THINKIN' 'BOUT LAST NIGHT: The River Bandits rode a season-high 16 hits to a 12-7 win over Lake County ... seven Quad Cities batters posted multi-hit games, including five extra-base hits ... Juan Carlos Negret begame the first Bandit to record five RBIs in a game this season, launching a three-run homer and a two-run double ... Gavin Cross picked up three hits on the night, all singles, plus a walk and two RBIs ... starter Chandler Champlain (5-3) worked into the sixth inning for the fifth-straight start and got the win after 5.2 innings ... Anthony Simonelli tossed the only scoreless game out of the bullpen, stranding a pair of base runners in the ninth to close out the game.

ROYALLY GOOD MONTH: Utility man Javier Vaz and right-hander Chandler Champlain earned Royals Minor League Player and Pitcher of the Month honors for May ... Vaz slashed 294/.360/.510 with nine multi-hit performances, 12 extra-base hits, and 18 RBIs, while also stealing eight bases without being caught ... Champlain led the River Bandits pitching staff, tossing four consecutive quality starts and posting a 0.75 ERA (2 ER in 24.0 IP) with 26 strikeouts and a 0.71 WHIP ... infielder Cayden Wallace and right-hander Luinder Avila earned took home the honors in April.

YOU LIKE VAZ?: Over his last five games, Javier Vaz is batting 9-for-21 with two home runs, a triple. a double, eight RBIs, and two stolen bases ... in the month of May (25 games), the former Vanderbilt product slashed.

12 AND UNDER: The River Bandits over twoweek run came to an end on Tuesday, marking the franchise's third 12-game win streak since 2015 and their longest as a Royals affiliate--one win shy of the longest win streak in franchise history (13, 1979 Quad City Cubs).

IT'S WHAMMER TIME: Since joining the River Bandits roster on May 9, John McMillon has been nearly untouchable out of the bullpen ... the former Texas Tech product has struck out 25 batters in 12.1 innings the second-highest SO/9 among Midwest League relievers with at least 12.0 IP ... Lake County left-hander Tyler Thorton leads the category at 20.5 (35 S0 in 15.1 IP).

STAFF APPRECIATION WEEK: Last week, Quad Cities arms posted a 1.45 ERA (9 ER in 56.0 IP), the third-best mark in Minor League Baseball, while matching the South Bends Cubs for the second-best WHIP at 0.93 WHIP ... the bullpen surrendered just one earned run in 28.1 innings with 36 strikeouts.

MODERN WOODNEN

A CENTURY OF BASEBALL: The 2023 season marks the 100th year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, the franchise has been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

PROSPECTING THE RIVER: The River Bandits roster features six of the Royals top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): **Gavin Cross** (1) (70 overall), **Cayden Wallace** (5), **Carter Jensen** (10), **Mason Barnett** (18), **Chandler Champlain** (26), and **Luinder Avila** (30) ... the last time Quad Cities roster featured at least six of the Royals top 30 prospects was in 2021 when they would go on to win the High-A Central Championship.

PART OF THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2023 marks the River Bandits third season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, five River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: Angel Zerpa ('21), Michael Massey ('21), Vinnie Pasquantino ('21), Nate Eaton ('21), and Maikel Garcia ('21).

MANAGER BROOKS CONRAD

Brooks Conrad manages the River Bandits for the second-consecutive season, his seventh (sixth managerial) in the Royals organization, after managing the Columbia Firefiles in their first year as a Royals affiliate in 2021. The 43-year-old led the Lexington Legends to a South Atlantic League Title and was honored with the Dick Howser Award, which is given annually to one Royals player development employee for outstanding contributions to the organization. Conrad was slated to lead Lexington again in 2020 before the MiLB season was canceled. He joined the Royals organization as First Base Coach at Burlington in 2017, before serving as Manager there in 2018.
