RHP TYLER DANISH (0-1, 8.00) vs. RHP GABE MOSSER (0-1, 12.38)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Chihuahuas meet for the third of five series on the year, and the second of three in El Paso ... Albuquerque is coming off a 3-9 12-game homestand against Oklahoma City (2-4) and Round Rock (1-5) ... Tyler Danish is expected to take the hill for the Isotopes while Gabe Mosser is slated to start for El Paso.

TOTAL ATTENDANCE: For the year over 21 openings, Albuquerque has drawn a total attendance of 138,884—the highest in MiLB (second: Triple-A Las Vegas, 127,663).

PACK THE PARK: Sunday night's attendance of 12,011 is the highest of the season at RGCU Field at Isotopes Park and the second-highest in Minor League Baseball (highest: Triple-A Toledo, 12,800). The Isotopes also hold the fifth and sixth largest crowds in MiLB in 2024.

FIVE DIGITS: The Isotopes drew back-to-back five-digit crowds for the 51st time in team history (Saturday: 11,417).

THREE-BAGGERS: Coco Montes tripled in the fourth frame Sunday, giving the Isotopes an MiLB-leading 17 three-baggers on the year. They've tallied a triple in 12 of 33 games.

UNO: The Isotopes scored one run or fewer in three-straight games for the fourth time in team history (also: July 24-26, 2018, vs. OKC; May 24-26, 2015, at Round Rock/New Orleans and May 5-7, 2003, vs. Salt Lake and at Tucson).

MARGIN: The Isotopes lost by 10 runs Sunday, the fourth time in 2024 the club has lost by 10-plus tallies (twice against Round Rock last week). The 10-run loss is the fourth-largest margin of defeat on the year.

RISP: Over the five losses to the Express, Albuquerque went a combined 4-for-33 with runners in scoring position. They were 8-for-14 in Thursday's victory.

FIRST INNING RUNS: The Isotopes allowed three first-inning runs Sunday and 11 over the six-game series. For the year, the club has surrendered 34 first-inning tallies, the most in Triple-A.

OPPOSING STARTER: Shaun Anderson is the first opposing starting pitcher to toss 7.0 innings since El Paso's Anderson Espinoza tossed 7.0 shutout frames Aug. 19, 2019 ... His 10 punchouts are the most against the Isotopes since Salt Lake's Kenny Rosenberg also fanned 10 June 2, 2023, in Utah.

TRAILING: Albuquerque has trailed in all 21 home games this season, and 23-straight dating back to Sept. 23, 2023.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron has a hit in 20 of 21 games played in 2024, including six-straight, with three multi-hit contests on the year ... Dating back to June 25, 2023, Herron has reached base in 65 of his last 71 ballgames.

ON-BASE STREAK: Jimmy Herron tallied a Sunday to extend his on-base streak to 21, every game he's played in 2024. His on-base streak is tied for the longest active streak in Triple-A (also: David Hensley, SUG; Shay Whitcomb, SUG).

HOME RUN KING: Sam Hilliard registered his team-leading 14th multi-hit contest of the year Sunday with two singles. It's his seventh in his last 12 contests. He's slashing .367/.426/.755 with five doubles, one triple, four homers and eight RBI during span ... Four of his six homers have come in stretch.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes tallied his 13th multi-hit contest of the year Sunday and his sixth in his last 10 contests. He recorded his second triple of the year, each coming in the last four games ... Has just two XBH hits in last six games.

THE HITS KEEP COMIN': Drew Romo has recorded a hit in 19 of his last 20 contests, including 11 multi-hit contest, three, three-hit games and one four hit contest ... During the stretch he is slashing .432/.429/.605 with nine doubles, one triple, one homer and 15 RBI.

HE'S BACK: Left-handed reliever Reagan Todd made his first affiliated appearance in 623 days Sunday after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery at the end of the 2022 season. He tossed a scoreless inning without allowing a hit or walk.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia registered his second XBH (double) of the year with Albuquerque Sunday and first since April 30 vs. RR (five games).

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 1st in average (.371), T-5th in doubles (10) and T-7th in hits (36) ... Aaron Schunk is T-5th in doubles (10) ... Coco Montes is 4th in OBP (.426) and 6th in walks (22) ... Sam Hilliard is 5th in OPS (.994) and average (.325), T-5th in hits (37), 6th in total bases (66), 7th in slugging (.579) and OBP (.415), T-7th in runs (25) and stolen bases (8) ... Julio Carreras is T-5th in triples (3).

BB, K RATIO: The Albuquerque pitching staff allowed more walks (eight) than strikeouts (six) for the sixth time in 2024 (last: April 25 vs. OKC, 11 walks, five punchouts).

ERROR 404: The Isotopes have committed an error in 12 of their last 13 contests.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
