Double Feature (Times Six) – For the sixth time already this season the Worcester Red Sox will play a make-up doubleheader today when they take on the Syracuse Mets in a twin bill beginning at 4:05 pm at Polar Park. Both 7-inning games are live on NESN+ and can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM and The Pike 100.1 FM. Last night was supposed to be the opener of this 6-game home and home series, but heavy rains fell at game time and the persistent precipitation forced Worcester's sixth home postponement already this season to equal the WooSox club-record for most home games either postponed or cancelled in a single season (originally set back in 2021 Worcester's inaugural season at Polar Park). Today's twin bill is the third of the season between Worcester and Syracuse – the Sox swept on April 23 and the Mets swept on April 27 (both here at Polar Park).

Double Duty - Worcester is 2-1-2 in their first five twin bills this season...two sweeps, swept once, and split two others. They split a doubleheader at home vs. Columbus on April 9; swept a doubleheader in Rochester on April 17; swept Syracuse at Polar Park on April 23 (both by 5-4 scores); were swept by the Mets later in that series on April 27 (5-6 and 12-20); and split at home vs. Durham on May 24. Worcester then went 5½ weeks without playing another doubleheader until today. For what it's worth...the WooSox played ten doubleheaders all of last season (going 0-2-8 in those...no sweeps, twice swept, and 8 splits). The Worcester club-record for most twin bills in a season is 11 in 2023. The Sox went 5-2-4 in their franchise-high 11 doubleheaders in 2023 and they played seven doubleheaders during each of the 2021 and 2022 seasons going 1-2-4 both those years.

Holiday Week/Weekend – The Worcester Red Sox and the Syracuse Mets are spending the first part of their holiday week here at Polar Park in Worcester before enjoying the holiday/weekend at NBT Bank Stadium in Syracuse, NY as the clubs play what amounts to a six-game home and home series. The WooSox and Mets will play a pair here in Worcester starting at 4:05 pm this afternoon and will conclude the Polar Park portion of the series tomorrow at 5:05 pm (with UniBank Fireworks following that game). The 5:05 pm game time is mandated by Triple-A rules as the latest start time allowed when teams have to travel overnight and play elsewhere the next day. Because all International League clubs get to play at home on either July 3rd or July 4th (to insure each team gets to enjoy a holiday fireworks crowd), both the WooSox and Mets will head to Syracuse following tomorrow night's game in Worcester before continuing their home and home series in Syracuse, NY on Friday, July 4th at 6:35 pm. The holiday game begins a 3-game weekend set in Syracuse including Saturday at 6:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm.

Home Rentals - Worcester has just 9 home games total in the month of July beginning with this 3-game set vs. Syracuse, then a 3-game weekend series from July 18-20 just after the All-Star break vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, and finally 3-games to end the month from July 29-31 vs. Lehigh Valley that actually starts a 12-game homestand. From July 29 – August 24, the WooSox will play 18 of their scheduled 24 games at Polar Park during that stretch. On the other hand, after these three games here vs. the Mets, the next three in Syracuse starting on Friday begin a 9-game roadtrip that will continue in Central New York next week from July 8-13 when the WooSox move to Rochester for a 6-game series. That will lead to the All-Star break from July 14-17 before Scranton/Wilkes-Barre pays their first visit of the season to Worcester for a rare 3-game weekend series from July 18-20 at Polar Park.

Welcome Mat for Masataka - Boston Red Sox OF **Masataka Yoshida** will DH for Worcester in Game 1 today as he officially begins his injury rehab assignment. “Mah-sah-TAH-kah yo-SHEE-dah” has been on Boston’s injured list all season recovering from right shoulder labral repair performed last October 3rd by Dr. Evan O’Donnell at Massachusetts General Hospital. He did appear in 11 spring training games this past March as the DH batting .286 (10-for-35) with 1 2B, 1 HR, & 7 RBI but he has yet to appear in any game since the regular season began.

Yoshida had an excellent season in his first year with the Red Sox in 2023 after signing as a free agent in December of 2022, hitting .289 in 140 games with 33 2B, 3 3B, 15 HR, 72 RBI, 71 runs scored, and 8 stolen bases. He finished 6th in the 2023 American League Rookie of the Year voting after leading AL rookies in hits (155), doubles (33), and average (.289).

He followed that up with relatively consistent numbers last season batting .280 in 108 games with 21 2B, 10 HR, 56 RBI, and 45 runs scored. He did miss six weeks last season with a left thumb strain suffered at the end of April and played in two rehab games with the WooSox at Polar Park on June 8 & 9, 2024 going 1-for-7 with 1 walk & 2 runs scored as the DH.

In 119 career games at Fenway Park, he has hit .300 with a .360 OBP, and .814 OPS. During the 2023 season with the Red Sox, Masataka played in 87 games in left field and 49 as the designated hitter while in 2024 with Boston he was used as the DH in 101 games and played just 1 game in LF.

The 31-year-old from Fukui, Japan (he will turn 32 this July 15), played for the Orix Buffaloes of Japan’s Nippon Professional Baseball from 2016-2022 and in 762 games he hit .327 with 153 HR & 467 RBI and was a four-time NPB All-Star. In consecutive calendar years, he won an Olympic Gold Medal with Japan (2021), the Japan Series Championship (2022), and the World Baseball Classic title for Japan (2023).

Opposites Attract – These two teams have started the second half of the International League schedule in opposite fashion as Syracuse just finished taking 5 of 6 at Rochester while the WooSox lost 5 of 6 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. As a result, the Mets are tied with Scranton/WB for the best record in the early going of the 2nd half at 5-1 while the Sox are a ½ game better than Rochester (1-6) for the worst mark after a week+ of 2nd half action. That said, Worcester’s overall record for the season is 42-38 and 6½-games better than Syracuse who have a 36-45 overall record on the year.

Low Five – In losing 5 of 6 at Scranton/WB last week/weekend, Worcester suffered a series defeat for the first time in seven weeks since dropping 4 of 6 at Lehigh Valley from May 6-11. Worcester had won three series and split their other three prior to their loss at Scranton/WB. It also marked the first time the WooSox dropped 5 games during a 6-game series in over a year since they lost 5 of 6 at home to Norfolk from May 21-26, 2024.

Second Half Stats – Worcester is batting just .172 in the first 6 games of the 2nd half (all last series at Scranton/WB) going 33-for-192 with 4 HR & 15 runs scored. Their Team Batting Average has dropped from .260 when they last left Polar Park after a win on June 22 to their current .254. Sox pitchers in the 2nd half are 1-5 with a 4.68 ERA (26 ER in 50 IP) with 5 HRA and 27 runs given up. Syracuse, meanwhile, is hitting .310 in their 6 games in the 2nd half (62-for-200) with 11 HR & 41 runs scored while Mets pitchers are 5-1 with a 2.70 ERA (15 ER in 50 IP) with 5 HRA and 17 runs allowed.

Season Series vs. Syracuse – This week is Syracuse's third and final trip to Polar Park this season. The WooSox will make their first visit to Syracuse later this week and will also be back in Central NY for a 6-game series vs. the Mets from September 9-14 to end Worcester's road schedule. Worcester leads the 2025 season series over Syracuse, 5 games to 4. The clubs met for what was originally to be a 3-game weekend series to begin the 2025 season here at Polar Park from March 28-30 but a rainout on March 29 reduced that series to two games and a split. The WooSox took 4 of 7 from the Mets from April 22-27 also at Polar Park, although Syracuse did sweep a make-up doubleheader to conclude that series on April 27 (by scores of 6-5 and 20-12).

Stats vs. Syracuse This Season - WooSox batters are hitting .317 (91-for-287) in the first 9 games vs. Syracuse this season with 12 HR and 64 runs scored while Sox pitchers are 5-4 with a 5.18 ERA (42 ER in 73 IP) allowing 9 HR and 47 runs to the Mets. One caveat to consider...Roman Anthony (.450/3/6 in 7 games vs. Syracuse this season), Nate Eaton (.433/1/7 in 9 games), and Marcelo Mayer (.379/3/14 in 8 games vs. the Mets this season) are all in Boston and no longer with the WooSox.

Stats vs. Opponents – Worcester's .317 average vs. Syracuse this season is their best among the nine opponents they have faced. Here are the rankings in order of Worcester's team batting averages against their opponents. 1. vs. Syracuse (.317), 2. vs. Rochester (.309), 3. vs. Durham (.282), 4. vs. Buffalo (.271), 5. vs. Columbus (.255), 6. vs. Toledo (.232), 7. vs. Lehigh Valley (.210), 8. vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (.207), and 9. vs. Jacksonville (.185).

All-Time vs. Syracuse - Pawtucket/Worcester leads the all-time series over Syracuse by a 486-468 count.

Second Half Adjustments – Despite dropping 5 of their last 6 games, the WooSox have still won 15 of their last 25 games. They are 1-5 after the first six of 75 scheduled games in the second half as all 20 International League clubs started with fresh 0-0 records on June 24. Worcester finished the first half of the season with a 41-33 good for 4th-place in the International League East (7th overall in the 20-team IL) and 5½-games back of first half champ Jacksonville.

Tough Finish to a Winning June – Worcester posted a winning June with their 15-10 record that began with their 9-game winning streak from June 1-11 and was 14-5 prior to the start of the 2nd half (1-5 to end the month). The WooSox out-scored their opponents, 140-124 in June while batting .240 (197-for-822) with solid production including 49 doubles, 7 triples, 34 HR and 140 runs scored. WooSox pitchers were 15-10 with a 4.72 ERA in June (116 ER in 221.1 IP) with 23 HRA & 124 runs allowed.

Homefield Advantage – The WooSox – 13-3 at home since May 23 - are 23-15 at Polar Park to again reach a season-high 8-games over .500 at home (also on June 20). Worcester is under .500 on the road at 19-23.

Series Business – Worcester is now 5-5-4 in their first 14 series played ...five wins, five losses, and four splits. Since dropping 4 of 6 at Lehigh Valley seven weeks ago (May 6-11), Worcester had won three series and split their other three prior to their loss last week/weekend at Scranton/WB.

Pulling Their Sox

-OF **Jhostynxon Garcia** has hit in 8 of his last 10 games (10-for-38) with 1 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 9 RBI, and 7 runs scored. He has hit safely in 26 of his first 33 games since joining the WooSox on May 20 going 38-for-130 (.292) with 5 2B, 2 3B, 9 HR, 23 RBI, and 23 runs scored.

-INF **Vaughn Grissom** has hit in 9 of his last 12 games (13-for-44, .295) with 7 doubles, 2 homers and 7 RBI.

-1B **Nathan Hickey** has hit in 5 of his last 9 games (10-for-34, .294) with 2 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR, 3 RBI, and 5 runs scored.

-INF **Blaze Jordan** has hit safely in 17 of his first 23 games with the WooSox since joining the club on June 3 going (27-for-93, .290) with 8 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 12 RBI, and 14 runs scored.

-OF **Corey Rosier** has hit in 7 of his last 9 games (8-for-32) with 3 HR, 8 RBI, and 7 runs scored.

-INF/OF **Karson Simas** has hit in 6 straight with the WooSox dating back to his last stint with the game in mid-May and now in mid-June doing 7-for-22, .318.

-INF **Nick Sogard**, just back from Boston, has reached base in 34 of his last 79 plate appearances with the WooSox with 21 hits & 13 walks. He has hit in 13 of his last 16 games (20-for-63, .317) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 5 RBI, and 13 runs scored.

What Have You Done For Me Lately – The WooSox have lost 5 of 6 after winning 14 of their previous 18 games. They have still won 17 of their last 29 overall. Worcester has also won 11 of their last 13 at home while also coming up winners in 13 of their last 16 games at Polar Park since May 23.

Eight Was Enough – Until their defeat on June 18, the WooSox had won a Worcester club-record 8 straight at home from May 25 – June 18.

Highs and Lows – Worcester has been a season-high of 8-games over .500 on three different occasions (last on June 22 at 41-33). Those are their best marks since finishing last year with a 79-71 record.. The WooSox have been at the .500 mark 15 different times this season...1-1, 2-2, 3-3, 8-8, 9-9, 14-14, 16-16, 18-18, 20-20, 21-21, 24-24, 25-25, 26-26, 27-27, and 28-28. The Sox were a season-low 4-games below .500 (4-8) on April 11.

June is Better and not Wetter – Worcester finished 15-10 in June with no postponements. They have already had one home rainout on the 1st of July. The Sox went 13-14 in the month of May (with one home postponement) after going 1-1 in March (with one home postponement) and 13-13 in April (with two home postponements & one home cancellation along with one road postponement).

Month to Month - WooSox hitters batted .246 in May with 29 HR & 114 runs scored while Sox pitchers were 13-14 with a 4.84 ERA during the month with 32 HRA and 132 runs allowed. Worcester hit .273 in April with 25 HR & 145 runs scored and WooSox pitchers were 13-13 in April with a 4.74 ERA along with 26 HRA and 128 runs given up.

Ups and Downs – Worcester's recent stretch of winning 14 of 18 from June 1-22 was one of their best of the season along with an April 13-24 stretch when they won 10 of 11 games. Their worst stretch came from April 25 – May 11 when they lost 11 of 15 games.

Doing One Better – The WooSox have won seven of their last nine 1-run decisions since May 23 and are 11-10 in 1-run games on the year after starting the season by dropping 8 of their first dozen 1-run decisions.

Home Run Derby – Worcester has won 14 of the last 20 games during which they have hit a homerun. The WooSox have maximized their use of the long-ball all season as 43 of their total 92 HR on the year have come with runners on base. Worcester batters have belted (49) solo HR, (26) 2-run homers, (10) 3-run blasts & (7) grand slams.

Streaks Appeal – The WooSox enjoyed a season-high and Worcester club-record 9-game winning streak June 1-11. They fell two wins shy of matching the longest winning streak for a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate in 55+ years...since the Pawtucket Red Sox won 11 straight in 2014. The WooSox have also had two 5-game winning streaks (from April 13-18 and again from April 20-24). Worcester had a season-high 5-game losing streak from April 25-30.

A Winning Tradition – The 2024 Worcester Red Sox went 79-71 to post a winning season for the fourth time in as many years of existence and for the third year in a row under manager Chad Tracy. Trace is only the second Red Sox Triple-A manager to ever post three consecutive winning seasons. Darrell Johnson did so from 1971-73 (the first two years when the Red Sox Triple-A club was in Louisville before moving to Pawtucket in 1973). Worcester finished 35-40 during the first half last year but then improved to 44-31 in the second half. Overall the 2024 WooSox went 40-34 at home and 39-37 on the road. The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, and the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark.

2024 WooSox Batters Led the Way – Worcester led all 20 International League clubs in a host of team offensive categories last season. The WooSox led the league with 869 runs scored and also led the IL with 786 walks. Worcester paced the league by a wide margin with an impressive .369 on-base pct. as the WooSox were the only team in the IL with an OBP of over .359. Furthermore, Worcester had the 2nd best OPS in the league at .795.

2024 Rankings – Worcester finished 5th in the IL in team batting with a .259 average. On the pitching side, the Sox were 10th in team ERA (4.84). Sox pitchers allowed the 2nd fewest HR in the league. Defensively, the WooSox were 11th with a .979 field pct. (107 errors in 5126 total chances).

Players Aplenty - The 2024 WooSox built on a pair of all-time Red Sox Triple-A records (previously set by the 2023 WooSox) as they made 281 player transactions during the 2024 campaign and set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players appearing in a single season. The WooSox used 84 different players in 2024 (37 position players and 47 pitchers) to better the mark of 79 players in 2023. Ironically, the 2021 WooSox broke a long-standing Red Sox Triple-A record when they used 72 different players to beat the 1995 Pawtucket Red Sox (during a strike year when replacement players were used for the first month+ of that season) and the 2006 PawSox who each employed 70 different players. When Chad Tracy made his Worcester debut in 2022, the WooSox quickly set a new record using 75 different players (that was immediately topped first in 2023 and again in 2024).

WooSox to BoSox - The WooSox sent 28 different players to Boston during the 2024 season (not counting rehab players). A total of 22 different players were promoted from Double-A Portland to Triple-A Worcester last season.

PORTLAND SEA DOGS (AA) GAME RECAP – The Portland Sea Dogs (3-4)/(37-37) erupted for 6 runs in the top of the 11th inning to win at New Hampshire last night, 11-6. Tied at 5-5, the Sea Dogs scored half a dozen in the 11th... Mikey Romero's RBI double snapped the deadlock. Allan Castro (RBI single), Max Ferguson (RBI SF), a run scoring wild pitch, a Marvin Alcantara RBI single, and an Ahbram Liendo RBI single accounted for the 6-pack. Zach Ehrhard drilled a 3-run HR (#6) earlier in the game.

WOOSOX PLAYER MOVES – None today as of early this afternoon. Worcester has made 53 player moves since June 1. Yesterday the WooSox added INF Nick Sogard and RHP Zack Kelly following their options from Boston.

Sogard, 27, was recalled to Boston on Friday when the Red Sox placed INF Marcelo Mayer on the bereavement list. Sogie made three starts for the Red Sox over the weekend (3B, 2B, and 2B while also appearing at SS) and went 3-for-10 with 2 doubles, 1 RBI and 1 run scored. Overall he has hit .254 (15-for-59) with five doubles and 10 runs scored in 17 games for Boston this season, making 11 starts at first base, two at second base, and two at third base. The switch-hitter has also played in 45 games for Worcester this season, batting .234 (39-for-167) with 28 runs scored, nine doubles, and three home runs. Originally selected by the Tampa Bay Rays in the 12th round of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft, the California native has batted .265 (36-for-136) in 48 career Major League games, all with the Red Sox (2024-25), making 13 starts at second base, 11 at first base, eight at third base, and six at shortstop.

Kelly, 30, began this season with Boston, was optioned to Worcester on April 22, recalled on May 25, optioned on May 26, recalled on June 3, and now optioned on June 30. He has pitched in 17 games for Boston this season, posting a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) with 25 strikeouts. The right-hander has also made 11 outings (one start) for Triple-A Worcester. Originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Oakland Athletics in 2017, the Virginia native owns a 4.31 ERA (49 ER/102.1 IP) with 103 strikeouts in 87 career games (three starts), all with Boston (2022-25).

In Game 1 today, rehabbing OF Masataka Yoshida will become the 62nd different player used by Worcester already this season (35 pitchers and 27 position players).

At the end of the first half this year (June 22), the WooSox had used 59 different players which is two more than last year at that same point. At the end of the first half of the season (June 23, 2024), the WooSox had used 57 different players (30 pitchers and 27 position players) on their way to a Red Sox Triple-A record 84 players used during the 2024 season.

Since the start of the season (13½ weeks) the WooSox have sent RHP Hunter Dobbins (three times), RHP Robert Stock (twice), C Blake Sabol, RHP Josh Winckowski, RHP Michael Fulmer, NF Nick Sogard (three times), RHP Luis Guerrero (three times), RHP Cooper Criswell (four times), INF Abraham Toro, RHP Nick Burdi (twice), Marcelo Mayer, Zack Kelly (twice), Nate Eaton (twice), Brian Van Belle, Roman Anthony, and Richard Fitts to Boston. Criswell, Sabol, Stock, Sogard, and Kelly are all back with Worcester. The Red Sox have also recalled rehabbers RHP Lucas Giolito, C Connor Wong, INF/OF Romy Gonzalez, OF Wilyer Abreu, LHP Chris Murphy, and RHP Jordan Hicks from Worcester this season.
