Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Rorik Maltrud** to the mound tonight, looking to even the series at 2-2 (11 Friday losses are most of any day of the week for Columbus). Lehigh Valley will counter with RHP **Andrew Painter**. Columbus is 39-23 (.629) versus right handers this year. Painter has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (tonight is 25th career game in the IL).

vs. the IronPigs

Columbus has won 46 of the last 79G (.582), including playoffs. All-time in Allentown, the Clippers are 34-26 (.567), including playoffs (2-0 in '11 GC Finals). This year marks the second straight season the Clippers have travelled to Allentown and the third time since the expansion of the IL (Lehigh has been to Columbus once, 2024). **Dom Nunez** has 2HR and 7RBI in 8G against the Pigs in his career.

Outliers

The Clippers are on the verge of reaching 50 wins, doing so with a negative run differential (-6; other five teams with at least 49 wins are at least +22, averaging +48). Columbus also has the wrong end of the hit battle (-3; other five teams average +17), while sitting perfectly even in the homer department (other five average +17). Over 70% of the team's wins (35) have been in games decided by three or fewer.

Ingle is Back

Cooper Ingle's two week stint in the Majors (.095/.208/.095 in 7G) dropped him below out of qualification for rate statistics in the IL this year (debuted as the leader on 6/7). Including a 4x4 (3HR) game on 6/18 vs. Scranton/WB, he has slumped to a line of .215/.296/.452 in his last 23G with Columbus. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.293OPS (11HR) in 31G (.486OPS and 1HR in 19G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao has a 1.116OPS in the last 20G, batting .411 (30x73) while drawing 14BB in 90PA (16%) over that time (11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has scored 18 runs in those 20G, collecting 12RBI and 9XBH (.616SLG). Among IL hitters with at least 35PA from the 7th inning on, Genao has the 2nd best OPS (1.198; 1st- **Travis Bazzana**, 11th- **Cooper Ingle**, 12th- **Kody Huff**).

More Ralphy

Ralph Velazquez extended his career best on base streak to 29G with an HBP last night (.383OBP since 6/3; hits in 14 of last 16; .323, 20x62). His streak is the 3rd longest active streak in the IL (5th overall) and, since its start, he has watched his OBP balloon by 78 points, his average jump 67 points and his SLG climb 142 points (had 6XBH in first 8G, 1XBH in middle 16G, 4XBH in last 5G).

Bo Bomb

In the second half of the year, Columbus has the 7th most PA with the bases loaded in the IL (25), but the lineup has produced the 17th best OPS (.591; 4x23 with 13RBI). The Clippers did not leave the bases loaded last night (five times in previous 3G), as **Bo Naylor** poked a grand slam. Naylor is hitting only .171 (6x35) in his last 10G, but boasts a .429SLG, as every hit has gone for extra bases.

Free for All

CJ Kayfus was part of the crime ring on Wednesday, collecting the first multi-steal game of his career (21SB in 304G prior). As a team, the 8SB from Columbus in the last 2G equals the total over the previous 13G (87SB in first 59G of the year, 16SB in next 28G before Wednesday). In his last 5G, Kayfus is hitting .320 (6x20) with 3XBH (.600SLG; was 10x56, .179, with 2HR and a .286SLG in 15G prior).

Roughing It

Since doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** is hitting .135 (5x37, all singles), while scoring twice and driving in a pair over his last 10G. He has drawn only 4BB during the slump (3BB on Sunday) against 8K in 41PA. Valera has not homered since 5/19 vs. Louisville (87AB since) and has just 2HR in his last 42G (149AB, .322SLG). Additionally, he has no multi-RBI games since 5/30 (21G).

Ten for Tolentino

Milan Tolentino saw his hitting streak snapped at 10G on Sunday (.382, 13x34, 6/24-7/4), one off his career best of 11G in 2023 with Lake County. Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, he is 18x52 (.346) in his last 16G, collecting 10XBH (.635SLG) and 12RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 9G, Tolentino has drawn 9BB to only 6K (38PA; had 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA).

This Date in Clipper History

7/10/1995

The Clippers blanked the Mud Hens by a score of 7-0 at Cooper Stadium. Every Clipper had a hit, including **Derek Jeter**, who went 2x5 with a couple runs and a stolen base. Jeter was selected to play in the Triple-A All-Star Game in 1995 and was also named to the post-season IL All-Star Team after hitting .317 with a league-high 96 runs. In his Major League career, Jeter was a 14-time All-Star.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,453 to 1,400).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 131-107 (.550) in pitch reviews, with batters going 67-70 (.489) and pitchers/catchers going 64-37 (.634). They have run out of challenges in 38G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 809, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 111 through the first 89G (on pace for 186SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 30CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 2nd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (50; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 135 runs while crafting a .919OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 72 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +63 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 201-134 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,958RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.15 through the first 89G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 176HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 49G this season (29-20, .592), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the most games decided in the last at bat (25). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 98G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-50 (.490, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 435-446 (.494), 405-400 with Columbus (.503).

June Swoon:

In 5G of June (17.1IP), Maltud gave up 15ER (23.0IP, 7ER in May; 27.2IP, 8ER in March/April). Of the runs allowed, 3ER came in an inning vs. Omaha on 6/2, as a result of three infield singles.

Undecided:

Among 56 pitchers in the IL with at least 11GS, Maltud is the only one that has yet to take a loss and his pair of wins makes him the only starter with just two decisions. Despite a 3.68ERA as a starter and run support of 5.8 per game, Maltud has left with the lead only five times because the offense is averaging only 2.1 runs while he is the pitcher of record, including 9G with two runs or fewer (4G with zero runs).

Efficiency is Key:

Through 74 innings started in 16G, Maltud has retired the side with fewer than 10 pitches on 11 occasions, including a 4-pitch inning on 4/3 vs. Indianapolis, while turning in 15 innings of more than 20. He has hit 30+ thrice, thanks to an 11-pitch battle vs. Iowa's **Pedro Ramirez** on 4/17 (walk, 34 in the inning) and a 14-pitch skirmish with Buffalo's **Yohendrick Pinango** on 4/23 (groundout, 30 total). He ranks 4th in the IL with 15.4 pitches per inning.

Among the Leader Beans:

Entering today's game, Maltud is 7th in the IL with a 3.82ERA (nearly half a run better than all other Clipper starters with at least 10GS). From his quality start win on 4/11 at Worcester through his quality start on 5/25 at Toledo, he crafted the 2nd best ERA in the IL, at 2.14ERA (42.0IP, 10ER). Additionally, Maltud's 0.95WHIP in that time ranked 2nd best (1.24WHIP on the season places 5th).

Pitch to Contact:

Maltud's Triple-A debut on 3/28 at Iowa was the 44th game of his career and marked his 37th consecutive start (reached 41GS before relief appearance on 4/30 vs. Toledo, all 6G in relief have come on starter's rest and been at least 3.0IP). He did not punch out any Cubs in that game (15BF), marking his second straight game without a strikeout (37BFwith 0K from, 9/10/25-4/3/26; had at least 1K in all 42G prior). Among 124 pitchers in the IL that have at least 170BF this year, Maltud has the 28th best walk rate (7.9%; 24BB to 305BF) and the 56th best strikeout rate (22.0%, 67K; had worst rate, 11.9%, prior to 55K in last 11G).

In Relief:

Maltud has pitched twice in relief this season (previous 5G out of the bullpen came among first 7G as a pro), piggybacking **Trenton Denholm** on 4/30 vs. Toledo (3.0IP, 40 pitches) and **Daniel Espino** on 6/2 vs. Omaha (4.0IP, 81 pitches). He has registered a 5.14ERA out of the bullpen (7.0IP, 11H, 4R, 4ER, 2BB, 13K),
