**Last Night: Captains 13, Lugnuts 9.** Trailing 7-1 entering the seventh inning, the Captains scored 12 runs in the final three innings to stun the Lugnuts, overcoming home runs by **Shane Selman**, **Jordan Diaz** (420 feet) and **Austin Beck** (424 feet). Beck had a tremendous game, drawing a walk, crushing two doubles, homering and driving in four runs.

### LUG•NOTES: HEADLINES AND POINTS OF INTEREST

**Star of Stars:** The 2021 MLB All-Star Game MVP Award was presented to 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, who went 1-for-3 with two RBIs, including a 468-foot home run, in the American League's 5-2 victory. Vladdy Jr. then opened up second-half play with two home runs yesterday. He leads the Majors in batting average (.335), RBIs (77), on-base percentage (.434), total bases (216) and OPS (1.111) and is second in home runs (30).

**Streiking:** Outfielder **Shane Selman** hit his second leadoff home run of the season yesterday and has now reached base in his last 18 games dating back to June 25, batting .323 with 12 walks and one HBP during the streak.

**Alumni Report:** 2019 Lugs outfielder **Griffin Conine**, playing for Beloit (MIA), leads the minors with 21 homers and tops the High-A Central with 56 RBIs and a .570 slugging percentage, while 2017 outfielder **Edward Olivares**, playing for Omaha (KC), leads the Triple-A East with a .348 batting average and 2015 first baseman **Ryan McBroom** (Omaha) is tied for first in the Triple-A East with 47 RBIs.

**Bruised:** Last night saw five more players hit by pitches, three Captains and two Lugnuts. This came after a record-setting Wednesday night in which Lugnuts pitchers hit seven Lake County Captains with pitches (including Joe Donovan three times), setting the all-time High-A single game record and breaking a franchise mark set by Lugnuts batters in 2017 vs. Peoria and Captains batters in 2019 vs. the Lugnuts. Lugnuts pitchers have hit 54 batters this year, second in the league, while Lugnuts hitter have been struck 59 times, first in the High-A Central. In 14 games in July, the Lugnuts have been hit 11 times while Nuts pitchers have hit 16 batters.

**Heating Up, Hitters:** The Lugs' leading batsmen in July are **Jordan Diaz**, hitting .356/.463/.556 with 10 runs, 11 RBIs, 5 XBH (2 HR) and a 9/6 BB/K ratio in 14 games, and **Shane Selman**, hitting .319/.407/.532 with 8 runs, 4 RBIs, 6 XBH (2 HR) and a 6/10 BB/K ratio.

**Heating Up, Pitchers:** Starter **Reid Birlingmair** gave up one unearned run in five innings yesterday and has now posted a 1.06 ERA in three starts this month (3 R/2 ER, 17 IP) with a .153 opponent batting average. Fellow starter **Jack Cushing** has a 1.00 ERA in three starts (2 R/18 IP), allowing an OBA of .145.

**Patience:** Catcher **Drew Millas** drew two more walks yesterday, giving him a team-leading 37 walks this year, fifth best in the High-A Central. It was Millas's tenth game this year with multiple walks drawn.

### TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

**2013:** The late Victor Sanchez, a promising 18-year-old right-hander who died in a swimming accident (hit by a boat) on 3-28-15 back home in Venezuela, tossed a nine-inning no-hitter to lead Clinton to a 1-0 win over the Lugnuts at Ashford University Field. It was the third time the Lugnuts were no-hit this season. The game was finished in two hours and one minute. Nuts catcher Santiago Nussy committed three passed balls. The game's only run was scored, however, on a one-out walk from Taylor Cole to Janelly Zorrilla, a throwing error on a pickoff, a groundout, and a Cole wild pitch. Sanchez wrapped up the no-hitter by retiring Dwight Smith, Jr. on a popout to first. Attendance: 827.

**Root, Root, Root for the Home Team:** July 4th's Lugnuts/Dragons series finale drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's a larger crowd than any of the Blue Jays' home games this season in Dunedin or Buffalo and it's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Detroit Tigers (9,717), Baltimore Orioles (8,654), Pittsburgh Pirates (8,237), Tampa Bay Rays (6,783), Oakland Athletics (6,403), Miami Marlins (5,983) and Toronto/Buffalo/Dunedin Blue Jays (3,877). Only eight of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vegas.

**Major League Lugnuts:** Three former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 157 all-time - pitcher **Ty Tice** '18, outfielder **Josh Palacios** '16-'17, and pitcher **Taylor Saucedo** '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: **Carlos Febles** and **Carlos Beltrán** for the Kansas City Royals. Saucedo most recently debuted, tossing a scoreless inning for the Blue Jays on June 17.

**Record-Setting, For Better:** On June 15, **Max Schuemann** broke **Samad Taylor's** franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

**Record-Setting, For Worse:** On June 20, **Stevie Emanuels** broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

**So Many Starters:** The Lugnuts have used 14 different starting pitchers this season, namely **Brady Basso**, **Reid Birlingmair**, **Jeff Criswell**, **Jack Cushing**, **David Leal**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Richard Guasch**, **Rafael Kelly**, **Bryce Nightengale**, **Colin Peluse**, **Ludeny Pineda**, **Seth Shuman**, **Shohei Tomioka** and **Brock Whittlesey**.

**Roster Index:** **José Mora** is the 845th Lugnut all-time and the 41st player used this year. The 2021 Lugnuts have already surpassed the total number of players used in the 1999 and 2008 seasons (38 apiece). The franchise record for most players used in a single year is 54, set in 2017. Currently, about 18.6% of all Lugnuts are reaching the Major Leagues (157 of 845). If that percentage continues to hold true, at least seven of the 41 players to see time this year with the Nuts will reach MLB.

**Finally:** Pitchers **Jeff Criswell**, **Stevie Emanuels** and **Shohei Tomioka**, catchers **Jared McDonald**, **Drew Millas** and **William Simoneit**, first baseman **Patrick McColl**, and outfielder **Michael Guldberg** have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts.

**Front Office Connections:** Lugnuts pitching coach **Don Schulze** was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman **Patrick McColl** set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

**Clubhouse of Higher Learning:** The Ivy League is well represented on the Lansing roster. First baseman **Patrick McColl** played for Harvard University, reliever **Michael Daniellak** was drafted from Dartmouth College and catcher **William Simoneit** spent four years at Cornell University before grad-transferring to Wake Forest. Speaking of outstanding academic institutions, starter **Jack Cushing** spent four years at Georgetown University.

**Power Five Baseball:** The Lugnuts also represent the ACC (**Michael Guldberg**, Georgia Tech); Big 12 (**Brady Basso**, Oklahoma State); Big Ten (**Dalton Sawyer**, Minnesota); the SEC (**Cobie Vance**, Alabama); and the Pac-12 (**Stevie Emanuels**, Washington).

**International Appeal:** In addition to 17 different states (Arizona, California, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada (Connor Hughes), North Carolina, Ohio (Scott Steinmann), Texas, Virginia, Washington) represented by Lugnuts players and coaching staff, seven nations are represented: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (Anthony Phillips) and Venezuela (Javier Godard).

**Representing His Country:** 1B/3B **Jordan Díaz** played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

- May 15 at Dayton: Relieved Seth Shuman (2 IP)... gave up a Brian Rey HR for only run... exited with 2-1 lead, but Michael Danielak gave up a two-run HR to Bren Spillane in the 8th.
- May 22 at Fort Wayne: Made first start... allowed a Jonny Homza solo HR in the 3rd... departed in the 4th with one out, one run in and the bases loaded, and Bryce Nightengale allowed all three inherited runners to score.
- May 29 vs. Great Lakes: gave up solo HR to Andy Pages in the 1st... exited after allowing first two batters to reach base in the 6th, one of whom scored against Bryce Nightengale.

**Prospecting:** Rated Baseball America's **No. 26** A's prospect... "Not assigned to the alternate training site, Peluse committed to an at-home workout plan tailored to increase his leg strength and added 10 pounds of muscle. He arrived at instructional league showing significant velocity gains, much to the A's surprise... Peluse's fastball sat 96 mph and touched 98 at instructs, a marked increase from his low-90s readings in college. His slider was already a plus pitch, showing late life and more drop than a typical slider"... MLB Pipeline's **No. 28** A's prospect, grading his fastball at 55, slider at 55, change-up at 50 and control at 45, writing about Peluse, "A ninth-round

pick in 2019, Peluse has put himself on the prospect radar for the A's after showing up to the instructional league that consistently hit 97-98. Now carrying a power fastball, Peluse also brings a strong slider that flashes plus, as well as a changeup that is still developing. His command has always been solid going back to his days at Wake Forest, and it showed up in his debut season in the Class A Short Season New York-Penn League, walking just six batters across 24 innings. Approaching his first full season in the Minors in 2021, Peluse will get a chance to show what he can do with his improved repertoire. His repeatable delivery projects him to stick as a starter."

**Draft Day:** Taken 284th overall in the 9th round, 2019, and signed for \$149,300... highest of five Wake Forest players drafted in 2019... only one Demon Deacon was drafted in 2020, but it was Braves first-rounder Jared Shuster, taken 25th overall... one of nine Lugnuts drafted in 2019, including the 6th round (Seth Shuman), 7th round (Drew Millas), 10th round (Patrick McColl), 16th round (Brady Basso), 19th round (Jared McDonald), 21st round (Shane Selman), 26th round (Elvis Peralta, Jr.) and 33rd round (Charles Hall)... college teammates with 2019 Lugnuts third baseman Johnny Aiello.
