Today's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound today, needing a win to secure their first series in a month (tied three straight, 3-0-8 in last 11). Louisville will counter with RHP **Julian Aguiar**. Columbus is 38-22 (.633) versus right handers this year. Aguiar has pitched against Columbus twice in his career, going 1-0 with a 4.91ERA (11.0IP, 13H, 6R, 6ER, 7BB, 6K).

vs. the Bats

Columbus was 7-11 against Louisville last year, going 4-10 in the last 14G to lose the season series for the third straight year (4-0 from 2018-22). The Clippers took the series 3-2 in the first half of the season this year, with each team scoring 18 runs. **George Valera** has collected 6HR and 14RBI in 32G opposing Louisville, while **Angel Genao** has hit .387 (12x31) in 10G this year.

Great Timing

Columbus and Louisville took 2:32 to complete last night's game (also 2:32 on Wednesday and Thursday; 6G of 2:32 on the year, most common result). Friday saw a time of 2:26 (second most common time: 4G), as the Clippers and Bats have averaged 2:35 in their 9-inning contests this year. Non-DH Sundays are seeing games average 2:48, with a pair of extra-innings outings (10-4 on Sunday).

Back in the Black

Homers from Petey Halpin and Ralphy Velazquez pushed the team total to 99, moving the differential meter to +1 (8HR in last 11G, including 7G homerless). The Clippers still carry negative differentials in the hit (-6) and run (-14) columns, making them the only winning team in the IL with fewer hits and runs than their opponents. The last 10 Columbus wins have been by three runs or fewer.

Coming Back Strong

Petey Halpin is 8x22 (.364) in 5G since getting optioned, scoring a run in each game (113 runs since Triple-A debut, 10th most in the IL in that time). Including the week before his last stint in Cleveland (at Indy, 6/9-6/13), Halpin has hit .318 (14x44) over his last 10G with Columbus. He has 37K in 40G this year (1K in last 6G), following a '25 campaign that saw the 7th most in team history (156 in 126G).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao has a 1.079OPS in the last 16G, batting .404 (23x57) while drawing 11BB in 70PA (16%) over that time (11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has scored 13 runs in those 15G, collecting 10RBI and 6XBH (.579SLG). Among IL hitters with at least 35PA from the 7th inning on, Genao has the 2nd best OPS (1.212; 1st- **Travis Bazzana**, 9th- **Kody Huff**, 10th- **Cooper Ingle**).

Snapping Out of It

Juan Brito saw his hitting streak snapped at 8G last night (.345, 10x29, 6/25-7/3; hit .136, 8x59, in 16G prior, 6/4-6/23). He had 6XBH (.690SLG) during the hit streak, including a trio of doubles to tie him with **Ricky Ledee** for the 24th most doubles in franchise history (62). His walk streak was also snapped last night, having reached 7G (9BB from 6/26-7/3; 151BB in Clipper career, tied for 21st).

More Ralphy

Ralphy Velazquez extended his career best on base streak to 25G last night (.385OBP since 6/3), collecting a homer (hits in 11 of last 12; .333, 15x45). His streak is the third longest active streak in the IL (**Kody Huff** is tied for 8th at 20G). Over his last 17G, Velazquez has watched his OBP rise 60 points and his average grow by 44, but his SLG has increased by only nine points (2XBH in 69AB).

Another Personal Best

Kody Huff tied his career high in steals (7) on Sunday, a game after establishing new career highs in RBI (48) and runs (now at 49). He is currently riding a career best 20G on base streak (.385OBP since 6/2) after having twice set career long hit streaks this year (10G from 4/1-4/12, 12G from 5/1-5/16). Also, he has already hit top marks in triples (3) and HR (10) this year (3BB from personal best: 44 in '24).

Tens for Tolentino

Milan Tolentino extended his hitting streak to 10G last night (.382, 13x34), one off his career best of 11G in 2023 with Lake County. Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, he is 15x39 (.385) in his last 12G, collecting 9XBH (.692SLG) and 9RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). In the last week, he racked up his 10th homer (6/28 at Omaha) and 10th steal (7/3; one of 10 IL batters with 10 of each).

This Date in Clipper History

7/5/1991

Kevin Mmahat struck out nine batters en route to the third no-hitter in Clippers history as Columbus beat Louisville 6-0. Mmahat went 17-12 over parts of four seasons for Columbus (1989-1992), pitching 49 games with the Clippers (half of his career total). The Clippers have 10 no-hitters to their credit, with a pair of them coming in 2018 (five since 2011, only one at Huntington Park).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,451 to 1,399).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 123-103 (.544) in pitch reviews, with batters going 64-69 (.481) and pitchers/catchers going 59-34 (.634). They have run out of challenges in 37G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-3 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-36 when playing past regulation (.604, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 91G to require extra play, 72 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 806, would rank as 5th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 102 through the first 85G (on pace for 179SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 30CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (53; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 133 runs while crafting a .933OPS (over 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 68 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 197-131 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,950RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.23 through the first 85G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 172HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 9th in the IL this year (.979), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 45G this season (27-18, .600), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

Dayan Frias bunted the tying runs into scoring position on 6/20 vs. Scranton/WB and the Clippers ended up completing the comeback win. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 89-23 (.795) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 6-2 mark this season (.750, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the most games decided in the last at bat (23, tied with Omaha). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 97G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-49 (.495, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 433-444 (.494), 403-398 with Columbus (.503).

Workhorse

Allen is the only Clipper averaging over 80 pitches a start this season, at 87.5 (along with **Ryan Webb**, only pitchers to throw more than 90 in a game multiple times). Averaging almost 93 pitches per outing in the Majors last season, Allen hit triple digits six times (Columbus has not had a pitcher reach 100 since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 549G ago).

On Guard(ians):

In two stints in the Majors this season (27th man in a DH on 4/5 and a two day excursion from 5/24-5/25), Allen has appeared once for Cleveland, closing out the game on 5/25 vs. Washington (4.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K). The game was his second in relief at the Major League level (once last season) and he has just 4G out of the bullpen in the minors (all on starter's rest, three piggybacking rehabbing Major Leaguers).

Stellar Support:

Through 14GS, the bullpen has graced Allen with a 2.49ERA in relief (50.2IP, 14ER), stranding three of six runners inherited. The defense has committed only 11E in Allen's starts, while the offense has put forward 5.4 runs per game. That all adds up to a 12-2 record for Columbus when he takes the hill.

Tough Split:

In his first 5GS (103BF), Allen recorded 32K (31%) against only 10BB (10%), while painting the zone with strikes on 63% of his offerings. Once the calendar flipped to May, however, he made 4GS (87BF), watching his strikeout rate dip to 16% (14K) and his walk rate inflate (14%, 12BB; strikes on 57% of pitches). He found his groove in June, starting with a 10K outing (fifth of career) on 6/6 vs. Omaha (40K to 105BF last month, 38%; 5BB, 4%, 67% of pitches were strikes).

Cleaning Up:

Opposing cleanup hitters had just one hit off Allen in their first 30AB of the season, though the hit went over the wall (**Charles McAdoo**, 4/26 at Buffalo). Coming into today, they are 3x33 (1BB, 10K) and, looking at the lineup as a whole, the top five in the order have slashed .208/.285/.357 with 5HR in 168AB against Allen, while batters 6-9 have hit .373/.441/.608 with 5HR in 102AB.
