YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Patriots, 9-2. **Dayson Croes** hit an RBI double in the first and **Jean Carlos Sió** scored on an error after a steal in the second for a 2-0 Richmond lead. Somerset tied the score in the fifth with a two-run triple by Coby Morales. In the sixth, Josh Moylan hit a go-ahead, solo homer and Kevin Verde hit a two-run homer. In the seventh, Moylan, Manuel Palencia and Luis Durango had RBI hits before a sac fly by Connor McGinnis pushed the score to 9-2. **Trevor Cohen** went 4-for-5 for Richmond and stole three bases.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Somerset Patriots, Double-A affiliate, in the fourth of a six-game series. This series is the second between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels won five-of-six against the Patriots at CarMax Park from April 21-26. This series is Richmond's second of three straight against Northeast Division opponent and the team's second of two trips to Northeast Division ballparks this season.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 58-40 record is tied for the best in team history through 98 games, even with 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split seven and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 31-33 in their last 64 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 58 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 29 of them. In 18 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 10 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in each home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has three wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .286 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is fifth in MiLB.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.268), doubles (190) and sacrifice flies (40) this season and ranks fourth in hits (874). The team has combined for 101 homers this year, surpassing 11 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS and sacrifice flies. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown nine shutouts this season, which is the most in the Eastern League and tied for second in Double-A. At 35-16, the Flying Squirrels have the third-best home record in MiLB this season, trailing only High-A Bowling Green (37-10) and Low-A Hickory (31-14). Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .342 this year, which leads the minors.

THE PATRIOTS finished in second place in the Northeast Division first-half standings, 2.5 games behind Hartford. In the second half, they are in third place and 3.5 games behind first-place Reading. After going 3-9 from July 4-22, Somerset is 8-1 in its last nine games. This season, the Patriots lead all Double-A teams in homers (146). Somerset's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Yankees prospects list, including RHP Ben Hess (No. 6), RHP Cade Smith (No. 18), RHP Ben Grable (No. 19), RHP Chase Hampton (No. 21), LHP Xavier Rivas (No. 27) and OF Jace Avina (No. 30). MLB.com's top-30 Yankees prospects list features eight Somerset players, including Hess (No. 6), Smith (No. 15), Avina (No. 19), RHP Rory Fox (No. 20), Hampton (No. 21), Rivas (No. 24), Grable (No. 25) and RHP Tony Rossi (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Tyler Switalski** makes his fourth Double-A start and his first against the Patriots. He last pitched last Saturday against Hartford and held the Yard Goats to one run over his first four innings before allowing three in the sixth. He was handed a losing decision after allowing four runs in six innings, his longest start at Double-A so far and tied for his longest start of the season overall. Switalski began the season with High-A Eugene and went 2-5 with a 4.22 ERA in 16 outings (15 starts). At the time of his promotion, he was leading the Northwest League in strikeouts (94) and innings pitched (74.2). In his last start on Sunday for Eugene at Vancouver, he allowed five runs (four earned) over 3.1 innings. Over his previous six starts from May 30-June 30, Switalski posted a 3.66 ERA (13 ER/32.0 IP) with 42 strikeouts. Switalski pitched two seasons at Gardner-Webb University in North Carolina and was named Second-Team All-Big South as a sophomore in 2023. He transferred to West Virginia University for the 2024 season and was selected by the Giants that year in the 16th round of the MLB Draft. **For more on Switalski, see page two.**

FOR SOMERSET: Right-hander Chase Hampton makes his eighth Double-A start of the season and the first of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He was selected by the Yankees in the sixth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Texas Tech and reached Double-A for 11 starts in his first professional season in 2023. After being limited to seven starts in 2024 due to injury, Hampton had Tommy John surgery in April 2025 and missed the season. He returned to the mound in May and made six rehab starts between Low-A Tampa and High-A Hudson Valley before being assigned to Somerset on June 12. He last pitched last Saturday at New Hampshire and allowed two runs over 4.1 innings. Hampton is rated by Baseball America and MLB.com as the No. 21 Yankees prospect.

GRAND LARCENY: In the second game of Wednesday's doubleheader at Somerset, the Flying Squirrels set a single-game franchise record with 11 stolen bases, passing the previous record of eight (5/9/14 vs. ERI, 13 inn.). The 11 steals were also tied for the most in an Eastern League game since at least 2005, tied with two other games (POR @ SOM, 6/12/25 and 7/28/26, HFD vs. NH). Richmond set a single-inning franchise record with six stolen bases in the top of the third. All 11 steals were between the second and fourth innings, including 10 in the third and fourth. **Trevor Cohen** stole four bases in the game, tied for the second-most in a game in franchise history (Johneshwy Fargas, 6/8/19 @ NH), trailing only a five-steal game by Kelby Tomlinson (5/9/14 vs. ERI). The Flying Squirrels have 139 steals this season, which is second-most in franchise history behind 2014 (168). Since Tuesday, the Flying Squirrels lead MiLB with 20 stolen bases in 22 attempts.

HAPPY HOMECOMING: In his return to his home state, **Trevor Cohen** is batting .556 (10-for-18) in four games with two doubles, an RBI and eight stolen bases with five runs scored. He has picked up multiple hits in five straight games dating back to Sunday, batting .545 (12-for-22) in that span, raising his Double-A batting average from .212 to .345. Cohen is a native of Galloway, N.J., which is 90 minutes south of Bridgewater. He tied his career high for hits on Friday, going 4-for-5.

KILEN IT: In his first 13 Double-A games, **Gavin Kilen** is batting .292 (14-for-48) with seven doubles, a triple and nine RBIs. For the season, he leads all MiLB hitters with 34 doubles. He also leads all Giants minor league hitters with 74 RBIs this year. After playing in the All-Star Futures Game in Philadelphia, Kilen was promoted to Double-A on July 17. He has at least one hit in 10 of his 13 games in the Eastern League. Kilen was selected by the Giants last year out of the University of Tennessee with the 13th overall pick in the MLB Draft. He is tied for the third-highest pick in the MLB Draft in Flying Squirrels franchise history with Patrick Bailey (2020) and trailing only Joey Bart (2, 2018) and Hunter Bishop (10, 2019).

GO, DIEGO, GO!: In his last 25 games since June 28, **Diego Velasquez** is batting .403 (31-for-77) with a homer, five doubles, 11 walks, nine RBIs and nine stolen bases. Since joining the Flying Squirrels in July 2024, Velasquez has played 254 games. In Richmond's franchise history, Velasquez ranks second in sacrifices (19), third in walks (122), third in OBP (.374, min. 400 PA), fourth in stolen bases (43) and sixth in hits (250). In July, he ranked second in the EL in batting average (.389) and OBP (.463).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 318 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is fifth in batting average (.300) and fifth in OBP (.387). **Charlie Szkowny** is tied for second in triples (4). **Bo Davidson** is tied for third in homers (19) and eighth in SLG (.521). **Parks Harber** is eighth in batting average (.284) and ninth in OPS (.879). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and seventh in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (13) and tied for seventh in wins (7). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), eighth in ERA (4.22) and fifth in BAA (.238).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 8), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 9), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 10), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Junior Marte** (No. 29). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features six Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 9), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 22), Marte (No. 24) and **Maui Ahuna** (No. 30).

JULY WRAP: The Flying Squirrels went 9-14 in July, second-worst in the Eastern League. The Richmond pitching staff ranked 10th with a 4.95 ERA. The Richmond offense combined to hit .256, sixth in the league. In the EL, **Diego Velasquez** ranked second in batting average (.389), second in OBP (.463), tied for fifth in hits (28) and ninth in OPS (.963). **Jean Carlos Sió** ranked tied for fourth in homers (6). **Gavin Kilen** ranked tied for fifth in doubles (7). **Trevor Cohen** ranked tied for seventh in stolen bases (8). **Greg Farone** ranked tied for third in wins (3) and eighth in WHIP (1.13). **Cristian Alvarado** ranked tied for third in saves (3). **Charlie McDaniel** ranked third in innings pitched (28.0). **Junior Marte** ranked seventh in innings pitched (25.2) and 10th in WHIP (1.17).

1988: The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 5-0, at The Diamond. Tommy Dunbar hit for the cycle. He hit a triple in the first, homered in the third, singled in the fifth and hit a double in the seventh. Starter Dave Miller threw a six-hit shutout with four strikeouts and no walks. **2008:** The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 3-2, at The Diamond. \ With two outs in the bottom of the ninth, Jason Phillips tied the score, 2-2, with a double. In the bottom of the 10th, Barbro Canizares won the game with a walk-off single to score Ray Serrano. Richmond pitchers Jo-Jo Reyes, Matt DeSalvo and Jorge Julio held Columbus hitless over the final five innings. **2013:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Portland Sea Dogs, 6-5. Richmond trailed, 5-4, heading into the eighth until Mark Miniccozzi drove in Joe Panik to even the score. In the bottom of the 10th, Javier Herrera won the game with a walk-off single. The start of the game was delayed over two hours until 9:15 p.m. and it finished at 12:49 a.m. Miniccozzi finished the game 4-for-5 with two RBIs. Adam Duval had three hits, including his 12th homer in the sixth inning.
