**Today:** Happy Independence Day! The Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, play the opener in a six-game series against the Lake County Captains, High-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. The Nuts are 5-7 against Lake County this year, losing four of five at Classic Auto Group Park in April before winning four of seven in Lansing in May. The two clubs will meet again in a six-game set in Eastlake, Ohio, to end the season; Lansing's 24 meetings with Lake County are the Nuts' most against any MWL team.

**Yesterday:** Loons 5, Lugnuts 4. CJ Rodriguez laced a game-tying RBI double in the top of the ninth inning, only to have Damon Keith answer with a game-winning RBI single in the bottom of the ninth, giving the Loons a series victory over the Lugnuts at Dow Diamond. Both Euribiel Angeles and Danny Bautista, Jr. collected three hits in defeat.

**On the Air:** Today's game can be viewed on Bally Live and MiLB TV with an audio-only broadcast via StreamGuys. Broadcasters Jesse Goldberg-Strassler and Adam Jaksa deliver the call, as they have ever since the start of the 2019 season.

### LUG•NOTES

**Michigan Baseball Hall of Fame:** Today we celebrate the pregame induction of former Lugnuts owner Tom Dickson into the Michigan Baseball Hall of Fame. On Friday, we induct the all-time winningest head coaches in Western Michigan University and Michigan State University history, Fred Decker and Danny Litwhiler.

**2022 Retrospective:** Last year, the Lugnuts drew a crowd of 10,055 on the 4th of July, the Midwest League's largest single game crowd of the season, and they saw a barnburner. The Great Lakes Loons tied the game at 4-4 in the top of the ninth on a two-out Eddys Leonard two-run homer, setting the stage for a Tyler Soderstrom walk-off three-run homer in the bottom of the ninth for a 7-4 victory.

**The Future is Now:** Speaking of Tyler Soderstrom, he and 2022 Lugnuts teammate Lawrence Butler will take part in the 2023 Sirius XM All-Star Futures Game. It is Soderstrom's second time appearing in the Futures Game; he initially appeared in 2021, when he was playing for the Single-A Stockton Ports.

**All-Star Nuts:** 2017 Lugnuts standouts Bo Bichette and Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. will appear in the Major League Baseball All-Star Game, named All-Star reserve infielders on the American League squad. It is Guerrero's third consecutive All-Star Game appearance and Bichette's second All-Star nod, joining 2021.

**Two for the Price of One:** The Lugnuts' defense ead the league with 69 double plays this year, eight more than second-place South Bend and 34 more than 12th-place Lake County. The Nuts' 54 errors ranks second lowest in the circuit, with only three errors in the last nine games and 36 errorless games this season. Conversely, Lake County has committed 72 errors this season, 10th in the league, and has made 15 errors in the 12 games that the Captains have played against the Lugnuts.

**Roster Transaction:** Earlier today, INF Alexander Campos was placed on the 7-day Injured List.

**The Cycle:** On June 21 at Wisconsin, Jack Winkler went 4-for-4 with a single, double, triple, home run and four RBIs, becoming the eighth player in team history to hit for the cycle. The other cycles: Corey Patterson (7/5/99 at South Bend); Donnie Hood (4/21/03 vs. Dayton); Chip Cannon (6/2/05 vs. Clinton); Travis Snider (7/7/07 at Fort Wayne); Brad Glenn (7/26/10 vs. Clinton); Edward Olivares (4/24/17 vs. South Bend); and Ryan Gold (4/18/19 vs. Dayton).

**They Know Their Trade:** Lansing has four players acquired via trade by the Oakland Athletics on its roster: Christian Fernandez (Tampa Bay Rays, 7/9/22, for Christian Bethancourt); Euribiel Angeles (San Diego Padres, 4/3/22, for Sean Manaea); and Junior Pérez (San Diego Padres, 6/30/20, for Jorge Mateo); and Alexander Campos (Seattle Mariners, 11/15/17, for Ryon Healy).

**First-Round Pedigrees:** The Lansing roster boasts Oakland's last two first-round selections.

- SS Max Muncy was taken 25th overall in 2021. MiLB Pipeline ranks Muncy the A's No. 1 shortstop prospect.
- Daniel Susac went 19th overall in 2022 and is ranked the A's No. 2 catching prospect, trailing only No. 1 overall prospect Tyler Soderstrom.

### TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

**2010:** A crowd of 11,114 saw the Lugnuts finally beat Lake County for the first time. After losing their first eight meetings with the Captains, in their first Midwest League season after moving from the South Atlantic League, the Lugnuts triumphed in the 10th inning when a routine two-out grounder from Justin Jackson took a bad hop over the head of second baseman Argenis Martinez, bringing in the tying and game-winning runs for a wild 7-6 Lugnuts win.

**2022:** With 10,055 in attendance, Tyler Soderstrom belted a walk-off three-run homer to center field to launch the Lugnuts to a 7-4 victory over the Great Lakes Loons (Yes, 7-4 on 7/4!). Mac Lardner struck out eight batters in six shutout innings, but the Loons tied the game with an Alex De Jesus two-run double in the seventh off Brock Whittlesey. In the bottom of the eighth, after manager Phil Pohl was ejected arguing against batter interference, Kevin Richards delivered a two-out, two-run double off new Great Lakes reliever Braydon Fisher for a 4-2 lead. But with two outs in the top of the ninth, Eddys Leonard swatted a game-tying two-run homer to left-center off Trayson Kubo, setting the stage for the bottom of the ninth. It was Soderstrom's second walk-off home run of the year.

**Personal:** Brady's last name is pronounced "bass-o," with 'bass' like the fish rather than the instrument... got married during the 2020-2021 offseason after spending 2020 hiatus planning his wedding in addition to preparing for the 2021 season... made seven appearances for the Lugnuts in 2021 before suffering ACL tear... 687 days between MiLB appearances, June 15, 2021, and May 3, 2023, in returning from Tommy John... has tied professional high with four innings pitched in each of last two outings.

**Raising Expectations:** An MLB.com article from Athletics MiLB camp by Jonathan Mayo on April 28, 2021, carried a bit of surprising news on a couple of breakout pitchers, specifically, as Mayo wrote, "Brady Basso's role is changing. A lefty who signed for just \$75,000 as a 16th-round pick in the 2019 Draft out of Oklahoma State, Basso pitched almost exclusively in relief in college and threw well in that role in the Rookie-level Arizona League in 2019. Now that he's up to 95-96 mph with his fastball to go along with a curve that flashes plus and a work-in-progress changeup, he's going to get the chance to start." Melissa Lockard, writing for The Athletic on May 2, 2021, included Basso in her Lugnuts preview, writing, "Left-hander Brady Basso (2019, 16th round) opened a lot of eyes this spring with his fastball sitting at 95-97 mph."

**Pro Debut:** Brady pitched for Athletics Gold in the AZL after signing: 15 G, 1 GS, 1.64 ERA, 25 2/3 IP, 0 HR, 8 BB, 38 K... limited right-handed hitters to .194/.257/.313 in 74 PA, while lefties hit .250/.344/.286 in 32 PA... opposing base stealers were nabbed twice out of three attempts... made first professional start on 8/16/19, tossing three innings with 4 K's.

**Draft Day:** Basso was selected 494th overall in the 16th round of the 2019 draft from Oklahoma State... scout: Chris Reilly... signed for \$75,000... in the same round, two all-name players were drafted: the Tigers selected Kona Quiggles and the Blue Jays took Jackxarel Lebron... one of eight OSU Cowboys to be drafted in 2019.

**College Days:** Brady was primarily a reliever at Oklahoma State (12 G, 2 GS as freshman; 18 G, 5 GS as sophomore; 14 G, 0 GS as a junior)... after a rough sophomore season (8.27 ERA), rebounded as a junior (1.64 ERA, 11.0 IP, 6 H, 16 K)... majored in finance in Stillwater with the intention of becoming a financial advisor after his playing career ends.

**Let Your Babies Grow Up to be Cowboys:** Oklahoma State players in MLB have included Allie Reynolds, Robin Ventura, Jeromy Burnitz, Pete Incaviglia, Mickey Tettleton, Mike Henneman, Doug Dascenzo, Andrew Heaney, Matt Hague and Jordy Mercer... teammate Caeden Trenkle was drafted from Oklahoma State University in the ninth round last season.

**Baseball Runs in the Family:** Brady's father, Mike, played in the minors for nine seasons in the San Diego Padres system, 1986-1994, rising as high as Triple-A... after retiring as a player, immediately began managing in 1995 at age 30, and managed in the Padres' org. from 1995-2000... joined the Toronto Blue Jays and managed in the Jays system in 2003-2006 and 2009... spent the next decade as an MLB scout before being let go by the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2020.

**Hometown:** Hails from Pearland ("PAIR-land"), Texas, south of Houston... during senior year at Pearland H.S., posted 0.48 ERA, with 101 strikeouts in 57 innings... named All-District in football, averaging 29.9 yards per catch as a receiver with one primary route: go deep... also from Pearland H.S.: Kirk Dressendorfer, Clay Hensley and Robbie Weinhardt; Megan Thee Stallion spent her teen years living in Pearland.
