Dayton Dragons (2-1) at Lake County Captains (2-1)

RH Joe Boyle vs. RH Tanner Bibee

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Lake County Captains (affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians) in game one of a six-game series.

Dragons in the Standings (Midwest League East Division): Dayton is in a three-way tie for first place with Lake County and West Michigan.

Last Game: Sunday: Doubleheader vs. Fort Wayne (at Dayton). Game 1: Fort Wayne 13, Dayton 2. Game 2: Dayton 5, Fort Wayne 1. The Dragons earned the split, helped by a two-run home run by Alex McGarry and a strong performance by second game starter Andrew Abbott, who allowed one run in four innings. Rece Hinds had a two-run homer and a double in the first game.

Current Series: Tonight is the first meeting. **2021 Season Series:** The Dragons were 9-15 vs. Lake County in 2021 (5-7 on the road). The Dragons posted a winning record against the other four teams in the East Division. The Dragons and Captains will meet 24 times in 2022 (12 times in each city).

Lake County in 2021: The Captains finished tied with the Dragons for first place in the East Division in 2021, though neither team qualified for the playoffs under unique 2021 procedures.

Team Notes

- The Dragons roster includes six of the top 17 players in MLB.com's ranking of top Reds prospects, and eight of the top 30. The list includes Elly De La Cruz (#3); Rece Hinds (#9); Mat Nelson (#12); Andrew Abbott (#13); Connor Phillips (#14); Jose Torres (#17); Allan Cerda (#22) and Joe Boyle (#29).
- The Dragons roster is headlined by star prospect Elly De La Cruz, an infielder, who entered spring training as the Reds #3 prospect (based on MLB.com). With the top prospect on the list, Hunter Greene, set to begin the season with the Reds, and the number two player on the list, Nick Lodolo, in contention to also start with Cincinnati, De La Cruz could be the Reds #1 minor league prospect by mid-April. The last player ranked as the Reds #1 prospect while he was playing for the Dragons was Homer Bailey in 2005.
- The Dragons roster includes a whopping 11 players selected in the first five rounds of the draft. Along with Hinds (2nd round), Nelson (supplemental 1st round), Abbott (2nd round), Phillips (supplemental 2nd round), Torres (3rd round), and Boyle (5th round), the others are pitchers Thomas Farr (5th round), Nick Hanson (3rd round), Evan Kravetz (5th round), and James Marinar (4th round), and infielder Nick Quintana (2nd round).
- The roster includes 14 players who spent all or part of the 2021 season with the Dragons, led by outfielder Quin Cotton, the Dayton leader in home runs last season.
- Outfielder Rece Hinds was named by *Baseball America* as the "Best Power Hitter" in the Reds organization entering 2022.
- Catcher Mat Nelson led the entire nation in home runs at the college level in 2021 at Florida State University.
- Pitcher Andrew Abbott was a 2nd Team All-American in 2021 at the University of Virginia and led the Atlantic Coast Conference in strikeouts.
- Shortstop Jose Torres was rated as the best defensive shortstop in the 2021 draft after leading North Carolina State University to the College World Series.
- Power-hitting outfielder Allan Cerda was promoted to Cincinnati's 40-man roster over the winter and participated in big league spring training.

Notable Changes for 2022

- The league is again known as the Midwest League (as it was from 1956-2019) after being called the High-A Central League in 2021.
- This is the second year in which the league is classified at the High-A level of Minor League Baseball. The Midwest League was a Low-A league prior to 2021. The 12-team Midwest League operates with two six-team divisions.
- New Rules: The Midwest League has adopted a Pitch Clock to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within 14 seconds of receiving the ball when the bases are empty, and within 18 seconds with runners on base. Defensive positioning rules now require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are now limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner will be awarded the next base via a balk. Additionally, the size of each base has been increased from 15" to 18".
- Roster limits in 2022 have been set at 30 players, the same as in 2021, after teams had played with 25-player limits in previous years.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Brian LaHair is in his first season as Dragons manager and his fifth year in the Reds organization. He served as manager with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 and was the manager at Billings in 2019. LaHair opened his coaching career as the Billings hitting coach in 2018. LaHair played professionally for 14 seasons from 2003-14 and 2016-17, appearing in more than 1,000 games. He was primarily a first baseman but also saw considerable time as a corner outfielder. He played in 195 major league games with the Seattle Mariners and Chicago Cubs. In 2012, he appeared in the MLB All-Star Game. LaHair played for TEAM USA's national team three times (2005 World Cup, 2006 regional Olympic qualifier, 2007 Olympic qualifier). LaHair led all of Minor League Baseball in home runs in 2011 with 38 with the Iowa Cubs and was selected as the Pacific Coast League Most Valuable Player. He played one season in Japan in 2013. LaHair is a native of Worcester, Massachusetts and was chosen as the 2000 Massachusetts High School Player of the Year. He was selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2002 draft out of St. Petersburg College in Florida.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** returns to the Dragons in 2022 as pitching coach after serving in the same position in 2021. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level. He finished fourth in the Pioneer League in saves with nine in his first pro season with Helena in 2010.

Hitting coach **Daryle Ward** returns to the Dragons in 2022 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18 and 2021. He is in his seventh year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. Ward played in 948 big league games with the Astros, Dodgers, Pirates, Nationals, Braves, and Cubs. He connected on a career-high 20 home runs in 2000 with the Astros. In the later stages of Ward's Major League career, he emerged as one of the National League's top pinch hitters. He led all of baseball in pinch hits and runs batted in as a pinch hitter in 2006 while finishing tied for first in pinch hit home runs. Ward played in 2,318 professional games before retiring at the age of 40 following the 2015 season. Ward was originally signed by the Tigers as a 15th round draft pick in 1994 out of Rancho Santiago College in California. He is a native of the Los Angeles area and now makes his offseason home in Riverside, California. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Juan Samuel joins the Dragons as bench coach in 2022, his first season in the Reds organization. The 2022 season is Samuel's 40th year in professional baseball as a player or coach. After a 19-year professional playing career including 16 seasons in the Major Leagues, he served on the Detroit Tigers big league coaching staff for seven years from 1999-2005. He was the manager of the Mets Double-A club in Binghamton in 2006 before returning to the Majors as a coach for the Baltimore Orioles from 2007-10. He served as the manager of the Orioles on an interim basis in 2010. He was a Major League coach for the Philadelphia Phillies from 2011-17. He served as a coach with Monclova in the Mexican League in 2021. Samuel has 18 years experience as a Major League coach and two years as a coach in the minors. Samuel enjoyed a 16-year Major League playing career from 1983-98 and was selected to play in the MLB all-star game three times. Samuel collected more than 1,500 big league hits during his time with the Phillies, Mets, Dodgers, Royals, Reds, Tigers, and Blue Jays. In 1984, he set an MLB record for stolen bases by a rookie with 72 and finished second in the NL Rookie of the Year voting. His best season came in 1987 when he blasted 28 home runs and drove in 100 runs while batting .272 to win the NL Silver Slugger award at second base. Samuel was inducted into the Phillies Wall of Fame in 2008 and was selected as one of the 50 greatest players in Phillies history in a book by Robert W. Cohen. Samuel was born in San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic and graduated from Lacey High School in Puerto Rico.
