RHP Brett Kerry (1-0, 0.00) vs. RHP Anthony Molina (0-1, 14.73)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque holds a 3-2 series lead over Salt Lake after its 14-3 victory last night ... With a win, the Isotopes will claim their first series victory over the Bees in Albuquerque since taking two of three from July 14-6, 2024 ... Anthony Molina is expected to take the hill for Albuquerque while Brett Kerry is slated to start for the Bees, a rematch of Game 1 starters.

VEEN: Zac Veen's 5-for-5 performance last night marked the 30th time in Isotopes history a player recorded a five-hit contest, and was the first since rehabbing Kris Bryant on July 21, 2024 at Sacramento ... It also marked Veen's first career five-hit game, as his previous high was four, reached on four occasions (most recently: May 9, 2024 at Reading).

SAM I AM: Yesterday, Sam Hilliard connected on his 78th home run in an Isotopes uniform across five seasons (2019, 21, 22, 24 and 25). He is now one blast away from tying Mike Busch (1993-96) for most among all Albuquerque Triple-A players.

ISOTOPES RBI RECORD: Hilliard has 218 RBI with Albuquerque, which ranks third among career leaders in team history. Jordan Patterson (2016-18) is second with 229 RBI.

FULFORD: Braxton Fulford is the first Albuquerque player to homer in at least three-straight starts since Elehuris Montero from July 28-Aug. 1, 2024, a stretch that reached four contests.

KEST DADDY: Keston Hiura went 2-for-3 last night, including a two-run single in the fourth inning. He finished with three runs batted in, his first multi-RBI performance since Aug. 17, 2024 at Sacramento (also three).

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel went 2-for-4 last night, his second multi-hit game of the year (also: March 30 at SAC).

HOMERS: The Isotopes hit three home runs in an inning for the first time since July 20, 2024 at Sacramento, when Trevor Boone, Kris Byrant and Elehuris Montero all went yard in the eighth.

TWO-BAGGERS: Veen doubled twice, the first Isotopes player to do so since A.J. Lewis on Sept. 13, 2024 against Las Vegas.

PUT IT IN PLAY: The Isotopes struck out just once last night, the 15th time in team history with just one punchout (last: July 5, 2018). The club has never had a game where they have not struck out at least one time.

SERIES WIN: With a win today, the Isotopes will claim their first series victory since taking four of six from Reno from Aug. 27-Sept. 1, 2024 (six series).

AMADOR: Adael Amador recorded a single yesterday and has a hit in four-straight games and five of the six contests he's played in 2025 ... He also drew two walks last night, his second-straight contest with two free passes, the first time with two walks in two-straight games since May 22-23, 2024, at Portland.

B2B: Albuquerque has won consecutive games for the first time since Aug. 31-Sept. 4, 2024, when they took the final two at home against Reno and then won the first two during their road trip to Tacoma.

IT'S ALIVE: The Isotopes have compiled 39 runs and 46 hits over their last four contests after combining for four runs and 19 hits in their initial four games this year.

ON THE BUMP: Albuquerque's pitching staff struck out 13 Bees yesterday, their third consecutive game recording double-digits in punchouts (37 total since Thursday).

RUNS ALLOWED: The Isotopes have allowed four runs or fewer in four of their eight games in 2025.

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{HOMERS}}\xspace$: Albuquerque has homered in six of their first eight games to begin the season.

SWIPES: The Isotopes have compiled just four stolen bases on the season while also being caught four times, which is tied for the most in all of Triple-A (also: Norfolk, Sugar Land, Tacoma and Toledo).

WHO'S PITCHING? Salt Lake Bees backup catcher Sebastian Rivero came on to pitch last night in the ninth inning. It was the first time a position player pitched against Albuquerque since Tristen English on Sept. 21, when he earned the win for Reno in extra innings.

CELEBRATE GOOD TIMES: Jefry Yan punched out five batters in two scoreless innings last night. So far this season, Yan has not allowed a run in three outings (5.0 innings) while giving up just one hit, walking three and striking out nine.

SALT LAKE TIES: Bees right-handed pitcher Dakota Hudson pithed for the Isotopes in 2024 ... Salt Lake right-hander Chase Silseth hails from Farmington and was named Gatorade New Mexico Player of the Year in 2018 after his senior year at Piedra Vista High School ... Isotopes infielder Keston Hiura played in 37 games for the Bees last season, blasting 20 home runs with 42 RBI.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his fourth season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
