### FIVE-RUN SEVENTH PUSHES RIDERS OVER MISSIONS:

The Frisco RoughRiders won their second consecutive game over the San Antonio Missions, taking Sunday's series finale with a 9-7 final score. **Ezequiel Duran** doubled twice on his way to a 4-for-5 day, scoring twice and driving in a pair of runs. The top four Frisco (24-20) hitters of **Jonathan Ornelas**, **Justin Foscue**, **Blaine Crim** and **Duran** combined to go 10-for-17 in Sunday's win while scoring seven times. **Dustin Harris**, **J.P. Martinez** and **Foscue** all homered in the Sunday win, increasing their season total to 63, third-best in the Texas League behind Amarillo (68) and Tulsa (71). San Antonio (23-21) plated their first run on the first pitch of the game from **Avery Weems** to **Esteyru Ruiz**, who hit his eighth home run of the year to give the Missions a 1-0 lead. Frisco quickly erased the deficit in the bottom of the first, thanks to a leadoff **Ornelas** double and an RBI knock from **Foscue**. **Duran** doubled in **Foscue** two batters later, giving the Riders a 2-1 lead. **Duran's** two doubles increased his tally to 21 on the season, which leads all of baseball. After a scoreless second inning, Frisco stretched their lead with two more runs in the third inning on back-to-back doubles from **Crim** and **Duran**. With two outs, **Martinez** drove in **Duran** with a base hit to give Frisco a 4-0 advantage. **Harris** slugged his eighth home run of the year, 433 feet, in the bottom of the fifth inning, scoring **Crim** and **Duran** to erase San Antonio's three-run mark in the top of the fifth. After the Missions scored a run in the seventh, **Martinez** knocked his eighth home run in the bottom of the inning and **Foscue** got his third in the eighth to give the Riders a 9-5 lead. San Antonio pushed two runs across in the top of the ninth but was denied by reliever **Chase Lee** to finalize the 9-7 win. Frisco reliever **Tim Brennan** (1-0) struck out two batters in 2.1 innings, giving up one run on three hits. **Michel Baez** (4-1) continued his rehab assignment for the Padres with San Antonio and gave up three runs on the **Harris** longball.

### RIDERS OFFENSE BLOOMING LIKE MAY FLOWERS?

In the month of May, the RoughRiders have exploded on the offensive side, tying the Tennessee Smokies (Double-A, Cubs) with 43 home runs to lead all of Minor League Baseball. Their .470 slugging percentage as a team is second in the Texas League (Tulsa, .499) and sixth in Minor League Baseball as well. Their 6.0 runs per game in the month are third in the Texas League as well and 16th in the minors.

### NO ONE MAN SHOULD HAVE ALL THAT POWER:

The RoughRiders have relied heavily on the home run ball this season. Through 45 games, Frisco has hit 63 long balls (1.4 per game) which is third in the Texas League and tied for 14th in Minor League Baseball. At this rate, the RoughRiders would finish the season with 193 home runs, a mark which would be the most in franchise history (beating 2007 when Frisco hit 176 home runs). In May, the RoughRiders have hit 43 home runs in 25 games, tied for the best total in Minor League Baseball (and averaging 1.7 per game). Out of their 45 total games, the Riders have hit home runs in 31 games, which means that when they hit a home run, they are averaging 2.0 home runs per game when they hit them. In the 14 games that the Riders have not hit a home run, Frisco is just 7-7. **Blaine Crim** leads the Riders with 10 long balls - and is tied for sixth in the league - while **Ezequiel Duran** is tied for 14th with his seven homers. **J.P. Martinez** has hit home runs in consecutive games entering the series against Wichita.

### CRIM CRUSH:

**Blaine Crim** has heated up as the season has shifted into late May. Over his last 25 games, **Crim** is hitting .348 (32-for-92)/.426/.717 with seven doubles, nine home runs and 25 RBIs. **Crim** is also on a 13-game on-base streak, hitting .375/.474/.667 with five doubles, three home runs, 11 RBIs and 12 runs. **Crim** led the Rangers organization in 2021 with 29 home runs and he is atop the org again this season with 10 so far in 2022. His eight homers in May are tied for the most in the Texas League and the 8th-most in Minor League Baseball.

### DURAN, DURAN: DOUBLE TROUBLE

Riders infielder **Ezequiel Duran** leads all of Minor League Baseball in doubles with 21 (only **Matt Olson** of the Atlanta Braves has as many, 21, in MLB). After a monster game in Tulsa on May 15th, going four-for-four with two doubles, two home runs, five runs scored (tying a franchise record) and five RBIs, **Duran** is now hitting .391 (34-for-87)/.427/.759 over his last 22 games with 12 doubles, one triple, six home runs, 23 RBIs and 19 runs scored. The Rangers No. 4 prospect by MLB.com has a .923 OPS this season now. In May, **Duran** is fourth in the Texas League in OPS (1.123), second in SLG (.717) and first in extra-base hits (19). After striking out 27.6 percent of the time last year in High-A between the Yankees and Rangers systems, his strikeout rate is down to 17.0 percent this season, under the MLB average of 21 percent.

### AYYY, IT'S THE FOSC:

Riders infielder **Justin Foscue** has caught fire for Frisco. After starting in Extended Spring Training because of back tightness, he joined the club on April 19th. **Foscue** went 1-for-7 in his first two games, but in his last 20, the former Mississippi State Bulldog has hit .315 (23-for-73)/.457/.548 with nine doubles, a triple, two home runs, 12 RBIs, 18 walks and 12 runs. He snapped a 20-game on base streak on Wednesday, where he owned a .462 OBP and a 1.016 OPS. He was the first RoughRiders player since 2017 (**Scott Heineman**, 25 games) with an on-base streak of 20 games or longer. The longest streak in franchise history is 50 games in 2012 by **Jurickson Profar**.

### JONNY ON THE SPOT:

Riders infielder **Jonny Ornelas** has been tearing the cover off of the baseball in recent days. **Ornelas** has batted .356 (57-for-160)/.394/.488/.882 in his last 38 games. He has eight games with at least three hits this season to lead the club. **Ornelas** is also the youngest player on the Riders and the 22-year-old is the 10th-youngest in the Texas League. **Ornelas** owns a .345 average on the season, which is third in the Texas League, third in Double-A, the best in the Texas Rangers organization and 11th in MiLB. **Ornelas** owns 58 hits, the most in the Texas League and tied for fourth in MiLB.

### REARVIEW MIRRORS:

Since the 2019 season ended and the standings reset on September 3rd, 2019, the RoughRiders have not been in second place for 1,002 days. From the season-opening game in 2021, the RoughRiders held first place the entire season and have now been in first place for every game in 2022 as well.

### ABOUT JACK

-Leiter was drafted in the first round (No. 2 overall) in 2021 by the Rangers out of Vanderbilt University. With the Commodores, Leiter was a unanimous First Team All-American and a finalist for both the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Trophy.

-Threw first regular-season, complete-game no-hitter to start SEC play since 1971 against No.16 South Carolina on March 20th, 2021. He walked the first batter of the game before retiring the last 27 he saw with 16 strikeouts on 124 pitches. Followed up that no-hitter with 7.0 no-hit innings in his next start (20.2 consecutive no-hit innings over three starts from March 20th - April 2nd).

-Drafted in 20th round in 2019 by NYY out of Delbarton School (NJ). Named 2019 New Jersey Gatorade POY, striking out 95 in 57 innings as a senior.

-The family lineage is strong with Jack. His father, Al, pitched in 19 MLB seasons (1987-2005), making two All-Star teams and winning both the 1993 and 1997 World Series. His uncle, Mark, played 11 seasons in the majors (1990-99; 2001) and his cousin, Mark Jr., pitched two seasons (2017-2018) with Philadelphia and Toronto. Al now works as an analyst for MLB Network.

### 2022 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2022 season as the No. 17 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com. He is listed as the No. 1 prospect in the Rangers organization as well.

-Leiter dazzled in his professional debut, striking out seven over his three innings against the Arkansas Travelers on April 9th. The righty helped draw the largest crowd since 2019 at Riders Field for the debut (9,322).

-Threw the Riders first quality start of the season on May 7th against Arkansas. Leiter retired the last 15 batters he saw, allowing just two hits (one in the first and one in the second inning).

### 2021 SEASON

-After being drafted second overall in the 2021 draft, Leiter did not pitch in the minor leagues. Instead, he returned to Vanderbilt to work out, continue college and prepare for 2022. Did not finish degree, but got closer.

### MORE INFO

-Leiter was high school teammates with Yankees No. 1 prospect (No. 8 in baseball) Anthony Volpe at Delbarton School (NJ).

### ABOUT KEVIN

-Originally drafted by the Phillies in the 2nd round of the 2016 draft out of Santa Barbara High School.

-Gowdy was teammates with Ian Anderson (Braves), Hunter Greene (Reds) and Forrest Whitley (Astros) on the 2015 World Baseball Softball Confederation U-18 Baseball World Cup in Japan, winning with the gold medal.

-He was committed to UCLA before signing with Phillies, joining Mickey Moniak (1st overall pick by PHI) and Blake Rutherford (18th overall by NYY) as UCLA commits to sign professional contracts.

-Wears stirrups on just days that he pitches. He has been wearing stirrups since he was required to on his seventh grade team.

### 2022 SEASON

-First two outings came out of the bullpen for RoughRiders.

-After two spot starts, earned long relief role for Frisco.

### 2021 SEASON

-Traded on July 30th, 2021 from Phillies to Rangers in Kyle Gibson deal. Came to Texas with RHPs Spencer Howard and Josh Gessner while RHPs Ian Kennedy and Hans Crouse joined Gibson in the deal to Philadelphia.

-Opponents hit .275/.326/.421/.748 against Gowdy in 2021.

### 2020 SEASON

-Struck out 17 of 44 (38.6 percent) batters faced in the Fall Developmental league while allowing just two runs over 10.2 innings.

### 2019 SEASON

-Ended the season as the No. 24 prospect in the Phillies system by MLB.com.

### 2018-17 SEASONS

-Missed seasons recovering from "Tommy John" surgery. Ranked as Phillies No. 8 prospect at the end of the 2017 season by MLB.com.

-Developed splitter in lieu of his changeup during his rehab. Couldn't get a feel for his change up with new arm action after the surgery.
