Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Zack Godley to the mound tonight (first game since being DFA'd by Milwaukee on 6/21), followed by RHP Kevin Herget. Toledo will counter with RHP Drew Hutchison. The Clippers are 20-21 (.488) against right handers this year. Hutchison has faced the Clippers 11 times in his career, going 3-5 with a 4.83ERA (63.1IP, 54H, 34R, 34ER, 30BB, 60K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus went 14-9 against the Mud Hens in 2019, snapping a two year losing streak (7-13 in 2018, 10-13 in 2017), while posting a margin of 4.6 in wins (seven by 4+) and losing by an average of 5.6 (six by 4+). Of the last 21 played between the two, 11 have been decided by at least five runs. Andres Gimenez has hit .281 (16x57) with 5HR and 12RBI against Toledo this season (13G).

Godley on the Hill

Zack Godley will get the start for Columbus tonight, 12 days after getting DFA'd by Milwaukee (elected free agency on 6/24, signed by Cleveland 6/29, assigned to Columbus 6/30). Godley was 3-2 with a 2.40ERA in Nashville (30.0IP, 21H, 9R, 8ER, 12BB, 34K) and had 2G with Milwaukee (3.1IP, 4H, 7R, 6ER, 5BB, 5K). Cleveland is the seventh organization of his career (CHC, ARI, TOR, DET, BOS, MIL).

Cooling Off

The Clippers came into Toledo as the hottest team in the IL (14-6), but lost three straight to the Mud Hens before last night, scoring three runs or fewer in each of the losses. Through 51G, they have scored fewer than four 23 times (three shutouts, only team in IL with zero games with a single run). Last night's 7-run outburst was the 15th of the season with at least seven (12th in the last 22G).

Getting the Call

Alex Call was promoted from Akron Tuesday and has gone 4x16 with 2HR in 4G. Call used a hot June (.329, 27x82) to climb into the top ten of the EL batting race (9th, .310) and also populated the top ten in OBP (10th, .389), doubles (7th, 13), runs (6th, 34) and steals (2nd, 12) at the time of his call up. His 2HR game Wednesday night was his second of the month (6/4 vs. Erie) and fourth of his career.

Hammering Gimenez

Andres Gimenez homered in each of 6G from 6/13-6/19, after never having homered in consecutive games in his career (7HR, 19RBI and a .704SLG since 6/13; 1st, 2nd and 8th in the IL, respectively). Prior to his surge, Gimenez laid down three sac bunts over4G from 6/6-6/9 (3-0 when Gimenez executes a sac bunt, 6-2 when he homers). However, Gimenez has missed his last five sac bunt attempts.

Work to Do

Owen Miller is batting .255 (13x51) since returning from a three week stint in Cleveland, picking up his first 3-hit game last night (had five 3-hit games before promotion). He was hitless in four straight from 6/18-6/22 (14AB) and saw his average sink to .324 on 7/1 (season low). Miller is 7PA short of qualifying for the batting title and adding them as hitless AB would place him 5th (would rank 6th in OBP).

Missing Again

Following a 7G hit streak from 6/18-6/25 (.346, 9x26, 5K), Daniel Johnson is 2x23 with 13K in his last 6G (all with multiple strikeouts). The current multi-K streak is the longest of the season for Johnson and the third one of at least 4G this year (5/27-5/30 and 6/13-6/17). He ended the month of May with seven multi-K games in eight tries (5x35, 21K) and struck out at least once in 19 straight from 5/11-6/1.

Take Two

The double from Nolan Jones Thursday was his IL-best 18th of the year (Oscar Mercado is 5th, 13). As a team, the Clippers doubled in 26 straight from 5/22-6/20 and 48 of 51 on the year (doubleless in 25 games during 2019, 11 times in first 51). Jones is slugging .588 over his last 24G, collecting 13 doubles, a triple, 3HR (6XBH through first 26G) and only 20K (had 43K in first 26G).

Bullpen Bashers

The Clipper bullpen had a rare scoreless outing against Toledo last night (had given up at least 4ER to the Mud Hens in four straight), and now has a 5.68ERA (69.2IP, 44ER) against Toledo (4.26ERA, 162.2IP, 77ER against all others). Toledo has scored a total of 27 runs from the 7th inning on against Columbus in only 16G, while all others in the IL have scored 38 runs from the 7th inning on in 35G.

This Date in Clipper History

The Clippers needed a 6-run 10th inning to hold on for a 15-14 win in Syracuse. Columbus rallied from a 5-1 deficit in the 7th to tie the game and after taking a 3-run lead in the top of the 8th, the Chiefs rallied to tie it. Columbus took the lead again in the 9th, only to be tied again to force extras. A 2-run HR by the Clipper of the Year, **Brian Dayett**, capped the 6-run 10th as the Clippers survived a 5-run 10th from Syracuse.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (967 to 925).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in win percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 10-27 (.270) in games in which they trail, ranking

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; two straight extra-inning losses following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.12 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.76ERA at Huntington Park is by far the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 5th (494K, 38 off the pace, St. Paul). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.69K per game.

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Oscar Mercado advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 54-73 (.425), 24-27 with Columbus (.471).

Huntington Park Effect:

Herget has started four games in Huntington Park this season, getting blistered to the tune of a 9.00ERA (19.0IP, 19ER). He has allowed 8HR to 90BF in Columbus, compared to 1HR to 55BF elsewhere in the IL (13 of 23 runs allowed at home have come via the long ball). In two starts at home from 6/16-6/22, he allowed three leadoff homers, with all of them coming immediately after the Clippers put up runs.

Though 5/26 marked Herget's International League debut, he had pitched in Huntington Park once before, as a member of the Memphis Redbirds against the Durham Bulls in the 2018 Triple-A National Championship (W, 14-5). Herget started and picked up the win for Memphis (5.1IP, 5H, 2R, 2ER, 0BB, 4K), outdueling future Clipper Chih-Wei Hu (2019).

That Was Fast:

Starting the season with Fargo-Moorhead in the American Association, Herget made only one start, on 5/19 vs. Cleburne (W, 7.0IP, 3H, 1R, 1ER, 1BB, 10K), before Cleveland signed him to a minor league deal on 5/25. While Herget became the first RedHawk to play for Columbus, six former Clippers have suited up for Fargo-Moorhead: Jalal Leach, Mike Figga, Randall Simon, Donzell McDonald, Yurendell de Caster and Yhoxian Medina.
