LAST NIGHT: Round Rock dealt the Skeeters a 7-0 loss Friday night at Constellation Field. It was the Skeeters' first shutout loss of the season.

QUINTANA: Prior to Saturday's game, the Astros traded C Lorenzo Quintana to Miami. Quintana has been assigned to Jacksonville (AAA). The Astros signed the Cuban native to a minor league contract in '17. He's spent three seasons in the Astros system, hitting a combined .283 (177x625) with 28 home runs and 102 RBIs in 172 games.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to Saturday's game, OF Carlos Machado was assigned to Sugar Land from Corpus Christi (AA). Machado has played in a game with Fayetteville (A-) and Corpus Christi this year, going a combined 1x5. The 23-year-old hit .206 (33x160) with a homer and 15 RBIs in 46 games with Quad Cities (A) in '19.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Astros catcher Jason Castro began an MLB Rehab Assignment Friday with the Skeeters, going 0x2 on the night. Castro has been on the 10-Day IL since May 25 with left achilles soreness. He's hit .271 (13x48) with two home runs and eight RBIs in 20 games for the Astros this season. He signed a two-year contract with the Astros this past offseason after appearing with the Astros from 2010, '12-16, including an All-Star appearance in '13.

WRECK IT RALPH: Ralph Garza Jr. was recalled by the Astros prior to their game Friday in Minnesota. Garza Jr. is making his second stint with the Astros this season. He made his Major League debut on May 29 vs. San Diego.

DE LA DINGER: Bryan De La Cruz hit his fourth home run of the season in Thursday's win and drove in the game-winning run in the bottom of the eighth. It was the second time this season De La Cruz delivered a go-ahead hit in the eighth inning or later. He also had a walk-off RBI single on May 21 vs. El Paso.

LMJ: Astros RHP Lance McCullers Jr. began a MLB Rehab Assignment Thursday for the Skeeters. McCullers Jr. struck out four batters through four innings (64 pitches) and allowed a run on two hits. McCullers Jr. has not appeared since being placed on the 10-Day IL on May 23 with right shoulder soreness. He's gone 3-1 with a 2.96 ERA (17 ER/51.2 IP) in nine starts with the Astros this season.

AAA WEST LEADERS: The Skeeters and Round Rock are first and second, respectively, in the Triple A West, East Division standings. The Express sit just a half-game back of the Skeeters.

JAKE, FROM THE OUTFIELD: Skeeters OF Jake Meyers hit his sixth home run of the season in Tuesday's loss, giving him the team lead. Meyers is three home runs away from matching his career high set in '19 with Fayetteville (A+) and Corpus Christi (AA).

DON'T MESS WITH THE BULL: Abraham Toro has hit .361 (13x36) with a home run and eight RBIs over his last nine games. Toro was activated from the Minor League IL and assigned to the Skeeters on May 27.

CLOSE SHAVE: Colton Shaver hit his second home run since re-joining the Skeeters last Thursday in Tuesday's loss and has gone 3x9 (.333) with two homers and six RBIs over his last three games.

WALK THIS WAY: Ronnie Dawson leads Triple A West with 27 walks this season and Alex De Goti is tied for ninth with 17 walks. Dawson's also tied for 10th in the league in runs (23).

OH SO SWEET: The Skeeters are fourth in MiLB with a .278 team average. The Skeeters' 3.50 ERA is the lowest of Triple A teams.

BLANCO FUEGO: Ronel Blanco converted his fourth straight save opportunity Monday night. Blanco has a save in two of the Skeeters' last three wins and ranks tied for sixth in Triple A West in saves.

MiLB HONORS: RHP Brett Conine was named the Triple A West Pitcher of the Month for May by Minor League Baseball. Conine has gone 4-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 ER/19 IP) through four games (three starts). He's recorded the lowest ERA in Triple A West and leads the league in wins, opponent batting average (.167) and WHIP (0.95).

ARE YOU 'SIRI'OUS: OF Jose Siri leads Triple A and is fifth in MiLB with 32 RBIs this season. He's also hit two grand slams and is one of six players in MiLB to have already hit two grand slams this season.

RONNIE SALAMI: Ronnie Dawson hit the Skeeters' third grand slam of the season on 5/30 vs. ABQ. The Skeeters are tied for third in Minor League Baseball with three grand slams.

GEAUX PAPPY: Michael Papierski ranks seventh in Triple A West with a .435 on-base percentage. The LSU alum had two RBI triples during the last homestand and is tied for fifth in Triple A West with two triples. He's reached safely in 17 of his 23 appearances this season.

TEXAS TWO-STEP: The Skeeters are hosting the Round Rock Express at Constellation Field for the first time in franchise history. The two teams are scheduled to play each other 23 more times this season, including tonight. The six-game series beginning Thursday is Round Rock's only trip to Sugar Land in '21.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out of Triple A teams. The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

MAJOR TALENT: The Skeeters roster features eight players with Major League service time: C, **Jason Castro**, OF **Ronnie Dawson**, IF **Alex De Goti**, RHP **Ryan Eades**, RHP **Tyler Ivey**, RHP **Francis Martes**, RHP **Lance McCullers Jr.**, RHP **Andre Scrubb**, RHP **Peter Solomon**, IF **Abraham Toro**, RHP **Hector Velazquez**. All but Eades, Rivera and Velazquez have appeared at the Majors with the Astros.

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: **Ronnie Dawson**, **Alex De Goti** and **Peter Solomon** each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two. **Ralph Garza Jr.** received his first promotion to the Major Leagues on May 26. He made his Major League debut on May 29 vs. San Diego and threw an inning of relief.

FRANCHISE RECORD: Jose Siri drove in seven runs on May 13 at Round Rock, setting the Skeeters franchise record, including their n--ine seasons as an independent franchise. Siri accomplished the feat with a grand slam and three-run double. Five players in Skeeters history had recorded six RBIs in a single game. The seven RBIs are tied for the second-most in a game this season of Triple A players.

ROAD TRIP: The Skeeters went 2-4 on their most-recent road trip in Oklahoma City. It marked the worst winning percentage of their first two road trips. The Skeeters were dealt two come-from-behind losses on the road trip, including a four-run lead that was lost Tuesday night. It was the largest lead lost for the Skeeters this season.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: **Mickey Storey** is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University. He finished his career second all-time in strikeouts, tied for second in wins and finished top 10 in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. REST OF THE CREW: Joining Mickey Storey on his staff are pitching coach Erick Abreu, hitting coach Ben Rosenthal and development coach Sean Connoles. John Gregorich and A.J. Smith are the Skeeters' athletic trainers and Hazael Wessin is the team's strength and conditioning coach. Abreu is in his eighth season with the Astros organization and his first as the organization's Triple A pitching coach. Rosenthal is in his fifth season with the Astros and third as the hitting coach for their Triple A affiliate. Connoles is in his second season with the Astros and his first as the development coach for the team's Triple A affiliate.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the post-season in five of nine seasons. The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their '13 season. The Skeeters have been managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, the Skeeters went 601-502. Notable people to appear for the Skeeters include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino

On This Day In Astros/Skeeters History

Mike Scott just missed throwing his second career no-hitter on this date in 1988 against the Atlanta Brave. Scott settled with a 5-0 one-hit shutout after infielder Ken Oberkfell broke up the no-hit bid with a single down the right-field line at the Astrodome with two outs in the ninth inning. Scott threw his first career no-hitter on September 25, 1986 against the San Francisco Giants, which clinched the National League West title for the Astros.

MR. MAY: Conine was named the Triple A West Pitcher of the Month for May after going 4-0 with a 0.95 ERA to open the season ... He led Triple A West through May with a 0.95 ERA, opponent batting average (.167) and WHIP (0.95).

WIN, WIN, WIN: Conine won his first four decisions this year. He leads the Skeeters in the category and has set his career-high winning streak. He leads Triple A West in the category as well.

LEAGUE LEADER: Conine leads Triple A West with a 1.88 ERA. Conine is second in the league with a .209 opponent's batting average and fourth in WHIP (1.08)

SHOW BEFORE THE SHOW: The 24-year-old made his first start and appearance at the Triple A level on 5/8 at Albuquerque (W, 5.2 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 1 BB, 5 K) ... The 5.2 IP are the second-most by a Skeeters starter so far this season ... Split time between three different MiLB levels in '19 (Corpus Christi (AA), Fayetteville (A+) and Quad Cities (A))

PROSPECT CREDENTIALS: Conine is rated as the Astros No. 14 overall prospect by Baseball America and their No. 21 prospect by MLB Pipeline. He was also rated as having the "Best Control" in the Astros minor league system by Baseball America

CONTROL FREAK: Struck out 134 batters in '19 while allowing just 29 walks (4.62 SO/W)

PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Was named Texas League Pitcher of the Week on 8/25/19 ... Went 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA (1 ER/10.0 IP) and nine strikeouts in two starts for Corpus Christi (AA) the week prior.

INNINGS EATER: Was fourth amongst Astros minor leaguers in innings pitched in '19 (114.1 IP) ... Recorded the second-lowest ERA (2.20) of Astros minor leaguers with at least 100 innings pitched (16 qualifiers) ... Was fifth amongst Astros minor leaguers in strikeouts (134)

TRANSITION TO ROTATION: Conine, who was a closer in his collegiate playing days, has favored well in his move to the starting rotation. Conine has gone 8-3 with a 1.74 ERA (24 ER/103.1 IP) as a starter in his pro career while going 4-2 with a 2.56 ERA (16 ER/56.1) as a reliever

REVERSE SPLITS: The right-hander has been exceptionally tough on left-handed hitters throughout his pro career, holding them to just a .189 average (52x275) and .590 OPS ... He's yet to allow a hit to a left-handed batter this season (0x16).

DRAFT DAY: Selected by the Astros in the 11th round of the '18 MLB Draft from Cal State Fullerton

GO TITANS: Conine played three seasons collegiately at Cal State Fullerton and worked as the team's closer his sophomore and junior seasons before transitioning to a starter at the pro level ... Was voted All-Big West First Team in '17 and '18 ... Was 15/15 in save opportunities in '17 with a 1.39 ERA, which were the sixth-most saves in the nation and the fourth-most in Cal State Fullerton single-season history
