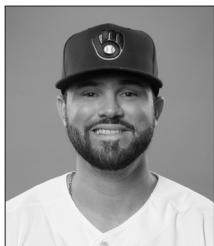

### 2022

- Went 3-2 with a 3.88 ERA in 35 games with Double-A Biloxi (26) and Nashville (9)...51.0 IP, 38 H, 22 R, 22 ER, 30 BB, 73 K
- Began season with Biloxi...had two stints with Sounds (June 30-July 25 and September 8-end of season)
- Did not allow a run in 24 appearances...20 of 24 were at least 1.0 inning
- Posted a 0.84 ERA (10.2 IP/1ER) with 13 strikeouts in six May appearances
- Spent June 6-15 on 7-day injured list
- Possessed best opponent batting average (.188) and second-best WHIP (1.06) among Biloxi relievers at time of first promotion to Nashville
- Tossed a scoreless inning in his Triple-A debut on July 1 vs. Indianapolis (1 H, 2 BB, 2 K)
- Struck out 28 over 19.0 innings in 11 games at MGM Park in Biloxi
- Held left-handed batters to a .139 average (10-for-72) with 33 strikeouts with Biloxi
- Made six appearances for Glendale in the Arizona Fall League (6.0 IP/8 ER)
- Went 3-2 with a 5.79 ERA (14.0 IP/9 ER) in 15 appearances with Lara in the Venezuelan Winter League after the season

### 2021

- Went 0-1 with a 5.19 ERA in 3 games (all starts) with Biloxi...8.2 IP, 9 H, 7 R, 5 ER, 3 BB, 19 K
- Placed on the injured list on May 27 and missed rest of season

- Held left-handed batters to a .128 average (5-for-39) with 10 strikeouts with Wisconsin

### **SOUND BYTES - IT'S A CYCLE**

Outfielder Tike Redman became the first Nashville Sounds player in the club's history to hit for the cycle, accomplishing the feat in 2001.

On June 30 at Tucson in a 6-5 defeat, the Sounds' leadoff hitter grounded out to second to open the game, singled to shortstop in the fourth inning, homered to right in the sixth, doubled down the right-field line in the seventh, then completed the feat with a one-out triple during the Sounds' 9th.

Catcher J.R. House joined Redman in the Nashville cycling club when he accomplished the feat on May 21, 2004 at Sacramento to lead the Sounds to an 8-7 win.

The backstop ripped an RBI double in the first, singled in the third, belted his eighth home run of the year in the fifth (off Sacramento starter Joe Blanton), and completed the feat with a go-ahead, two-out RBI triple on a 3-2 pitch in the top of the seventh inning that gave Nashville a lead that would last the remainder of the game.

Outfielder Caleb Gindl became the third member of the Sounds' cycle club on July 10, 2011, when he accomplished the feat at Albuquerque during a 9-5 Nashville victory.

The right fielder ripped a triple in the second, homered in the third, doubled in the eighth and completed the feat with a single in the ninth.
