Final Game Notes for 2022

Updated following Completion of Season

Today's Game: Season Completed on September 11.

Last Game: Sunday: Cancelled, rain. Saturday: Lansing 9, Dayton 5.

Streaks: The Dragons went 12-3 over their last 15 games and 16-5 over their last 21 contests.

- The Dragons clinched a winning full-season record for the second straight season. They were 65-55 in 2021.
- The Dragons narrowly missed becoming only the second MWL team to lead the league in both home runs and stolen bases in a season since 1988. Cedar Rapids led in both categories in 2007. The Dragons finished first in the MWL in home runs but finished five stolen bases behind league-leading Peoria (the Dragons played four fewer games than the Chiefs).
- Over the last 15 games, the Dragons led the MWL in team batting (.279), runs (98), extra base hits (54), and stolen bases (40).
- Dayton hit 152 home runs in their 128 games, setting a new club record for homers in a season. The club record had been 144 in 2001 in a 139-game season.
- For the first time in franchise history, the Dragons had had six players hit at least 10 home runs this season (Elly De La Cruz, Allan Cerda, Jose Torres, Alex McGarry, Austin Hendrick, Rece Hinds). In 2001 and 2004, the Dragons also had five with 10+ home runs.
- The Dragons had the second most batting strikeouts in Minor League Baseball with 1,437, a new club record (old record: 1,382 in 2004). This is believed to be the fifth most in Minor League Baseball history (top five are all from 2019 and later) and second in MWL history (Clinton: 1448, 2019).
- Over the 2021-22 seasons, the Dragons allowed the fifth fewest hits in all Minor League Baseball (120 teams) and the fewest in the MWL.
- The Dragons set a franchise record for fewest errors in a season with 107 errors in 128 games. The previous Dragons record for fewest errors in a season was 113 in 2021 in a 120-game season.
- In 2022, 64 players have appeared in at least one game for the Dragons, a new club record. The previous record was 59, in 2021.
- **Tyler Callihan** was selected as the MWL Player of the Week (8/29-9/4). In his last 10 games, he batted .359 with 3 HR, 1 3B, 4 2B, 9 RBI.
- **Steven Leyton** over his last 17 games batted .328 with three home runs, one triple, and six doubles.
- **Justice Thompson** over his last 15 games batted .327 with a home run, three doubles, 10 RBI, nine walks, and four stolen bases.
- **Mat Nelson** over his last 15 games batted .333 with a home run, one triple, and three doubles.
- **Ashton Creal** over his last 11 games batted .323 with one triple, one double and three RBI.
- **Michel Triana** over his last 12 games batted .289 with four home runs, three doubles, two triples, 13 RBI, and an OPS of 1.051.
- **Austin Hendrick** over his last eight games batted .308 with two home runs, four doubles, 10 RBI, and an OPS of 1.163 (8 BB, 8 SO).
- **Michael Trautwein** finished the season by hitting safely in six straight games, batting .333 with a double and seven RBI.

- **Donovan Benoit** over his last 11 appearances: 14.2 IP, 2 R (1.23 ERA), 6 H, 3 BB, 23 SO, 5 for 5 in save opportunities.
- **Jake Gozzo** over his last six appearances did not allow a run in 8.1 IP (1 H, 4 BB, 9 SO).
- **Braxton Roxby** over his last five appearances did not allow a run in 8.2 IP (5 H, 3 BB, 14 SO).
- **James Marinan** over his last five appearances did not allow a run in 7.0 IP (4 H, 3 BB, 7 SO).

Top Prospects Join Dragons: The Dragons made 54 roster moves after the MLB all-star break on July 20, receiving the top three prospects who finished the season on the roster. The new arrivals include the following players: Blue-chip prospect **Noelvi Marte**, who was acquired from the Mariners in the trade involving MLB all-star Luis Castillo. Marte is ranked as the Reds #2 prospect by both Baseball America and MLB.com (behind Elly De La Cruz); Starting pitcher **Chase Petty**, acquired in spring training from the Twins for MLB all-star Sonny Gray and was the Twins first round draft pick in 2021 (Reds #8 by Baseball America and #9 by MLB.com); Outfielder **Jay Allen II**, the 30th overall selection in the 2021 draft (Reds #12 by MLB.com; #16 by Baseball America).

Promotions: The Dragons saw three players promoted to Double-A Chattanooga during the first half: starting pitcher Andrew Abbott, relief pitcher Spencer Stockton, and first baseman Alex McGarry. Early in the second half, outfielder Allan Cerda, infielder Nick Quintana, and starting pitcher Connor Phillips were promoted. Later in the second half, in this order, catcher Daniel Vellojin and starting pitchers Evan Kravetz and Joe Boyle, reliever Myles Gayman, starting pitcher Christian Roa, and catcher Garrett Wolforth all went to Chattanooga.

Historically Speaking: The Dragons first half winning percentage of .591 (record of 39-27) was second best in franchise history, trailing the 2007 Dragons, who finished 44-26. The 2022 first half record was the fourth best in any half in Dragons history. **Note:** The Dragons were the first MWL team since 1992 to post a winning percentage in the first half of .591 or higher but fail to reach the post-season. Exactly 30 years ago, Springfield posted a first half winning percentage of .600 but failed to reach the post-season that year.

What Happened? Entering a doubleheader on June 9, the Dragons were 36-15 (best record in franchise history after 51 games) and held a lead of eight and one-half games over second place Great Lakes with 15 to play. At the time, Dayton had not lost more than two consecutive games all season. The Dragons went 3-11 over the next 14 games while Great Lakes went 12-1 over the same period, a difference of nine and one-half games, as the Loons clinched the division title...From June 9 through the end of the first half (15 games), the Dragons averaged 3.3 runs per game (last in the league). Meanwhile, the Dragons team ERA from June 9 through the end of the half was 5.34 (next to last in the league).

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Bryan LaHair is in his first season as Dragons manager and his fifth year in the Reds organization. He served as manager with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 and was the manager at Billings in 2019. LaHair opened his coaching career as the Billings hitting coach in 2018. LaHair played professionally for 14 seasons from 2003-14 and 2016-17, appearing in more than 1,000 games. He was primarily a first baseman but also saw considerable time as a corner outfielder. He played in 195 major league games with the Seattle Mariners and Chicago Cubs. In 2012, he appeared in the MLB All-Star Game. LaHair played for TEAM USA's national team three times (2005 World Cup, 2006 regional Olympic qualifier, 2007 Olympic qualifier). LaHair led all of Minor League Baseball in home runs in 2011 with 38 with the Iowa Cubs and was selected as the Pacific Coast League Most Valuable Player. He played one season in Japan in 2013. LaHair is a native of Worcester, Massachusetts and was chosen as the 2000 Massachusetts High School Player of the Year. He was selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2002 draft out of St. Petersburg College in Florida.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** returns to the Dragons in 2022 as pitching coach after serving in the same position in 2021. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level. He finished fourth in the Pioneer League in saves with nine in his first pro season with Helena in 2010.

Hitting coach **Daryle Ward** returns to the Dragons in 2022 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18 and 2021. He is in his seventh year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. Ward played in 948 big league games with the Astros, Dodgers, Pirates, Nationals, Braves, and Cubs. He connected on a career-high 20 home runs in 2000 with the Astros. In the later stages of Ward's Major League career, he emerged as one of the National League's top pinch hitters. He led all of baseball in pinch hits and runs batted in as a pinch hitter in 2006 while finishing tied for first in pinch hit home runs. Ward played in 2,318 professional games before retiring at the age of 40 following the 2015 season. Ward was originally signed by the Tigers as a 15th round draft pick in 1994 out of Rancho Santiago College in California. He is a native of the Los Angeles area and now makes his offseason home in Riverside, California. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Juan Samuel joins the Dragons as bench coach in 2022, his first season in the Reds organization. The 2022 season is Samuel's 40th year in professional baseball as a player or coach. After a 19-year professional playing career including 16 seasons in the Major Leagues, he served on the Detroit Tigers big league coaching staff for seven years from 1999-2005. He was the manager of the Mets Double-A club in Binghamton in 2006 before returning to the Majors as a coach for the Baltimore Orioles from 2007-10. He served as the manager of the Orioles on an interim basis in 2010. He was a Major League coach for the Philadelphia Phillies from 2011-17. He served as a coach with Monclova in the Mexican League in 2021. Samuel has 18 years experience as a Major League coach and two years as a coach in the minors. Samuel enjoyed a 16-year Major League playing career from 1983-98 and was selected to play in the MLB all-star game three times. Samuel collected more than 1,500 big league hits during his time with the Phillies, Mets, Dodgers, Royals, Reds, Tigers, and Blue Jays. In 1984, he set an MLB record for stolen bases by a rookie with 72 and finished second in the NL Rookie of the Year voting. His best season came in 1987 when he blasted 28 home runs and drove in 100 runs while batting .272 to win the NL Silver Slugger award at second base. Samuel was inducted into the Phillies Wall of Fame in 2008 and was selected as one of the 50 greatest players in Phillies history in a book by Robert W. Cohen. Samuel was born in San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic and graduated from Licey High School in Puerto Rico.

Rules Changes for 2022

The Midwest League has adopted a Pitch Clock to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within 14 seconds of receiving the ball when the bases are empty, and within 18 seconds with runners on base. Defensive positioning rules now require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are now limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner will be awarded the next base via a balk. Additionally, the size of each base has been increased from 15" to 18".
