



WooSox GAME NOTES

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SEPTEMBER 16th DURHAM (37-32)/(65-79) at WORCESTER (38-30)/(74-65) 6:05 pm

Durham Bulls RHP Chris Clark (1-1, 6.15) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Blake Wehunt (3-1, 3.02)

Five Guys (er, Games) – The Worcester Red Sox – who began their final series and homestand of the season last night at Polar Park in rousing fashion - rallying to tie the game vs. Durham with two outs in the 8th inning and then winning it with 2 outs in the 10th inning, 2-1 – are still very much alive in the amazing International League 2nd half pennant race with just five games remaining in the regular season. The WooSox are 2½ games behind front-running Indianapolis (who scored 2 runs in the 9th inning to win earlier today at Gwinnett, 6-5) as Indy is currently alone in 1st-place (pending Rochester’s result tonight) and thus presently own the one playoff spot that comes with the best winning pct. in the 2nd half of the International League season. Tonight’s game two of this 6-game set vs. the Durham Bulls (AAA-Tampa Bay) at Polar Park begins at 6:05 pm and can be seen on NESN+ and heard on NASH 98.9 FM and The Pike 100.1 FM.

Running With the Bulls – Last night was the first meeting between the teams this year and was a thrilling opener to a series that continues tonight, Thursday, and Friday evenings (all at 6:05 pm) and then over the weekend on Saturday at 4:05 pm and Sunday in the season finale at 1:05 pm. All of these games take place during what again is being affectionately called “Fan Appreciation Week/Weekend” at Polar Park in a tribute to all of WooSox Nation. Last night, Allan Castro, who belted a 2-run HR in the top of the 9th inning to give the WooSox an 8-7 win at Lehigh Valley in their last game on Sunday, was the hero again as he laced an RBI single to right field with two outs in the 10th inning to plate Max Ferguson with the game winning run in Worcester’s dramatic, 2-1 walk-off victory (Worcester’s 6th walk-off of the year, their 21st last at-bat win, and their 33rd come-from-behind victory of the season).

Keep Hope Alive - The WooSox – who have won 4 of 6 and 9 of their last 13 games – are doing their best to keep their uphill (but climbing closer) playoff hopes alive for as long as they can this week and hopefully into the final weekend. Worcester enters play tonight trailing 1st-place Indianapolis by 2½-games, but the WooSox are in 5th-place in the crowded International League Pennant race. Only the team with the best record in the 2nd half among all 20 IL clubs will earn a playoff spot and the opportunity to go to 1st half champ Memphis next week to face the Redbirds in a best 2 out of 3 series to determine the 2026 International League Champion.

Pennant Race - With 5 games remaining in the regular season for all but Indianapolis & Scranton/WB (who each have 4 games left after playing this afternoon), the International League 2nd half pennant race remains up for grabs. Five teams are within 2½-games of the top spot and the one playoff berth that comes with the best overall 2nd half record in the 20-team IL. Worcester is in 5th place overall and 2½ -games behind front-running Indianapolis who is in 1st-place with a .592 winning pct. to lead the 20-team league (the 2nd half champ will be determined by winning pct.). Rochester is next at .586 and can move back into a tie with Indy with a win tonight at Buffalo. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (.574) is 1½-games back pending the result of their game at home vs. Jacksonville this afternoon, then Syracuse at .565 and 2-games behind (the Mets play host to Lehigh Valley tonight). Worcester is next at .559 and 2½ games back. Scoreboard watching continues this week - and hopefully weekend.

Coming Up Winners – At 74-65 with five games remaining, the WooSox have clinched their sixth winning season in their six years of existence since their inaugural season in Worcester in 2021. Including this season, the WooSox are 457-404 all-time for a .531 winning pct. with a 233-198 record at home (.541) compared to a 224-206 mark on the road (.521).

How Worcester Has Won - The WooSox team records through the years...74-54 in 2021, 75-73 in 2022, 79-68 in 2023, 79-71 in 2024, 76-73 in 2025, and 74-65 thus far in 2026. The WooSox are a perfect 6-for-6 as winners since they made the move from Pawtucket to Worcester for the 2021 season. The best the Pawtucket Red Sox ever posted was five straight winning seasons in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000. For what it's worth, the WooSox have had 6 games canceled due to weather this year so they will ultimately play 144 of their scheduled 150 games this season.

WooSox History – Furthermore, for the fifth time in the six years of Polar Park, the WooSox will finish with a winning home record. Their only losing season at home came in 2022. All others have been significant winners. Worcester is 38-30 at home this season with five home games remaining. The WooSox needed a dramatic, 8-7 last-inning victory in their final road game on Sunday at Lehigh Valley to finish 36-35 on the road this season. It is their fourth winning road record in six years (along with a .500 road season and one losing road year). Worcester had four road games canceled due to weather and thus only played 71 of their scheduled 75 road games while they have had two home games canceled and will play 73 home games. Here are the WooSox all-time records overall as well as home & away during each of their six seasons to this point...

Young Arms Growing Up – During a two week stretch from July 21 – August 4, the Boston Red Sox promoted three young righthanded starting pitchers from Double-A Portland to Worcester. All three have been impressive – especially lately. **Blake Wehunt**, 25, was the first to be promoted on July 21 after going 5-4 with a 3.52 ERA in 13 starts for the Sea Dogs. In his last four starts for the WooSox he is 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA (5 ER in 21.2 IP). **John Holobetz**, 24, joined the WooSox one week later on July 28 after posting a 5-3, 4.33 record in 17 games (15 starts) for Portland to begin the year. In his two starts this month for the WooSox he is 1-0 with a 0.79 ERA (1 ER in 11.1 IP) with 11 SO. And then, one week after Holobetz arrived, **Gage Ziehl**, 23, was promoted to make his Triple-A debut. Ziehl went 6-3 with a 4.33 ERA in 17 starts for Portland and in his three starts this September with Worcester he is 1-0 with a 3.12 ERA (6 ER in 17.1 IP). Wehunt, Holobetz, and Ziehl are all expected to make their final appearances of the year this week/weekend at Polar Park during Worcester's last series.

Home Goods– The WooSox are 38-30 at home. Their team batting average at Polar Park this season is .257 (568-for-2209) while Worcester pitchers have a 4.87 ERA at home (332 ER in 614 IP). Worcester has been out-homered at Polar Park, 88-51 but they have out-scored their opponents at home, 383-372.

The End of the Road – The WooSox finished 36-35 on the road this season. The team batting average on the road was .249, but the WooSox out-scored their opponents, 349-303 on the road this season. The Sox were out-homered, 78-74. WooSox pitchers had a 4.14 ERA in away games. Worcester's next road game won't come for about 6½ months when the 2027 WooSox travel to Allentown, PA to take on the Lehigh Valley IronPigs next March 30th.

Dancing in September – The WooSox are 8-4 in September and have out-scored their opponents by a 71-46 margin this month. Sox hitters are batting .291 (129-for-444) with 14 HR while Sox pitchers are 8-4 with a 3.61 ERA (43 ER in 107.1 IP) in September.

Ebb & Flow - Prior to going 9-4 over the last two+ weeks, the Sox had lost 9 of their previous 14 games. Worcester was 5-13 between August 9-29 and that slump came immediately after the WooSox went 15-2 between July 22 – August 8. Between June 28 and August 8, the WooSox had their best stretch in club-history as they won 24 of 30 games.

Countdown - Barring any other weather-related cancellations, Worcester will wind up playing a total of 144 games this season thanks to 6 games that have already been cancelled (4 in the 1st half and 2 in the 2nd half) with 5 of those canceled games occurring on the road. The 144 games will be the fewest the WooSox will play in a season since their Covid-reduced inaugural season of 2021 when they played 128 games. The next fewest was 147 games in 2023.

Peak Performance – Worcester (now 38-30 in the 2nd half) began the 2nd half with an 0-5 record. They peaked at 11-games above .500 in the 2nd half twice – the latest on August 13 at 26-15. As far as their overall record, the WooSox (now 74-65) have been a season-best 12-games over .500 twice – the latest on August 13 at 62-50. Their lowest level came on June 27 when they were 36-40.

Warm & Hot Sox –

Franklin Arias	Had his 8-game hitting streak snapped on Friday. Now hit in 10 of his last 11 games (20-for-49, .408) with 4 2B, 1 HR, 8 RBI, 11 runs scored. Has struck out just 5 times in his last 16 games (72 plate appearances). Also had a 7-game hitting streak from August 19-28 but went 0-for-1 as a late replacement on August 29. So he has hit safely in 17 of his last 19 games (28-for-73, .384) with 8 2B & 11 RBI. And last 36 games is batting .350 (50-for-143) with 11 2B, 5 HR, 31 RBI, 25 runs scored. Has 24 HR total on the season (19 with Portland & 5 w/ Worcester) and 84 RBI (52 with Portland & 32 w/ Worcester) in 113 games total.
Kristian Campbell	Placed on the 7-day injured list on September 10 with a left foot contusion. Hit in 6 of his last 9 games (12-for-32, .375) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 11 RBI, 6 runs. Had a 20-game on-base streak from July 5 – August 6 (ended on August 7 despite two line-drive outs). Last 43 games since July 3 is batting .327 (47-for-144) with 30 walks. Is tied for 7 th in the league with 73 BB and 9 th in OBP (.383).
Vinny Capra	Hit in 6 of his last 10 games (12-for-42, .286) with 3 HR, 5 RBI, 9 runs scored. Had his 14-game hitting streak – longest on WooSox this season – end on August 12 (he did walk in the game). Last 36 games is batting .310 (39-for-126) with 4 2B, 5 HR, 14 RBI, 29 runs scored. Is 4 th in league with 83 runs scored.
Romy Gonzalez	Went 0-for-1 with a walk before being removed from the game on September 8 (elbow) ending his 8-game hitting streak. Returned to lineup on Tuesday going 1-for-3 with 2B, BB, RBI. So has hit in 9 of his last 10 games (17-for-36, .472) with 3 2B, 2 HR, 12 RBI, and 7 runs scored. Also hit in 17 of his last 21 games (31-for-79, .392) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 21 RBI and 13 runs scored.
Mikey Romero	Went 0-for-4 on Tuesday ending his 9-game hitting streak. Now hit in 9 of his last 10 games (17-for-44, .386) with 4 2B, 4 RBI, and 8 runs scored.
Braiden Ward	Leads the league with 58 SB setting a new WooSox club-record (and the “modern day” Red Sox organization Triple-A record - since 1973) for stolen bases in a season that was held by David Hamilton with 57 in 2023. Ward has been hit by pitch 30 times to lead Minor League Baseball. Those 30 HBP are a new modern day Boston Red Sox Triple-A record that was held by Pawtucket INF David Eckstein with 20 HBP in 2000. Ward also is tied for 9 th in the International League with 76 runs scored.
Hobie Harris	Last 17 relief appearances is 4-0 with 3 SV and a 1.19 ERA – 22.2 IP, 13 H, 5 R, 3 ER, 14 BB, 25 SO.
John Holobetz	In 2 starts in September is 1-0 giving up 1 ER in 11.1 IP with 11 SO.
Sam McWilliams	Last 9 relief appearances is 1-1 with 1 SV and a 1.59 ERA – 11.1 IP, 9 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 15 SO.
Jedixson Paez	Since returning to Worcester on September 4 after making his Boston Red Sox debut on September 1 has made 2 starts for the WooSox – 9.1 IP, 7 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 1 BB, 8 SO.
Noah Song	Last 12 relief appearances has a 2.03 ERA – 27 IP, 17 H, 9 R, 8 ER, 9 BB, 35 SO.
Blake Wehunt	Last 4 starts is 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA giving up 5 ER in 21.2 IP with 18 SO.
Gage Ziehl	In 3 starts in September is 1-0 with a 3.12 ERA allowing 6 ER in 17.1 IP.

Last Season and All-Time vs. Durham – The WooSox went 7-5 vs. Durham last season (4-2 here at Polar Park and 3-3 in Durham). Worcester leads the all-time series, 15 games to 10 over the Bulls.

Durham Dynasty - The Durham Bulls became the Triple-A affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays in 1998 when they joined the International League. From 1998 – 2019 (the last year of the former International League), Durham won nine (9) Governors' Cup Championships as champions of the IL post-season. Those titles came in 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003 (over the PawSox), 2009, 2013 (over the PawSox again), 2017, and 2018. Pawtucket did defeat Durham in a thrilling 5-game Governors' Cup Finals series in 2014. In 2021 in the new Triple-A East, Durham had the best record of any of the 20-teams in the league winning the Triple-A East South Division with their 86-44 overall record. And in 2022 the Bulls won their 10th Governor's Cup before falling one game short of another title in September of 2023.

First Things First – The WooSox have scored in the 1st inning in 8 of their last 12 games. The 1st inning has been their most productive of the season as the Sox have scored 118 runs in the 1st. Their next best inning is the 3rd with 96 runs. The WooSox have out-scored their opponents, 118-75 in the 1st inning this year.

Daydream Believer – The WooSox have a 31-22 record in day games compared to a 43-43 mark at night.

Six Days a Week – The WooSox finished 10-12 on Tuesdays this season. They are 16-7 on Wednesdays, 16-7 on Thursdays, 9-15 on Fridays, 8-15 on Saturdays, and 15-9 on Sundays.

Series Matters – The WooSox are 12-9-4 in their 25 series played on the year...12 wins, 9 losses, and 4 splits. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

Homer Haven – The WooSox belted 17 HR in their last 13 games after hitting just 1 HR total in their previous 9 games. They are 56-21 when they homer in a game this season, however, they are next to last in the International League with 125 HR on the year.

Ups and Downs – Worcester has been a streaky team over the last 3+ months. The WooSox had a 5-game losing streak from May 19-23, a 4-game winning streak from May 26-20, a 5-game winning streak (June 4-9), a 4-game losing skid right after that (June 10-13), a 5-game losing streak (June 23-27), and right after that a 4-game winning streak from June 28 – July 2. In July the WooSox had another 4-game winning streak from July 5-9, a season-best 6-game winning streak from July 22-26, and a 5-game winning streak (July 29 – August 2). Worcester's 6-game winning streak (July 22-26) was their longest since their club-record 9-game winning streak last year from June 1-11, 2025. They had a 4-game losing streak (August 14-18) and another 4-game skid from August 20-23. And the Sox were recently on a 5-game winning streak (August 30 – September 5).

Plead the Fifth – Worcester endured their third 5-game losing streak from June 23-27. They also had 5-game losing streaks from May 19-23 (all at home vs. Rochester) and from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). Worcester's longest losing streak all of last year was also 5 games (April 25-30, 2025). They have not lost 6 straight since a 6-game losing streak from May 22-28, 2024. Their longest losing streak in their nearly 6-year history came in 2022 when they lost 10 consecutive games from May 5-15, 2022.

Weather or Not – The WooSox had their game on September 2 in Buffalo officially canceled – it was their first rainout in just over six weeks since July 21 at home vs. Jacksonville. The Sox have now had 6 games cancelled due to inclement weather (4 in the 1st half and 2 in the 2nd half) with 5 of those cancelled on the road. Worcester has had 6 other games postponed this season. Overall they have lost 4 home openings and 8 road openings due to inclement weather. Last year the WooSox set a new club record for most home games either postponed or cancelled in a single season with 9, along with 2 other road games postponed, for a total of 11 PPD.

August Moon - The WooSox – coming off their best July ever (16-7) – finished below .500 in August with a 12-14 record. In August, the Sox batted .246 (210-for-855) with 16 HR while Sox pitchers were 12-14 with a 4.43 ERA (114 ER in 231.2 IP) with 32 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month of August, however, 137 runs while allowing 125.

August Leaders – **Romy Gonzalez** was Worcester's leading hitter in August with a .333 average in 15 games with 2 HR & 12 RBI. **Franklin Arias** was next at .305 in 22 games with 2 HR & 18 RBI. On the pitching side, relievers **Hobie Harris** was 2-0 with a 0.59 ERA and 3 SV in 10 relief appearances, **Noah Song** went 1-0, 2.76 in 6 RA, and **Tyler Samaniego** was 1-0, 2.79 in 8 RA.

A History-Making Month – July of 2026 will be a month to remember in both Red Sox and WooSox Nation. The Boston Red Sox, under a certain former WooSox manager, had their best month in their nearly 126-year history going 21-4 in July. Meanwhile, the Worcester Red Sox might not have been able to equal their big brothers in Boston, but they matched the best month in their almost six-year history finishing with a 16-7 record this July.

A Very Fine July – The WooSox finished 16-7 in July to tie for the best month in Worcester club-history. The 2021 WooSox also went 16-7 (.696) during September of their inaugural season. Worcester's winningest month ever in terms of victories was July of 2024 when they went 18-10 (.642). Worcester batters hit .270 this July (199-for-737) with 23 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.72 ERA during the month (103 ER in 196.1). The Sox out-scored their opponents, 145-113 in July. Furthermore, Worcester's 145 runs scored in July were the most of any club in the 20-team International League and their 40 stolen bases during the month were 2nd most in the league (Jacksonville had 45 SB).

July Leaders – **Kristian Campbell** led the WooSox in batting in July with a .379 average in 19 games (22-for-58) with 4 2B, 2 HR, 11 RBI, 13 walks (tied for most on team), and 15 runs scored (to lead the club). **Mickey Gasper** was next with a .367 average in 18 games (22-for-60) with 6 2B, 2 HR, 10 RBI. **Andrew Knizner** at .327 in 15 games (18-for-55, 6 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI) and **Braiden Ward** at .322 in 17 games (19-for-59, 3 2B, 2 3B, 1 HR, 6 RBI, 12 SB) also had excellent Julys. **Vinny Capra** and **Brett Harris** led the team with 14 RBI apiece. **Tyler McDonough**, sent to Double-A Portland on July 28, batted .357 in 14 games with 3 HR & 12 RBI. On the pitching side, **Angel Bastardo** went 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA in 9 relief appearances in July while **Tyler Uberstine** was 1-1 with a 1.88 ERA in 8 games.

June Tune – The WooSox went 11-13 in June suffering their second straight losing month. The WooSox went 10-15 in May after a 17-12 mark in March/April. Worcester pitchers had a 4.65 ERA in June (109 ER in 211 IP) while batters hit .245 (197-for-805) with 26 HR. The Sox were out-scored by their opponents, 124-109 in June.

Final June Leaders – OF **Allan Castro** (.305 in 22 games) led the WooSox in batting in June followed closely by INF **Mikey Romero** (.300 in 19 games). Romero led the team in HR (5) while Castro led the club in RBI (14). Among regular pitchers, RHP **Oswaldo Berrios** was 2-1 with a 0.57 ERA in 7 games while RHP **Wyatt Olds** was 1-1 with a 0.93 ERA in 9 games in June.

May We Skip the Month – Worcester's 10-15 record in May was the second worst month they have ever had behind only a 10-16 month of July during their inaugural season of 2021. Worcester has been remarkably consistent in their history and more recently since August of 2024 they have had just three losing months in their last ten months. The WooSox went 15-10 this April.

Monthly Team Stats for May – Worcester hitters batted .235 this May (193-for-823) with 41 doubles, 4 triples, and 22 HR in 25 games while WooSox pitchers had a 4.85 ERA (118 ER in 219 IP) with 29 HRA. The Sox out-scored by their opponents, 126-110.

Monthly Individual Leaders for May – WooSox May leaders offensively included: **Anthony Seigler** at .344 in 18 games in May with 3 HR & 14 RBI and **Nate Eaton** at .289 in 19 games with 6 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 9 RBI. On the pitching side: **Tommy Kahnle** made 11 scoreless relief appearances in May covering 11 shutout innings; **Alec Gamboa** was 1-2, 1.89 in 5 G, 3 GS; **Eduardo Rivera** was 3-0, 2.20 in 8 RA; and **Noah Song** was 1-0, 2.25 in 7 RA.

An Enjoyable April – After going 2-2 to begin the season from March 27-31, Worcester posted a winning April going 15-10. The Sox finished April alone in 1st-place in the International League East Division. The 15 wins this April equal the most Worcester won in any month last season when they went 15-10 in June and 15-13 in August.

April Stats Leaders – As a club the WooSox batted .252 in April with 19 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.63 ERA with 24 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month, 127-122. **Vinny Capra** led the Sox in average in April hitting .322 in 18 games with 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a team-high 18 runs scored. **Matt Thaiss** (.324 in 11 games with 2 HR & 11 RBI), **Nate Eaton** (.301 in 23 games with 5 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR & 10 RBI), and **Kristian Campbell** (.294 in 23 games) all enjoyed fine Aprils. Leading pitchers during the month were **Payton Tolle** (2-0, 0.82 in 2 GS) and **Jake Bennett** (2-0, 1.00 in 4 GS) while **Tayron Guerrero** was the best out the bullpen posting a 1.13 ERA in 7 relief appearances with 2 saves.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and the 2025 squad went 76-73.

Fun Fact – Of the 305 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their nearly 6-year history (up to today), a total of 222 of them have played in the Major Leagues (73%) including 151 with the Boston Red Sox (49%).

Portland Sea Dogs Recap – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs finished the second half with a 36-32 record and an overall season mark of 71-65.

WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES – None today. The WooSox are at the roster limit with 28 active players not counting rehabbing RHP Tanner Houck who tossed a hitless 7th inning on Tuesday night on 1 walk with 3 strikeouts. Houck, recovering from Tommy John surgery in August of 2025, is expected to pitch in relief for the WooSox again this Saturday.

Worcester has made a total of 236 player moves thus far this season. The all-time Worcester (and Pawtucket) franchise-record is 281 player moves in 2024.

Except for three occasions, the WooSox have not gone more than back-to-back days without making a player transaction **all season**. The WooSox went three consecutive days without a player transaction from September 12-14 (although they did not play on Sept. 14), from May 30, May 31, and June 1 (although they did not play on June 1) and just after their season-opener, Worcester did not make a move during four straight days from March 28-31 (although they DNP on March 30) and that is the longest they have gone without a transaction all year.

The WooSox have used a total of 72 players this season (45 pitchers and 27 position players). RHP Johan Oviedo is expected to become #73 when he begins a rehab assignment as Worcester's starting pitcher tomorrow.. The all-time Worcester (and Pawtucket) franchise-record is an incredible 84 players used during the 2024 season (47 pitchers and 37 position players).

Furthermore, 22 different WooSox players have been promoted directly from Worcester to Boston this season (not counting rehabbers).
