vanderbilt, where he played under Tim Corbin. In 2008 while playing in Venezuela, Kim slept on a mattress in the bathroom in the locker room to save money and learn Spanish.

Cory Riordan | Pitching Coach *Year with Toronto: 5 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Killingworth, CT*

Cory Riordan enters his third season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach, after he held the same role with the FCL Blue Jays in 2021-22. He joined the Blue Jays organization in 2020, where he spent the 2020 shutdown assisting with the club's pitch design framework. Riordan pitched collegiately at Fordham University and went on to play 13 professional seasons, spending time with the Colorado Rockies and Detroit Tigers organizations, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time in the independent Atlantic League, and played internationally in South Korea and Taiwan, and three winter ball seasons in Venezuela and the Dominican Republic.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach *Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Denton, TX*

Nash Knight enters his second season with the Dunedin Blue Jays and Jays' organization. Under Knight's guidance in 2024, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League leaders with 101 HR (3rd), 34 3B (T-1st), and a .359 SLG (3rd). Knight made the transition to coaching following a seven-year playing career where he spent six seasons in Toronto's farm system, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sept. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Mississauga, ON.*

Stephenson is in her first season as Position Coach, after she spent the prior two seasons with the High-A Vancouver Canadians in the same role, helping to claim a 2023 Northwest League championship. Inducted to the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. Initially a star hockey player at the collegiate level at Wilfrid Laurier, she claimed four conference titles and a CIS National Championship, before joining the pro ranks in the original National Women's Hockey League and the Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson starred for Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004 to 2018. She was twice named the team's MVP, earned an All-Star nod at third base in the 2008 IBAF World Cup Tournament and won the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was renamed in her honor. She was tabbed as the 2022 recipient of the Baseball Canada Lionel Ruhr Elite Coach of the Year Award after she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team when she led the women's national team to two wins over Team USA in the Friendship Series then coached Ontario teams at the Women's Invitational and 16U Girls Championships ahead of joining the Blue Jays organization. Became the second female coach in the Jays system, following Jamie Lever.

Jonathan Davis | Ast. Hitting Coach *Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Camden, AR*

Davis enters his first season as a coach after retiring from an 11-year professional playing career this offseason. Davis spent parts of six seasons in MLB, including three with the Blue Jays, and one with the Yankees, Brewers, and Marlins. Davis was initially drafted by the Blue Jays in 2013 and made his MLB Debut in 2018 for the Jays. He spent parts of two seasons with the Dunedin Blue Jays in 2015 and 2016, where he played in a career 167 games for Dunedin with 15 HR, 72 RBI, and 38 RBI. Davis played in 2017 Arizona Fall League, where he hit .295 and helped the Peoria Javelinas win the AFL Championship on a team that included 19-year-old Ronald Acuna Jr. Hit the first cycle in Double-A New Hampshire history on June 16, 2017. Most recently played 34 games for the Marlins in 2023, and spent 2024 with the Marlins Triple-A Jacksonville. In 205 career MLB games, Davis hit .199/.295/.276 with 6 HR, 30 RBI, and 19 SB.

Rodrigo Vigil | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: David, Panama*

Vigil joins Dunedin for his first season as a Position Coach. A former catcher, Vigil enjoyed an 11-year professional playing career. He spent 10 seasons in the Miami Marlins farm system before finishing with the Blue Jays in 2021, where he hit .275 in 34 games between Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo. Overall, Vigil played 550 career minor league games, where he hit .251. He began his coaching career as a bench coach for the ACL Mariners in 2022 before returning to the Blue Jays system, where he spent the past two seasons as a rehab position coach.

Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach *Year with Toronto: 25 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cotui, DR*

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995-1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

SCOUTING REPORT: Fastball (94-99), Slider (81-87), Sinker

2025: Opened season with with 14 consecutive scoreless outings for Dunedin, recording 18 strikeouts in 15.1 innings and allowing only one hit. His 14-game scoreless streak tied for the longest in Minor League Baseball this season at the time, before it ended on Friday 5/30 vs. CLR. Went 11 outings without giving up a hit from April 13 @ JUP to May 30 vs. CLR, during that span he faced 44 batters without allowing a hit.

2024: Upon being drafted, Martin made nine appearances out of the bullpen for Class-A Dunedin in his professional debut spanning 8.2 IP, where he allowed 7 ER with 8 K/14 BB. Topped out at 99.8 MPH on the mound, the hardest pitch by a Dunedin player last season.

In 2023, Martin appeared in three games on the mound and posted a 16.20 ERA. In two total seasons for the Hornets played in 94 games and hit a combined .382 with 14 HR and 105 RBI, while pitching only 11 appearances, which spanned 9.1 IP where he allowed 9 ER with 16 K. Martin transferred to NAIA Southeastern University in Lakeland, FL for the 2024 season, who won the NAIA National Championship in 2018 and 2022. Attended 2023 MLB Draft Combine at Chase Field in Arizona, where he registered exit velocities of 94 and 95 MPH in the showcase game and hit the fifth furthest ball of the game. Shaw played shortstop, and all three outfield positions in High School. Spent a couple of weeks this past offseason at Driveline in Seattle, where they

helped clean up his bat path. It was Blue Jays Hitting Coordinator Craig Parry who helped set it up and the Blue Jays front office who brought it up as a possibility. Mitch Davidoff, Shaw's hitting coach at home in Victoria, also has had an instrumental impact on his swing.

PERSONAL NOTES: Grew up a Blue Jays fan in Canada and described the 2015 Jays' team as "the high of his baseball fandom." Listed favorite player as Troy Tulowitzki. Grew up attending Blue Jays spring training games in Dunedin with his family. Was once thrown a baseball by current Dunedin Assistant Hitting Coach Jonathan Davis. Considers his top Blue Jays moments of his life the Jose Batista "bat flip" 7th inning go-ahead homer vs. Texas in Game 5 of the 2015 ALDS and Edwin Encarnacion's three-run walk-off dinger in 2016 off Ubaldo Jimenez in the 11th, sending the Blue Jays to the ALDS. During the 2023 MLB Draft was expecting to hear his name called earlier in the day, so decided to go to a friends house to play ping pong and then they went golfing to take his mind away from the draft, so when he was drafted he was in the middle of putting on the green when his phone began to blow up. Area Scout Pat Griffin did a tremendous job to "recruit" Shaw to professional baseball, which included a visit to the Blue Jays Player Development Complex in Dunedin during Spring Training 2023, where Shaw met a lot of the big league team and met Ross Atkins and Mark Shapiro. "It made me feel like I would be a big prospect even as a later, high school pick. It sold me that I would be one of the guys and they wanted me here." Was playing against 15 years old in his hometown of Victoria by the time he was 12. Hit a walk-off grand slam in the Victoria Little League Championship, and at 19 years old, had the tournament renamed the Sam Shaw Little League Championship in his honor. Dad played pro roller hockey in Japan. Vancouver Cannucks fan. Self proclaimed best ping pong player in Blue Jays organization. Grew up playing hockey, soccer, lacrosse, and baseball. "I played T-Ball when I was four and just fell in love with it," said Shaw. He played hockey up until high school, and grew up playing with Matthew Wood, taken 15th overall in the first round in the 2023 NHL draft by the Nashville Predators, and played against 1st overall pick to the Chicago Blackhawks Connor Bedard. "There aren't a lot of Canadian kids that want to be professional baseball players," Shaw said. "Usually it's hockey or basketball, but I've always wanted to play baseball," adding, "For kids coming up, especially from B.C. or Victoria as well, there haven't been too many baseball players so hopefully I can create a good example," Shaw said. "We've got some good players and hopefully it ignites something." Was starstruck by Joey Votto, his dad's (Craig) favorite player. Shaw said he was stuttering when he met Votto he was so nervous. Votto hit behind him for a week in the FCL. Attended Vancouver Canadians (Blue Jays High-A) games at The Nat growing up, which is about an hour and a half ferry ride from Victoria (which is on Vancouver Island, which, confusingly, is not home to Vancouver). Shaw has a Vancouver Canadians ice cream helmet in his room. Victoria is the capitol city of BC, and has produced big leaguers Nick Pivetta, Rich Harden, Michael Saunders, and Steve Sinclair, in addition to NBA legend Steve Nash.

Toman's Mom played volleyball at Charleston Southern and his brother played baseball at Middle Tennessee State. Has a sister, Caroline, and Brother, Charlie Mac. Said it was during COVID when he realized he had the possibility of being drafted high enough where it would be a tough decision whether or not to go to school. Knew he wanted to go pro ball the entire time, but always wanted to win a College World Series. Tucker's dad, Jim, went to the CWS three times and never won. The situation was "win win" but the Blue Jays were the perfect fit. Toman's 2021 Phillies Scout Team was viral on social media for their roster, which included Max Clark, Elijah Green, Drew Jones, Blake Cyr, and Carsten Sabathia. The team had a camera crew from the social media channel "Youth Prospects" following them throughout the season, gaining millions of views on their gameday vlogs. "That was one of the most fun times of my life", added that the team wasn't at all cocky, a close group, fun to play for. Tucker and Max Clark became close during one tournament in Georgia where they carpooled together. Toman added It was great practice to have cameras all around, especially just to help allow him be comfortable and be himself once he got to pro baseball. Tucker was teammates as an amateur with Brandon Berriera at the two-week PDP program in Cara, NC at the Team USA headquarters, where the top prospects lived a pro baseball life. Toman played against Manuel Beltre at 14 years old, and the two were roommates to begin their pro careers together. Grew up a Red Sox fan, favorite player was Robinson Cano. Has a very good relationship with hitting coach Nash Knight. Has given credit for his defensive development to former defensive coordinator (now infield coordinator) Danny Solano current infield coordinator and former Dunedin manager Donnie Murphy.
