NEWS AND NOTES		
HOME SWEET HOME: Nashville's win on Tuesday night over Memphis was the 46th of the year at home to lead all Triple-A teams. Syracuse (42) and Columbus (41) both won on Tuesday night as well and are the only teams that could challenge the Sounds to finish the year with the most home wins in the International League. Nashville led the league in home wins in 2022, finishing the year at First Horizon Park 48-27, tied for the most wins at home in any season since 2005. Two more wins this week would guarantee the Sounds finish the second half of the season with a winning record - one of only two teams to have a winning record in all eight halves since moving to a split-season format in 2023. Oklahoma City (LAD) is the only other team to accomplish that.		
GOT WILK?: Brock Wilken recorded his 15th multi-hit game of the season - first since September 6 vs. Louisville - and finished Tuesday's series opener against the Redbirds 2-for-5 with the walk-off RBI, a walk, run, and a strikeout. He snapped a four-game hitless streak and bounced back from a 1-for-16 series in Durham last week. He is tied with Tyler Black and Akil Baddoo for the second-most multi-hit games on Nashville's active roster. Entering the night, Wilken was just 5-for-32 (.156) in nine games against the Redbirds this season with three of his hits coming in the matchup on June 20 in Memphis and was 1-for-20 against the Redbirds over his last six games. His walk in the bottom of the ninth inning was his 80th of the season, placing him in a tie with Brian Dayett (1982) for the 10th-most in a single season in Sounds franchise history. It was the third career walk-off for Wilken who recorded his last on May 25 of last season for		
Double-A Biloxi when he also reached on a fielder's choice. His first career walk-off hit was a RBI single to help the ACL Brewers beat the ACL Rangers in his sixth career game.		
BULLPEN BULLIES: After another seven innings without allowing an earned run in Tuesday's series opener against the Redbirds, Nashville lowered its bullpen ERA to 3.57. With five games remaining, the mark currently sits as the 7th-best in any season for Nashville since 2005. The 2007 club posted a 3.31 ERA (162 ER/440.1 IP). The bullpen's 57 wins this year are already the club's most in any season since 2005 and tied for the 10th-most for any Triple-A team over the span. Round Rock's bullpen posted a Triple-A best since 2005 with 67 wins in 2023.		
BROCK-OFF: Nashville's 5-4 walk-off win over Memphis was the Sounds' eighth walk-off win of the year. Brock Wilken delivered the game-winning run with grounder to second base in the bottom of the 11th inning to score Ramon Rodriguez. Wilken is the eighth different player to deliver a walk-off win for Nashville this season. Tuesday night was Nashville's second time going to 11 innings this year and the first since May 15 against Iowa when the Sounds walked-off the I-Cubs 4-3. The Sounds improved to 3-8 in extra innings this year with the win.		
KEY LOCK: Brandon Lockridge extended his current hitting streak to five games, tying his season high as part of a multi-hit day. After recording three of the Sounds' five hits over the last two games, he added his fifth multi-hit game, and second in his last three games, finishing Tuesday night 2-for-4 with a double, RBI, two runs, and a strikeout. He is 7-for-19 over his last five games with two doubles, three RBI, and a walk. Since returning to Nashville on August 23, he is hitting .266 (17-for-64) with a hit in 13 of his last 16 games.		
SO NICE WE DID IT BRYSE: Right-hander Bryse Wilson began his Major League Rehab assignment with 2.1 IP on Tuesday night in his first game action since he landed on the Brewers 15-day IL on August 31. He surrendered one unearned run on four hits with a pair of strikeouts against the Redbirds. In 12 relief appearances for the Brewers this season, Wilson has allowed seven earned runs across 24.2 IP with 22 strikeouts and just one walk. It was his first action in Triple-A since June 11 when he was with Lehigh Valley (PHI). After beginning the season in the Phillies org, Wilson appeared in 12 games for the Iron Pigs, going 3-5 with a 6.29 ERA in 11 starts. Despite pitching in 100 games for the Brewers between 2023-2024 & 2026, Tuesday night was his Nashville debut. He made 72 appearances between Gwinnett (2018-21), Indianapolis (2022), Charlotte (2025) and Lehigh Valley (2026) across the International League since 2018.		
WICHCRAFT: Brett Wichrowski worked his eighth straight game without an earned run allowed as he earned the win for Nashville on Tuesday night. Since August 23, the right-hander is 2-0, having allowed just four hits over his last 7.1 IP. He has issued just two walks over his last eight appearances with nine strikeouts.
