Luisangel Acuña's Mets Organizational Debut: Infielder **Luisangel Acuña** will make his Mets organizational debut on Tuesday, after being acquired in a trade with the Texas Rangers for RHP Max Scherzer and cash considerations on July 30. Acuña is ranked as the Mets' No. 2 prospect and baseball's No. 44 overall prospect, by MLB Pipeline. In 84 games for Double-A Frisco this season, he slashed .315/.377/.453 with 25 doubles, two triples, 51 RBI, 68 runs scored and 42 stolen bases. Acuña rides a 25-game on-base streak into Rumbletown, along with a five-game hitting streak with 12 hits in that span. He was the Rangers 2021 Minor League Defender of the Year.

Family Ties: **Luisangel Acuña** comes from a baseball family. His older brother is Atlanta Braves superstar Ronald Acuña Jr., the four-time All-Star who won the National League Rookie of the Year in 2018. His father, Ronald Acuña Sr., played seven seasons in the Mets organization, including 264 games from 2002-04 with the Double-A Binghamton Mets. Acuña Sr. hit .304 in 2003 and .300 in 2004.

Sharp as the Blade: Mets top pitching prospect **Blade Tidwell** was promoted to Double-A Binghamton on Tuesday. He is expected to start in his Double-A debut on Wednesday. Tidwell was drafted by the Mets in the second round of the 2022 draft out of Tennessee. The 22-year-old was 8-3 with a 3.09 ERA in 17 starts this year at High-A Brooklyn. He allowed two runs or fewer in each of his final 12 starts with the Cyclones and in 14 out of 17 starts overall. Tidwell held hitters to the lowest opponent batting average in the South Atlantic League (.190), earned the second most wins (8), and carried the third lowest ERA (3.09).

Last Time Out: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies defeated the Reading Fightin Phils 4-3 on Sunday night to take five-of-six games in Reading for the second time this season. JT Schwartz went 3-for-4, which marked his first three-hit game at the Double-A level. Rowdey Jordan, Schwartz, Jose Peroza, and Brandon McIlwain each drove in a run. Wilkin Ramos picked up his first Double-A save.

Recap in Reading: **Rowdey Jordan** hit two homers in the series and six of his 11 homers this year have come at Reading. **JT Schwartz** had his first three-hit game on Sunday and totaled five hits in the series in his return to the lineup. **Hayden Senger** hit a home run and go-ahead two-run double in extra innings on Saturday.

Last Start: Hamel struck out a career-high-tying 11 batters over a career-high-tying seven innings of work. His seven innings pitched set a new Double-A career high. He allowed just one run on three hits and two walks. Hamel retired 13 batters in a row during part of his start. He earned a no decision, leaving the game tied 1-1.

World Baseball Classic: Hamel represented Team Puerto Rico in the 2023 World Baseball Classic. He honored his late mother, who passed away 11 days before the Mets selected him in the 2021 MLB Draft. He was WBC teammates with current New York Mets, Francisco Lindor and Edwin Díaz.

2022: Was named the 2022 New York Mets Minor League Pitcher of the Year. He led all Mets minor leaguers with 10 wins and 145 strikeouts. Began the season with St. Lucie (A) and pitched to a 5-2 record with a 3.84 ERA in 14 appearances and 13 starts. He tossed 63.1 innings and struck out 71 batters, before he was assigned to Brooklyn (A+) on July 4. He went 5-1 on the mound with a 2.59 ERA in 11 starts for the Cyclones. He struck out 74 hitters over 55.2 innings and opponents hit just .180 against him.

BACKGROUND: Ranks as the Mets' No. 2 pitching prospect and No. 6 overall Mets' prospect by MLB Pipeline. He was drafted out of Dallas Baptist University in the 3rd round (81st overall) by the Mets in 2021. Hamel went 13-2 on the mound and racked up 136 strikeouts in his final year at DBU in 2021. He spent his first two years at Yavapai College in Arizona.

Reid Brignac - Manager - 2nd season with Binghamton - 4th year in the Mets organization.

In 2022, Brignac led a team that saw five players make their major league debut with the Mets after starting the season with the Rumble Ponies (Francisco Álvarez, Brett Baty, Jose Butto, Nate Fisher, and Bryce Montes de Oca), tied for the second-most in franchise history. This past fall, Brignac was one of two Mets staff members selected to be a part of the Arizona Fall League coaching staff, serving as the manager of the Peoria Javelinas. Following his retirement as an active player in 2018, Brignac was the manager of the St. Lucie Mets (Low-A) in 2021 before coming to Binghamton last year. As a player, Brignac appeared in parts of nine seasons in the major leagues with the Tampa Bay Rays, Colorado Rockies, Atlanta Braves, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Miami Marlins. He was drafted by the Rays in the second round of the 2004 MLB Draft.

AJ Sager - Pitching Coach - 1st season with Binghamton - 2nd year in the Mets organization. Sager served in the same role for the Brooklyn Cyclones (High-A) last season. Sager previously spent twenty seasons with the Detroit Tigers organization, including six seasons as the pitching coach with Triple-A Toledo.
