The Round Rock Express and Salt Lake Bees (Los Angeles Angels) get set for game three of their six-game set on Thursday. First pitch at The Ballpark at America First Square is set for 8:05 p.m. CT.

THAT ESCALATED QUICKLY

The Express earned a 21-2 win yesterday. Round Rock LF Billy McKinney led off the second with a single then RF Kellen Strahm doubled and it was 1-0. Strahm swiped third and C Chad Wallach drove him in on a sacrifice fly for a 2-0 Express lead. Express 3B Cody Freeman led off the third with a double and 2B Justin Foscoe followed with a single. Both Freeman and Foscoe came around to score on a Salt Lake SS David Mershon throwing error and it was 4-0. In the fourth, the E-Train added three more with a CF Dustin Harris RBI double and a Foscoe homer for a 7-0 edge. Salt Lake got on the board in the fourth as DH Carter Kieboom drove CF Kyren Paris in on a single to make it 7-1. The Bees added a run with a C Zach Humphreys RBI single. Freeman opened the sixth with a solo homer and it was 8-2. The Express blew it open with five in the seventh. Harris and Freeman recorded RBI singles and McKinney launched a bases-clearing triple moving Wallach added a solo home run in the eighth and Foscoe hit another homer in the ninth for a 15-2 lead. Round Rock scored seven runs on six hits in the ninth to top it off.

GOING WITH GARABITO

Round Rock RHP Gerson Garabito is scheduled for his ninth start. He is 0-6 with an 8.26 ERA (26 ER/28.1 IP). The 29-year-old has made it past 4.0 innings in two of his eight starts. Lefty's are batting .345 (19-55) against him while right-handers are batting .250 (14-56). All seven home runs have come against left-handed batters.

A NIGHT TO REMEMBER

Round Rock set a franchise record with 26 hits last night. The previous high was 24 hits (5/27/12 at Nashville and 6/6/19 at Las Vegas). All nine starters had at least two hits. It also marks the E-Train's first five-homer game since September 24, 2023. Round Rock posted .481 (26-54) average on the night.

DUSTIN DOES IT

OF Dustin Harris hit for the cycle yesterday. He went 4-for-7 with five RBI and three runs en route to completing Round Rock's first cycle since 1B Curtis Terry did it on June 18, 2021 against Oklahoma City. He becomes just the fourth player in club history to accomplish the feat (Curtis Terry - 6/18/21, Alex De Goti - 8/7/19, Doug Bernier - 7/27/16).

CODY NOT COOLING OFF

3B Cody Freeman went 3-for-7 with a double, a home run, two RBI and three runs on Wednesday night. He has posted seven consecutive multi-hit games and in nine of his last 10 he has multiple hits. During his 10-game on-base streak, he is batting .447 (21-47) with five doubles, three homers, 15 RBI, 11 runs scored, four walks and four strikeouts.

A WINNING STREAK?

Round Rock is searching for their first three-game winning streak since April 22-24. They have not won three consecutive road games this year. With a win tonight, they will be back at the .500 mark for the first time since May 8 at El Paso (18-18).

BIG LEAGUE EXPERIENCE

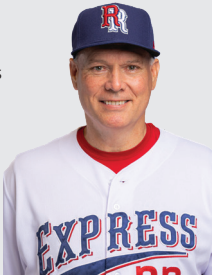

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.



In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
