<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u>: DAVIS' FIRST MANAGER IN THE MINOR LEAGUES WAS HAZLETON, PA NATIVE JOE MADDON, WHO EVENTUALLY LED THE CHICAGO CUBS TO THE 2016 WORLD SERIES.

It was announced January 27, 2020, that Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania native and Central Columbia High School graduate Doug Davis will manage the RailRiders for the 2021 season. He is the 13th manager in SWB franchise history, and just the fifth in Yankees-era history (2007-Present). He joins Dave Miley (2007-15), Al Pedrique (16-17), Bobby Mitchell (2018) and Jay Bell (2019) as SWB skippers to serve under the Yankees affiliation.

Davis enjoyed an 11-year professional career, which included spending parts of two years in Major League Baseball. He spent three seasons coaching with the RailRiders under three different managers, serving as the Defensive Coach in 2017 under Pedrique, the Bullpen Coach in 2018 under Mitchell and the Bench Coach in 2019 under Bell.

Davis, 59, has been in coaching since 1995, serving as a minor league manager for nine seasons. As a manager, he owns a career 590-536 record including championships with Pittsfield in the NY-Penn League in 1997 and Capital City (Columbia, SC) in the South Atlantic League in 1998. From 2007-2016 he was on staff in the Toronto Blue Jays system and before that he spent two seasons in the big leagues as the Florida Marlins bench coach from 2003-04, winning the World Series against the Yankees in 2003 with former SWB Pitching Coach Tommy Phelps on the roster.

In between coaching stints, Davis served as the Minor League Field Coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001), Florida Marlins (2002, 2005), and Toronto Blue Jays (2009-2016).

Selected in the ninth round of the 1984 MLB Draft out of NC State, the former catcher played professionally for 11 seasons between 1984 and 1994 in the minor league systems of California, Kansas City and Texas. He made it to the big leagues on two separate occasions, scoring one run in six games with the Angels in 1988 and he collected a hit in his only MLB at-bat with the Rangers in 1992.

Amicone enters his third season coaching in the Yankees organization, having spent the 2021 season with the Dominican Summer League Yankees. His DSL Yankee team set a franchise record with 60 home runs during the shortened COVID-19 season in 2021. Amicone joined the Yankees organization as a roving hitting instructor in 2020. The Sandy, Utah, native was an assistant coach and camp coordinator at Dixie State University (2017-19). He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Electronic Media and Broadcast News from Webster State University (2012). Amicone's father, Marc, is the General Manager of the Pacific Coast League's Salt Lake Bees in the Los Angeles Angels organization.

Johnson begins his first official season coaching in the Yankees organization. He made his professional coaching debut in 2018 and spent the last two seasons with Double-A Corpus Christi of the Houston Astros organization (2019, '21) Johnson has coached at the high school and college level since 2007 and served as the pitching coach at Morehead State (Ky.) University from 2012-17. He pitched four seasons (2003-07) at Culver-Stockton College. Johnson earned his Bachelor's Degree in Secondary Biology Education from Culver-Stockton (2007) and his Master's Degree in Education at Lindenwood University (2010).

Diaz is in his eighth season with the Yankees organization. He spent 2015-16 as a defensive coach for the GCL Yankees and served in the same role for Trenton in 2017. Diaz managed the Staten Island Yankees to a 37-36 record in 2018 and returned to the GCL in 2019 as their defensive coach. In 2021, he was a defensive coach in the Florida Complex League. Diaz was originally selected by Kansas City in the 30th round of the 1993 First-Year Player Draft and hit .294 over 504 games in the Royals Minor League system spanning five years.

He spent the previous two seasons as the defensive coach for Double-A Trenton and served in the same role for A-Advanced Tampa in 2017. Dominguez also has extensive managerial experience in the organization, serving as the skipper for the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). Dominguez was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2001.

Downam enters his tenth season with the Yankees as an Athletic Trainer, but his first in Triple-A. He joined the Yankees in 2013 as the trainer for Staten Island and also spent three seasons with Charleston from 2014 through 2016. Downam has been the New York's trainer for their Double-A club each of the last five seasons.
