April 18: RubberDucks 7, Senators 6: Julian Escobedo doubled home the go-ahead run in the bottom of the eight to put Akron back on top after the six run seventh by Harrisburg. Cade Smith converted his 13th consecutive save since 2022 by punching out the side in the ninth.

Bibee, Cantillo and Valera all earn postseason honors: Tanner Bibee was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Year and the right-handed starter on the 2022 Eastern League All-Star team. Bibee made 13 starts in Akron after being promoted on July 2. In those 13 starts, he went 6-1 with a 1.83 ERA and 81 strikeouts over 73.2 innings pitched. Joey Cantillo was the left-handed starter on the Eastern League All-Star team. Cantillo made 14 appearances (13 starts) for Akron, going 4-3 with a 1.93 ERA and 87 strikeouts in 60.2 innings. George Valera was named an outfielder on the Eastern League All-Star team. Valera played 90 games for the RubberDucks before being promoted to Triple-A. In his time in Akron, Valera hit .264 with 15 home runs and 59 RBI.

Tena back to defend hits lead: José Tena led the Eastern League with 136 hits in 2022, the most by a RubberDuck in a season since Yandy Diaz had 150 in 2015. Tena became the fifth Canton or Akron player to lead the Eastern League in hits, joining Omar Ramirez (162 in 1993), Alex Ramirez (169 in 1996), Darren Stumberger (164 in 1998) and Jordan Brown (161 in 2007). Tena's six triples are the most by any RubberDucks since Todd Hankins had seven in 2016.

Strikeout leaders: In 2022, RubberDucks pitchers had 1,408 strikeouts, most in Double-A and a new Eastern League record. The league record was also reset the last two seasons (1,271 by Reading in 2019 and 1,300 by Somerset in 2021). The Akron franchise record had been 1,190 (2021), and the RubberDucks have reset the club record in three straight seasons ('19, '21, '22). Akron led Double-A in strikeouts for the first time. In 2023, the RubberDucks pitchers have combined for double digit strikeouts in 7 of their 9 games.

Tough to repeat: Akron was eliminated from 2022 playoff contention with a loss Sept. 16, but still finished with the second-best record of any team in franchise history that followed a title winner. Only the 2006 Akron Aeros (87-55, also lost in the Eastern League Championship Series) had a better record in a season after Akron won a league title. Akron has never won back-to-back titles and last made consecutive playoff appearances with five straight 2005-2009.

Odor among the best: Managing Akron for the previous three seasons, Rouglas Odor has tallied 213 regular season wins. Only three-year managers Brad Komminsk (244), Dave Wallace (223) and Joel Skinner (221) have more wins for the franchise. No others have reached 200 wins. Returning for a fourth season, Odor becomes the longest-tenured manager in franchise history. Nine games into 2023, Odor is now 27 wins away from passing Komminsk for winningest manager in franchise history. The RubberDucks are also 27 wins away from reaching 2,500 wins since moving to Ohio in 1989.

RubberDucks host Senators: Akron is playing the first of three scheduled series this season with Harrisburg, and the only meeting in the first half of the season. In 2022, the RubberDucks were 12-6 against Harrisburg, including 7-5 at Canal Park. According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include:

Top 10 team: The RubberDucks were named the 10th most talented team in Minor League Baseball by Baseball America. The RubberDucks feature seven of the Guardians top 30 prospects according to MLB.com and Baseball America including Gavin Williams, who is ranked as Cleveland's top prospect by Baseball America. The Somerset Patriots (#9) are the only other Eastern League team to make Baseball America's list. The Columbus Clippers (Guardians Triple-A affiliate) are ranked third on the list.

Former RubberDucks make MLB debuts: 13 players from Akron's 2021 or 2022 roster made their MLB debuts with Cleveland. So far in 2023 this trend of recent RubberDucks making MLB debuts has continued. Carlos Vargas (2022) made his MLB debut with the Arizona Diamondbacks on Mar. 30 against the Los Angeles Dodgers. Vargas struck out two while allowing one run over two-thirds of an inning. Tim Herrin (2021-2022) debuted for the Guardians on April 2 against the Seattle Mariners and struck out the first four batters he faced. Herrin became the first pitcher since 1893 to face at least four hitters and strike them all out in his MLB debut. On April 12, Peyton Battenfield (2021) became the third member of the 2021 or 2022 RubberDucks to make his debut when he started against the New York Yankees. Battenfield struck out three over 4.2 innings pitched allowing just one run.

Entered the 2023 season as Cleveland's No. 30 prospect by MLB Pipeline.

2022

- Ranked as Cleveland's No. 28 prospect by MLB Pipeline.
- Came within a strike of a seven-inning no-hitter in Game 1 of a July 9 doubleheader in Fort Wayne, but he got a no-decision in a 3-2, eight-inning loss.
- Through his final High-A start, his 118 strikeouts ranked ninth in the Midwest League, and his 21 starts ranked tied for sixth.
- Promoted to Akron Aug. 29 and made three Double-A starts.
- Pitched 4.2 scoreless innings at Harrisburg on Sept. 9, allowing just one hit with nine strikeouts, as part of a combined 5-0, one-hit shutout.

College:

- Posted a 12-2 record with a 2.45 ERA in 16 games/15 starts at Ole Miss in 2021 (92.0IP, 62H, 25ER, 31BB, 142SO).
- Earned First Team All-American honors from ABCA/Rawlings, Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA and D1Baseball.
- Set an Ole Miss record for single-season wins (12) and finished second in program history for single-season strikeouts (142, fifth in NCAA), behind Lance Lynn's 146 in 2007.
- In 2021, he was a finalist for the C Spire Ferriss Trophy (awarded to the top collegiate baseball player in the state of Mississippi) and a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award.
- Was the second Ole Miss pitcher drafted in 2021, as RHP Gunnar Hoglund was drafted in the first round (No. 19 overall) by Toronto, which traded Hoglund to Oakland in the Matt Chapman deal in March 2022.
- Concluded his three-year college career with a 24-6 mark and a 2.81 ERA in 40 games/33 starts (204.2IP, 149H, 64ER, 73BB, 259SO).
- Recorded a one-hit shutout vs. Mississippi State and set an Ole Miss single-game record with 16 SO vs. Florida State at the Oxford Regional.
- Was a member of the Team USA Baseball Collegiate National Team in 2019
- Set an Ole Miss freshman record with 86 SO (previously 81 by Jeff Calhoun in 1977 and Drew Pomeranz in 2008) in 89.2 innings, earning Freshman All-American honors in 2019.
- Major in political science.

Amateur:

- Lettered all four years, playing right field and pitching, at West Orange High in Windermere, FL, under head coach Jessie Marlo.
- Was a two-time district champion in 2016 and 2017 that included a trip to the state final four in 2017.
- Was a member of the USA Baseball team in 2015.
- Was the student body president at West Orange High, a national debater, and a coordinator of West Orange dance marathon that raised \$80,000 for a children's miracle network.

Nikhazy baffles hitters with his breaking balls, a mid-70s curveball with big shape and a shorter mid-80s slider/cutter. His fastball features below-average velocity, sitting at 88-92 mph and topping out at 94, but he compensates by creating run and deception with his high three-quarters arm slot and quality extension. He also has an interesting changeup that ranges from 78-82 mph with tumble and fade.

Nikhazy doesn't excite radar guns but succeeds with a combination of fastball metrics, breaking ball spin rates, savvy and mound presence. He wasn't terribly wild in his debut but a tendency to nibble and try to be too fine with his pitches led to his walk rate soaring from 3.2 per nine innings in college to 6.9 in 2022. He's going to have to demonstrate much better control and command to make it as a starter.

2023 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager (Fourth Season)* – Odor, 55, is in his 36th season with the Cleveland organization as a player, coach and manager. The 2023 season is Odor's fourth as RubberDucks manager, making him the longest-tenured Akron manager. Odor led Akron to a 79-59 record in 2022. He guided Akron to the Double-A Northeast championship and a 73-46 record in 2021, and was named Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year. Odor also led the RubberDucks to a 61-79 record in 2019. He is 213-184 as RubberDucks manager. Odor ranks fourth all-time in franchise managerial wins.

Odor was the first member of the Guardians organization to be a member of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks. He was an infielder for Canton-Akron for parts of the 1991, 1993 and 1994 seasons. Odor served as the Aeros hitting coach in 2012 and served as the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014.

A native of Maracaibo, Venezuela, Odor was a 32nd round selection by Cleveland in the 1988 draft out of the University of New Orleans. The former shortstop played in the minor leagues for Cleveland from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), and Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

Odor resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of major league infielder Rougneh Odor.

#30 Brad Goldberg, *Pitching Coach (First Season)* — Brad Golberg, 33, enters his second season with the Guardians and first with the RubberDucks. In 2022, Goldberg served as a pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex staff.

A native of Beachwood, Ohio, Goldberg pitched at the Ohio State University before being a 10th round selection of the Chicago White Sox in the 2013 draft. He spent six years between the White Sox and Diamondbacks systems, appearing in 200 games. Goldberg made his Major League debut with the White Sox in 2017 with 11 relief outings.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, *Hitting Coach (Third Season, First as Hitting Coach)* — Mergenthaler, 34, enters his seventh year with the Guardians organization and third season with Akron. Mergenthaler spent 2022 as Akron's assistant hitting coach after serving as the bench coach for the RubberDucks in 2021.

Prior to coming to Akron, Mergenthaler was the bench coach with Lynchburg in 2019. In 2017 and 2018, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland and Milwaukee joint Dominican Summer League team. The Thiells, New York, native was a 32nd round pick of the San Francisco Giants in the 2011 draft out of the University of Richmond. In two professional seasons, he hit .252 in 102 games.

#1 Ian Forster, *Assistant Hitting Coach (First Season)* — Forster enters his fourth season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Forster spent 2022 as the hitting development coach on the Arizona Complex staff.

A graduate of North Olmsted High School, Forster played four years at Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, graduating in 2018.

#4 Daniel Robertson, *Bench Coach (First Season)* – Robertson, 37, enters his second season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Robertson spent 2022 as the bench coach for Single-A Lynchburg.

A native of West Covina, California, Robertson was a 33rd round pick in the 2008 draft by the San Diego Padres out of Oregon State University. Robertson played 12 professional seasons including 148 Major League games. He appeared in 32 games as an outfielder for Cleveland in 2017.

Jacob Legan, *Athletic Trainer (Third Season)* — Legan is in his 10th season in the Cleveland organization and third season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Legan served as the athletic trainer for Lynchburg in 2019. He earned his bachelor's degree in Athletic Training from East Carolina, his master's degree in Exercise Physiology from the University of Akron and his Doctor of Athletic Training from Temple University.

Mo Cuevas, *Strength and Conditioning Coach (First Season)* – Cuevas enters his eighth season with the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Cuevas served as the rehab strength and conditioning coach in 2022.

Zach Block, *Baseball Technology Fellow (Second Season)* – Block returns to Akron after serving in the same role in 2022. Since graduating with a bachelor's degree from the University of Miami in 2015, Block has worked in the Cincinnati Reds, Toronto Blue Jays, Los Angeles Angels and Washington Nationals organizations. He earned his master's degree in sports analytics and management in 2022.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the 'Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.

Akron Baseball: A Winning Tradition

This is the 33rd season of Double-A baseball in Northeast Ohio, and the 25th in downtown Akron. The franchise began as the **Canton-Akron Indians** in 1989, and then moved to **Canal Park** in Akron as the **Aeros** in 1997, later becoming the **RubberDucks** before the 2014 season. The club has made the Eastern League playoffs 18 times overall, and 12 of the last 19 seasons. The team has captured **six league titles**—2003, 2005, 2009, 2012, 2016 and 2021. Notable alumni of the franchise include Víctor Martínez, CC Sabathia, Grady Sizemore, Charles Nagy, Cliff Lee, Jhonny Peralta, Jaret Wright, Francisco Lindor, José Ramírez, and Shane Bieber.
