LAST TIME OUT: Rocket City lost its seventh consecutive game on Sunday, falling to Birmingham 9-2. With the win Birmingham swept the series from the Trash Pandas and eliminated Rocket City from playoff contention. It was the first time Rocket City has been swept in franchise history. The Barons jumped all over Trash Pandas starter Chase Silseth who was making his second start of the series, by scoring five in the first. Catcher Carlos Perez belted a three-run homer to start the scoring. First baseman Xavier Fernandez added a sac fly and centerfielder Ian Dawkins added an RBI single in the first before Perez launched a solo homer in the second, giving Perez three dingers for the series. He would add an RBI double in the fourth to give him five RBI for the game as Birmingham raced to a 7-0 lead. Rocket City scored both of their runs in the seventh on an RBI double from Mitch Nay and an RBI groundout from Orlando Martinez, however the Barons got the runs back in the bottom-half on a two-run single from Dawkins who finished with eight hits for the series and three RBI for the game. The Trash Pandas used seven pitchers, which is the most in a single game this season. Silseth allowed four runs on five hits over 0.1 of an inning for the loss. Hunter and Livan Soto each had two hits to pace the Trash Pandas. One of Hunter's hits was a double while Soto scored a run.

HOT HITTING HUNTER: One of the few bright spots for the Birmingham series was the work of Torii Hunter Jr. Hitting as high as .265 this season, Hunter was 4-49 (.082) in the 16 games leading into the Birmingham series. Against the Barons, Hunter was 9-18 (.500) with five doubles and four runs scored. The son of MLB All-Star Torii Hunter Sr., the former Notre Dame football receiver saw his average go up from .219 to .234 over the series.

SOTO NOT SO-SO: The #12 prospect in the Angels system, Soto is a whiz defensively, however his bat has been a huge question mark after posting a .217 average at high-A Tri-City then starting his Rocket City career 2-23. However, the career .232 hitter came up huge against the Barons going 7-20 (.350) with a double and two RBI.

STRUGGLES FROM THE STARTERS: One of the biggest reasons why the Barons swept the series is the work of the starters. Birmingham's rotation allowed 11 ER over 25.2 (3.86 ERA) with 10 of the earned runs coming in two games. On the other hand, Rocket City's starters allowed 23 ER over 20.2 innings (8.08 ERA). Rocket City's John Swanda allowed seven ER in his AA debut on 9/8 while Cristopher Molina allowed seven ER on 9/9 before Chase Silseth was knocked around for four ER in 0.1 innings on 9/12.

NO POWER PANDAS: In addition to the struggles from the starters, the bats have gone silent. Rocket City relies heavily on the long ball, yet the Trash Pandas failed to send one out of the yard for the entire series. They have gone seven consecutive games without a dinger, which is the longest stretch of the season. Coincidentally, Rocket City has lost all seven games and the seven-game losing streak is the longest such stretch this season. It was also the first full series where Rocket City has gone homerless. They also failed to hit a round-tripper in an abbreviated four-game set, 8/24-8/27, at Biloxi. Meanwhile, the Barons registered seven bombs in the six-game set.

PANDAS POUNCE AT HOME: Toyota Field has become quite the launching pad for the Trash Pandas. Of the 152 homers hit on season, Rocket City has blasted 91 of them at home. After hitting 12 in the first series against Tennessee, the Trash Pandas hit 18 dingers during an 11-game homestand against Chattanooga and Birmingham. In fact, the home team had at least one homer in 10 of the 11 games. Rocket City tied the 12-homer mark with a dozen in the series against Montgomery, six of which were hit by Luis Aviles Jr. The Trash Pandas' highwater mark came in the 7/20-7/26 series against the Smokies as they blasted 13 homeruns over five games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Righty John Swanda will look to bounce back after a rough first outing for the Trash Pandas on 9/8 against Birmingham. In that game, the Des Moines, IA native allowed seven earned runs on nine hits over four innings in a 7-5 loss. Swanda was solid for low-A Inland Empire before getting promoted to Rocket City on 9/7. In 20 games (15 starts) for Inland Empire, he went 7-5 with a 4.14 ERA along with 92 strikeouts and 33 walks over 104.1 innings. He was originally selected by the Angels in the fourth round of the 2017 draft. He pitched only four games in 2019 before being shutdown after an elbow injury.

WHAT IS A TRASH PANDA?

The name was chosen in a name-the-team contest and is a reference to the area's association with the space industry and the determination and ingenuity of raccoons, aka trash pandas.

Trash Pandas, slang for raccoon, was included in the original 10 nominations following several Brandiose-led focus groups in Madison and Huntsville. The ballot descriptor read: Our community is known for engineering, and no creature in our galaxy is as smart, creative, determined and ingenious a problem solver - dedicated to the challenge at hand - as our local raccoons!

In July 2018, after the results from several focus groups in Madison and Huntsville, 10 names were selected, based on their uniqueness and how each name relates to the characteristics of the area: (Alphabetically) Army Ants, Comet Jockeys, GloWorms, Lunatics, Moon Possums, Puffy Head Bird Legs, Space Chimps, Space Sloths, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas. The focus groups were led by San Diego-based Brandiose, the Minor League Baseball industry's premiere branding partner.

Over the next few weeks, two rounds of online voting took place. The first round narrowed the list to Comet Jockeys, Moon Possums, Space Chimps, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas.

Trash Pandas won the final round with 44.75 percent of the vote to ThunderSharks 19.25 percent. Moon Possums was third (12.57 percent); Space Chimps fourth (12.05 percent); and Comet Jockeys fifth (11.38 percent).

By the way, Trash Pandas dominated both rounds.

More than 28,500 nominations and votes were recorded. According to Brandiose, this represented - by far - the largest community participation in a Name the Team contest in the history of Minor League Baseball. The team name was announced in a local microbrewery in September 2018 with nearly 1,500 fans on hand. Trash Pandas was nominated by Matthew Higley of Lacey's Spring, Ala. He received two box seats for the first five seasons and will throw out the ceremonial first pitch at a Trash Pandas home game.

The regional identifier was also chosen by the community. Out of 13,559 votes cast, 67.4 percent chose Rocket City over North Alabama (18.09 percent) and Madison (14.51 percent).



NEW MiLB RULES FOR 2021

Press Release From Major League Baseball - March 11, 2021

Major League Baseball (MLB) announced today the testing of a variety of experimental playing rules at various levels of the Minor Leagues during the upcoming 2021 season. These experimental playing rules have been approved by the Competition Committee and the Playing Rules Committee. MLB will closely monitor and analyze the impact of each rule change throughout the 2021 season and report to Clubs on their effects for further analysis. Consistent with the preferences of our fans, the rule changes being tested are designed to increase action on the basepaths, create more balls in play, improve the pace and length of games, and reduce player injuries.



Below is a summary of the experimental rules that will be tested during the 2021 Minor League season:

Double-A (Defensive Positioning): The defensive team must have a minimum of four players on the infield, each of whom must have both feet completely in front of the outer boundary of the infield dirt. Depending on the preliminary results of this experimental rule change, MLB may require two infielders to be positioned entirely on each side of second base in the second half of the Double-A season. These restrictions on defensive positioning are intended to increase the batting average on balls in play.

NOTEWORTHY

THE SWANDA FILE: RHP John Swanda will make his Toyota Field debut in his second Rocket City start tonight after a successful stint with Low-A Inland Empire, mostly in the rotation. Swanda has spent his entire career with the Angels after being selected in the 4th round of the 2017 draft. In 2019, he was limited to four starts for Low-A Burlington due to injury. This season for Inland Empire, Swanda was the most consistent starter on the 66ers staff. In May, he was 2-1 with a 2.75 ERA (6 ER/19.2 IP) along with 14 strikeouts and 10 walks over five games (three starts). In August, he pitched at least five innings in each of his four starts, winning three while posting a 3.47 ERA (9 ER/23.1 IP) with 20 strikeouts and five walks. In his final Low-A start on September 3 at Modesto, Swanda tied a season-high with season scoreless innings, striking out eight to earn the win. At the time of his promotion to Double-A, he Low-A West in innings pitched (104.1) and ranks among the league leaders in wins (2nd, 7), WHIP (4th, 1.31), and ERA (5th, 4.14). Swanda got rocked for seven runs in four innings and took the loss in his Double-A debut on September 8 at Birmingham.

VS. PENSACOLA: Making his second Double-A start, Swanda will face the Blue Wahoos for the first time in his career tonight at Toyota Field.

MORE NOTES

HIGH SCHOOL SIGNEE: After being drafted by the Angels in 2017 out of Roosevelt High School (Des Moines, Iowa), Swanda chose to sign his first professional contract rather than attend the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. As a senior, Swanda went 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA while also batting .486 with seven home runs and 61 RBI to earn the Gatorade Iowa Player of the Year Award. He was selected with the 115th pick in the draft, 14 picks ahead of current Toronto Blue Jays infielder Kevin Smith.

WIN DROUGHT: Swanda earned his first professional win on August 6, 2017 for the AZL Angels at the AZL Diamondbacks after pitching two scoreless innings. He then wouldn't win another game until this season, when he earned the victory on May 23 vs. Modesto. After waiting 1,386 days for his second professional win, his third came just seven days later, pitching six scoreless innings to beat Fresno on May 30.

TOMMY JOHN SURGERY: In 2019, Swanda started the year with three solid starts for Low-A Burlington. But in his fourth on May 19 vs. Wisconsin, he departed after just three pitches in the first inning. He suffered a full UCL tear and later underwent Tommy John surgery. At the time, he was ranked as the Angels' No. 28 prospect according to MLB.com.
