July 12: RubberDucks 8, Fightin Phils 3: Ryan Webb fanned eight over six scoreless innings and Alexfri Planez picked up three hits in Akron's fifth straight victory.

Today's starting pitcher: Aaron Davenport joins Ryan Webb in the 17-start club for the RubberDucks on Saturday. The right-hander has been one of the best pitchers in the Eastern League this season ranking top 10 in ERA (third), innings pitched (ninth), average against (ninth), WHIP (sixth) and winning percentage (second). In his last start, Davenport struck out a season-high eight over five innings in Erie. He has worked at least five innings in every start since May 31.

The Best Day: The RubberDucks offense had one of the best days in franchise history in the series opener against Reading. Akron scored 19 runs on 26 hits. These 19 runs were the third most runs scored in a game by a Guardians affiliate this season (Columbus-23; Lake County 20) and the most runs scored in a game by an Akron team in seven years. The 26 hits were the most in a game by a Guardians affiliate this season, most in an Eastern League game in five years and the second most hits in a game in Akron franchise history (27 hits on May 25, 1999). Nine of the 10 RubberDucks batters had multiple hits.

Sparks (and homers) Fly: The RubberDucks offense has started to swing for more power as the weather has warmed up. After hitting 28 home runs combined between April and May, the RubberDucks slugged 23 home runs in June and 16 home runs in July. In the last two months, CJ Kayfus (eight homers), Kahlil Watson (seven homers) and Alexfri Planez (six homers) are leading Akron's power surge.

I'm the problem, it's me: CJ Kayfus has been a problem for opposing pitchers in 2024. Since joining the Eastern League, Kayfus ranks top 10 in homers (second, 8), RBI (first, 37), OBP (second, .436), slugging (second, .619), OPS (second, 1.055), extra base hits (tied third, 16) and total bases (tied first, 70). His 37 RBI are most on the RubberDucks despite making his Akron debut on June 4. During his time in Akron (30 games), Kayfus has three multi-home runs games (the first three of his professional career). His numbers between Akron and Lake County have him top in the Guardians organization in RBI (74), slugging percentage (.596), extra base hits (37) and total bases (159).

Gold Rush: Akron's offense has been red hot since hitting the road in July. Ducks batters have 80 hits including 12 home runs during the trip (seven games). Since the second half of the season began on June 25, Akron is averaging 6.4 runs per game while batting .283/.352/.497 with 35 doubles, 21 home runs and 96 RBI. RubberDucks travel to the Fightin Phils: Akron and Reading will face off for the first of two series this season and the only series at FirstEnergy Stadium. The two clubs have not played since 2022 when Akron went 4-2 at Canal Park. The RubberDucks went 5-1 in 2021 at FirstEnergy Stadium. Top prospects in this series include: Guardians (MLB.com): #15 OF Petey Halpin, #21 LHP Parker Messick, #27 IF CJ Kayfus, #28 IF Dayan Frias Phillies (MLB.com): #20 C Caleb Ricketts, #23 LHP Samuel Aldegheri, #25 IF Robert Moore

I knew you were trouble: Milan Tolentino has been trouble for opposing pitchers in the season's second half. Over his last 10 games, Tolentino is batting .308/.341/.718 with four home runs, four doubles, nine RBI and seven runs scored. Tolentino had his first career multi-home run game on July 10 in Reading. His .340 average is the highest on the team during the second half of the season (since June 25).

The 1: Joe Lampe has raised his average from just .161 at the end of April to a RubberDucks leading .285. He now has the eighth best average and second most triples (four) in the Eastern League.

And for a fortnight: Aaron Bracho has been on fire since coming off the injured list two weeks ago. Bracho has played in 11 games batting .367/.404/.490 with four doubles, one triple and five RBI. His 18 hits are most on the RubberDucks during the second half of the season.

End Game: Lenny Torres Jr. and Jack Leftwich have been two of the best in the Eastern League at closing games. Torres Jr. is tied fourth in the Eastern League with seven saves while Leftwich has picked up seven in his first season as a reliever. Combined the two are 14 of 17 in save opportunities this season.

Former RubberDucks make MLB debuts: Rouglas Odor (Akron manager 2019-2023) and Brad Goldberg (Akron pitching coach 2023) each made their MLB coaching debuts on Opening Day 2024. Cade Smith (2022-23) made his MLB debut on March 30 for the Guardians striking out five over two scoreless innings against the A's. Chris Roller (2021-22) made his MLB debut for the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15. Johnathan Rodriguez (2022-23) made his MLB debut for the Guardians on May 21 against the Mets. Trenton Brooks (2019, 2021) made his MLB debut for the San Francisco Giants on May 28. Daniel Schneemann (2021-22) made his MLB debut for the Guardians on June 2 against the Nationals. Angel Martinez (2022-23) made his MLB debut for Guardians on June 22 against the Blue Jays. Jhonkensy Noel (2022) made his MLB for Cleveland on June 27 against Baltimore.

2024 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#26 Manager Greg DiCenzo enters his fourth season with the Guardians organization. The 2024 season will be DiCenzo's first as RubberDucks manager, and third as a manager in the Guardians organization. He becomes the 19th manager in Akron franchise history (since 1989).

Prior to becoming Triple-A Columbus' bench coach in 2023, DiCenzo spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the manager in High-A Lake County. He guided the Captains to a 141-108 record in his two seasons including a Midwest League finals appearance in 2022.

A native of Duxbury, MA, DiCenzo was the head baseball coach at Holy Cross for 12 seasons prior to joining the Cleveland organization. The Crusaders went 137-109 in Patriot League play during his tenure, including a 2017 Patriot League Championship, and posted 20-win seasons in 10 of those 12 years.

#38 Hitting Coach Jordan Becker enters his fifth season with the Guardians and first with the RubberDucks. In 2023, Becker served as the hitting coach for Lake County.

Becker joined the Cleveland organization in 2019 after a collegiate coaching career that saw stops at Riverside Community College and New Mexico State University.

#50 Assistant Hitting Coach Amanda Kamekona enters her second year with the Guardians organization and first season with <u>Akron</u>. Kamekona spent 2023 as the hitting development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

Kamekona is the first female on-the-field coach in RubberDucks history. She played professional softball on the PFX Tour from 2010-2011 and the NPF tour from 2011-2019 where she was a three-time National Champion. Kamekona started her coaching career as an assistant softball coach at Limestone College before becoming the head softball coach at Brevard College. She also has head coaching stops at Bishop Amat High School and CA Bombers Fastpitch.

Pitching Coach Cody Buckel enters his sixth season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Buckel was the pitching strategist for the Columbus Clippers for the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

After starting his coaching career as a pitching coach in the Seattle Mariners organization, Buckel has spent time in the both the dugout and front office for Cleveland serving as the pitching resource coordinator and assistant director of pitching development before joining the Clippers field staff in 2022.

#32 Assistant Pitching Coach Michael Poole enters his second season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Poole was the pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

A native of Akron, Poole played at Cuyahoga Community College and Lake Erie College before starting his coaching career at Inspiration Academy (FL) in 2019. Poole was an assistant coach at LSU-Eunice for the Bengals D2 JUCO World Series Championship season in 2021.

#28 Bench Coach Kyle Lindquist enters his fifth season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Lindquist spent 2023 as the bench coach for Lake County.

A native of Columbus, Lindquist played at Marietta College (Ohio) and was a three-time All-OAC selection, 2012 All-American and member of the back-to-back National Championship teams in 2011 and 2012. After starting his coaching career at Marietta, Lindquist spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Denison University and one season at Davidson before joining the Cleveland organization.

#45 Bullpen Coach Seth Caddell enters his first season as a coach in the Guardians organization after spending the last three seasons as a catcher in the Cleveland organization. Signed out of East Carolina, Caddell last played for the RubberDucks in 2023.

Athletic Trainer Derrik Diaz enters his seventh season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Diaz served as the head athletic trainer for the Dominican Republic Complex in 2023. Named the 2021 PBATS Athletic Trainer of the Year for the Dominican Summer League. Also serves as the Assistant DR Medical Coordinator.

Assistant Athletic Trainer Karina Gonzalez enters her second season in the Guardians organization and first season in <u>Akron</u>. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Gonzalez served as an athletic trainer at the Arizona Complex. Gonzalez graduated from Sonoma State University (CA) in 2012 with a degree in kinesiology and earned a Master's degree in athletic training from Thomas Jefferson University (PA) in 2020. She earned a doctorate in athletic training from Indiana State University in 2022.

Strength and Conditioning Coach Mo Cuevas enters his ninth season with the Guardians organization and second season in Akron. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Cuevas served as the rehab strength and conditioning coach in 2022. Earned a Bachelors and Master's degree in Exercise Science at East Stroudsburg University.

Tech Assistant Henry Haracz enters his first season in Akron after spending last season in Lake County.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** and general manager **Jim Pfander** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the **"Rubber Capital of the World."** Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital *"D."* In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as *"the 'Ducks"* is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
