Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Ben Lively** to the mound tonight, making his first start in Triple-A since 4/9/24 (rehab, last non-rehab start: 8/18/23 with Louisville). The Storm Chasers will counter with RHP **Henry Williams**. Columbus is 49-34 (.590) versus right handers this year. Williams has pitched against Columbus three times in his career, going 0-1 with a 5.52ERA (14.2IP, 14H, 9R, 9ER, 8BB, 19K).

vs. the Storm Chasers

Columbus has lost 51 of the last 84 regular season games against Omaha, dating to 5/5/22. Of those 84G, the Clippers are 12-48 (.200) when they allow at least four runs to Omaha (5-5 in last 10G), while going 21-3 (.875) when they hold the Storm Chasers to three or fewer. Individually, **Ralph Velazquez** has played 12G against Omaha in his career, hitting .340 (17x50) with 5HR and 11RBI.

Getting Offensive

Over the last 14G, the Clippers have plated a total of 108 runs (most in the IL, 7.7 per game), after coming out of the All-Star Break with 35 runs in the first 9G (16th in the IL, 3.9 per). They scored at least five runs in 13 straight games until last night (longest stretch in IL this year). The scoring barrage has seen 75 tallied in the first four innings of the game (30 scored in the 1st), including five innings of 5+.

Homer Time

Columbus has gained 14 in the homer column over the last 14G (39-25; out-homered 36-21 in 19G prior) to get back in the black (+1, 8th in the IL). The 39HR hit in the last 14G (most in pro baseball since 7/28) is the best 14G stretch for any team in the IL this season (64HR combined is the most hit and allowed over a 14G run; 4.6 per game). The Clippers have homered in 13 of the last 14G.

Walking in Front

A pair of walks tonight will give the Clipper lineup 600 on the year, as they sit 38BB up on 2nd place in the IL (598BB already ranks as 8th most in franchise history, on pace for 770; record of 741 was established in 1983). Unfortunately, they crossed 1,000K in last night's game (16th time in franchise history, all in last 18 seasons). The 156HR hit are tied with last year's club for 10th most in team history.

Ingle is Back

In 25G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 37x101 (.366), drawing 19BB (.463OBP) with 16XBH (6HR, .644SLG). He is the only batter in the IL hitting .300/.400/.500 (57PA from permanently qualifying for rate statistics), while currently riding a 17G on base streak (.470OBP since 7/23, drawn 7BB in last 4G). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.317OPS (15HR) in 42G (.660OPS and 3HR in 33G between DH and LF).

Deep Fry'd

David Fry was 0x9 (3K) in his first 2G after getting optioned on 8/3, but has rebounded to go 6x12 with a double, 4HR and 9RBI in his last 3G. He passed 100RBI as a Clipper last time out, with a career best 6RBI on 8/12 vs. Omaha (105RBI in 156G for Columbus). **Kyle Manzanro** has 2HR and 3RBI in his last 4G, as 57 of 103 hits in his Columbus career have gone for extra bases (.555SLG).

Bring it on Home

Ralph Velazquez had 4HR in 5G at Syracuse (21AB; had 2HR in 100AB of previous 25G on the road), boosting his OPS away from Huntington Park to .709. He owns 3HR in 2G this week (.977OPS in 31G at home) and, dating to 7/28, he leads the IL in HR (10), RBI (20; RBI in 12 of 13G) and SLG (.940). Aside from the trip to St. Paul (0x21 in 6G, 7/21-7/26), he is hitting .326/.401/.652 since 6/18.

Good Trip

Dayan Fries played four times last week in August (4G in previous two series combined, 7/21-8/2), collecting a hit in each one to bat .429 (6x14) with a HR and 3RBI. After slashing .171/.275/.220 with a HR and 9RBI in his first 44G, Fries is at .279/.347/.442 with 2HR and 13RBI in his last 27G. He enters tonight at season highs in average (.215) and SLG (.311; .304OBP is highest since .317 on 4/12).

Problems on the Back End

Since allowing 7ER in 4.1IP at Lehigh Valley on 7/12, the Clipper bullpen has registered an IL-worst 7.39ERA in 24G (98.2IP, 81ER). Clipper relievers have surrendered 20HR in that time (3rd most in the IL), allowing a line of .277/.387/.514. The bullpen has not put together a scoreless outing since back to back games vs. Louisville from 7/4-7/5 (95ER in 29G since; 64ER in 29G prior).

This Date in Clipper History

8/14/1985

Bob Tewksbury dominated Richmond, allowing 1ER in 7.0IP, to pick up his first win of the season. The Clippers won 8-2 with offensive contributions coming from **Scott Bradley** (1HR, 2RBI), the 1984 IL MVP, and **Dan Pasqua** (1HR, 3RBI), the 1985 IL MVP. Both Bradley and Pasqua also won the IL Rookie of the Year in their respective MVP seasons (J.T. Snow became the 3rd double winner for Columbus in 1992).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,472 to 1,421).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 167-131 (.560) in pitch reviews, with batters going 85-80 (.515) and pitchers/catchers going 82-51 (.617). They have run out of challenges in 45G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 834, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 133 through 115G (on pace for 172SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 41CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (53; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eights

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 164 runs while crafting an .893OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 106 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +58 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 264-168 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,978RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.47 through 115G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 201HR (2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 62G this season (37-25, .597), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 6th most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 8th most games decided in the last at bat (27, Norfolk has 34). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 101G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-53 (.475, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 447-460 (.493), 417-414 with Columbus (.502).

June Swoon:

In his first 10G of the year (March-May), Maltrud gave up 15ER in 50.2IP (2.66ERA), holding the opposition to a .195 average (38x186, 4HR). He gave up multiple runs in each of 5G in June (17.1IP, 15ER) and struggled in July also (22.0IP, 12ER), as he posted a 6.18ERA (39.1IP, 27ER) over the two months. Opposing hitters batted .294 (48x163) with 10HR in 10G from June-July (9HR to last 107BF). Since the calendar has flipped to August, Maltrud has regained his early season form, turning in a 1.86ERA (9.2IP, 2ER) through his first two outings.

Undecided:

Through the month of June, Maltrud was the only pitcher in the IL with at least 10GS that had not taken a loss and his lone win (4/11 at Worcester) made him the only starter with a single decision. He is 3-1 in 7G since the start of July, winning back to back starts to begin the month and suffering his first loss of the year in his 17th start (7/22 at St. Paul). Despite a 3.93ERA as a starter and run support of 5.5 per game, Maltrud has left with the lead only nine times because the offense is averaging 2.5 runs while he is the pitcher of record, including 11G with two runs or fewer (5G with zero runs).

Efficiency is Key:

Through 103 innings started in 21G, Maltrud has retired the side with fewer than 10 pitches on 13 occasions, including a 4-pitch inning on 4/3 vs. Indianapolis, while turning in 21 innings of more than 20. He has hit 30+ three times, thanks to an 11-pitch battle vs. Iowa's **Pedro Ramirez** on 4/17 (walk, 34 in the inning) and a 14-pitch skirmish with Buffalo's **Yohendrick Pinango** on 4/23 (groundout, 30 total). He ranks 4th in the IL with 15.6 pitches per inning (17.0 per from 6/2-7/28).

Among the Leader Beans:

Entering today's game, Maltrud is 6th in the IL with a 3.97ERA (19 qualifiers, dropped out of the top five after allowing 7ER in 3.2IP at St. Paul on 7/22). From his quality start win on 4/11 at Worcester through his quality start on 5/25 at Toledo, he crafted the 2nd best ERA in the IL, at 2.14ERA (42.0IP, 10ER). Additionally, Maltrud's 0.95WHIP in that time ranked 2nd best (1.29WHIP on the season places 6th).

Stepping Up:

With runners in scoring position this season, Maltrud has held the opposition to a line of .171/.263/.232, surrendering just 1HR in 82AB. With a runner at first base, he has struggled to a line of .297/.358/.514 while allowing 4HR (74AB) and with the bases empty, the bad guys have hit .253/.310/.428 with 10HR in 229AB.

Pitch to Contact:

Maltrud's Triple-A debut on 3/28 at Iowa was the 44th game of his career and marked his 37th consecutive start (reached 41GS before relief appearance on 4/30 vs. Toledo, all 7G in relief of career have come on starter's rest and been at least 3.0IP). He did not punch out any Cubs in that game (15BF), marking his second straight game without a strikeout (37BFw/0K from, 9/10/25-4/3/26; had at least 1K in all 42G prior). Among 101 pitchers in the IL that have at least 230BF this year, Maltrud has the 23rd best walk rate (8.0%; 34BB to 424BF) and the 62nd best strikeout rate (20.3%, 86K; had worst rate, 11.9%, through first month of the year).

In Relief:

Maltrud has pitched three times in relief this season (previous 5G out of the bullpen came among first 7G as a pro), piggybacking **Trenton Denholm** on 4/30 vs. Toledo (3.0IP, 40 pitches), **Daniel Espino** on 6/2 vs. Omaha (4.0IP, 81 pitches) and Austin Peterson on 8/9 at Syracuse (3.1IP, 47 pitches). He has registered a 4.35ERA out of the bullpen (10.1IP, 15H, 5R, 5ER, 2BB, 16K).
