RHP NOAH DAVIS (0-2, 7.52) VS. LHP CARSON WISENHUNT (1-3, 5.96)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque lost game three last night, 4-2, and have lost the first three games of a series for the fourth time this year and second-straight series ... Noah Davis is slated to toe the rubber for the Isotopes while Carson Wisenhunt is scheduled to start for Sacramento.

JONESY: Nolan Jones played his seventh rehab game last night, going 0-for-4 with a walk and three strikeouts. Has reached base at least once in six of the seven contests. Over seven games, Jones is 4-for-23 with three RBI, four walks, 11 punchouts and one home run.

DOWN UNDER: With the loss last night, the Isotopes are now 26 games under .500, a low watermark in the 21-year history of the franchise. They had previously been 25 under the breakeven ledger on three occassions.

LOSING STREAK: The Isotopes have lost a minimum of four consecutive contests on five occassions this season (last: May 25-31, five games). They have also matched their longest road losing streak of the campaign at four games (also: April 5-16).

RISP: Albuquerque went 2-for-12 with runners in scoring position and left 11 on base yesterday. Over the last nine contests, the club is 9-for-80 (.102) with RISP with 72 left on base.

TWO-RUNS: The Isotopes were held to two runs or fewer for the 17th time this season and eighth in the last 12 games. During that stretch, Albuquerque has scored 39 runs, fewest in Triple-A and sixth fewest in all of Minor League Baseball.

FOUR-STRAIGHT: Albuquerque has plated two or fewer tallies in at least four consecutive games for the first time since May 29-June 4, 2021, a stretch of six-straight.

@ SACRAMENTO: Albuquerque has plated two runs or fewer in six of their last nine games at Sutter Health Park. The club has scored six-plus runs in just three of their last 15 contents in Sacramento.

NOW THAT'S QUALITY: Peyton Battenfield delivered the fourth quality start of the season for the Isotopes (last: Karl Kauffmann, May 26 at Salt Lake). However, the Isotopes are just 1-3 after recieving a quality start.

ONE SWING: Hunter Stovall put Albuquerque on the board with a two-run single in the fourth inning last night. It was the third-straight contest where the Isotopes only two tallies came via one swing of the bat. Michael Toglia and Nolan Jones hit two-run homers on Tuesday and Wednesday, respectively.

STOVIE: Hunter Stovall recorded multiple RBI in a contest for the third time in 2024 (also: May 17 vs. Sugar Land, May 21 at Salt Lake).

SAM I AM: Hilliard is 3-for-38 in his last nine games (seven hitless) ... Average has dipped from .324 to .281 during the timeframe. Additionally, Hilliard has failed to record a hit in four consecutive games with a plate apperances for the first time since April 26-May 4, 2023 with the Braves.

JC: Julio Carreras produced his sixth multi-hit contest of the season last night and first since May 9 vs. El Paso ... Average currently sits at .194, and has not been over .200 since March 11 ... Swiped his team-leading 18th stolen base of the year yesterday. He is one shy of tying his career high for a season (high: 19, 2022 with Spokane, 17, and Hartford, two).

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk drew just his second walk in his last 13 games last night ... Has a hit in 12 of his last 17 contests (20x69), including seven multi-hit contests.

HIS NAME IS DREW: Drew Romo tallied a hit last night to end his two-game hitless stretch. Has just one mult-hit game in his last 13 contests.

COOLIN' OFF?: From April 21-May 18, Romo slashed .450/.459/.725 with eight doubles, four homers, 20 RBI ... Last 11 games, hitting .195 (8x41) with a double, triple, two homers.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes is 7-for-18 in his last five games (.389) with three walks.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 2nd in average (.330) and 10th in slugging (.533) ... Aaron Schunk is 3rd in doubles (19) and T-10th in XBH (25) ... Coco Montes is 1st in average (.343), 2nd in hits (71) and OBP (.429), 4th in OPS (.970), T-5th in triples (4), T-6th in total bases (112) and walks (32), 7th in slugging (.541) ... Sam Hilliard is T-2nd in runs (44), T-6th in total bases (112), walks (33) and homers (11), T-8th in XBH (26), T-9th in hits (61) and T-10th in triples (3) ... Julio Carreras is T4th in stolen bases (18).

TEAM STATS: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in total bases (1,002) and triples (28), 2nd in hits (588), 3rd in slugging (.472), 4th in average (.277) and OPS (.837), 5th in doubles (127), 8th in runs (344).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
