Carter Aldrete hit a three-run homer, his third home run of the series, and Brandon Martorano scored in the top of the fourth to open a 6-0 Richmond lead Bowie scored its first run in the bottom of the inning on an error. In the fifth, Shane Matheny hit a two-run double and later scored on an error to extend the lead to 9-1. Bowie scored four runs in the eighth, including a three-run homer by Ramon Rodriguez, to close the score to $9-5$. Matheny doubled home a run in the top of the ninth to give Richmond a five-run lead. The Baysox capped the scoring with a bases-loaded walk by Billy Cook in the bottom of the ninth
TOLAY'S GAME: The Richmond Flying Squirrels play the first of a six-game series against the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals. Richmond played six games in Harrisburg from April 11-16 and dropped four of them, three by one run. The Flying Squirrels return to Harrisburg for a three-game series from July 14-16. The Senators will play a second

5 were 14-7 through their first 21 games but are 14-28 since May 3. For the year, Richmond starters have thrown 224.1 innings, which is the fewest in Double-A. Richmond relievers have thrown 317.2 innings this year, the most in
Double-A. The Flying Squirrels bullpen has a 3.29 ERA, which is the second-lowest in Double-A and is fifth-lowest of the 12 teams in the minors.
THE SENATORS are in fourth place in the Southwest Division, 3.5 games behind first-place Erie. They have dropped five-of-their-last-seven games, including four-of-six in last week's series at home against the SeaWolves. The Harrisburg offense has scored 271 runs, the fewest in the Eastern League this year. Harrisburg relievers lead the league with 20 saves. Harrisburg's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects, including OF James Wood (No. 1), OF Robert Hassell III (No. 2), RHP Jackson Rutledge (No. 6), RHP Cole Henry (No. 13), 3B Trey Lipscomb (No. 17), LHP Mitchell Parker (No. 24) and OF Jacob
Young (No. 27). Hassell is rated by Baseball America as the best hitter for average and the best strike-zone discipline in the Young (No. 27 ). FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander Mason Black makes his 13th Double-A start and second against the Senators. He last pitched in the first game of a doubleheader at Bowie on Wednesday and threw four scoreless innings with four strikeouts. It was his second straight start throwing four scoreless frames. He last faced the Senators on April 15, his second Double-A start, and allowed Black was selected in the third round (85th overall) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Lehigh University, where he was the Patriot League Pitcher of the Year as a junior. He made his professional debut last season with the Low-A San Jose Giants, posting a 1.57 ERA in eight starts. Black led the minors with a 0.35 ERA for the month of May last season and earned a promotion named an Mil B com Giants Organization All-Star. Black is rated by Baseball Amprica as the No 9 Giants prospect and No 10 by MLB.com. For more on Black, see page two.

FOR HARRISBURG: Left-hander Alex Troop makes his 12th start of the season and his third against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on Wednesday against the SeaWolves and surrendered five runs over 1.2 innings. He made his season debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 11 at FNB Field and allowed five runs (four earned) over 3.1 innings. In his second start of that series on April 16, he pitched five innings and allowed three runs. Troop was selected by the Nationals in the ninth round of the 2019 MLB Draft out of Michigan State. He first reached Double-A in 2021 for four relief outings and pitched 28 games for the Senators
in 2022, going $7-5$ with a 4.81 ERA. Today marks his 44th Double-A appearance and his 29 th start, totaling a $10-10$ record with in 2022, goin

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all of Double-A in total attendance $(406,560)$ and average attendance $(6,160)$ for the first time in franchise history. For the year, Meckler leads all minor league hitters (min. 120 PA) in batting average (.410). He has picked up 14 hits and seven walks in his 11 Double-A games since being
promoted from High-A Eugene on May 17.

ALL ABCARD THE SHANE TRAIN: Shane Matheny was assigned to the Richmond roster on June 13 . In his season debut for the Flying Squirrels that night at Bowie, he hit a first-inning homer on the second pitch of the game. On Sunday, Matheny added three hits, including two doubles, and drove in three runs. In his six games with Richmond this year, Matheny is batting .261 ( 6 -for-23) with three doubles, a homer, five RBls and five walks, totaling a .393 on-base percentage.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Hayden Cantrelle is sixth in OBP (.405). Tyler Fitzgerald is tied for third in triples (3). Kai-Wei Teng is seventh in strikeouts (68).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Two former Flying Squirrels players have made their MLB debuts for the San Francisco Giants last week Last Tuesday, Keaton Winn pitched in St. Louis and allowed one run over four innings in the Giants' $11-3$ win, becoming the first Gi ants player in franchise history to pick up a save in his debut. Last season, Winn joined the Flying Squirrels in mid-August and went 2-3 with a 4.15 ERA in six starts to close the regular season. On Wednesday, Luis Matos made his major league debut against the Cardinals and went 1 -for-3. He was on the Flying Squirrels' Opening Day roster this year and .304 with three homers in 31 games with the Giants including Tristan Beck (2021-22 Flying Squirrels) Casey Schmitt (2022), Patrick Bailey (2023) and Ryan Walker

(2021-22). On Wednesday, Matos became the 90th Flying Squirrels alum to reach the big leagues.
