### Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Ben Krauth** to the mound tonight, making a spot start (fourth career, first since '17). St. Paul will counter with LHP **Andrew Albers**. The Clippers are 1-5 (.167) against left handers this year. Albers has pitched against the Clippers five times in his career (Rochester in '13 and '16, Gwinnett in '17), going 2-2 with a 3.75ERA (24.0IP, 28H, 12R, 10ER, 4BB, 26K).

### vs. the Saints

This series marks the first ever matchup between the Clippers and the St. Paul Saints. In 2019, Columbus split the season series against the baby Twins with Rochester, 3-3, after having won 2018, 4-2 (outscored by a combined 57-39 from 2018-19, as the Clippers went 6-1 in 1-run games). The series win over Rochester in 2018 was the first for Columbus since 2015.

### Turning a Corner

After starting the season 5-1, the Clippers went 4-18 from 5/12-6/5 (worst 22G stretch since 4-18 from 6/13-7/4/09), but have rebounded to go 11-4. The Clippers are hitting .256 (40x156) with runners in scoring position in the last 15 (.180, 34x189 in the 22G prior) and have scored at least four runs in 12 of 15 (had at least four runs once in previous nine; 9-run inning in 13-9 loss vs. Nashville on 5/28).

### Pummeled Pitching

Huntington Park has zoomed back to the top of the IL in homers per game (3.35), following 46HR in the last 12G. Unfortunately, 29 of those 46 have been surrendered by Columbus (149HR allowed in last 73G in the regular season at HP). Almost 22% of hits allowed at home have left the yard (41 of 189), the highest rate in the IL (led the league in 2019, as 20.4% of hits allowed at HP were homers).

### Hammering Gimenez

**Andres Gimenez** homered in each of six games from 6/13-6/19, after never having homered in consecutive games in his career. His power rested on the seventh day (0x4, 2K) and roared back to life with a HR Tuesday (just missed a HR last night). Prior to his surge, Gimenez laid down three sac bunts over four games from 6/6-6/9 (3-0 when Gimenez executes a sac bunt, 6-2 when he homers).

### Perez Rehab

Last night was the first appearance for **Roberto Perez** since he fractured his right ring finger on 5/3 in Cleveland (on DL since 5/5, on 60-day since 5/23). Perez was hitting .131/.274/.295 with 3HR and 9RBI in 19G (61AB) with Cleveland this year. He last played in Columbus during a rehab assignment in 2016 and has hit .240/.341/.376 with 8HR and 68RBI in 123G with the Clippers.

### Reyes Rehab

**Franmil Reyes** went 0x3 on Tuesday night, his first action since going on the DL with a left abdominal strain on 5/23. Reyes was batting .257/.316/.576 with 11HR and 29RBI in 40G (144AB) prior to his injury (tied for 9th in the AL in HR). He had struggled over his final 16G in Cleveland, homering only four times in 54AB (.463SLG), while batting .185 (only one multi-hit game).

### Work to Do

**Owen Miller** returned to Columbus last Tuesday after a three week stint in Cleveland (5x46, 23K). At the time of his promotion to the Big Leagues, Miller ranked 3rd in batting in the IL at .406 (26x64). He is 10PA short of qualifying for the batting title and adding them as hitless at bats would place him in 9th. Miller has five hitless games since his return (8G; had four hitless in 16G prior).

### Warming Up to Huntington Park

**Trenton Brooks** was 2x4 last night, making him a combined 8x15 in his last four (1x11 in first four in Columbus). Dating to 5/22 with Akron, Brooks is hitting .346/.454/.641 with 6HR and 23RBI in 24G. He has reached base in 21 of those 24 (did not reach in single PA on 6/17 vs. Toledo) and scored a total of 21 times. Between Akron and Columbus, he has nearly as many walks (26) as strikeouts (27).

### Bringing it Home

**Connor Marabell** reached base in nine of 10 on the roadtrip, batting .387 (12x31). That hot trip bumped his career average on the road in the IL to .300 (42x140), compared to a dismal .174 (23x132) in Huntington Park. However, Marabell put forth back to back multi-hit games on 6/15 and 6/16 (three multi-hit games in HP career prior) and is hitting .333 (9x27) on the home stand (now .201 in HP career).

# Columbus Clippers Game Information

## This Date in Clipper History

6/24/1995

**Derek Jeter** propelled the Clippers to 6-2 victory over the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Red Barons, going 3x5 with a run, 2RBI and a HR. In 1995, Jeter was the only Clipper selected to represent the IL in the Triple-A All-Star Game and was also named to the postseason team after hitting .317 with a league-leading 96 runs. He currently ranks 3rd in franchise history with a .324 career average with the Clippers.

## Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (964 to 920).

## Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

## Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in win percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 9-23 (.281) in games in which they trail, ranking 10th.

## Get What You Pay For

Columbus is the only team in the IL that has yet to play any free baseball this season, having played 83 straight games, including the postseason, since their last extra-inning rumble (7/31/19 vs. Louisville, an 11-8 loss in 11; only extra inning loss of the season, 8-1). The only other time since the start of the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) that the Clippers have gone this long without extras was from 4/22-7/19/94 (current run of 43 straight to start the season is a record; had 39 in 1987).

## Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.46 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 6.50ERA at Huntington Park is by far the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

## Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

## Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 5th (421K, 37 off the pace, St. Paul). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.79K per game.

## That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

## One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

## Good Baseball

**Andres Gimenez** advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/10 at Iowa and the runner came around to score in the win (3-0 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

## International Accolades

**Bobby Bradley** was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

## Manager Profile

**Andy Tracy** makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 50-69 (.420), 20-23 with Columbus (.465).
