YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the RubberDucks, 4-2, at Canal Park for their fourth straight win. Akron took a 1-0 lead in the third inning on a single by Cooper Ingle, the only run allowed by **Seth Lonsway** in his start. **Sabin Ceballos** tied the game with an RBI single in the top of the fourth inning. In the fifth, **Carter Howell** gave the Flying Squirrels the lead with a sacrifice fly in the fifth and **Turner Hill** added an RBI single. Richmond opened a 4-1 lead in the eighth with a sacrifice fly by **Justin Wishkoski**. In the bottom of the ninth, Jonah Advincula hit an RBI single, cutting the score to 4-2, but **Marques Johnson** recorded a strikeout to strand a runner at first and end the game. **Nick Sinacola** allowed one hit over 2.2 scoreless relief innings.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a six-game road series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. This is Richmond's final trip to Akron this year. The RubberDucks swept a three-game series at The Diamond to open the season from April 4-6 and took five-of-six at Canal Park from April 22-27. The Flying Squirrels host the RubberDucks from August 26-31.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,622 fans per home game, which ranks sixth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS swept the weekend three-game series in Bowie and went 4-2 against the Baysox between the home-and-home sets last week. Their current four-game win streak is their longest this season. Of Richmond's 52 losses this season, 29 of them have been by two runs or less (19 by one, 10 by two). Their 19 one-run losses are the most in the EL, one ahead of Reading (18). The Richmond offense is 11th in the Eastern League in runs scored (268). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.48 ERA.

THE RUBBERDUCKS have lost four straight games after winning their previous five straight. Over the weekend, they dropped all three games at home against the SeaVolves. They swept their three games in Erie to begin last week. The RubberDucks finished the first half in second place in the Southwest Division, two games behind Erie. Akron's roster features three players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects, including SS Angel Genao (No. 2), C Cooper Ingle (No. 8) and OF Kahlil Watson (No. 22). There are three Akron players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects, including Genao (No. 2), Ingle (No. 8) and Watson (No. 29).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 17, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.04 ERA (49 ER/145.0 IP) in 17 games, which is third-best in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 1.46 ERA (11 ER/68.0 IP) in that stretch. In their last eight road games since June 17, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 1.91 ERA (14 ER/66.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his 16th start of the season and his third against the RubberDucks in his hometown at Canal Park. He last pitched on Thursday at The Diamond against the Baysox and allowed two runs over five innings in a no-decision, striking out seven. Whitman was born in Akron and attended Hudson High School, about 25 minutes north of Canal Park. With Richmond, Whitman pitched in Akron twice earlier this season. On April 22, he was charged with three runs over four innings with five strikeouts in a loss. He was also hit with a loss in the Sunday finale of that series on April 27, allowing four runs in 2.2 innings. On May 3, Whitman threw six perfect innings against the Patriots at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced, and set a career high with 10 strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on May 5. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 10 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Rorik Maltrud makes his 10th start of the season and his second against the Flying Squirrels. He threw two scoreless innings in his last start on Thursday at Erie. In his previous start on June 27 against the Senators, he pitched one scoreless inning. That was his first outing back from the injured list after missing a month with a forearm strain. Maltrud pitched against the Flying Squirrels on April 26 at Canal Park and pitched 4.1 scoreless innings. After allowing five runs in his previous start on April 19 at Erie, his start against the Flying Squirrels started six-start span where he has gone 2-0 with a 0.46 ERA (1 ER/19.2 IP). Maltrud signed with the Guardians last January after spending the 2023 season at Missouri. He also pitched two seasons at New Mexico State. In his professional debut season last year, Maltrud went 8-5 in 24 outings (19 starts) between Low-A Lynchburg and High-A Lake County.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 44 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 31 runners caught stealing. Sugastey is tied for the second-most runners caught stealing by a catcher in a single season in franchise history, even with **Andrew Susac** (31 - 2013) and trailing **Jackson Williams** (35 - 2013). For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 44 runners caught stealing for his career is fourth-most in franchise history, five behind **Brandon Martorano** (49 - 2021-24).

SUGEY SHOW: At the plate, **Adrián Sugastey** is batting .364 (12-for-33) with two homers, a double, seven RBIs, five walks and three runs scored over his last 10 games since June 21. He has posted a 1.023 OPS in that stretch. In his current six-game hitting streak dating back to June 28, he is batting .429 (9-for-21). He has picked up two hits in three-of-his-last-four games, totaling six RBIs. For the season, Sugastey is second on the team with 29 RBIs and is tied for the team lead with eight homers, which is a new career high.

ARTY PARTY: **Aeverson Arteaga** has three multi-hit games in his last seven games since July 1, batting .333 (7-for-21) with a homer, a double, five RBIs, three walks and five runs scored. Last Tuesday, he had his fourth three-hit game of the season. He picked up two singles in Friday night's win at Chesapeake and closed the weekend with a 2-for-3 game on Sunday, adding a homer and a double with three RBIs.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?: **Vaun Brown** is batting .364 (8-for-22) over his last eight games since June 27, raising his season average from .192 to .243. In that stretch, he has two doubles, five walks, three stolen bases and four runs scored. On Sunday afternoon in the finale in Bowie, he went 3-for-3 with a double and a walk, scoring twice.

SAVING THE DAY: **Tyler Myrick** recorded his fifth save of the season on Wednesday night in the completion of Tuesday's rain-suspended game against the Baysox. It was the 17th save of his Richmond career, tying home for seventh on the Flying Squirrels career saves list with **Heath Hembree**. He is three saves behind **Cody Hall** for sixth on the all-time list.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked fifth in hits (76), sixth in OBP (.372) and tied for sixth in walks (42). **Turner Hill** is tied for second in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is fifth in innings pitched (79.2), seventh in ERA (3.50) and seventh in strikeouts (74). **John Michael Bertrand** is second in innings pitched (83.2) and eighth in ERA (3.55). **Jack Choate** is sixth in strikeouts (77) and 10th in BAA (.236). **Joe Whitman** is 10th in strikeouts (72).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 231 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Diego Velasquez** (No. 7), **Joe Whitman** (No. 8), **Jack Choate** (No. 24) and **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 29). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

SHUFFLING THE RANKINGS: Baseball America announced its updated top-30 Giants prospects list this week. **Diego Velasquez** climbed from 10th to seventh. **Joe Whitman** dropped from fifth to eighth. **Jack Choate** climbed from 26th to 24th. **Sabin Ceballos** dropped from 21st to 29th.

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1962: The Richmond Virginians beat the Columbus Jets, 4-0, at Parker Field. Jack Cullen threw a six-hit shutout. Richmond opened the scoring against Bob Veale in the fifth. Jack Davis hit an RBI triple and Albert Hall singled in a run for a 2-0 lead. Don Lock added an RBI single in the sixth. Ben Mateosky singled home a run in the eighth. Willie Stargell went 0-for-4. **1971:** The Richmond Braves lost to the Charleston Charlies, 4-1, in 10 innings. Ron Davis brought in the go-ahead run with a squeeze for the first of three unearned runs. Baltimore Colts quarterback Johnny Unitas was in town and stopped by the ballpark for the game. **1974:** The Richmond Braves beat the Memphis Blues, 13-8. Gary Carter gave Memphis a lead with a two-run homer in the fourth. In the fifth, Richmond scored four runs including a two-run single by Bob Beall. Richmond scored seven in the seventh. **2021:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 6-0, in the first game of a doubleheader at Prince George's Stadium. Caleb Kilian threw a complete-game, three-hit shutout, striking out four. Heliot Ramos hit a solo homer in the first inning. Brandon Martorano added a solo homer in the second. Later in the second, Bryan Torres and Ramos hit RBI singles to open a 4-0 lead. Richmond added two runs in the sixth with an error and a wild pitch.
