NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies fell to the Reading Fightin Phils, 3-2, at FirstEnergy Stadium on Sunday night in the series finale. **Jeremiah Jackson** hit two solo home runs, which marked his first multi-homer with the Mets organization and 12th of his professional career. **Cameron Foster** allowed one run on three hits and two walks over four innings with four strikeouts. **Daniel Juarez** pitched a scoreless frame in relief.

SPROAT KEEPS SPROUTING: Mets No. 13 prospect **Brandon Sproat** is slated to make his third start at the Double-A level tonight against Harrisburg. Sproat recorded a career-high nine strikeouts over a career-high seven innings of work in his last start on Tuesday morning at Reading. The 23-year-old has allowed three runs or fewer in all eight of his professional appearances. Sproat holds a 1.45 ERA in eight appearances/seven starts across High-A Brooklyn and Binghamton, which ranks 12th among qualified pitchers in Minor League Baseball.

JACKSON HITS JACKS: **Jeremiah Jackson** belted two home runs on Sunday night at Reading, which marked his first multi-homer game as a member of the Mets organization. He was traded to the Mets by the Los Angeles Angels for RHP Dominic Leone at the trade deadline in 2023. It marked Jackson's 12th multi-homer game of his professional career. It marked Binghamton's first multi-home run game of the season after the team hit seven last year, headlined by Luke Ritter's three multi-homer games. After homering three times at Reading last week, Jackson now leads the team with seven long balls this season.

PARADA PARTY: Mets top catching prospect **Kevin Parada** doubled in the sixth inning on Saturday night and extended his hitting streak to eight games. Over his eight-game hitting streak, Parada is hitting .323 (10-for-31) with a .405 on-base percentage and a 1.051 OPS, along with two homers, seven runs batted in, and seven runs scored. Parada has a team-high 24 runs batted in, which is currently the seventh-most in the Eastern League. He has an .840 OPS, four homers, five doubles, and 15 RBIs over his last 16 games.

LIGHTNING MCLEAN: Mets No. 19 prospect **Nolan McLean** singled and drove in a run on Saturday night at Reading and has now recorded a hit in three of his first four Double-A games as a designated hitter. McLean is hitting .250 (4-for-16) with two runs batted in and a run scored over his first four games with Binghamton. The two-way player allowed three runs over four innings with five strikeouts in his Double-A pitching debut at Reading on Wednesday. McLean was the Mets' third-round draft pick in 2023 out of Oklahoma State.

SENATORS ROSTER: The Harrisburg Senators current roster features eight of the Washington Nationals top 30 prospects and three of the top four prospects in the organization, via MLB Pipeline: **#2 Dylan Crews (#7 OVR)**, **#3 Brady House (#37 OVR)**, **#4 Yohandy Morales (#89 OVR)**, **#8 Robert Hassell III**, **#17 Andrew Pinckney**, **#23 Cole Henry**, **#24 Israel Pineda** and **#30 Andry Lara**. Crews, House, Morales, Pinckney, Henry, and Lara all played in the 2024 Spring Breakout game for the Nationals prospects against the Mets prospects at Clover Park on March 15. Crews as the No. 2 overall pick in the 2023 MLB Draft out of LSU, after leading the Tigers to the national title.

LAST START: Sproat struck out a career-high nine batters over a career-high seven innings at Reading on Tuesday morning, while allowing three runs on six hits and one walk...Sproat did not allow a hit until allowing a solo homer with one out in the fourth inning...Allowed 3 HR.

2024 SEASON: First professional season...Began the season with High-A Brooklyn...Made professional debut on April 9 against Asheville and threw 2.2 scoreless innings with five strikeouts...Made six appearances and five starts for the Cyclones and went 2-1 with a 1.07 ERA and 33 strikeouts over 25.1 innings...Did not allow more than three hits in any outing with Brooklyn and only allowed a combined three earned runs over six appearances, spanning 25.1 innings...Among pitchers with 25.0+ innings pitched, Sproat ranked third in the South Atlantic League in ERA and fifth in batting average against (.141).

LAST SEASON: Went 8-3 with a 4.66 ERA and 134 strikeouts over 106.1 innings in 19 starts at the University of Florida...Started Game One of the College World Series Finals against LSU and allowed two runs over four innings with seven strikeouts.
