TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The St. Paul Saints had their best season in 2023 since becoming the Minnesota Twins Triple-A affiliate in 2021. They finished last season a whopping 20-games over .500 at 84-64, a .568 winning percentage. That win percentage was the third best in the International League behind the Norfolk Tides (.604) and Durham Bulls (.587).

FOR OPENERS: The Saints are 1-2 in Opening Day games, all on the road, since 2021. In their first season as the Minnesota Twins Triple-A affiliate, the Saints lost in Omaha 8-2, bounced back in 2022 with a 3-2 with over Louisville, and last season lost 7-4 in Toledo.

AND THE SAINTS GO MARCHING IN: For the first time in franchise history, the Saints will play a home game in the month of March. Last season was the first time they had ever played a game in March, when the season opened on March 31 in Toledo. The March 30 start is the earliest in franchise history, including their days as an Independent club. Last season, following their three-game roadtrip in Toledo, their first two home games on April 4 & 5 were postponed. Their April 4 game was postponed due to six inches of snow that had fallen on March 31 and their April 5 game was postponed due to inclement weather.

HAVING A GRAND OL' TIME: The St. Paul Saints thrived with the bases loaded in 2023, clubbing 14 grand slams, the most in all of baseball. The 14 slam tied the modern day record (since 2005 in the Minor Leagues, as far back as minor league stats are available), matching Albuquerque who did it in 2022, Cleveland, who accomplished the feat in 2006 and Oakland who did so in 2000. No Major League team had hit more than 14 grand slams in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901).

HOME SWEET HOME: During their first three seasons as the Minnesota Twins Triple-A affiliate, the Saints are tied for 19th most home wins in all of baseball, with 128 victories. They are fourth in all of Minor League Baseball in home victories trailing only the Nashville Sounds (134), Durham Bulls (133), and Bowling Green Hot Rods (131).

IT'S LIKE DAY AND NIGHT: When the sun is shining, the Saints are red hot with the bats. Across Minor League Baseball over the last three seasons in day games, the Saints are second in home runs (157), fourth in runs scored (604), and total bases (1595). Contrast that during night games and the Saints are 16th in homers (421), 25th in runs (1769), and 26th in total bases (4680)

HOPING TO BE PRIME "BIG ALEX" MCDONALD: LIST TOP 30 PROSPECT: The Saints will have plenty of talent to start the season, especially if you go by the Top 30 List. The Saints have seven players listed on Baseball America's Top 30 List on their active/IL roster. They are: Brooks Lee (#2/#35 overall), David Festa (#5), Austin Martin (#10), Junior Severino (#20), DaShawn Keirse Jr. (#23), Jair Camargo (#26), and Simeon Woods Richardson (#30).

MAYBE ONE DAY WE'LL MEET: The Saints will play only one new team in the 2024 season, the Syracuse Mets when they visit CHS Field from June 4-9. There will still be six of the 19 IL teams the Saints will have yet to play when their fourth season wraps up in 2024: Charlotte Knights, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Memphis Redbirds, Norfolk Tides, and Worcester Red Sox. The Saints have also not traveled to eight International League cities. Along with those six teams, the Saints have not traveled to the Gwinnett Strippers and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders. The only new ballpark they visit this season is the Nashville Sounds, their first roadtrip of the season.

VIDEO(BOARD) KILLED THE RADIO STAR: The Saints replaced their old scoreboard in right field with a new videoboard. The original static board was 9'H x 36'W while the new videoboard is double the height at 16'H x 36'W with a 10mm pixel pitch (the distance between the center of one pixel to the center of the adjacent pixel. For outdoor venues a pixel pitch anywhere between 4mm and 10mm offers great visibility and image quality) and a resolution of 468 lines x 1080 columns). The Saints removed the electronic scoreboard just below the Riverview Suite terrace on the third base side and replaced it with a 4.80"H x 13.20"W video display with a 10mm pixel pitch and 144 pixel lines and 396 pixel columns

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins opened their 2024 season with a 4-1 win over the Kansas City Royals at Kauffman Stadium. Pablo López showed why he is the ace of the staff going 7.0 innings allowing one run on four hits and fanning seven. Royce Lewis was 2-2 with a home run before leaving with an injury. Carlos Correa went 3-4 with two RBI..

A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES: In just his ninth professional pitching appearance, Festa was a major part of a no-hitter. On May 10, 2022 with Fort Myers, he threw 6.0 no-hit innings, striking out a career-high 11 batters in a combined no-hitter for the Mighty Mussels. Jaylen Nowlin followed with 2.0 perfect innings and struck out three. Hunter McMahon tossed 1.0 hitless inning to finish it off, a 3-0 win.

ONE, TWO, THREE, YOU'RE OUT!: On July 24, 2022, Festa allowed three consecutive singles between the third and fourth innings. The final two batters of the third inning reached, as did the first of the fourth. Festa got three outs, but did not retire a batter because promptly picked off each of the three batters, one after the other.

你好: While attending Seton Hall Prep in New Jersey, Festa was a member of the National Chinese Honor Society... SAINTS RANDY: In 2023, Dobnak was a workhorse for the Saints, setting a number of single-season records. He set the franchise record for starts (26), innings pitched (126.1 IP), and strikeouts (115). The 2023 season was Dobnak's third with the Saints and consequently he is the franchise leader in two of those three categories as well: his 33 starts are four more than the #2 pitcher, Simeon Woods Richardson, his 164.1 IP are 12.0 more than Ronny Henriquez, and his 147 strikeouts are just eight shy of Ronny Henriquez.

KNOW ANY GOOD PIRATE JOKES? NEITHER DO AYYYYE: Dobnak grew up a huge Pittsburgh Pirates fan and we would often go to PNC Park. His favorite food to get there was nachos with pulled pork and cheese. He finally pitched at PNC Park on August 5, 2020. The irony was no fans were allowed in, not even his parents. He tossed 6.0 shutout innings allowing three hits and striking out one.

A BATTLE(R) OF WILLS: You can be forgiven if you've never heard of the DII school that Dobnak attended from 2014-17. He spent four years at Alderson Broadus (WV) University, located in Philippi, a town of 3,380. During his time with the Battlers he finished his career as the conference's all-time leader in ERA (2.61) and strikeouts (284). In his sophomore season in 2015, Dobnak threw a no-hitter against Bluefield State.

TWILIGHT SPARKLE MEET BUTTERCUP: Upon graduating from Alderson Broadus, Dobnak went undrafted and was looking for a way to continue his career. He got his break with the Utica Unicorns in the United Shore Professional Baseball League (a four team league where all four teams play in the same ballpark in Utica, MI near Detroit). He signed with them because he caught the eye of manager Jim Essian (a one time Cubs manager in 1981 & also played from 1973-84 in the Majors), whose son played with Dobnak at Alderson Broadus. Dobnak would become the only player to reach the Major League's out of the USPBL.

THERE'S ALWAYS THAT ONE PERSON: In order to make ends meet in the USPBL, Dobnak drove for Uber and Lyft. He began driving for both in October, 2017. His Uber rating was stellar, but not perfect. He had a 4.99/5.0 rating which meant he received all five-star ratings with the exception of one four-star rating. According to Dobnak, "I have one four-star. I'm hoping it was a mistake. I don't remember doing anything bad."

NOT QUITE MIKE ROWE: Just prior to joining the big leagues, Dobnak worked as a consultant for Jordan Tax & Accounting Services in Bethel Park, PA (2017), an accounting clerk at Accountant and Associates in PA (2017), pizza delivery for Italian Village Pizza in South Park, PA (2012-13) and supermarket stocker at Foodland in Pittsburgh (2010-12).

WE'RE BETTER THAN YOU, AND WE KNOW IT: Dobnak got married to Aerial Munson on September 28, 2019, never thinking he'd be in the Major Leagues. He returned home after the Twins finished a series in Detroit and got married on a Saturday. He wasn't exempt from the rookie ritual of having to dress up in a crazy costume. He had to dress up in a Globo Gym outfit and flew commercial home instead of the chartered flight. He showed up to his fiancée's in full attire.

CANDLESTICKS MAKE A NICE GIFT: Before getting married, some of Dobnak's wedding registry gifts wound up in the Twins game notes on September 20 (Amazon Echo, 67-inch leaf rake and Pine-Sol). All of it was the handiwork of intern Ian Kraft. The publicity of their registry becoming public made the soon to be married couple ask fans to donate to St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, which has always been important to Aerial Dobnak due to her lifelong desire to be involved with children and her experience with the loss of a friend to cancer during her freshman year of college at Alderson Broadus University, instead of buying them gifts. Their initial goal was \$2,000 and within 8 hours that goal was met. Eventually they raised \$4,093. But the story didn't end there. A representative of St. Jude reached out to her on social media afterward, wondering if the couple would be willing to engage in more significant involvement with the hospital once the wedding buzz had died down. They jumped at the opportunity, and the Dobnak's were flown to the hospital in Memphis for a weekend in January to meet patients, connect with fundraising coordinators and evaluate their options for continued future engagement.

- Won a career-best five consecutive starts July 31-August 22, 2020 going 5-0, 1.71 ERA (26.1 IP, 5 ER) with five walks and 13 strikeouts during that span. Marked longest win streak by a Twins rookie starter since Tyler Duffey won five-straight decisions from August 15-September 26, 2015. Also marked the first time a Twins rookie starter won at least five-straight starts since Francisco Liriano won six starts in a row from June 11-July 8, 2006
- Earned Jim Rantz Award for Twins minor league Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 12-4, 2.07 ERA (135.0 IP, 31 ER) in 24 games (21 starts) across three levels in 2019. Named starting pitcher on Twins MiLB.com organization All-Star team
- Started Game 2 of the ALDS October 5, 2019 at New York-AL, allowing four runs on six hits in 2.0 innings pitched. Became the fourth rookie in Twins history (6th occurrence) to start a Postseason game, 18th to ever pitch in one. Prior to Dobnak, the last Twins rookie to start in the Postseason was Brian Duensing in 2009 in Game 1 of the ALDS at New York-AL. The two other rookies to start in the Postseason for the Twins: Boof Bonser (Game 2, ALDS vs. OAK in 2006) and Les Straker (3 starts in 1987, 1 in ALCS at DET, 2 in WS at vs. STL)
- Pitched 6.0 innings with just one hit allowed September 25, 2019 at Detroit, becoming the second rookie in Twins/Senators franchise history to throw at least 6.0 innings while allowing no more than one batter to reach safely via hit, walk or hit-by-pitch (previous Twins pitcher was Camilo Pascual on September 14, 1954 at Cleveland)
