GAME INFORMATION

SOMERSET 3, BINGHAMTON 0: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies were shutout in the second game of the six-game series against the Patriots. Binghamton record just four hits and over the first 18 innings have six hits and just two runs. Bryce Conley allowed three runs across 6.0 innings and is the first Ponies' arm to record back-to-back starts of 6.0+ IP this year. Jefry Yan and Guillo Zuñiga were scoreless in an inning out of the bullpen.

SENGA TIME: New York Mets RHP **Kodai Senga** is expected to make a rehab start for Double-A Binghamton, against the Somerset Patriots at TD Bank Ballpark in New Jersey on Thursday. He was expected to start on Tuesday but was scratched with ulnar nerve irritation (right upper arm). Senga was placed on the Mets' 15-day IL on April 28 with lumbar spine inflammation. This will be Senga's fourth rehab start on this rehab assignment, after he made a rehab start with Single-A St. Lucie on May 22 (vs. Palm Beach) and with Triple-A Syracuse on May 28 (at Rochester) and June 3 (vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre). Senga signed a five-year, \$75 million contract with the Mets on December 17, 2022, after spending the previous 11 seasons in Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks. He is originally from Gamagori, Japan.

THE RUMBLE PEN: Binghamton's bullpen is has earned 19 of the 23 wins this season. They hold a 3.87 ERA across 260.2 IP and have combined for 332 strikeouts, while the starters are 4-25, with a 5.36 ERA. Over the last 94.0 innings the bullpen has allowed 41 ER and three over the last six games. **Douglas Orellana** has allowed one run over his last five appearances, which have spanned 8.1 innings and leads the team with 5 wins. **Felipe De La Cruz** leads the bullpen with a 1.37 ERA has not allowed a run over his last six appearances (6.1 IP), **Dan Hammer (3-0)** holds a 3.00 ERA over his first 12.0 IP, **Brian Metoyer** has not allowed an earned run over his last four appearances, and **Jefry Yan** as gone scoreless over his last 6.0 IP with 10 SO over his last 4.0 IP.

POWER SURGE: Binghamton has mashed 16 HR over their last 15 games, which ranks 6th in the Eastern League. Binghamton began a power surge May 13 @ Somerset, and unloaded 17 HR over a two-week trip to Somerset/Richmond. The Rumble Ponies hit 27 HR in May which was T-8th in the Eastern League, after hitting 14 in April which was last in the EL. Over the last 16 games **JT Schwartz** has 6 HR, **Vincent Perozo** and **Nick Lorusso** have 4 each, and **Jacob Reimer** has 3 HR. **JT SMOOTH:** **1B JT Schwartz** mashed his 6th HR of the year on May 3 and drove in a career-high seven runs and tallied the third-grand slam of his career, his first since August 25, 2023, at New Hampshire. Last homestand, Schwartz went 12-for-36 (.333) 2 2B, 4 HR, 10 RBI, 4 BB, 9 SO on the and has now hit all six of his home runs over his last 17 games, since May 19 @ Richmond. Schwartz smashed 5 HR in 84 games with Double-A Binghamton last season and surpassed that number with 6 HR over his first 33 games this season.

SLUGGING SUERO: **C Chris Suero** the Mets' No. 14 prospect hit a walk-off 3-run HR on Friday, and played a part in three walk-offs on last homestand. He hit the walk-off single against Portland on May 29, and scored the winning-run on May 30. Suero is 2nd on the team with 8 HR and second with 24 RBIs. In the Eastern League he ranks T-4th with 36 BB and T-8th with 18 SB (leads team).

LO KNOWS: **INF Nick Lorusso** deposited his team-leading ninth home run of the season on Saturday night. On Binghamton's last road trip Lorusso went 14-for-46, (.304 AVG) 6 HR, 9 RBI, and three multi-hit games. Lorusso has now blasted four home runs over his last 16 games. The 25-year held a 13-game on-base streak, until May 19 night which still leads all players for Binghamton and his nine-game hit streak, which was snapped on May 14 which was also the longest for any Pony this year. Lorusso is now T-20th in the Eastern League with nine home runs with six in May which ranked 11th. This season he is slashing .208/.274/.415/.689 with 9 HR and 24 RBI.

REIMER REASON: **INF Jacob Reimer**, the Mets' No. 4 prospect hit a two-run home run in the first inning on Friday for his fifth of the year. He has 2 HR, 9 RBI, 12 R, 5 2B, 12 BB, and 7 SB over his last 15 games. Reimer recorded a career-high three stolen bases on May 28, along with his seventh multi-hit game over now his last 23 contests and his eighth multi-hit game of the season. Reimer is T-11th in the Eastern League with 13 doubles and ranks 15th with 30 walks. The 22-year-old ranks as MLB Pipeline's No. 2 third baseman prospect in baseball.

18 MICHAEL COLLINS MANAGER

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Canberra, Australia

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.

-Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.

-Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.

-He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.

-Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.

-Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.



25 MARIANO DUNCAN BENCH COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 5th **YEAR WITH NYM:** 8th **HOMETOWN:** San Pedro de Macoris, DR

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.

-Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.

-The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.



32 MATT CARASITI PITCHING COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Berlin, Conn.

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.

-Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.

-Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.

-Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.

-Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.

-Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.

-Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.

-Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.



5 RACHEL FOLDEN HITTING COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Baldwin Park, Calif.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.

-Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.

-She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).

-Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.



9 JAKE HAGER ASSISTANT HITTING COACH / INFIELD COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Sierra Vista, Nev.

-Jake Hager begins his first season with the Rumble Ponies and first as a coach in the Mets organization.

-Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.

-Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.

-Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.

MEET THE MET

- Throws a pitch called the "ghost fork," that is so named because its break gives the appearance that it disappears out of the strike zone...In 2025, used a new song called "Ghost Fork" by Japanese artist Yusuke Kamiji as his warm-up music.
- Is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any Major League team.
- In 2023, became the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).
- Had fans vote for his uniform number with the Mets...Had worn #41 with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks.
- Has enjoyed pizza the most of the food he's tried in America... Likes cheese, pepperoni and sausage, in addition to corn...Enjoys corn as a topping because it makes the pizza sweeter.
- His desire to play in MLB sprouted from his experience playing against Major League stars at the 2017 World Baseball Classic... Struck out 16 and allowed one earned run over 11.0 innings in four games, earning All-Tournament Team honors.
- Grew up watching Yu Darvish and cites his career trajectory as a reason for wanting to play stateside.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Made his first career Postseason start in 2024, after making just one start in the regular season, on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...In total, he appeared in three games in 2024 Postseason.
- In 2023, became the 13th pitcher in Mets history to record 200+ strikeouts in a season, joining Dwight Gooden as the only Mets rookie to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season.
- Became just the 18th rookie in the Modern Era (Since 1900) and the sixth in the Wild Card Era (Since 1995) with 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Joins Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookies with 200 or more strikeouts in a season.
- In his first season as a Major Leaguer, Senga became the 11th rookie in Mets history to reach double-digit wins in a season.
- Spent 11 seasons in Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...Went 87-44 with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0) in his NPB career.
- Is a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017, 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019, 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019, 2020).
- Led the Pacific League in strikeouts twice (227 in 2019 and 149 in 2020) and led the Pacific League in wins with 11 in 2020.
- Hurlled 3.0 scoreless innings in two appearances to help Japan earn a gold medal at the 2021 Tokyo Olympics.

2025 SEASON

- Started the season 7-3 with a 1.47 ERA (12 ER/73.2 IP) through June 12, a stretch that included a career-high 18.2 consecutive scoreless innings streak from April 1-25...Landed on the IL with a strained right hamstring in mid-June.
- Following his return from the IL, posted a 5.90 ERA (26 ER/39.0 IP) in nine starts...Was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on September 5.

2024 SEASON

- Missed nearly the first four months of the season with a right shoulder capsule strain.
- Made one start on July 26 against Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf.
- The right-hander made five rehab starts, one with High-A Brooklyn and four with Triple-A Syracuse...In his five rehab starts, Senga allowed six runs over 14.0 innings and recorded 15 strikeouts.

POSTSEASON

- Made his first career Postseason start, after making just one start in the regular season, on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...He threw 2.0 innings, allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts.
- In total, he appeared in three games in 2024 Postseason starting Game 1 of the NL Division Series against Philadelphia, Game 1 of the NL Championship Series and appeared out of the bullpen in Game 6 of the NL Championship Series against Los Angeles-NL.

2023 SEASON

- Finished his rookie season with a 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP), 202 strikeouts against 77 walks in 29 starts.
- Senga recorded 202 strikeouts through his first 29 career Major League games, the fourth-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (251), Matt Harvey (217) and Noah Syndergaard (210) have recorded more during that span.
- His 202 strikeouts are the third-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 29 career games, trailing only Hideo Nomo (244) and Yu Darvish (221).
- Senga led all Major League rookies with 12 wins this season, and tied for 11th in the National League overall in that category...His 202 strikeouts also led all Major League rookies, and tied for eighth in the National League.
- Ranked fifth in the majors and second in the NL with a 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP), the fifth-lowest mark by a Mets rookie in franchise history.

- His 29 starts tied with Masato Yoshii for the ninth-most by a Mets rookie in a season.
- Became just the 11th rookie in franchise history to record double-digit wins in a season, while his 12 wins rank tied for seventh among Mets rookies.
- Led all rookie pitchers in bWAR (4.5) and fWAR (3.4)...He was the only rookie to qualify for the ERA title.
- Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5 percent whiff rate and a 28.2 percent putaway rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.
- Recorded 2.42 ERA (25 ER/93.0 IP) at Citi Field, the second-best home mark in the majors among qualifiers...Senga held opposing batters to a .179 average at home, the third lowest-mark in the majors among qualifiers...His 12.00 K/9 rate at home was the fifth-highest in the majors.
- Named to the National League All-Star team, joining Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game.
- Became the 64th pitcher whose Major League debut came in a start for the Mets...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his Major League debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their Major League debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their Major League debut.

2022 SEASON

- Went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

2021 SEASON

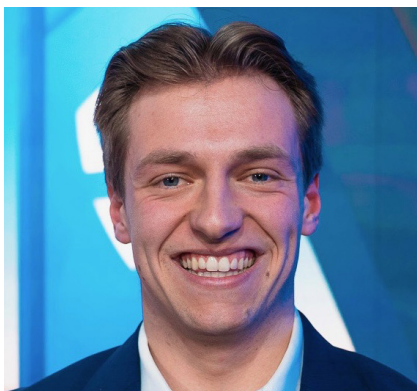
