#### Today's Game

The Fightin Phils remain home and continue a six-game series tonight against the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, Double-A affiliate of the New York Mets. It is the 13th-of-17 matchups between the teams this season and seventh-of-12 at FirstEnergy Stadium. The Rumble Ponies hold a 7-5 edge in the season-series after taking four-of-six from Reading in April at FirstEnergy Stadium and three-of-five from the R-Phils in May at Mirabito Stadium.

#### Game 89 Recap

The Fightin Phils used six-unanswered runs en route to a series-opening 6-3 win over Binghamton on Tuesday afternoon. After the teams failed to score any runs through the first three innings of the game, Binghamton plated two runs in the fourth and one in the fifth off Reading starter Estibenzon Jimenez. Overall through, Jimenez tossed another quality start in a no-decision. The righty allowed three runs over six innings, with a Double-A high eight strikeouts. Down 3-0, the Fightin Phils responded with two runs in the sixth, seventh and eighth innings to grab a 6-3 lead, they would not relinquish. Hendry Mendez had two hits and a run scored, and Alex Binelas had two hits and a RBI. Nick Dunn had a strong game, with two hits, one run and a RBI. Dunn hit his second Reading home run and first at FirstEnergy Stadium, a solo shot in the seventh inning to tie the game at three. Carson DeMartini hit a sac fly later in the inning to give Reading the lead for good. Jack Dallas tossed two-perfect innings of relief and earned his first win. Andrew Bechtold picked up his third save, and second in as many starts in a perfect ninth with two strikeouts. Reading improved to 16-0 this season when leading after eight innings at home.

#### Back to .500

With a win on Tuesday, the Fightin Phils returned to .500 at 11-11. It is the latest in a half that the R-Phils have been .500 or better since Al Pedrique took over as manager in 2023. It is also the latest Reading has been .500 in a half since the two-half schedule began in 2021. The latest Reading was .500 or better in a season or half was the conclusion of the 2019 season.

#### A Marathor

Sunday's 12-inning game against Portland was the longest game inning-wise that the Fightin Phils have played in since a 12-inning game against Harrisburg on Apr. 20, 2022. Reading lost that game 9-6 to the Senators. The 3:29 game time was also the longest game Reading has played in time-wise since an 11-inning game against New Hampshire, which was also 3:29 total.

## It's Miller Time

Phillies No. 2 Prospect Aidan Miller has become a threat on the basepaths this season. Miler is tied for first place in first place in the Eastern League and is first amongst all Phillies Minor Leaguers with 35 stolen bases. After his 35th stolen base on Saturday, Miller has stolen the most bases in a season by a R-Phil since Quintin Berry stole 48 in 2009. The last Fightin Phil to steal 30+ in a season was Johan Rojas in 2023 and the last to swipe 31 or more in a year was Roman Quinn in 2016.

## Mashing McIntosh

Paul McIntosh stayed red-hot at the plate with a double and RBI on Tuesday. Over three games vs Portland last weekend, McIntosh slashed .583/.615/1.167 (1.782 OPS), with three runs, four doubles, one home run and four RBI. The catcher is on an nine-game hitting streak dating back to July 3 and is slashing .484/.556/.774 (1.330 OPS), with six doubles, one home run and six RBI over the streak. He's also currently riding a 13-game on-base streak, dating back to June 21, and has a .549 on-base percentage over that stretch.

## The First Fightin

The red-hot Jean Cabrera makes the start tonight for the Fightin Phils. Over his list four starts, the Phillies No. 12 prospect is 3-0, with a 1.96 ERA (5 ER, 23.0 IP). Cabrera's Eastern League ranks are: 7th ERA (3.47), T-6th strikeouts (85), T-2nd starts (17), 3rd ERA (90.2), 2nd AVG (.199) and ninth WHIP (1.20).

## This Day in Baseballtown History

## Ponies Rumbling Into Baseballtown

Binghamton enters play today with a 59-30 overall record and 14-8 mark in the second half, which is in first place in the Eastern League's Northeast Division. The Rumble Ponies captured a first-half championship and qualified for the Eastern League postseason in September. Binghamton took two-of-three games at New Hampshire last weekend and after this week, Binghamton returns home to host Harrisburg. Binghamton's roster features 10 of the New York Mets' top-30 prospects: Jett Williams (1), Jonah Tong (2), Carson Benge (3), Ryan Clifford (6), Jonathan Santucci (11), Nick Morabito (16), Jacob Reimer (17), Chris Suero (20), Jack Wenninger (27) and Anthony Nunez (28).

## **Ponies Pitcher**

Righty Luis Moreno makes the start tonight for Binghamton in what is expected to be a bullpen game for the Rumble Ponies. Over 23 games and two starts, Moreno is 5-1, with a 4.37 ERA (17 ER, 35.0 IP). Moreno last pitched on July 18 at New Hampshire, allowing no runs on one hit over 1.2 innings of work. Moreno last started on June 22 at Harrisburg, going three innings and allowing three runs on four hits, with three strikeouts. He's also made five appearances with Syracuse (AAA) this season and has an 8.38 ERA (9 ER, 9.2 IP). Moreno spent most of last season with Binghamton, going 3-7, with a 4.27 ERA over 25 games/19 starts. The 26-year old signed with the Mets in 2019 as an International Free Agent out of the Domincan Republic.

- Opened the season ranked as the Phillies No. 11 Prospect (MLB Pipeline)
- Tabbed as Reading's Opening Day starter Apr. 4 vs Portland (ND, 4.2 IP, 2 H, ER, 4 BB, 3 SO)
- First win of season Apr. 16 vs Binghamton (5.0 IP, 4 H, 1 ER, 2 BB, 7 SO)
