Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound tonight, making his first start since his Major League debut on 9/5 (tonight is 101st game in the minors). The Bats will counter with RHP **Jose Franco**. Columbus is 56-40 (.583) versus right handers this year. Franco has pitched against the Clippers five times in his career, going 2-0 with a 1.80ERA (15.0IP, 9H, 3R, 3ER, 7BB, 14K).

vs. the Bats

Columbus was 7-11 against Louisville last year, going 4-10 in the last 14G to lose the season series for the third straight year (4-0 from 2018-22). The Clippers have won each series so far this year (3-2 from 5/19-5/23, 4-2 from 6/30-7/5). **Kahlil Watson** has hit .340 (17x50) with 2HR and 6RBI in 13G against Louisville in his career (**Milan Tolentino** has hit 4HR with 18RBI in 30G).

That Hurts

Last night's loss marked the second straight road series to open 0-3 (last 0-4 start was 7/29-8/1/25 at Jacksonville) and guaranteed a losing record on the road. The Clippers were hitless with RISP for the second straight game (1x126 in the series), while watching 11LOB for the second straight game (31LOB in the series). However, Columbus can still clinch the half with as few as six wins in the last nine.

Start with a Bang

Over the last 37G, the Clippers have plated 251 runs (most in the IL, 6.8 per), with 160 (64%) tallied in the first four innings of the game. Opponents have only 81 in the first four innings of the last 37G, but are outscoring the Clippers 121-91 thereafter. Tuesday night's loss snapped a 64G win streak when Columbus led after the 7th (first loss since 8/22/25; 78 straight wins when leading after the 8th; 8/7/25).

Bombs Away

Columbus leads all of pro baseball in homers hit since 7/28 (77), entering today with the 3rd most in franchise history (194, one of four teams in the IL with at least 190, zero PCL teams have that many; 10 of 13 teams with at least 160 in Triple-A are in the IL). Columbus has only 90HR on the road, but is averaging at least one a game for the seventh straight season (zero times in previous 14 seasons).

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 29 points on his batting average over his last 25G (.213, 19x89) and 75 points from his slugging, with only 4XBH (HR on Saturday snapped streak of 66AB without), but his OBP has dipped only six points in that time, as he has 30BB in 119PA. He ranks 2nd in the IL in walks (82; **Christian Cairo** is 1st with 90BB), having accumulated them in only 433PA (19%, Cairo has 509PA).

Heating Up

Kahlil Watson has hit safely in each of the last 7G (.367/.406/.767), picking up 3HR and 9RBI (.204/.339/.355 with 4HR and 15RBI in first 26G after being optioned on 7/22). **Kyle Manzardo** was 5x24 in his first 7G after getting optioned on 8/3, but then went on a 19G hit streak from 8/15-9/6 (2nd longest in the IL this year; .347, 26x75, 3HR, 23RBI) before going hitless in the first 2G of this series (9AB).

Twenty Town

Kody Huff snapped a 12G homerless streak on Tuesday, to reach 20 on the season (.346, 18x52, .538SLG since 8/23). Columbus now has three players with at least 20 and a couple more with 19 (**Kahlil Watson** hit 19th on Sunday, **Cooper Ingle** hit 19th on Saturday), marking the second time in history (2019) the Clippers have five players with at least 19HR (never had five with at least 20HR).

Capitalizing

George Valera has played sparingly since 7/28, appearing in only 16 of 37G, but he has slashed .350/.451/.767 with 6HR and 14RBI when he does take the field (hit .148/.250/.182 with 0HR and 7RBI in 26G prior, 6/10-7/26). The hot streak includes hits in 14 of 16G and, dating to a game prior, he has reached base in 17 straight (.440OBP). In his Clipper career, he has hammered 49HR (t-17th all time).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino popped his 20th homer Saturday night and picked up his 18th steal on Friday, as he attempts to secure the second 20-20 season in franchise history. He scored the first such season last year and, since the start of 2025, he is 2nd in the IL with 41HR (t-25th with 38SB). **Kahlil Watson** is sitting at 19HR (career high, had 11HR through 5/29) and 22SB (three off career best).

This Date in Clipper History

9/11/2010

The legend of **Playoff Paolo Espino** was born in Scranton, as he dominated the Yankees over 7.0IP to clinch a 3-1 series win and a berth in the Governors' Cup Finals against Durham. Captain Clinch also won the deciding game of that series and the deciding game of the 2011 Governors' Cup against Lehigh Valley. Espino was 3-0 with a 2.25ERA in three postseason starts for the Clippers in his career.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,496 to 1,450).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 190-150 (.559) in pitch reviews, with batters going 95-89 (.516) and pitchers/catchers going 95-61 (.609). They have run out of challenges in 48G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 838, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 166 through 138G (on pace for 177SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 50CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (53; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 190 runs while crafting a .884OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 129 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +61 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 310-201 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,003RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.36 through 138G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 198HR (would be 2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 76G this season (43-33, .566), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (15, three off the lead) while playing in the 13th most games decided in the last at bat (28, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 102G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 49-53 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 460-470 (.495), 430-424 with Columbus (.504).

Made It:

After pitching exactly 100G in the minor leagues, Peterson was recalled to Cleveland on 9/4 to make his Major League debut on 9/5 vs. Detroit (11th Clipper to debut this season; 2.0IP, 1H, 0R, 0ER, 0BB, 3K). Following that one relief appearance (had 4G in relief of minor league career, all with Columbus), he was optioned to Columbus on 9/6.

Starting Now:

Peterson got a late start to the season, beginning the year on the shelf with a strained right triceps. Since being activated on 4/28, he is one of 31 pitchers in the IL to accumulate at least 80.0IP, ranking 13th among that group with a 4.53ERA (95.1IP, 48ER) and 18th with a 1.42WHIP. He ranks 4th with 102K thanks to a 12K outing on 6/16 vs. Scranton/WB (one off career high of 13K with Lake County at Cedar Rapids on 5/29/24; had second career 0K game on 7/9 at Lehigh Valley).

That's Over:

From 5/9-7/23, the Clippers went 1-12 in Peterson's 13G, as he personally went 0-8 (longest losing streak of career, had 10 losses in previous two seasons combined). He registered a 5.52ERA (58.2IP, 36ER) over the stretch, while the bullpen produced a 6.99ERA (47.2IP, 37ER) and blew three saves. In 6G beginning with 7/29 vs. Toledo, he is 5-0 and owns a 3.34ERA (29.2IP, 11ER), as the Clippers have been victorious in each game.

Love Those Ohio Mounds:

Peterson excels when pitching in Ohio, having appeared in the state 42 times over his short career (19G with Columbus, 12G with Akron, 8G with Lake County, 3G in Toledo). He owns a 16-10 record in the Buckeye State, fashioning a 2.57ERA (234.2IP, 187H, 71R, 67ER, 51BB, 232K). Outside of Ohio, his ERA sits at 4.42 over 58G (283.1IP, 299H, 161R, 139ER, 71BB, 258K).

First and Foremost:

Through his first 12GS, Peterson allowed a single run in the 1st inning (homer to **Kaelen Culpepper** to lead off the game on 5/15 at St. Paul; opposing hitters were 3x38 with 3BB and 16K in the 1st inning). That all changed in his 13th start, at Lehigh Valley on 7/9, when he labored through the opening frame on 41 pitches, allowing a trio of runs (3x6, 2BB). In 8G since, including his two relief outings, Peterson has held the opposition to 5ER in his first inning of work (10x34, 2BB, 9K). Despite that early success, the top third of the order has a .934OPS off Peterson (9HR in 145AB), while batters 4-9 produce a .667OPS (4HR in 224AB).

In a Jam:

Opposing hitters are batting .309 (47x152) with runners on base (.310, 27x87 with RISP) this year, while going just 54x217 (.249) with the bases empty. He did not uncork a wild pitch this season until his 410th offering with men on base, 7/9 at Lehigh Valley (had another wild pitch in next outing, 7/18 vs. Indy; 3WP in 1,280 pitches with men on base during Clipper career).

From the 'Pen:

Peterson made his third career relief appearance on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, picking up a suspended game in the 4th inning against the Indians. Pitching on his regular day of rest, he threw 72 pitches over 4.0IP, while allowing 4ER (15.0IP, 11ER in relief career). He then made his fourth career appearance on 8/23 vs. St. Paul, piggybacking off **Justin Campbell** and scoring a win (82 pitches, 4.2IP, 6H, 3R, 3ER, 0BB, 7K).

500K:

On 8/1 vs. Toledo, Denholm racked up 8K for the third time this year, crossing 500 in his career in the process (8.4K/9IP). He has seen that rate bump slightly this season (8.8K/9IP), while his 3.48K/BB ratio ranks 5th in the IL among 54 pitchers with at least 80.0IP (0BB to 67BF from 7/21-8/7).

Great Start:

Denholm's season debut, 4/1 vs. Indianapolis, was his 100th career game and his second at the Triple-A level (367 days between Triple-A games). He needed only 69 pitches to record a quality start (6.0IP, 1ER), giving the Clippers their first of the season (5th game, did not have a quality start until 41st game last season). Columbus has 19QS on the season (20QS through this point last year, on the way to 23), with **Rorik Maltrud** (8), **Logan Allen** (4) and Denholm (4) accounting for 84%.

In Relief:

Denholm pitched exclusively in relief during May and June, but each appearance came on starter's rest, as he averaged 56.0 pitches per outing (ranged from 38-84, while recording 2.0-5.0IP). In total, he was 7-0 with a 1.95ERA over 9G (32.1IP, 30H, 9R, 7ER, 5BB, 35K). He led the IL in wins from May-June and, among 76 pitchers with at least 30.0IP, his ERA was 2nd best (also 2nd with 7.00K/BB and 6th with a 1.08WHIP). On 5/20 vs. Louisville, Denholm notched his first save in Triple-A (4.0IP, 1ER) and the fifth of his pro career.

90 is the New 100:

On 8/7 at Syracuse, Denholm threw 91 pitches to mark the only time in the last 83G that a Columbus pitcher has crossed 90 (staff had seven such outings through first 55G, maxing out at 93 pitches three times; no 100 pitch games since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 602G ago). Denholm is one of two Clipper starters averaging over 80 pitches per start (80.1; **Logan Allen** is at 87.3).

Tough Ones:

On 4/12, Worcester hung 7ER on Denholm, tying a career high (third time), while also connecting for 2HR (both to same batter, Allan Castro). He followed up with a quality outing next time out, 4/18 vs. Iowa (6.0IP, 3ER), throwing a season high of 92 pitches. Denholm closed out April by giving up 7ER again, this time to Toledo on 4/30, while giving up 3HR for the first time in his career. Since leaving April with a 6.60ERA (30.0IP, 22ER), he has registered a mark of 4.28 (88.1IP, 42ER).

Limiting the Longballs:

From 4/12-4/30, Denholm surrendered 7HR to 90BF (one per 12.9BF), accounting for 15 of 19ER (6HR with men on base, including a grand slam on 4/12 at Worcester). He allowed only 2HR to the next 188BF from 5/7-7/12 (94.0BF per) before surrendering a pair in the 3rd inning at Lehigh Valley on 7/12. Including those IronPig homers, Denholm surrendered bombs in each of 3GS from 7/12-7/26, giving up 5HR to 57BF (one per 11.4BF; 4HR to 139BF since the start of August).
