YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Sea Dogs, 5-1. In the third, Justin Wishkoski hit a double and scored on a single by Diego Velasquez to give Richmond a 1-0 lead. In the fourth, Ronald Rosario hit a two-run homer to give the Sea Dogs a 2-1 lead. Rosario homered again the eighth, a solo shot to push to lead to 3-1. In the ninth, Portland scored a run on a fielder's choice and Max Ferguson added an RBI single for a 5-1 lead. The Flying Squirrels left the bases loaded in the eighth and ninth innings.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game series against the Portland Sea Dogs, Double-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox. This is the only series between the two teams this year. Last year in their only head-to-head series, the Flying Squirrels won four of six in Portland. In the series, the Flying Squirrels have hit .177 (11-for-62) with runners in scoring position and have left 47 on base.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,556 fans per home game, which ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won Friday night to snap a three-game losing streak, their first since mid-June, before losing again on Saturday night. They are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, one game behind Altoona. Prior to this series, they had gone 10-2 in their previous 12 games. They had won three consecutive series, sweeping a three-game road series against the Baysox from July 4-6, winning five-of-six in Akron from July 8-13 and taking two-of-three at The Diamond against the Senators last weekend. Their six-game win streak from July 4-10 was their longest winning streak since picking up seven consecutive wins from Sept. 2-9, 2023. Of Richmond's 58 losses this season, 32 of them have been by two runs or less (21 by one, 11 by two). Their 21 one-run losses are the most in the EL, one more than Reading. Richmond's +23 run differential in the second half is second-best in the league.

THE SEA DOGS were on a four-game win streak, one shy of their longest winning streak of the season, before losing on Friday They are 8-3 in their last 11 games since July 11 after going 3-11 in their previous 14 games from June 25-July 10. Portland's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Red Sox prospects, including LPP Payton Tolle (No. 3), OF James Tibbs III (No. 10), LHP Connelly Early (No. 11), RHP David Sandlin (No. 12), SS Mikey Romero (No. 14), OF Allan Castro (No. 25) and OF Zach Ehrhard (No. 29). MLB.com's top-30 Red Sox prospects list features nine Portland players, including Tolle (No. 3), Tibbs (No. 6), Sandlin (No. 9), Early (No. 10), Romero (No. 12), Castro (No. 20), RHP Blake Wehunt (No. 24), LHP Hayden Mullins (No. 29) and Zach Erhard (No. 30).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.04 ERA (91 ER/269.0 IP) in 31 games, which is the second-best in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 2.36 ERA (35 ER/133.2 IP) in that stretch. In their last 12 road games since June 17, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.29 ERA (28 ER/110.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander John Michael Bertrand makes his 19th start of the season and the sixth of his career against the Sea Dogs. Tonight marks the 57th start of his Richmond career, moving him ahead of Kyle Crick (2014-16) and Jack Snodgrass (2013-15) for third-most in franchise history. He started the series opener on Tuesday night against the Sea Dogs and threw five scoreless innings with six strikeouts. It was his second consecutive scoreless start. He threw seven innings and allowed two hits on July 10 at Akron in his last start before the All-Star Break. In July, Bertrandis 2-0 with a 0.51 EPA (1 ER/17.2 IP) in three starts. For the season, he ranks second in the Eastern League in innings pitched (95.2), third in ERA (3.10) and ninth in WHIP (1.30). After going 0-4 with a 5.91 ERA (14 ER/17.1 IP) in five April starts, Bertrand has gone 4-3 with a 2.30 ERA (19 ER/174.1 IP) in his last 3 starts since May 4. Since the start of the 2024 season, Bertrand leads all MilLB pitchers in innings (25.12) and double play groundouts (34). Last year, he was named the Flying Squirrels' Pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand lead all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MilLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. He was selected by the Giants in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft. For more on Bertrand, see page two.

FOR PORTLAND: Left-hander Connelly Early makes his 13th start of the season and the first of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Sunday at Reading and allowed one run over 5.2 innings. He also allowed one run over six innings in a
win in his previous start on July 12 against the Yard Goats. For the season, Early ranks third in the Eastern League in strikeouts
(96) and tied for seventh in wins (7). Of pitchers in the EL who have thrown at least 70 innings this season, Early has the second-highest K/9 (12.1) and strikeout percentage (32.3%), trailing only Binghamton's Jonah Tong (14.0/40%). He first reached Double-A with Portland last July and went 2-3 with a 4.50 ERA in eight starts to close the season. Early is a native of Midlothian, Va.,
and attended James River High School. He started his collegiate career at Army West Point before transferring to the University
of Virginia for his final season in 2023. With UVa, he made a start at The Diamond on April 18, 2023 against VCU and allowed
three runs over five innings in a win. Early was selected by the Red Sox in the fifth round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of UVa.

NEW FACES: Outfielders Bo Davidson and Scott Bandura were assigned to the Flying Squirrels last week from High-A Eugene. With the Emeralds this season, Davidson was ranked second in the Northwest League in batting average (.309), second in RBIs (56), second in triples (6), third in SLG (.507), fourth in OBP (.412), fourth in OPS (.919), fourth in hits (87), tied for fourth in total bases (143), tied for fifth in runs (53), seventh in walks (49) and seventh in extra-base hits (30). He was also second in the Northwest League in wRC+ (148). Davidson is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 4 Giants prospect and No. 8 by MLB.com. Bandura was leading the Northwest League in runs (65) and ranked second in hits (98), second in stolen bases (30), third in batting average (.307), fifth in OBP (.399) and seventh in total bases (140). Bandura made his Double-A debut in the first game of last Saturday's doubleheader and collected three hits, including a solo homer. Davidson hit his first Double-A homer last Sunday.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan and Onil Perez have combined to catch 49 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 36 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 49 runners caught stealing for his career is tied for third-most in franchise history, even with Brandon Martorano (2021-24) and trailing Eliezer Zambrano (53, 2010-2017).

SECOND-HALF SABIN: Sabin Ceballos is batting .310 (18-for-58) in his last 17 games since July 3 with two homers, four doubles, nine RBIs, 10 walks and 10 runs scored. The stretch has raised his season batting average from .176 to .205. He reached base four times on Tuesday night against the Sea Dogs, going 3-for-3 with a double and a walk. He repeated on Wednesday, going 3-for-3 with a double and a walk. He had reached base in eight consecutive plate appearances entering Friday's game before flying out in his first plate appearance. Last year, Ceballos hif. .295 with seven homers and 30 RBIs in his last 32 games of the season, all with High-A Eugene after being traded from the Braves to the Giants.

KING OF THE HILL: Turner Hill had his 13-game on-base streak snapped on Thursday, going 0-for-2. It was tied for the second-longest on-base streak by a Richmond player this year. In his last 15 games since July 3, Hill is batting .320 (16-for-50) with three doubles, two triples, a homer, 10 walks and 10 RBIs. Despite not starting his season until May 27, Hill is tied for second in the Eastern League with five triples this year.

SAVING THE DAY: Tyler Myrick recorded his seventh save of the season on July 12 in Akron. It was the 19th save of his Richmond career, which sits seventh on the franchise's all-time list, one behind sixth-place Cody Hall (20). Myrick has converted all three of his save attempts since July 1 over six appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on Friday night, working the final four outs.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked tied for fifth in walks (48), sixth in hits (88) and seventh in OBP (366). Turner Hill is tied for second in triples (5). Seth Lonsway is third in innings pitched (92.0), sixth in ERA (3.52) and ninth in strikeouts (84). John Michael Bertrand is second in innings pitched (95.2), third in ERA (3.10) and ninth in WHIP (1.30). Jack Choate is fourth in strikeouts (95) and, seventh in ERA (3.59) and eighth in BAA (.230). Joe Whitman is 10th strikeouts (82). Tyler Myrick is tied for fifth in saves (7).

TOP SKIPPER: Hyng Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 239 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bo Davidson (No. 4), Diego Velasquez (No. 7), Joe Whitman (No. 8), Jack Choate (No. 24) and Sabin Ceballos (No. 29). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features four Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 12), Velasquez (No. 18) and Choate (No. 27).

1967: The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 3-2, at Parker Field in front of a crowd of 11,27. In the bottom of the 10th, Felix Millan singled and moved to third on a hit-and-run by Tommie Aaron. Jim Beachamp hit into a force out but beat a throw to first to score the winning run. . Richmond manager Luman Harris was ejected arguing a ball call during the second batter of the game. Rochester manager Earl Weaver put the game under protest. 1981: The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 4-3, at Parker Field. In the bottom of the 10th, Randy Johnson led off with a homer to win the game. 1990: The Richmond Braves beat the Buffalo Bisons, 2-1, at The Diamond. In the bottom of the 10th, Dwight Taylor singled home Bruce Crabbe to win the game. 1993: The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 11-7, at The Diamond. Ryan Klesko won the game with a walk-off grand slam in the 10th. 2018: The Flying Squirrels beat the Reading Fightin Phils, 2-1, at The Diamond. Conner Menez started and threw 5.2 scoreless innings, striking out 10 batters. John Polonius gave Richmond a 1-0 lead with an RBI double in the second inning. Reading tied the game, 1-1, with an RBI single by Deivy Gruillon in the top of the ninth inning. In the bottom of the ninth, Polonius was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded to bring home the walk-off winning run. 2024: The Flying Squirrels beat the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, 4-3, at The Diamond.
