

#### **BAYCARE BALLPARK INFORMATION**



#### ANNOUNCEMENTS

PA and video board announcements can be arranged for a nominal fee by visiting Guest Services behind Section 106 before the end of the second inning.

#### **ATM**

The ATM is located on the first base side of the concourse behind section 105.

#### **BAGS & BACKPACKS**

Bags can be no larger than 16"x16"x8" and will be subject to inspection upon entry in accordance with Major League Baseball security regulations. Guests may discard or return the prohibited items to their vehicle.

#### BATS

Full-size baseball bats are prohibited from entry by guests to the ballpark.

#### BERM SEATING

Berm seating is limited and ticketed. Blankets are permitted to be brought into the park for berm seating. Chairs, folding chairs, camp chairs, and the like, are not permitted to be brought into the park.

#### **CHILD TICKETS**

Children 13 and younger qualify for the child's ticket price. For children 4 and younger, please see the BayCare Box Office or a ballpark gate attendant for a complimentary ticket. **CUSTOMER SERVICE & ADVANCE TICKETS** 

The Customer Service/Advance Tickets window is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind Section 106. Guests can report problems, check for lost and found items and claim prizes at this location. Tickets for future games may also be purchased here.

#### FIRST AID

The First Aid office is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind section 106 Guests can either report to this office or contact an usher if in need of medical assistance.

#### FOOD AND DRINK POLICY

No food, bottles, coolers or cans may be brought into the ballbark. The Threshers reserve the right to search any medical or diaper bags entering the ballpark.

#### **FOUL BALLS**

Any foul ball hit into the stands may be kept. Guests are not permitted on the field or to reach into the playing area. Foul balls may be dangerous, so please be alert at all times and aware of the potential hazards.

#### **GATES OPEN**

Ballpark gates will open one hour prior to scheduled game

#### HANDICAPPED SEATING

Disabled seating is available all throughout the ballpark. Limited wheelchair seating is available through the ticket office in person or on the telephone. One companion seat is available for purchase with each wheelchair space. An elevator is available for disabled use on the first base side of the stadium (South Parking Lot). Drop-off is available on the West Side of the ballpark (no elevator access here). Please contact an usher for assistance entering and exiting the ballpark.

#### KIDS ZONE

The left-field concourse features a playground and Kids Zone for our vounger guests.

#### LOST AND FOUND

Located at Customer Service behind Section 106. SENIOR TICKETS

#### Seniors 55+ may purchase discounted tickets.

#### **SMOKING**

Smoking is prohibited in most areas of the ballpark. Special smoking sections are marked. Smoking is permitted only on the concourse bridge by the right field foul pole and the Tiki Pavilion in left field. For resources to help quit smoking, call 1-877-U-CAN-NOW (1-877-822-6669).

#### **TEAM STORE**

The Threshers Team Store, Diamond Outfitters, is located next to the ballpark's west entry, and features hats, apparel and collectibles to satisfy Threshers fans of all ages. Merchandise available 24 hours a day on-line at ThreshersBaseball.com.

#### **TIKI PAVILION**

The Frenchy's Tiki Pavilion is located beyond the left field wall. It features a variety of mixed drinks, beer and wine for quests 21 and over. Seats in this section are first-come, firstserve during Threshers season.



#### **HOW TO KEEP SCORE**

#### Scoring Basics...

Different fans have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method...

If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right, if he doubles, write a "-" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the numer advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the numbers who score Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes).

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score.

#### **Phillies Youth Movement**

18-Year-Old Eduardo Tait Emerges as a Top Prospect for the Phillies
By Josh Sperber



Age can be an important factor when it comes to finding prospects and talent. Younger players are often viewed with more room to grow because their bodies are still developing. It is rare to find a teenager who already has a polished enough game to turn pro before they turn 20, and not even all such players can last long enough to make it to the pros and achieve phenom status. One young rising star is 18-year-old catcher Eduardo Tait, who is already garnering attention as he approaches his first full season in affiliated baseball.

Tait hails from Panama, a Central American nation that produced Phillies great catcher Carlos Ruiz, as well as Hall-of-Famers Rod Carew and Mariano Rivera. Like most Latin American countries, Panama has a proud baseball history, and the sport is widely popular among child athletes there from an early age. Eduardo describes the culture of baseball as vibrant and full of passion, but also very competitive. That is a pretty good description of how Tait plays; he's locked in, enjoying himself on the field and makes tons of exciting plays.

Like most kids who grow up in Panama, Tait began playing baseball when he was around four years old. Tait credits his grandmother with introducing him to the game and helping him foster his love for baseball. However, no one else in the Tait family played baseball, so he joined his





older cousin when his aunt and godmother took him to practices. It wasn't long before Tait came out of the bleachers and onto the field, and he has been playing baseball consistently ever since.

From the beginning of his playing career in Little League, it was clear that Tait had an advanced skill set. He would quickly advance through the age rankings in Panamanian Little League and by the time he turned 13, his advanced talent was abundantly clear. Tait jumped at the opportunity to train at a baseball academy in Panama, and he quickly became one of the youngest and most talented prospects in the country.

Despite a baseball-centric environment with a lot of focus on honing his craft, Tait admitted that adjusting to academy life was challenging. "It was hard at first, because they focused a lot on rest, and I was ready to play more. After I got used to it, I really enjoyed my time and learned a lot." After a year at the academy, Tait was one of the youngest prospects invited to work out in front of MLB scouts at just 14 years old.

When he began training at the academy, he needed to choose a position. With his powerful bat and larger frame developing at a young age, first base or catcher were his best initial choices, according to Tait and his agent. "My agent told me that playing catcher would be the best position for me because of my physique and even my swing, so I chose to start catching," Tait says of choosing his position.









"I like the confidence you get and building relationships with the pitchers, you really get to take part in every aspect of the game as a catcher." Tait's bat was already drawing attention for his exceptional power at such a young age, and now his fielding was developing even more. Developing his skills behind the plate took some time, but Tait's strength was evident in his throwing arm from an early age, making him a marquee catching prospect as a newly minted teenager.

It didn't take very long for Tait to realize that he had a future in professional baseball, so he started meeting with teams to try and figure out where he could sign at a younger age than most prospects. Fortunately, other players he had trained with were able to help him out as he got increased attention from scouts. "The Phillies had recruited some people from my academy, and I had heard good things about the organization," said Eduardo of the beginning of his scouting process. "When they first started looking at me, I got really excited and knew that this would be the right fit." Though Tait was one of the youngest players signed in the 2023 International Signings Class, it was clear that he was also one of the best. For the first time since Carlos Ruiz in 1999, the Phillies signed another young Panamanian star to be their catcher of the future.

In January 2023 at just 16 years old, Eduardo Tait signed his first professional contract to play baseball for the Phillies. "It was so exciting for me, and my family was just as excited as I was," Tait said of his reaction to signing his first deal. "It felt like a dream that I always hoped to achieve, and it felt so good to

be able to become a professional ballplayer." With the first step towards his ultimate goal of making the big leagues completed, Tait went right to work and debuted in the Dominican Summer League in June of that year.

The 16-year-old recorded a hit in his first professional at-bat and drove in 36 runs in his first season playing for the DSL Phillies Red and White teams. Despite being the youngest player on the team, Tait finished his first professional season leading all Phillies DSL players with a .333 batting average, 3 homers and 36 RBIs between the two teams. He also earned a DSL Midseason All-Star nod with the Phillies White.

By 2024, Tait earned a promotion to the United States and began the season with the Florida Complex League Phillies. He was in the running to make his US debut with the Clearwater Threshers, but the Phillies chose to prioritize his development rather than posing the challenge of going straight from

short season to full season. Whether it was the promotion or just his hard work coming to light again, Tait broke out in the complex league, driving in 49 RBIs and belting 6 homers in 51 games, bringing in almost one run per game while hitting .321. After two seasons and a combined average of well over .300 in rookie ball, as well as a solid stint in the Spring Breakout game last March, it was clear that Tait was ready to make the jump to Single-A.

Eduardo debuted on the road for the Threshers, joining the team in Tampa for the final series of July. After his first two series with Clearwater, Tait had already launched a pair of home runs, clearing the right field foul pole at Steinbrenner Field in the finale of his first series with the Threshers, and belted a two-run blast to the highway to kick off his first weekend at BayCare Ballpark. Talent-wise, it was clear that Tait had an elite skill set comparable to anyone on the Threshers roster, and he paid no mind to the fact that he was two or more years younger than the majority of the team.

The transition from rookie to full season seemed easy, and Tait continued to defy the age gap as he quickly established himself as one of the best players on the Threshers and the entire Phillies development system. "It's always the same game, whether it's in the DSL or in the minor leagues. You've got the same ball and the same positions, so you have to play the same way there as you would here," Tait said of adjusting to the game in the US. His hard work is very evident on the field, and it's plain to see how easily Tait tunes out the distractions and keeps his focus squarely on what's happening on the field.

Still only 18 years old at the start of the 2025 season, Tait joins Sebastion Walcott of the Rangers and Ethan Salas as 17–18-year-olds who were high-level teenage prospects thriving in A-Ball last year. It is easy to see how he has been so successful in his first two seasons in the minors with his work ethic and constant dedication to the game. "It was a little harder (in the academy) because there were only two coaches with me," Tait said of some of

the differences between the academy and pro ball. "Here with the Phillies, there are so many coaches around and that is extra helpful for me."

Giving a workhorse like Tait a bunch of great coaches with extensive baseball experience as well as top-notch facilities and technology can only mean great things for someone who works as hard as Eduardo does. As good as he is now, he can get infinitely better as he grows and matures throughout his minor league development. There is no telling how fast he will move up the rungs of the Phillies' minor league ladder as he begins his third year as a professional and his first full year not classified as a minor, as he turned 18 in August.

The last Panamanian catcher signed by the Phillies was Carlos Ruiz, who has caught the most no-hitters in Phillies history. If the trend continues, we could see a 27–28-year-old Eduardo Tait in the prime of his career backstopping the Phillies. Regardless, it is very clear that Tait is poised to become a star.



#### A Family Affair Heading to Philadelphia

How Dante Nori's Family Influence and Self-Determination Got Him to the Pros By Josh Sperber



Whether it's a career or their personal life, sometimes a person's destiny is predetermined. That is typically influenced by family and friends, with staying in the "family business" tending to be a large factor in some people's choices. Dante Nori was born into the game of baseball, and it already seems like that's what he was meant to do. Most of Dante's family played baseball, with his uncle playing college baseball at Miami of Ohio, his dad and grandfather both playing at the University of Indiana, with his grandfather reaching as high as Triple-A with the Mets during his career.

As soon as he was old enough, Nori was in Little League and beginning his baseball journey. "I kind of had no choice in a way, I was going to be playing baseball," said Nori of his beginnings in baseball. "Right from the get-go I started playing." Most of his family played infield, and as a lefty, he was well suited for first base. When Dante turned ten, he started growing fast, too fast for a typical first basemen, so he switched to the outfield and never looked back. Dante's speed





and athleticism made it a great fit from a very young age. Although, his skill set best suits him for centerfield, Nori can play all outfield positions equally well.

Nori spent a lot of time around the Indiana baseball program where he learned from many up-and-coming Hoosier stars as a kid playing catch with program legends such as Kyle Schwarber and Sam Travis. "Seeing how hard all these stars worked, seeing what it takes, being around them as a person, and seeing how they act off the field kind of builds you up from there." Though Dante's father, Micah, eventually pivoted to coaching basketball, Dante was still able to get some practice in and get advice from players who would eventually go on to the major and minor league ranks.

His friendship with Kyle Schwarber certainly came in handy, especially once Dante reached the pros. Nori getting to see how student athletes and professionals carried themselves throughout the season certainly helped him reach prominence as a draft prospect and now a rising star in the Phillies organization.

Every career has setbacks, and Dante Nori's has been no exception. By the time he turned 13, Nori was already part of the travel ball circuit, taking advantage of every opportunity. He started with a prestigious travel ball team playing with them for two seasons. According to Nori, he struggled in his second year and was released from the team, the first time he had been cut from a baseball team at 15 years old. "It kind of stuck with me, knowing they didn't think I was good enough anymore," Nori said of being cut from his previous team.

"Pushing yourself to the limit to prove them wrong showed that I'll be the strongest person if I can't be the biggest and so on." To this

day, Nori still refers to this moment as his biggest motivating factor in his journey to the pros. He is still one of the smaller players in the professional ranks, but that hasn't stopped Dante from reaching his goals and working hard.

This release wasn't just hurtful to Dante because of his love for the game and talent, but also because it was one of the first real reminders of the tough business of baseball, even at the amateur level. He was loyal and played hard, but it wasn't enough to keep him on his original team. Nori wasn't a free agent for long, as roughly an hour later he signed to the Canes, one of the top travel baseball programs in the country. With his new team, Dante reached new heights in the travel and recruitment circuits and quickly became one of the top high school prospects in baseball.









Nori played his high school baseball at Northville High School in Michigan. By his junior year, Dante was starting to become a more established name on the recruiting circuit. He got the attention of scouts in the summer of his junior year, and it vaulted him towards the top of many prospect lists across the country. As the summer wore on, more scouts were coming to Nori's game to see him play, and he did not disappoint.

"If you play the game right and you have fun, then there's nothing to stress about. They know what you can do, they're here to see how your body moves and everything else," Nori said of dealing with the scouting process early in his career. His confidence and skill caught notice of scouts at the college and professional levels, making him realize that his dream of playing professional baseball was no longer out of his reach.

By the time his senior season started, he had committed to Mississippi State to play college baseball, one of the best collegiate baseball programs in the country. But for Nori and his teammates, there was still some unfinished business at Northville, and that was a State Championship.

With Nori leading a solid group of seniors, and the Mustangs coming off two tough losses in the State Tournament, going all the way was the main thing on the minds of Nori, his teammates, and a first-year head coach ahead of the 2024 season. With an outstanding season from Nori and his teammates, the Mustangs went 30-7 and beat the number one team in the state 2-1 in the title game, giving Northville their first ever baseball State Championship team.




Nori was unquestionably the standout player and leader on Northville's first state title team which opened even more eyes during his senior year. He was already committed to Mississippi State, but he now had a tougher decision to make after the win. Nori's exceptional performance in the State Playoffs caught the eyes of many major league scouts, and now there was an option for him to go to the pros immediately out of high school.

Dante received an invitation to the MLB Draft Combine, where he shined in front of major league scouts from every single team. Fortunately, his support system was there to assist him in his decision to go pro, depending on which team drafted him in which round. With his connection to the Phillies via Kyle Schwarber, the Phillies made the list of teams he would sign with if they drafted him.

After his State Tournament performance, Nori was projected as a first or second round pick. His performance at the MLB Draft Combine may have pushed Nori into the first round on many mock drafts and MLB Draft Boards. The added confidence and near-unanimous first round projections helped sway his decision towards the pros, and he called it a "nobrainer" when the Phillies selected him 27th overall in the 2024 Draft.

From there it was right to rookie ball and, soon after, the Threshers to begin his professional career. Nori was a regular starter in the final month of the season following an August call-up to the Threshers. He demonstrated great poise at the plate, finishing with 12 hits, 16 walks, and 14 strikeouts in 50 at-bats in his first 14 games with Clearwater. He also drove in nine runs, including two game winning hits and a walk off in his first month as a professional.

#### **Catching Up with Mavis Graves**

How Changing College Commitments Propelled Mavis Graves to the Pros

Every decision has consequences that effect the life of the decision maker. Whether it's surrounding oneself with the right people, choosing a career or picking the right college. This especially applies to young athletes choosing the next place to continue their career, and Mavis Graves' tough decisions about the next level of his baseball career have gotten him to the Phillies system as one of their most promising young starters.

Baseball runs in the Graves family and has been an important part of Mavis' life from the very beginning. Mavis' father played college baseball at Tennessee and his younger brother is committed to play at Spartanburg Methodist College. As soon as he could carry a bat, Mavis was playing in Little League around the age of three. He played first base, then when he reached the 12U level, he began to pick up pitching.





No matter what position he played, Graves excelled, performing as a solid two-way player all the way through high school. College baseball was always the goal, and Mavis had his sights set on Clemson. A lot of his family members went to Clemson, a school with a solid athletic and academic reputation in the heart of Graves' home state of South Carolina. The Tigers began recruiting him during his sophomore year, but during his junior season Graves struggled at the plate.

Mavis hit well throughout his high school career, but now had to make a decision on how far his bat would take him during the recruitment process. "My junior year I struggled hitting and my senior year it came along. After I spent so much time working on hitting even my coach at Clemson said, 'we might want you to hit over there, but you're obviously more dominant as a pitcher." After his junior year at Eastside High School, Mavis committed to Clemson as a pitcher, set to begin there in 2023.

Things changed for Mavis his senior year, who's hard work in the offseason paid off on the mound and at the plate. In 2022, Graves' senior season, he hit .450 with 13 home runs in what would be his final season at bat. "I liked hitting a lot, but once I got here, I knew it was going to get way more competitive, and I wasn't trying to do that," said Mavis of ending his two-way career after high school. "I don't think I would have been able to compete against pitchers on this side of the baseball."

Graves' final season was a huge year for him in every way, emerging as the top starter and a key position player on a State Championship team at Eastside. But the extra scouts now focusing on Graves made him reshuffle his priorities, and he no longer thought his dream school was his best option for college baseball. MLB clubs had started to give him extra attention, and he was rethinking his decision to attend Clemson.

After a lot of thought, Mavis decommitted from Clemson and announced that he would instead be playing his college baseball at Spartanburg Methodist College, a prestigious JUCO in South Carolina where his younger brother is set to play college ball next year. Mavis came to believe that the instruction he would receive at a junior college in addition to collegiate coaching would ultimately help his game more on his road to the major leagues. Little did he know this decision would permanently alter the course of his baseball career.

After his senior season, MLB recruiting picked up, and Mavis was projected as a top 200









prospect with a lot of attention from big league scouts. He was beginning to realize that turning pro was an option before college, and that was when he started appreciating his decommitment from Clemson even more. "My senior year of high school, I decommitted from Clemson and committed to JUCO and I think making that decision made it a lot easier," said Graves looking back on his decision. Picking colleges is hard enough, but changing schools from his dream school, a place where so much of his family had gone, certainly wasn't any easier. But supportive family and a lot of research helped Mavis make a decision that eventually jump-started his professional career.

As he went through the draft process, Graves realized that going pro early could have even more impact on his development than he had originally thought. The more he worked with different teams, the more he learned about camps and other development programs that you could only attend as a member of a major

league farm system. With his draft stock rising significantly over the course of his senior year, Mavis now had to make a third decision on whether to continue his professional career or play college ball at Spartanburg Methodist.

When draft day rolled around in the summer of 2022, it was more a matter of when than if Graves would be drafted. While Graves was somewhat uncertain about his future, the Phillies made him a part of their 2022 Draft Class, selecting Graves in the sixth round of the Draft, making him the Phillies' first left-hander, and third pitcher selected behind Alex McFarlane (fourth round) and Orion Kerkering (fifth round). But for Mavis, this meant he would need another long conversation with his family to help him decide the best route to take to help accomplish his professional dreams.

There were a lot of factors that went into Mavis' final decision, and the Phillies drafting him certainly helped it along. All the camps

and extra opportunities for player development that the Phillies offer helped move the needle, as Graves is a hard worker and student of the game who wanted as many opportunities to improve as he could. "My family and I thought it would be the better option if we picked the pro level and got started the long haul of the baseball grind that it is," said Graves of his family's help and support throughout his senior year. The Graves family was in agreement, and Mavis was officially the first member of a baseball-obsessed family to reach the pros.

After two collegiate commitments and decommitments plus an official end to his career as a position player, Mavis began his career in the Florida Complex League in his second season as a professional. With a long season following a state championship run behind him, the Phillies opted for Graves not to pitch in 2022, and he spent his first season at the Carpenter Complex. Though he struggled a bit in the FCL, he led all Phillies rookie ball pitchers with 11 starts and amassed 34.0 innings in his lone FCL season.

Who knows where Mavis would be pitching now had he not decommitted from either one of the two schools where he thought he would be continuing his baseball career. It is clear that Mavis' development has been impressive so far in his minor league career with the Phillies. "You can never perfect the game of baseball; it'll humble you very quickly. Just keep going at it, I always try to do my best and do my job," said Mavis of his professional career so far. While it may have been a hard choice to select the next step of his baseball career, Mayis Graves has never had to choose to work hard. That has always come naturally, and it is certainly showing at the start of his professional career.
